Offensive Player of the Year

BRANDON PLANTE

URBANA Senior Attack

■ Had a knack for playing well in big moments, assisting on the game-winning goal in Urbana's 11-10 section final win over Middletown and scoring the game-winning goal in a 13-12 region final win over Damascus that gave Urbana its first state berth since 2009.

■ Before leading the area in scoring with 86 points (57 goals, 29 assists), named a finalist for the C. Markland Kelly Award, which recognizes the state's best boys lacrosse player.

■ Will play college lacrosse at Division I Lehigh.

RYAN CROMPTON

MIDDLETOWN Senior Goalkeeper

■ Stingy as a goalkeeper, Crompton regularly frustrated opposing attackmen on point-blank chances or one-on-one opportunities with stellar play.

■ Led the MVAL with a 4.44 goals against average and a .691 save percentage, which earned him U.S. Lacrosse All-American honors. Allowed 10 goals or more just three times during the 2014 season.

■ Will play college lacrosse at Lenoir-Rhyne University.

■ Proved one of the area's most efficient players. Scored 35 goals on just 66 shots. Also collected 24 assists and 32 ground balls.

SENIOR ATTACK

■ An all-area first-team pick for the second straight year and a strong distributor, had 21 goals, 38 assists and 30 ground balls. Will play at the University of Tampa.

SENIOR ATTACK

OAKDALE

■ The area's fourth-leading scorer, led the Bears with 47 goals and 21 assists. Graduated as all-time points leader at Oakdale with 148 (92 goals, 46 assists).

■ Alternated between attack and midfield positions to keep defenses off-balance. Collected 38 goals and 24 assists. Will next play at St. Vincent College.

■ Another Kelly Award finalist, Jozwiak assumed a coach's role on the field, calling out formations and plays. He had 35 goals, 29 assists and 54 ground balls.

■ Team captain and top offensive player for the Titans. Led Tuscarora with 30 goals and 22 assists. Will play college lacrosse at Alderson Broadus.

URBANA

■ Superior stick skills allowed him to force 42 turnovers and collect 76 ground balls. Will play lacrosse at the University of Massachusetts-Lowell.
