TOWN OF STERLINGTON

The Town of Sterlington, hereinafter referred to as "Town", has adopted the following Citizen Participation Plan to meet the citizen participation requirements of Section 508 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. The Town of Sterlington is committed through adoption of this plan to full and total involvement of all residents of the community in the composition, implementation and assessment of its Louisiana Community Development Block Grant (LCDBG) Program. Attempts will be made to reach all citizens, with particular emphasis on participation by persons of low and moderate income, residents of slum and blighted areas and of areas in which funds are proposed to be used. A copy of this plan will be made available to the public upon written request during the period of implementation of the program

As part of the citizen participation requirements and to maximize citizen interaction, the Town of Sterlington shall:

- 1) Provide citizens with reasonable and timely access to local meetings, information and records relating to the State's proposed method of distribution, as required by the Secretary, and relating to the actual use of funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended;
- 2) Provide for public hearings to obtain views and respond to proposals and questions at all stages of the community development program. These hearings will entail the development of needs, the review of proposed activities, and review of program performance. Said hearings shall be held after adequate notice of a minimum of five calendar days, at times and locations convenient to potential or actual beneficiaries, and with accommodations for persons with disabilities:
- 3) Provide for and encourage citizen participation, with particular emphasis on participation by persons of low and moderate income who are residents of slum and blighted areas and of areas which funds are proposed to be used;
- 4) Provide for technical assistance to groups representative of persons of low and moderate income that request such assistance in developing proposals;
- Where applicable, identifies how the needs of non-English speaking residents 5) will be met in the case of public hearings; and

f) Location and hours available for application review.

The notice shall state that all citizens, particularly those affected by the proposed project, as well as low and moderate income persons of slum and blighted areas, are encouraged to submit their written view and proposals to:

Negative comments received will be forwarded to the State's Office of Community Development, Division of Administration, or the application will be withdrawn if necessary.

AMENDMENTS

Program amendments, which substantially alter the LCDBG project from that approved in the original application, shall not be submitted to State without holding one public hearing in accordance with procedures outlined within this Citizen Participation Plans. Minutes of the hearing will be submitted with the request for the amendment. All interested residents, particularly the low and moderate income, elderly, handicapped and residents of the project area shall have the opportunity to comment of proposed amendments and/or submit alternative measures.

III. GRANTEE PERFORMANCE

The Town of Sterlington shall hold one performance hearing to ascertain the effectiveness of the LCDBG Program. The manner of notification will be the same as previously described for all public hearings. Notification will be made in the official journal approximately thirty (30) calendar days prior to anticipated submittal of closeout documents to the State, and will indicate the date, time, and place of the performance hearing, and invite comments and opinions on the LCDBG activities implemented under the Town's LCDBG Program being closed out. The notice will also state that accommodations will be made for disabled and non-English speaking persons provided a three day notice is received by the Town.

The notice shall invite all interested parties, particularly those low to moderate income residents in the target area to attend.

The hearing will be no sooner than five calendar days from the publication date of said notice.

CONSIDERATIONS OF OBJECTION TO APPLICATION

Written minutes of the hearings and an attendance roster will be maintained by the Town of Sterlington.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Notices informing citizens of any public hearings will appear in the official journal of the News-Star a minimum of five calendar days prior to the hearing. In addition, notices will also be posted in the Town Hall and/or dissemination of leaflets in the target area. Hearings will be held at times and locations convenient to potential or actual beneficiaries with accommodations for individuals with disabilities and non-English speaking persons. Whenever possible these hearings will be held within or near the target areas, at times affording participation by the most affected residents.

I. APPLICATION

First Notice/Public Hearing

The Citizen Participation Plan will be available at the Hearing. The public notice shall state that the following items will be discussed at the hearing:

 - The Town's prior performance of LCDBG programs funded by the State d) of Louisiana. In addition, the notice shall state that all citizens, particularly low and moderate income residents of slum and blighted areas, are encouraged to submit their views and proposals regarding community development and housing needs. TIMELY ACCESS AND ADEQUATE INFORMATION

The Town shall provide timely disclosure of records, information and documents related to LCDBG program activities. Documents will be made available for copying upon request at the Town Hall, Monday, through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Such documents may include the following:

- 1) All meetings and promotional materials.
- 2) Records of hearings and meetings.
- All key documents, including prior applications, letters, grant agreements, citizen 3) participation plans, and proposed applications.
- 4) Copies of the regulations (final statements) concerning the program.
- 5) Documents regarding other important requirements, such as Procurement Procedures, Fair Housing, Equal Employment Opportunity, Uniform Act, Labor Provisions and Environmental Procedures.

The Town will have copies of the Citizen Participation Plan and proposed applications which will be available for persons affected by the LCDBG program who request the information.

CITIZEN COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

SECTION 1

It is the policy of the Town of Sterlington to review all complaints when requested by anyone concerning actions of the Town,

SECTION 2

The following procedures will be followed on all complaints received by the Town of Sterlington:

- 1 The complainant shall notify the Town Clerk of the complaint. The initial complaint may be orally or written correspondence.
- 2. The Town Clerk will notify the Mayor or designated representative of the complaint within five (5) days.
- The Mayor or designated representative will investigate the complaint and will 3. report his findings to the Town Clerk within five (5) days.
- The Town Clerk will notify the complainant of the findings of the Mayor or designated representative in writing or telephonically within five (5) days.
- If the complainant is aggrieved by the decision, he must forward the complaint in writing (if previously submitted orally) to the Town Clerk who will forward the complaint along with actions taken by the Mayor or designated representative to the appropriate committee for their review. This will be accomplished within seven (7) days of receipt of written complaint.
- 6. The Town's Council will have seven (7) days to review the complaint and will forward their decision to the complainant in writing.
- 7. If the complainant is aggrieved with the decision of the Council, he must notify the Town Clerk in writing that he desires to be afforded a hearing from the Town's Council. The complainant will be placed on the next regularly scheduled Town meeting agenda. The Town Clerk will notify the complainant in writing of the date of the hearing.

PROCUREMENT POLICY

These procedures are intended to serve as guidelines for the procurement of supplies, equipment, construction services and professional services for the LCDBG Program. These guidelines meet the standards established in 24 CFR 85.36 and state requirements.

CODE OF CONDUCT

No employee, officer, or agent of the Town of Sterlington shall participate in the selection or in the award or administration of a contract supported by LCDBG funds if a conflict of interest, real or apparent, would be involved. Such a conflict could arise if the employee, officer or agent; any member of his/her mmediate family; his/her partner; or an organization which employs or is about to employ any of the above, has a financial or other interest in the firm selected for award. above, has a finar

No officer, employee or agent of the **Town of Sterlington** shall solicit or accept gratuities, favors or anything of monetary value from contractors or firms, potential contractors or firms, or parties to sub-agreements, except where the financial interest is not substantial or the gift is an unsolicited item of menined interface pather.

Any alleged violations of these standards of conduct shall be referred to the Town of Sterlington Attorney. Where violations appear to have occurred, the offending employee, officer or agent shall be subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to dismissal or transfer, where violations or infractions appear to be substantial in nature, the matter may be referred to the appropriate officials for criminal investigation and possible prosecution

PROCUREMENT PROCEDURES

The director or supervisor of each department or agency of the **Town of Sterlington** responsible for procurement of services, supplies, equipment, or construction obtained with LCDBG funds shall review all proposed procurement actions to avoid the purchase of unnecessary or duplicative items. Such reviews shall consider consolidation or breaking out to obtain a more economical purchase. When determined appropriate by the Director or Supervisor, an analysis to determine which approach would be the most economical shall be undertaken.

The **Town of Sterlington** shall take affirmative steps to assure that small and minority firms, women's business enterprises, and labor surplus firms are solicited whenever they are potential qualified sources. The **Town of Sterlington** shall also consider the feasibility of dividing total requirements into smaller tasks or quantities so as to permit maximum participation by small and minority firms, women's business enterprises, and labor surplus firms. Where permitted by regulations, delivery schedule will be developed which will include participation by such businesses.

The Town of Sterlington shall assist the prime contractor whenever possible by providing copies of lists which identify qualified small and minority firms, women's business enterprises, and labor surplus area firms.

SELECTION PROCEDURES

ALL procurement carried out with LCDBG funds, where the **Town of Sterlington** is a direct party, shall be carried out in a manner that provides maximum free and open competition. Procurement procedures will not restrict or eliminate competition. The **Town of Sterlington** shall not place unreasonable requirements on firms in order for them to qualify to do business. Nor will the **Town of Sterlington**

encourage or participate in noncompetitive practices among firms. The **Town of Sterlington** is alert to organizational conflicts which would jeopardize the negotiation process and limit competition. The **Town of Sterlington** will not require unnecessary experience or bonding requirements.

Pursuant to state law, all solicitations of offers shall incorporate a clear accurate description of the technical requirements for the material, service, or product to be procured. In competitive procurements, these descriptions shall not contain features which unduly limit competition. The description may include a statement of the qualitative nature of the material, product or service and the minimum essential

characteristics and standards to which it must conform if it is to satisfy its intended use. Detailed product specifications shall be avoided whenever possible. A "brand name or equal" description may be used to define the performance or other salient requirements of procurement. The specific features of the named brand which must be met by offerers shall be clearly stated.

All solicitations of offers shall clearly set forth all requirements which offerers must fulfill and all other factors to be used in evaluating bids, proposals, or statements of qualifications.

Contracts shall be awarded only to responsible contractors/firms that possess the potential ability to perform successfully under the terms and conditions of the proposed procurement

Consideration shall be given to such factors as the contractor's/firm's capacity, integrity, compliance with public policy, record of past performance, and financial and technical resources.

METHODS OF PROCUREMENT

Direct procurement by the **Town of Sterlington** shall be made by using one of the following methods depending on the type of service to be procured.

<u>Small Purchase Procedures</u>. Relatively simple, informal procurement procedures will be used where the purchase of materials, supplies, equipment, and/or other property will not cost in the aggregate more than \$30,000, and for construction with a cost of not more than \$100,000, except where further limited by state law or LCDBG policy. The small purchase procedure can also be utilized to procure administrative consulting and other professional services not costing more than \$100,000. The only exception to professional services is for architectural/engineering services that must be procured through competitive negotiation. The procurement officer must obtain a minimum of three oral or written or rate quotations from qualified sources. Documentation on all quotations received (whether oral or written) shall be made a part of the file. a part of the file.

<u>Competitive Sealed Bids/Formal Advertising</u>. Under this procedure bids are publicly advertised in accordance with the state's Public Bid Law. A firm fixed price contract (either lump sum or unit price) shall be awarded to the responsible bidder whose bid is lowest in price and that conforms to all the material terms and conditions of the advertisement for bids.

Competitive sealed bids can be used ONLY when the following criteria are met: (1) there are complete, adequate, and realistic specifications or purchase descriptions; (2) there are two or more responsible bidders who are willing and able to compete effectively; (3) the procurement can be made on a firm fixed-price contract and selection of the successful bidder can appropriately be made principally on the basis of price

When formal advertising is used the following conditions shall be met.

- The advertisement for bids shall be publicly advertised in accord with state law, The advertisement for bids, including the specifications and pertinent attachments, shall clearly define the items or services needed in order for the bidders to properly respond to the ii.
- All bids shall be opened publicly at the time and place specified in the advertisement for bids.
- All bids shall be opened publicly at the time and place specified in the advertisement for bids. A firm fixed-price contract award shall be made by written notice to the lowser responsible bidder whose bid conforms to the advertisement for bids. Where specified in the bid documents, factors such as discounts, transportation costs, and life cycle costs shall be considered in determining which bid is lowest. Payment discounts shall only be used to determine low bid when prior experience indicates that such discounts are generally taken. Notwithstanding the above, any or all bids may be rejected when there are sound documented business reasons in the best interest of the LCDBG Program. îv.

Competitive Negotiation: Requests for Proposals/Qualification Statements. This method may be used when formal advertising is not appropriate. Architectural and engineering services must be procured via requests for qualification statements; administrative consulting services must be procured via requests for proposals. Other professional services may also be procured by requests for proposals. The following procedures will be used for competitive negotiation:

- Requests for proposal or qualification statements must be advertised in a newspaper in the nearest metropolitan area in accordance with the rules of the State's LCDBG Program. All submittals will be honored and entered into the competition. The package for proposals or qualification statements shall identify all significant evaluation factors or selection criteria, including the corresponding point system that will be used to rate the proceeds/multification statements.

- factors or selection criteria, including the corresponding point system that will be used to rate the proposal/qualification statements. The selecting official (or committee, if one is designated) shall review all proposals and statements received and make a technical evaluation of each. This shall also include a written statement that identifies the basis upon which the selection was made. Contract award will be made to the responsible offerer whose submission is deemed most appropriate to the **Town of Stertington** with consideration for price, qualifications, and other factors set by the local governing body. Unsuccessful offerers shall be notified in writing within ten working days of contract award. Documentation of notification shall be maintained in the contract selection file for the individual project. Following the review of the qualification statements received, the most qualified competitor will be selected to enter into contract negotiation. This shall always include negotiation of price to statement the order into contract negotiation. This shall always include negotiation of price to the selection file for the individual project. iv.
- ٧. be selected to enter into contract negotiation. This shall always include negotiation of price to insure cost reasonableness. At the conclusion of successful negotiation, the competitor shall be invited to enter into a contrac

Noncompetitive Negotiation/Sole Source. Noncompetitive negotiation shall be used when small purchase, formal advertising, or competitive negotiation procedures are not feasible. Noncompetitive negotiation will involve solicitations of a proposal from only one proposal or qualification solicitations under the competitive negotiation procedures result in only one proposal or qualification statement. Noncompetitive negotiation shall only be used when written authorization has been obtained from the state's Office of Community Development. In order to qualify for this type of procurement, one of the following circumstances must apply: of the following circum ances must apply

- The item or service is available only from a single source; It is determined that a public urgency or emergency exists and the urgency will not permit the delay beyond the time needed to employ one of the other three methods of procurement.

iti. After solicitation of a number of sources, competition is determined to be inadequate.

CONTRACT PRICING

Cost plus percentage of cost and percentage of construction cost methods of contracting MUST NOT be used. The **Town of Sterlington** shall perform cost or pricing analysis in connection with EVERY procurement action including contract modifications. Costs or prices based on estimated costs for LCDBG projects shall be allowed only to the extent that the costs incurred or the cost estimates included in negotiated prices are consistent with federal cost principals. Cost reimbursement, fixed price, per diem contracts, or a combination thereof may be utilized as appropriate.

A cost reimbursement type contract is most appropriate when the scope and extent of the work to be performed are not clearly defined. A cost reimbursement contract MUST clearly establish a cost ceiling which may not be exceeded without formally amending the contract, and must identify a fixed dollar profit that may not be increased unless there is a contract amendment that increases the scope of the work

A fixed price contract is appropriate when the scope of work is very well defined and product oriented. A fixed price contract MUST establish a guaranteed price that may not increase unless there is a contract amendment that increases the scope of the work.

A per diem contract expected to exceed \$10,000 will not be considered unless the **Town of Sterlington** has determined that a cost reimbursable or fixed price contract is not appropriate. Cost and profit included in the per diem rate MUST be specifically negotiated and shown separately in the proposal. The contract must clearly establish a ceiling price that may not be exceeded without formally amending the contract

The **Town of Sterlington** may use a multiplier type of compensation under either the cost reimbursement or fixed price contract. The multiplier and the portions of the multiplier applicable to overhead and profit must be specifically negotiated and separately identified in the contract.
