REGULAR MEETING 4 October, 2016

The Mayor and Board of Alderman of the Town of Clayton met in regular session at the Clayton Town Hall, Clayton, Louisiana on October 4, 2016 at 7:00 P.M.

THERE WERE PRESENT: Mayor Josephine Washington; Lavon Barber, Houston Holmes, Willie Evans and Irene Jefferson, Alderpersons.

THERE WERE ALSO PRESENT: Sally B. Lewis, Office Clerk, Chief Bobby Madison, J.J. Griffin, Gas Operator and visitors.

THERE WERE ABSENT: Alderperson Shannon Madison.

The meeting was called to order and opened with prayer by Mayor Washington followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor had roll call and she read off the items on the Agenda. The minutes of the September 6, 2016 meeting were read by the office clerk. Motion was made by Ms. Jefferson, seconded by Mr. Holmes to accept the minutes as read. All voting aye, motion carried.

Mr. Evans asked how much money had the town borrowed so far. Mayor Washington stated the town has borrowed \$160,000.00. Mayor stated that she tried to poll the alderman to let them know what the monies were being spent on. Mr. Evans said he could not receive a phone call on his job until after 4:00 P.M.

Mayor informed the board that the town charges \$10.00 per thousand gallons to highway companies for extra water usage. Motion by Mr. Barber, seconded by Mr. Holmes to increase the water rates from \$10.00 to \$50.00 per thousand. All voting aye, motion carried. Motion by Mr. Barber, seconded by Mr. Evans to raise returned check fee to \$35.00. All voting aye, motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Barber, seconded by Ms. Jefferson to start enforcing the \$25.00 per service reconnect fee in Jan. 2017. All voting aye motion carried.

Mayor informed the board that with the new water plant the town will be spending \$150,000.00 on new water meters.

A discussion came before the board concerning customers not paying their bills on time. The board agreed to work with the elders if they have a problem with paying their bills. Mayor stated she would check with the attorney about a customer not paying an old bill.

Ms. Jefferson will pick a date to have a town trash pickup day.

Mr. Evans asked the board to put a spending limit in the Mayor. Mayor stated in Jan. she received a letter from the state with eleven items listed that had us out of compliance and after working to correct the problems, we have a meter left which will be fixed by Wornack and Sons at a price of \$2,316.62. Mr. Evans said he has no problem with emergency spending. Motion by Mr. Evans to set a \$500.00 spending limit, except for emergency spending, on Mayor Washington. Died for a lack of second. Mr. Evans said to let the record reflect that the town cannot control the means of spending by allowing the Mayor to have a maximum amount of spending before consulting with the board.

Mayor Washington informed the board that the old truck Mr. Johnson used had been discussed and agreed on to purchase a motor for the truck at an estimated price of \$2100.00. Chief Madison informed the

Ms. Kelly led the invocation and Ms. Davis the pledge of allegiance.

Chairman Glenn Henderson asked for the roll call of members.

Present was Ms. Myisha Davis, Mr. Glenn Henderson, Ms. Cathy Kelly and Ms. Tiesha Lewis. Absent was Mr. Kary "Butch" Hammett. Acting Secretary Kevin M. Friloux was also present.

A motion was made by Ms. Davis seconded by Ms. Kelly to approve the minutes of the special meeting of September 29, 2016. Motion carried.

Mr. Henderson asked if anyone was present to address the board. Being none, the chairman proceeded with the meeting.

Ms. Kelly reported on additional records obtained by Mr. Friloux's office from former secretary Justina Cook. She noted that the records included lease agreements, minutes of previous years' meetings, a bank account deposit book and several other district business items. Ms. Davis requested the list of items and copies of the lease agreements. The board accepted Ms. Kelly's report as presented.

Ms. Kelly gave additional financial information saying she had closed several accounts in the area and paid several outstanding bills. A motion was then made by Ms. Lewis seconded by Ms. Davis to ratify and approve the payments made by Ms. Kelly. Mr. Friloux suggested that reimbursement to Ms. Davis for the purchase of a tape recorder be included. It was so noted. Motion carried.

Mr. Henderson advised that the bus owned by the district had been towed into Ferriday by Curtis Wrecker Service. A motion was made by Ms. Lewis seconded by Ms. Kelly to pay the invoice from Curtis Wrecker Service. Motion carried.

Ms. Kelly reported on the condition of the ballpark fields and facilities. She also reported on repairs done on the building owned by the Town of Ferriday concluding that additional work is needed. After a brief discussion Ms. Davis indicated that she would check on the legality of the district using inmate labor to complete the repairs to the building and performing other district work.

Ms. Davis inquired as to the balance in the district's banking accounts. Ms. Kelly indicated a checking account balance of approximately \$8,000. The question of whether Ms. Jerry Sue Tosson had been contacted was raised. Mr. Henderson advised that he had not yet been able to get in touch with her to seek her assistance but would continue to do so.

Ms. Kelly advised that two applications had been received for the position of district secretary. The two applicants will be interviewed by board members and a recommendation for hiring will be made at the next meeting.

A motion was made by Ms. Kelly seconded by Ms. Davis to authorize Mr. Hammett to oversee grounds and facilities at this time. Motion carried.

A general discussion ensued on the general upkeep of the grounds and facilities and the best way to manage them. No decisions were made at this time. Ms. Kelly the advised that she would speak with police jury president, Jimmy Jernigan and seek assistance from the police jury for the next few months.

Ms. Davis inquired as to the balance of the account at Home Hardware. Ms. Kelly indicated the balance was \$1,000. Ms. Davis then made a motion seconded by Ms. Lewis to pay the entire balance. Motion carried.

The compensation of the proposed district secretary was discussed. After exchanging comments a motion was made by Ms. Kelly seconded by Ms. Lewis that a set salary should be paid and capped at \$250-\$300 per month. Motion carried.

A general discussion ensued on initiating team sports in the district and possible steps to take to encourage public participation, including providing information to the public. The possibility of establishing a webpage was discussed and received favorable comments.

With regard to the previously approved interview process of the applicants for district secretary, Ms. Kelly and Ms. Lewis agree to perform the interviews.

There being no further business a motion was made by Ms. Lewis seconded by Ms. Davis to adjourn. Motion carried.

The Concordia Parish Recreation District No. 1 met this day in special session convened.

Ms. Kelly led the invocation and Ms. Davis then led the pledge of allegiance.

Chairman Glenn Henderson asked for the roll call of members:

Present was Ms. Myisha Davis, Mr. Glenn Henderson, Ms. Cathy Kelly and Mr. Kary "Butch" Hammett. Absent was Ms. Tiesha Lewis. Acting Secretary Kevin M. Friloux was also present. Several members of the community were also present.

A motion was made by Ms. Davis seconded by Mr. Hammett to approve the minutes of the organizational meeting of September 21, 2016. Motion carried.

Ms. Kelly reported on the records obtained by Mr. Friloux from former secretary Justina Cook. She noted that the records included no minutes, no formal lease agreements nor any of the noted assets on the asset inventory list. The board accepted her report as presented.

A motion was then made by Ms. Davis seconded by Mr. Hammett that follow-up certified letters be sent to the former employees demanding the return of any and all remaining equipment and records to the district. Motion carried.

The board agreed to have Ms. Justina Cook invited to the next meeting.

Ms. Kelly presented the board with a number of unpaid bills including those to the Town of Ferriday, the utility bill, equipment rental and for a storage unit. Ms. Kelly then made a motion seconded by Mr. Hammett to pay these bills. Motion carried.

The board discussed the request of Justina Cook to pay her salary for the period of August to September in the amount of \$1,000. After a brief discussion a motion was made by Ms. Davis seconded by Mr. Hammett to grant the request and make the payment. Motion carried.

Ms. Kelly advised the board that the current checking account balance is \$10,248.89 and the board has one certificate of deposit in the amount of \$5,000.

A motion was made by Ms. Kelly seconded by Mr. Davis to have Ms. Jerry Sue Tosson to assist the board in reconciling the district's financial records including the checking account and investment activity. Motion carried.

A general discussion ensued on the facilities that the district currently uses, including Ferriday Jr. High, Learned Park and the building recently remodeled using district funds. Upon completion of the discussion a motion was made by Ms. Davis seconded by Mr.

Hammett to request of the Towns of Clayton, Ferriday and Ridgcrest and the Concordia Parish School Board to advise of any written agreements that exist with the Recreation District including use agreements, cooperative endeavor agreements or lease agreements. Motion carried.

Mr. Justin Conner and Mr. Johnny Brown, members of the audience, addressed the board and gave their advisory opinions on how the district might move forward. Mr. Brown offered his services to the board and offered a copy of a past recreation plan for the district.

The board discussed the position of secretary, noting that Mr. Friloux advised that he would like the board to move quickly in finding a permanent secretary. Ms. Davis introduced Ms. Keisha Prosser whom she believed would be a qualified person for the position. Ms. Prosser briefly introduced herself to the board. The matter was taken under advisement.

After a short discussion on filling the position of secretary, a motion was made by Mr. Davis seconded by Ms. Kelly to advertise in the Concordia Sentinel for two weeks and accept applications until October 19, 2016. Motion carried.

Ms. Kelly agreed to meet with Mr. Friloux to put together a job description and notice for the newspaper.

Mr. Jimmy Harbor, an audience member, interjected that the board might hire Mr. Johnny Brown for the position of director of the district. Mr. Henderson advised Mr. Harbor that the board would not be taken that type of action until the board was able to establish its current financial standing as well as to determine the district's future direction. No action was taken.

Mr. Henderson advised that the board might look into establishing by-laws for the board's operations. It was so noted.

Mr. Brady Joe Fields, a member of the audience, addressed the board seeking funding for improvements to the Doty Road community building. He said that a public non-profit organization had been formed and was seeking the board's financial help. The board questioned the legality of the district providing funding to the organization. Ms. Davis advised that she would look into the legality of such funding. No action was taken.

The meeting was formally opened by Mr. Henderson. The invocation was led by Ms. Kelly and Mr. Henderson led the pledge of allegiance. Mr. Kevin M. Friloux, Notary Public, then proceeded with the Oath of Office to the newly appointed board members. All members were duly sworn in and then began to perform their duties.

The first order of business was to elect a chairman. After a brief discussion Mr. Glenn Henderson was elected without dissent. Ms. Cathy Kelly was then elected vice-chairman/treasurer without dissent. Mr. Henderson then suggested that Mr. Friloux be appointed as acting secretary until further action is taken by the board. The board agreed and Mr. Friloux was appointed without dissent.

A motion was made by Ms. Davis seconded by Mr. Hammett to appoint the Concordia Sentinel as the district's official journal. Motion carried.

A motion was then made by Ms. Lewis seconded by Ms. Kelly that all former board employees and the board secretary be removed from their respective positions and that all equipment, property, records and any assets be turned over to the new board. Motion carried. The board then discussed the best day and place for the board's regular meetings. It was the consensus to hold the regular meetings on the 3rd Thursday of the month at the Ferriday Town Hall. It was so noted.

Mr. Friloux advised that he would begin seeking all equipment and records as previously noted as soon as possible.

The board then set up a follow-up special meeting for Thursday, September 29, 2016 at 6:00 PM at the Ferriday Town Hall pending receipt of the district's equipment and records.

A round table discussion ensued on possible actions to take in the immediate future to get the board on the right track. It was suggested the members physically visit the sites the board maintains. It was further suggested the board determine the goals of the board for the immediate future. The board emphasized the need to work together in the interest of the people of the district.

Mr. Friloux advised the board that the district's property tax millage is to expire after 2017 and that an election will need to be held in 2017 for the tax renewal. The board so noted the advice.
