Dog Park Report from Parks & Rec Board. Steve Ashworth made staff comment regarding the history of this item, the Parks and Recreation Board review of the dog park issue, hurdles associated with using Powderhorn Park for a dog park, the potential to use the Post Office site for a dog park, creating another dog park outside of city limits at the Melody Ranch trailhead, the benefits of a dog park, and continuing to explore a dog park at the grassy area of the fairgrounds for a winter seasonal dog park.

Amy Romaine, representing PAWS, made public comment regarding gratitude for Council's consideration, an in-town location providing the most utility of a dog park, the importance of the size of the park, the benefit of pairing a winter dog park at the fairgrounds with a Melody Ranch park, the need for more financial information associated with a Melody Ranch park, creating a small dog area in the dog park, and parking challenges associated with the Post Office location. Ileen Zwerin made public comment regarding the feasibility of the land by the START facility. Maureen Karabatsos made public comment regarding urgency, using the Walgreens site as a dog park, and the implications of the vacancies on the Fair Board to moving forward with a winter dog park. Robert Diehl made public comment regarding wildlife and parking considerations associated with a dog park at the Post Office. Patina White made public comment regarding how common it is for cities to have dog parks, the need and demand for a dog park, moving forward with a seasonal dog park at the fairgrounds in the short term, and urgency. Bob Graham made public comment regarding housing provisions allowed near the START facility and related impact to wildlife as compared to the impact of a dog park. Steve Harrington, representing the Fair Board, made public comment regarding the Fair Board not yet having a chance to discuss this item, the potential for and associated challenges associated with a winter dog park at the fairgrounds, and the schedule of upcoming Fair Board meetings to discuss a winter dog park. Sandy Strout, representing the Grand Teton Kennel Club, made public comment regarding the benefits of a dog park, and dog restrictions on public lands.

Bob McLaurin made staff comment regarding the conservation easement restrictions on the parcel near the START facility, the timeline to move forward and coordinate a winter dog park with the Fair Board, and the potential to lift bans of dogs on some parks and related impact and next steps.

Discussion followed regarding options to move forward, coordinating a potential winter dog park at the fairgrounds with the Fair Board, parking considerations at the Post Office, the benefits of having a winter dog park at the fairgrounds this winter, the potential and related benefits of sectioning off several parks for neighborhood dog parks, the pros and cons of a Melody Ranch dog park, the potential for summer health concerns as a result of a winter dog park, and continuing to look at the Post Office location for a dog park.

Audrey Cohen-Davis made staff comment regarding required

ordinances and lease amendments depending on Council direction.

A motion was made by Bob Lenz and seconded by Hailey Morton Levinson to direct Town staff to work with the US Postal Service to develop an agreement to establish a long term off leash facility at the Post Office property on Maple Way, present that agreement to the Town Council for approval with specifics on staff and fiscal impact, direct Town staff to

work with Teton County and the Fair Board to explore existing agreements that would allow a seasonal off leash area in the grassy area at the Town owned rodeo grounds for presentation at the November 2nd Town Council meeting, and support the Parks and Recreation Director and Teton County in their efforts to establish an off leash area at Melody Ranch Trailhead parcel with information provided to the Town Council in terms of staff and fiscal impacts. Mayor Flitner called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor. The motion carried.
