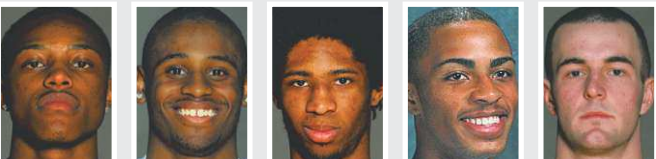

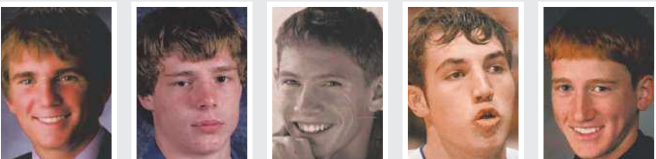

The heart of a 3-time champ

They're all back on the All-Nebraska team: Antoine Young. Wes Eikmeier. Jesse Carr. Josh Jones.

Especially Jones, whose basketball career was immaterial last fall when he underwent emergency heart surgery.

"He has such a positive outlook on things, I think that helped," Central coach Eric Behrens said. "It was his personality and all the response he got from people. There was so much support because he's such a likable kid anyway, and I just think everybody was pulling for him."

It was an easy call for Jones to be the honorary captain of the 94th annual All-Nebraska boys basketball team. He was Class A's leading scorer this season, smashed Central's career scoring record and also broke its single-game record. He tied the Class A record of 10 3-pointers in a game and led the Eagles to the school's third consecutive state championship.

Senior year was also memorable for the three other repeat selections, who like Jones will join Division I college teams next season. Fremont Bergan's Eikmeier and Ainsworth's Carr went to the top of their schools' scoring charts and rank eighth and 17th all-time, respectively, with 2,195 and 2,058 points. Young ranks second at Bellevue West to one of the state's all-time greats, Erick Strickland.

The keeper of the All-Nebraska flame into 2009 will be Jarrell Crayton. Bellevue East's 6-foot-6 junior center already was on the ballots of many coaches who submitted their all-state nominations in advance of the state tournament, then closed the deal with his outstanding play in Lincoln that pulled the Chieftains into the state final against Central.

This is the second time the All-Nebraska first team has included four repeat selections. On the 1982 team were Dave Hoppen of Omaha Benson, Bill Jackman of Grant, Ron Kellogg of Omaha Northwest and Kerry Trotter of Omaha Creighton Prep.

That team was regarded as the

best ever in the state. Their scholarships came from major-conferences schools. Hoppen and Mike Martz of Beatrice signed with Nebraska, Jackman with Duke (later returning to NU), Kellogg with Kansas and Trotter with Marquette.

Except for Eikmeier, who signed with Iowa State, midmajors are the next stop for these seniors. Jones and Young will be together at Creighton. Carr is bound for Colorado State.

On the All-Nebraska second team are seniors Josh Riser of Lincoln High, Jeff Allgood of Bellevue West, Josh Lynch of Elkhorn, John Levorson of Crete and Mike Fox of Class B state champion Beatrice. Allgood is an Army basketball recruit. Levorson, a two-time All-Nebraska football player, signed with NU in that sport. Lynch has signed with the University of Nebraska at Omaha.

Third-team selections are seniors Jake Reinders of Omaha Skutt, Kendall Wehrle of Papillion-La Vista South and Andrew Palmer of Waverly and juniors Greg Smith of Ralston and Eric

Koehlmoos of Pierce. Wehrle is an Arkansas baseball recruit who is the first from his school to receive all-state recognition.

Nominations of coaches and observations of The World-Herald's sports staff determine the honor teams. All schools received nomination forms.

Jones, a 6-foot-2 junior, averaged 19.8 points for Central as a senior and finished with 1,518 points in his four-year career. He poured in his 10 3-pointers on the night he scored 41 points, the school record, against Bellevue East in midseason.

Jones played against Young 10 times in their four seasons, winning six. His edge came from the state tournament, where Central went 3-0 against Bellevue West with two overtime victories in state finals before knocking out the Thunderbirds 80-66 in this year's semifinals.

"We're pretty good characters, which makes it fun the way we are," Young said. "We compete on the court, but at the same time we have fun."

Young, a 5-11 point guard, saw

considerable time at the off-guard position for West as a senior. That could be what he plays at Creighton. He averaged 17.2 points as a senior. His school-record 47 points came as a junior against Omaha Burke.

Eikmeier led the state by averaging 31.1 points. He scored 59 on North Bend and 43 in the Class D-1 state final against Humphrey St. Francis. That matched what the Flyers scored and duplicated a 36-year-old state tournament record.

"He saw so many defenses and still was able to get his points," Bergan coach Chris Paulson said. "That's a credit to his ability to shoot the 3, shoot the 15-footer and also get to the hole. He shot almost 190 free throws this year."

"I think everybody categorizes him as a shooter. He's not just a shooter. He's a scorer. To get to the line that many times tells you he's getting inside the lane, he's throwing his body at the big boys and doing whatever it takes to help his team win."

Carr, whose school won Class C-1 a year ago, averaged 24 points as a senior. He broke the state's career 3-point record with 303 and had 749 assists in his four-year Bulldog career. As a sophomore, he scored 68 points in one game.

Prior to his senior season, Carr was involved in vandalism at a rival school and received three years probation as part of a misdemeanor conviction. Carr said later, "It was one bad experience and one bad decision."

Crayton is the rising star. Nebraska coach Doc Sadler watched the Class A final, then offered a scholarship last Tuesday to the multi-sport athlete. Crayton skipped summer basketball last summer to concentrate on football, and he is out for soccer as a goalkeeper.

"Playing other sports is good," Chieftains coach Jason Ryan said. "For basketball, he's got to continue to get stronger. His mental toughness needs to get a lot better. His interior defense needs to get better."

"His ballhandling, his consistency shooting face-up jump shots from 15, 17, 18 feet and free throws need to improve. If he works on those things, he'll be able to play at the next level."
