Iowa State has won five in a row, including two unbelievable comebacks against Oklahoma (in Ames) and Kansas (in Kansas City). Barring another Georges Niang injury, the 'Clones should make a run.



FEELIN' THE BLUES
St. John's lost the regular-season finale to Villanova 105-68. Then it got whipped by Providence (on its home court) in the Big East tournament. Now Chris Obekpa is suspended. This won't end well for Steve Lavin.



CINDERELLA WATCH
In 2008, Davidson made the Elite Eight as a 10 seed, upsetting Gonzaga the first weekend. The Wildcats don't have Steph Curry, but Tyler Kalinoski is pretty good.



BEWARE OF ...
Georgetown's recent flops. Since taking the Hoyas to the Final Four in 2007, John Thompson III is 2-5 in the NCAA tournament, including losses to a 10 seed, a 14 seed, an 11 seed and a 15 seed. Ouch.



REMEMBER ME?
Larry Brown hasn't coached an NCAA tournament game since Kansas upset Oklahoma in the 1988 national championship game. But it is Brown's other former school — UCLA — he'll see in the opener.



SET YOUR DVR
A Duke-Gonzaga regional final would be the most enticing regional final in years. They're third and first, respectively, in field-goal percentage. The Zags have never made a Final Four. Coach K has made 11.

FEELIN' THE BLUES
ACC powers Virginia and Louisville haven't looked good the past three weeks. Rick Pitino's team is 3-3 without guard Chris Jones (dismissed from the team). And UVA lost two of the past three after a 28-1 start.



CINDERELLA WATCH
Northern Iowa enters the tournament 30-3. The Panthers aren't flashy, but their offense is actually very efficient. They won't be overwhelmed by Villanova's or Virginia's athleticism.



BEWARE OF ...
Unproven favorites. Last year, Virginia and Villanova were the top seeds in the East. Neither made the regional final, opening the door for eventual national champion Connecticut. Are the Cavaliers and Wildcats better this year? Hard to say.



REMEMBER ME?
Who beat Virginia in the Sweet 16 last year? Tom Izzo! This year, Virginia should see the Spartans in the round of 32. I'm sure Tony Bennett is thrilled.



SET YOUR DVR
Two of the 10 best guards in the tournament should meet in the round of 32. Oklahoma's Buddy Hield was Big 12 player of the year. Providence's Kris Dunn scores 16 points a game and his average of 7.6 assists ranks second in the country.

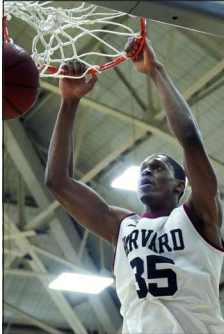

CINDERELLA WATCH
The 12 and 13 seeds in Jacksonville are intriguing because of their styles. Wofford and Harvard slow it down. Their opponents, Arkansas and North Carolina, love to play fast. If one of those underdogs can control tempo, expect an upset.



BEWARE OF ...
An Arkansas hangover. The Hogs played Kentucky on Sunday in Atlanta. It's not easy to come back from that test, especially for an Arkansas program that hasn't been to the NCAAs since 2008.



REMEMBER ME?
Wisconsin faced Oregon in last year's round of 32. And the Ducks led 49-37 at halftime in Milwaukee. Think Dana Altman might like another shot at Bo Ryan?



SET YOUR DVR
A rematch of last year's Wisconsin-Arizona regional final wouldn't set ratings records. But their 64-63 overtime battle was among the most competitive of the tournament. Let's do it again.

CINDERELLA WATCH
Last year, undefeated Wichita State got a bad draw when it ran into Kentucky in the round of 32. This year, the Shox can thrive in the underdog role. They certainly have NCAA tournament experience.



BEWARE OF ...
Notre Dame's awful defense. The Irish are 112th in defensive efficiency, which basically disqualifies a Final Four run. Last year, No. 3 seeds Duke and Creighton were outside the top 100 in defensive efficiency and lost the first weekend.



REMEMBER ME?
Seventeen years ago, Valparaiso's Bryce Drew hit one of the NCAA tournament's most famous shots, a 3 at the buzzer to beat Ole Miss. The Crusaders are a 13 seed again and this time Drew is the head coach. They're looking for their first NCAA win since 1998.



SET YOUR DVR
Kansas-Wichita State. The Shockers have waited only 22 years to play KU. Think their fans will be fired up? Bill Self said Sunday getting out of Omaha would constitute a successful season. He knows how tough it'll be.
