



Jeremy Thomas: *Tinsley Pink* 2014, forged mild steel, powder coat, and nail lacquer

Jeremy Thomas creates works in forged steel. His distinctive process, which involves inflating his folded, welded sculptures with pressurized air, results in forms shaped in part by chance. *Ditching the Cardigan*, an exhibit of his pieces, opens on Friday, Aug. 1, with a 5 p.m. reception. The title references the iconic sweaters worn by Fred Rogers (1928-2003), host of the children's television program *Mister Rogers' Neighborhood*.
