The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNTI

Charge: Receiving Stolen Property

Minnesota Statute: 609.53.1, with reference to: 609.52.3(3)(a)

Maximum Sentence: Not more than 5 years, Not more than \$10,000 fine, or both

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 06/11/2014

Charge Description: On or about June 11, 2014, in Rice County, Minnesota, Taylor Collin Heckers, the defendant, did unlawfully and feloniously receive, possess, transfer, buy or conceal any stolen property or property obtained by robbery, knowing or having reason to know the property was stolen or obtained by robbery, and the value of the property stolen was more than \$ 1,000 but not more than \$ 5,000, to wit: Jewelry belonging to CK and JA in the aggregate amount of \$4,250.

TATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUS

The Complainant states that the following facts establish probable cause:

Your Complainant and/or Signing Officer designated below, being duly sworn, has reviewed police reports relating to the above-named Defendant and the allegations contained herein, and/or has spoken with peace officers having knowledge of the incident, and based upon that information, believes the following to be true and correct.

On or about June 16, 2014, the Rice County Sheriff's Office began receiving numerous burglary reports that occurred at residences located in rural Rice County, MN. It was reported that several of the burglaries also included theft of jewelry. It was reported that a possible suspect vehicle may have been a 1990's white Dodge Stealth. Someone had contacted the Northfield Police Department to report that the suspect vehicle was observed parked at the residence of TAYLOR HECKERS on numerous occasions. A Northfield Police Officer drove by TAYLOR HECKERS' Northfield residence and observed a white Dodge Stealth parked there. The vehicle is registered to a female. The female is believed to be the girlfriend of a male who is a known acquaintance of TAYLOR HECKERS. The officer noted that the male and HECKERS are known to law enforcement for past burglary and theft cases.

Inv. LaRoche conducted a check of the police databases for items, such as jewelry, that TAYLOR COLLIN HECKERS, date of birth 2/19/1990, the defendant herein, may have been pawning or selling at any local pawn stores. Inv. LaRoche located a transaction involving jewelry on June 11, 2014, for a total amount of \$500, at a pawn store in Faribault, Rice County. The description of the jewelry items matched the items that had been reported stolen from the burglaries in Rice County. On June 19, 2014, Inv. LaRoche retrieved the jewelry items from the pawn store. The pawn store provided Inv. LaRoche with the video surveillance of the transaction. The pawn store also provided a copy of the seller's bill of sale. The bill of sale had TAYLOR HECKERS' signature. Inv. LaRoche later reviewed the video surveillance and observed TAYLOR HECKERS conducting the transaction at the pawn store.

On July 23, 2014, TAYLOR HECKERS were arrested by a Northfield Police Officer for an unrelated outstanding warrant. Inv. LaRoche told the defendant he wanted to speak to him about some thefts and burglaries. The defendant was informed of his Miranda Rights. The defendant indicated that he didn't really know what was going on and wanted to consult an attorney. An interview was not conducted.

Inv. Hanson contacted several of the burglary victims and asked them to review and identify the jewelry items.

On July 23, 2014, CK identified her jewelry items as the items that had been pawned by TAYLOR HECKERS at a pawn store in Faribault.

On July 25, 2014, JA identified her jewelry items as the items that had been pawned by TAYLOR HECKERS at a pawn store in Faribault.

On August 19, 2014, Inv. Hanson and Inv. LaRoche brought the recovered jewelry to a local jewelry store in Faribault. The investigators asked the jeweler to provide an estimate for the value of the jewelry pieces. The jeweler estimated that the stolen jewelry items from CK and JA were valued at an aggregate amount of \$4,250.

CK's jewelry items and values:

- 1. 14k gold anniversary band, valued at \$1185.
- 2. Marquise anniversary band (stones removed), valued at \$250.
- 3. Marquise value w/some stones intact, valued at \$250.

Estimated aggregate value of CK's jewelry: \$1685.

JA's jewelry items and values:

- 1. 14k gold snake chain, valued at \$300.
- 2. 14k gold Herringbone chain, valued at \$65.
- 3. 14k gold replacement chain, valued at \$50.
- 4. 14k gold band, valued at \$500.
- 5. 14k gold pear ring, valued at \$220.
- 6. 14k gold mother child pendant, valued at \$210.
- 7. 14k gold heard pendant, valued at \$250.
- 8. 14k gold band, valued at \$500.
- 9. 14k gold diamond pendant, valued at \$200.
- 10. 10k gold cross, valued at \$50.
- 11. 10k gold heart pendant, valued at \$25.
- 12. 10k gold ring, valued at \$195.

Estimated aggregate value of JA's jewelry: \$2565.

On August 28, 2014, Inv. Hanson and Inv. La Roche interviewed the male who is a known acquaintance of TAYLOR HECKERS. The male provided the following information: He has purchased jewelry from Heckers. He denied knowing that the jewelry items were stolen. He denied being involved in the theft of the jewelry or any burglaries with Heckers. Heckers never told him that the jewelry was stolen.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE: Pursuant to Minn. Stat. 609.49., intentional failure to appear for duly scheduled court appearances may result in additional criminal charges, and in addition to any arrest warrant that may otherwise be issued by the Court.
