While on routine uniformed patrol with P.O. Brian Bianchi I SiN 8071 in the Walnut Park eighborhood, on December 2(th, 2011, at about 1200hrs we were driving westbound on Thekla pproaching Riverview. As we approached Riverview, we passed a Charch's Chicken restaurant on the ortheast corner. I observed what I believed to be a hand to hand drug transaction between two black tales standing in front of the entrance of the Church's Chicken and no tified P.O. Bianchi. In order to urther investigate the possible crime, P.O. Bianchi, who was driving, pr lled onto the Church's Chicken it facing east, parallel to Thekla. It was our intention to conduct a collectrian check. P.O. Bianchi topped the marked police vehicle blocking those parked vehicles facing furthbound.

As we attempted to exit our vehicle, one male entered the buildin and the other entered a parked Iver Buick. As P.O. Bianchi opened the driver's side door, the male subject in the silver Buick drove is vehicle in reverse striking the police vehicle with force. The su pact pulled forward and again wersed his vehicle striking the police vehicle a second time. P.O. Bian hi exited the police vehicle and oproached the driver side window of the silver Buick, announcing "Police!" and instructed the subject stop his vehicle. The subject continued to attempt to exit his parkin; apot. F.O. Bianchi struck the over side window breaking the glass. At that time he noticed the m. le subject reaching for a silver eapon, believed to be a handgun, located on the passenger seat. As I xited the passenger side of the plice vehicle, P.O. Bianchi alerted me that there appeared to be a weapen. As I exited the vehicle I had my possession a personal wear on, an AK-47 pistol. I went around the front of the police vehicle, and : I did so, the male subject was able to exit the parking spot by pulling forward and striking me on the ght side of my body knocking rae sideways. Before striking me I theerved, in plain view in the ibject's hand while resting on the passenger seat, a silver handgun. The handgun was pointing up and wards me.

After striking me, the subject pulled forward in an effort to exit the lot and enter Thekla isthound. In order to do so the subject drove over the curb. Because of the presence of a weapon and scause I felt that my personal safety was in jeopardy, as was the safety if P.O. B. anchi, and bystanders, fired several shots at the subject. The subject was approximately a circlength away from me when I ted my weapon. While there were bystanders on the lot, they were behind me. At the time I discharged y department issued weapon, I was aiming at the suspect in a slightly downward direction. I am unsure iw many times I discharged my weapon. There were no civilians or b standers in my line of sight or

fire. In discharging my department issued weapon I did not put anyons but the subject driving the silver Buick in jeopardy. I struck the vehicle several times, but the subject or arinued castbound on Thokla. It should be noted that I did not discharge my personal weapon.

I entered the passenger side of the police vehicle and we gave pursuit to the silver Buick. P.O. Bianchi initiated the police vehicle's emergency lights and sirens. I im padiately got on the police radio and advised the dispatcher that shots have been fired and we were in a usuit of a silver car. Initially, I mistakenly advised the dispatcher I was travelling on Oriole, but the correct street was Thekla. As we approached the intersection of Thekla and Emerson, the subject made a left turn heading north on Emerson towards West Florissant. As the police vehicle entered the intersection, the vehicle slid and struck a fixed object on the northeast corner of the intersection. It should be noted that during this entire neident it was raining and the streets were wet.

We proceeded on Emerson to the intersection of Emerson and West Florissant where the subject turned left heading west count on West Florissant. We continued to give pursuit, advising the hispatcher of our current locations as the pursuit continued. It should be noted that traffic flow was very ight on the streets in which the pursuit occurred. We were able to keep the subject's vehicle in our sight luring the entire pursuit.

As we approached the intersection of West Florissant and Acm:, the subject lost control of his rehicle. The subject's vehicle spun in a complete circle and entert! the eastbound lanes of West Florissant, and came to a rest against the curb facing north just before it: intersection of West Florissant and Acme. As we followed the vehicle, a red truck travelling eastbour, I on West Florissant swerved to word the subject's vehicle and entered into our path. P.O. Bianchi, in: 1 attempt to avoid the red truck, werved and struck the subject's silver Buick. It should be noted that or rairbags did not deploy. It also hould be noted that there was no contact between the police vehicle and the red truck. The driver of the ed truck left the scene and is unidentified.

I exited the police vehicle on the passenger side, and approach d the Buick on the driver side. 'O. Bianchi also exited the vehicle and approached the driver side of the subject's vehicle. The airbags f the Buick had deployed blocking our view of the subject. Because we knew that the subject was rmed, and because of his assaultive behavior, I approached the sub act's vehicle with my weapon rawn. As I got to the driver sice window, I lifted the airbags so that I could see the subject clearly. I rade eye contact with the subject who, throughout the remainder of ite incident, stared at me while zying nothing. Both Bianchi and I instructed the subject to show his hands and stop moving. It should e noted that the subject's right pand was reaching between the passer per seal and the center console. is I observed this, I again and continuously ordered the subject to step moving and to show me his ands. The subject continued to reach between the passenger seat and t e center console. I believed he as reaching for the handgun which I observed earlier at the Church's Chicken parking lot. As the ibject continued reaching deeper into the area between the passenger se it and center console, it was my slief because of the way he moved, that he had gained control of the bindgen. Again I instructed him show me his hands but he refused. In fear for my safety and that f my partner, I discharged my apartment issued firearm at the subject striking him in the chest. I belie e I discharged my weapon four mes. I immediately holstered ray weapon. Prior to discharge, the w apon was fully loaded. I was proximately three feet away from the subject when I discharged my fire irm.

The subject then brought both of his hands to his lap and ceased existing or moving. I attempted a render first aid to the subject by going to my police vehicle and extricting my personally owned Quick Clot." Upon returning to the vehicle, it was apparent that the "luck Clot." was a futile effort to ave the subject's life. It should be noted that Sergeant Colin Rumps: IDSN 5250, had arrived on the center to supervise. I immediately entered the vehicle to locate the vehicle appoint and render it safe. The randgum was recovered in the area where the subject was reaching, be ween the center console and the assenger seat. I unloaded the silver handgum for safety reasons. I has placed the handgum on the assenger seat. I relinquished the scene to my supervisor and took no fullier action.

I was working the day suift from 0710hrs until 1500hrs. At r) time was I injured during the ucidents.
