Motion by Coffel, seconded by McGowan to approve the warrant listing dated January 3, 2011 as presented. Motion carried.

Water Superintendent Schemel provided a report of current water operations. In his report it was discussed that pumpage for the year was down 8% while revenues were projected to be down 5%. Snow cover has been cleared off of hydrants.

Utilities Manager Crooks provided an update on the Valleyfair WCC issue. The Commission agreed with staff that quarterly derivations of water connection charges will be used for historical calculations and also for calculations going forward. Discussion also took place about the possibility of the Met Council changing to a monthly derivation from the present quarterly method. Further discussion will take place with Valleyfair regarding this issue. The Commission would like to parallel the Met Council if a change would be considered by the Council.

Item 8c: 13 Month Nitrate Report (Advisory) was received under Consent Business.

Line Superintendent Athmann reported that no outages had occurred in the past 2 weeks. There have been some issues with neighborhood transformers and plying of cul de sacs. The Pike Lake Substation transformer is scheduled for delivery on January 11.

A smart grid pilot project update was presented by Mr. Crooks. Staff will be meeting with OPOWER on January 12 to discuss the customer involvement portion of the project. The costs of this portion of the project can be used as SCIP dollars since it involves direct measurement of energy savings with residential customers. Staff will also meet with West Monroe Partners on January 18 to begin discussion on the development of a business model for the project, technological advantages for SPUC operations and a further refining of the project as it moves forward. An update will be provided to the Commission in February.

Mr. Athmann provided an overview of the overhead line conflict with Northern States Power (NSP) on Adams Street and 11th Avenue. The SPUC electric lines have been undergrounded and the

cost to do so has been split 50-50 between SPUC and NSP. The Commission thanked staff for their work on resolving this issue in a timely and cost efficient manner.

Mr. Crooks discussed the status of the employee handbook/personnel policies. It was stated the document is in final draft form and is being updated to include Department Head comments. The Commission would like a 2 week review period for their comments and questions. The Commission would like to have legal review of the policies, and when all review and commenting is complete, adopt the policies by resolution.

The Marketing/Customer Service Position was discussed by Mr. Crooks. The posting was completed by January 3. Applications will be accepted through January 31, with interviewing taking place in February and March.

Item 10c: November Financials was received under Consent Business.

The tentative commission meeting dates of January 18 (Tuesday) and February 7 were noted.

Motion by Helkamp, seconded by Engler to adjourn to the January 18, 2011 meeting. Motion carried.
