Southwest LRT receives \$2 million grant

The Southwest Light-rail Transit project is receiving \$2 million in business development grant funding from the state.

The Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development announced last Thursday the recipients of \$47.5 million in grants that will fund nine economic development projects statewide, including the Southwest LRT.

According to a press release, the grant winners were chosen from 90 applicants with requests totaling \$288 million. The agency reviewed applications based in five criteria including project readiness, job creation, investment leverage, regional impact and public benefit. Projects were organized into three regions to achieve balance in-

cluding metro, north and south. Gov. Mark Dayton and his senior staff from the Department of Management and Budget reviewed DEED's decisions. The LRT was the only project not recommended by DEED that received funding.

"It was decided that a more accurate analysis of the project's job impact should be the total number of jobs, which would be created by the overall project, not just by this small component part," the release states.

The LRT and the St. Paul Saints Stadium, which was awarded \$25 million, were the two projects to receive funding in the metro region. The Metropolitan Council requested the funds to continue design and engineering of the light rail. The light rail is expected to serve 30,000 per day and provide improved transit ac-

cess to 60,000 additional jobs to be created in the southwest corridor by 2030, according to the release.

"The project will create 150 immediate design and engineering jobs. The construction phase will generate over 3,500 construction jobs and ultimately 175 permanent jobs to operate and maintain the LRT line. The Southwest LRT project will generate numerous private residential and commercial investments," the release states.

The LRT would run 15 miles from downtown Minneapolis to Eden Prairie, passing through the southwestern suburban cities of St. Louis Park, Hopkins and Minnetonka. The line would provide connection of two of the region's largest job centers — downtown Minneapolis and the Opus/Golden Triangle employment area.
