Fairview Clinics now open in Savage

The doctor can see you now. Fairview Clinics and the Institute for Athletic Medicine (IAM) in Savage opened Monday with a ribbon-cutting ceremony and tours of the facility.

The primary-care clinic, located on County Road 42 next to Wells Fargo bank, specializes in family medicine and offers preventive, acute and chronic care, as well as laboratory and X-ray services. Online access to health records through MyChart allows patients to make appointments, check lab results and email their care team.

"We are excited to serve the health-care needs of the Savage community," said Suzan Ford, clinic administrator for Fairview Clinics in Prior Lake, Lakeville and Savage. "The clinic offers many of the care innovations that have been developed and implemented throughout Fairview, including same-day appointments, e-visits, telephone visits and video visits. Providers and staff will provide a team-based, patient-centered care approach to meet the individual needs of each patient."

therapy services for acute (immediate) and chronic musculoskeletal conditions. The clinic also supports the athletic training services IAM provides to Prior Lake High School and other schools in the region.

Fairview has applied to the U.S. Green Building Council

for LEED certification, which recognizes projects that implement strategies for better environmental and health performance. In order to be LEED certified, the clinic must incorporate measurable green building design, construction, operations and maintenance solutions.
