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U.S. Senate Race—Boustany closing the gap

State Treasurer John Kennedy (R) continues to lead the field (17%), but Congressman Charles Boustany (R) is running an extremely close second (15%). Attorney Caroline Fayard (D) (11%) and Public Service Commissioner Foster Campbell (D) (9%) come in third and fourth respectively. Congressman John Fleming (R) rounds out the top five with 8%. Slightly more than one in four (26%) likely voters are undecided.

Over half (54%) of the voters in Boustany's Congressional district picked him as their choice for U.S. Senator. Kennedy shows strongest (32%) in Congressional district 6. Fayard holds a slight lead over Campbell among Democrats (19% to 17%) and a ten point lead among black voters (Fayard, 24%; Campbell, 14%).

U.S. Senate Race—Republican candidate favored in the runoff

When asked for whom they would vote if the runoff for U.S. Senator was between a Democrat and a Republican, 43% responded "the Republican" and 33% responded "the Democrat"; the remaining 24% were undecided. Those undecided voters could likely determine the outcome.

Republican voters are solidly behind the Republican candidate (85% with 11% undecided). Black Democrats are behind the Democratic candidate (70% with 28% undecided). Although white Democrats tend to support the Democratic candidate more than the Republican candidate (42% to 29%); 29% remain undecided. Voters who are not registered as Democrat or Republican tend to support the Republican runoff candidate (40%) over the Democratic runoff candidate (25%); 36% remain undecided.

Presidential Election—Louisiana is not a “battle ground” state

Donald Trump (R) leads Hillary Clinton (D) 49% to 33% with Gary Johnson (Libertarian) attracting 8%. Few voters (11%) remain undecided. Trump runs strongest among Republican voters (85%) while Clinton runs strongest among black voters (69%). Trump draws twice as many votes as Clinton among “other” voters—those voters who are not affiliated with either the Republican party or the Democratic party.

61% of the voters have an unfavorable impression of Clinton; 47% have an unfavorable impression of Trump. Trump’s favorable impression ratings exceed those of Clinton by 48% to 35%.

Job Performance—Governor John Bel Edwards gets high marks

Governor John Bel Edwards (D) received the highest “positive” job performance rating (63%) among the five elected officials tested in the poll with State Treasurer John Kennedy (R) coming in second at 62%. President Barack Obama (D) was the only one whose “negative” rating (56%) exceeded his “positive” rating (42%). Attorney General Jeff Landry (R) had a 53% positive rating and U.S. Senator Bill Cassidy (R) had a 49% “positive” rating.

Race Relations—Gotten worse but how much depends on who you ask

While no demographic group has a majority who would characterize race relations in the United States as having gotten better since Barack Obama became President, the proportion who say race relations have gotten worse varies considerably by race. Overall, 65% say race relations during the Obama presidency have gotten worse; that ranges from 74% among white voters to 41% among black voters. Add political affiliation to the mix and the differences are even more pronounced with 88% of Republicans saying race relations have gotten worse compared to only 38% among black Democrats.

ABOUT THE POLL

This statewide poll was developed and conducted by Southern Media & Opinion Research, Inc. The project was funded by private subscribers.

Interviews for this statewide poll were completed by telephone with 500 likely Louisiana voters from Thursday, September 15, through Saturday, September 17, 2016.

The overall margin of error for the statewide statistics obtained from the survey data is not greater than plus or minus 4.4 percentage points at the 95% level of confidence. In other words, there is a 95% certainty that the statistics presented from the results obtained on this survey of 500 likely voters statewide will not be more than 4.4 percentage points above or below the figure that would be obtained if all of the likely voters in the state would have been interviewed.

The sample error may be larger for subgroup responses based on attitudinal, demographic and geographic variables such as area, age, etc. There are other sources of potential error which cannot be calculated including question wording and order of question presentation.

Telephone numbers were selected at random from a sample frame of telephone numbers for likely Louisiana voter households. Both landline and cellular telephone numbers were included in the sample.

Respondents were assigned to one of four geographic areas based on their parish of residence. The four geographic areas along with the parishes comprising those areas are:

New Orleans metropolitan area, (includes Jefferson, Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, St. Charles, St. John the Baptist, St. Tammany and Washington parishes); **Florida-River Parishes**, (includes Ascension, Assumption, East Baton Rouge, East Feliciana, Iberville, Livingston, Pointe Coupee, St. Helena, St. James, Tangipahoa, West Baton Rouge and West Feliciana parishes); **Acadiana-southwest**, (includes Acadia, Allen, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Calcasieu, Cameron, Evangeline, Iberia, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, Lafourche, St. Landry, St. Martin, St. Mary, Terrebonne and Vermilion parishes); **North Louisiana**, (includes Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Caldwell, Catahoula, Claiborne, Concordia, DeSoto, East Carroll, Franklin, Grant, Jackson, LaSalle, Lincoln, Madison, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Rapides, Red River, Richland, Sabine, Tensas, Union, Vernon, Webster, West Carroll and Winn parishes).

A statistical weighting procedure was employed to normalize the sample to the likely voter population based on voter race, age category and political party affiliation.

The percentages shown in the tables are weighted. Counts within tables are unweighted counts. The count of cases used in computation of subset statistics (using the format $n=xxx$) presented under the relevant crosstabulation tables are unweighted counts of cases used to generate the statistics in those tables.
