## U.S. Senate Race—Kennedy maintains lead

State Treasurer John Kennedy (R) continues to lead the field (22%) followed by Public Service Commissioner Foster Campbell (D) (16%) and Congressman Charles Boustany (R) (14%). Attorney Caroline Fayard (D) (12%) and Congressman John Fleming (R) (9%) round out the top five. Undecided among likely voters is down to 15% (12% among white voters and 22% among black voters).

Kennedy is the choice of 31% of Republicans followed by Boustany (26%) and Fleming (15%).

Campbell leads Fayard among Democrats (27% to 18%) and holds a fourteen point lead over her among black Democrats (Campbell, 38%; Fayard, 24%). Interestingly, John Kennedy (R) garners 24% of the vote among white and "other" race Democrats compared to 15% for Campbell, 14% for Boustany and 11% for Fayard.

Of those voters who are not registered as either Democrat or Republican, 30% chose Kennedy as their first choice followed by Fayard (13%) and Campbell (11%).

# U.S. Senate Race—Republican candidate favored in the runoff

Regardless of who is elected President, right at half (50% if Hillary Clinton was elected and 48% if Trump was elected) of Louisiana likely voters say they will vote for the Republican candidate if the runoff for U.S. Senator was between a Democrat and a Republican. A little over one third (36% if Hillary Clinton was elected and 37% if Trump was elected) say they will vote for the Democrat.

# Presidential Election—Trump maintains a substantial lead

Donald Trump (R) leads Hillary Clinton (D) 50% to 35% with Gary Johnson (Libertarian) attracting 5%. Extremely few voters (8%) remain undecided. Trump dominates among Republican voters (92%) while Clinton runs strongest among black Democrats (77%). Trump draws over twice as many votes as Clinton among "other" voters—those voters who are not affiliated with either the Republican party or the Democratic party (52% for Trump and 23% for Clinton).

60% of the voters have an unfavorable impression of Clinton; 53% have an unfavorable impression of Trump. Trump's favorable impression ratings exceed those of Clinton by 45% to 38%.

# Job Performance—State Treasurer John Kennedy ranks highest

State Treasurer John Kennedy (R) received the highest "positive" job performance rating (65%) among the five elected officials tested in the poll with Governor John Bel Edwards (D) coming in second at 60%. Attorney General Jeff Landry (R) had a 50% positive rating and U.S. Senator Bill Cassidy (R) had a 45% "positive" rating. President Barack Obama (D) was the only one whose "negative" rating (57%) exceeded his "positive" rating (43%).

# **SMOR LOUISIANA POLL, OCTOBER 2016**

## ABOUT THE POLL

This statewide poll was developed and conducted by Southern Media & Opinion Research, Inc. The project was funded by private subscribers.

Interviews for this statewide poll were completed by telephone with 500 likely Louisiana voters from Wednesday, October 19, through Friday, October 21, 2016.

The overall margin of error for the statewide statistics obtained from the survey data is not greater than plus or minus 4.4 percentage points at the 95% level of confidence. In other words, there is a 95% certainty that the statistics presented from the results obtained on this survey of 500 likely voters statewide will not be more than 4.4 percentage points above or below the figure that would be obtained if all of the likely voters in the state would have been interviewed.

The sample error may be larger for subgroup responses based on attitudinal, demographic and geographic variables such as area, age, etc. There are other sources of potential error which cannot be calculated including question wording and order of question presentation.

Telephone numbers were selected at random from a sample frame of telephone numbers for likely Louisiana voter households. Both landline and cellular telephone numbers were included in the sample.

Respondents were assigned to one of four geographic areas based on their parish of residence. The four geographic areas along with the parishes comprising those areas are:

New Orleans metropolitan area, (includes Jefferson, Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, St. Charles, St. John the Baptist, St. Tammany and Washington parishes); Florida-River Parishes, (includes Ascension, Assumption, East Baton Rouge, East Feliciana, Iberville, Livingston, Pointe Coupee, St. Helena, St. James, Tangipahoa, West Baton Rouge and West Feliciana parishes); Acadiana-southwest, (includes Acadia, Allen, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Calcasieu, Cameron, Evangeline, Iberia, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, Lafourche, St. Landry, St. Martin, St. Mary, Terrebonne and Vermilion parishes); North Louisiana, (includes Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Caldwell, Catahoula, Claiborne, Concordia, DeSoto, East Carroll, Franklin, Grant, Jackson, LaSalle, Lincoln, Madison, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Rapides, Red River, Richland, Sabine, Tensas, Union, Vernon, Webster, West Carroll and Winn parishes).

A statistical weighting procedure was employed to normalize the sample to the likely voter population based on voter race, age category and political party affiliation.

The percentages shown in the tables are weighted. Counts within tables are unweighted counts. The count of cases used in computation of subset statistics (using the format n=xxx) presented under the relevant crosstabulation tables are unweighted counts of cases used to generate the statistics in those tables.
