THREE THINGS WE LEARNED

1. Four laps

The Cup Series race at Richmond was scheduled for 400 laps over the .75-mile oval. Erik Jones ran four of those laps after an early tangle with Kasey Kahne. "Just got ran into the fence right on Lap 1," Jones said. "That's unfortunate. It's frustrating."

2. Cone head

Most Cup tracks have a "commitment cone" at the pit road entrance. Hit the cone and get penalized. Since Richmond is short, there's a "commitment box" painted on the asphalt. Kyle Busch, who had a chance to win, ran over the box and got penalized. "Balls and strikes," he said.

3. The win-in guys

For those not paying attention to the "win and you're in" drivers, the ranks swelled to seven with Joey Logano taking the checkered flag Sunday. A win almost guarantees a driver will make NASCAR's 10-race, 16-driver playoff. "To break through with a win, that's nice," Logano said.

1. Where is Gibbs?

At this point of the 2016 season, Joe Gibbs Racing had won five of the first nine Cup Series races. The four-car Toyota team has yet to produce a victory for "Coach." Denny Hamlin was best in class, finishing third.

2. Earnhardt Nation


