Mr. LeDoux,

This complaint may seem over the top with details, backup documentation and suggestions, but I have found in the past that some agencies have a tendency to overlook the obvious or go out of their way to not find what is staring them in the face. This may seem offensive but since every one of my dealings with your office has been met with skepticism, resistance and non-action, I thought it was better, for all involved, to not only file a complaint (as you state is required) but to make sure the burden of proof was met using the documentation provided by the offenders.

As evidence that these types of charges are not unprecedented, I have enclosed a copy of an article where the Weld County District Attorney's office charged a board member of the Hudson Fire District with the same charges for the same crime (attachment 1).

All documents are legal documents from the Secretary of State website or official documents from the Hartsel Fire Protection District. All documents have been legally obtained through public access websites or open records requests.

I am requesting that your office file charges against the two individuals of the Hartsel Fire Protection District who failed to disclose a conflict of interest as required by the Secretary of State and file charges for each time they voted to pay themselves which clearly violates state statute and is considered first degree official misconduct.

I realize that misdemeanors have an 18 month statute of limitations and the expiration for the first of these counts are due to expires July 12, 2013. This gives two months for filing of these charges. I believe that given the documentation provided to you in this packet, you should have no trouble filing these charges prior to the deadline.

If you require more from me, if I need to submit this to another agency or you would like the signatures of members of the district who would like to see these charges filed, please provide me with a list of your requirements as soon as possible. If I do not hear from you, I will assume you are proceeding with filing of charges.

18-8-308. Failing to disclose a conflict of interest.

- (1) A public servant commits failing to disclose a conflict of interest if he exercises any substantial discretionary function in connection with a government contract, purchase, payment, or other pecuniary transaction without having given seventy-two hours' actual advance written notice to the secretary of state and to the governing body of the government which employs the public servant of the existence of a known potential conflicting interest of the public servant in the transaction with reference to which he is about to act in his official capacity.
- (2) A "potential conflicting interest" exists when the public servant is a director, president, general manager, or similar executive officer or owns or controls directly or indirectly a substantial interest in any nongovernmental entity participating in the transaction.
 - (3) Failing to disclose a conflict of interest is a class 2 misdemeanor.

William Schwartzkopf, is a member of the Board of Directors for Hartsel Fire Protection District and a Master Plumber, licensed in the State of Colorado (attachment 2), entered into an agreement for payment from the Hartsel Fire Protection District for work performed on Station #5 of the Hartsel Fire Protection District. Mr. Schwartzkopf was paid by Hartsel Fire Protection District on February 29, 2012 (attachment 3) and April 10, 2012 (attachment 4). At no time did Mr. Schwartzkopf file a conflict of interest with the Secretary of State (attachment 5) or governing body of the government which employs him as evidenced in the March 8, 2012 official minutes of the Hartsel Fire Protection Board Meeting (attachment 6). Therefore:

On or about March 5, 2012, in the County of Park, State of Colorado, William Schwartzkopf, a Board of Directors for the Hartsel Fire Protection District, exercised substantial discretionary function in connection with receipt of a payment from the Hartsel Fire Protection District, without having given seventy—two hours' actual advance written notice to the secretary of state and to the governing body of the government which employs the public servant of the existence of a known potential conflicting interest of the public servant in the transaction with reference to which he is about to act in his official capacity a violation of C.R.S. 18-8-308(1)(2). Failing to disclose a conflict of interest; a class 2 misdemeanor.

Since the first bill from Mr. Schwartzkopf was presented to the Board on 03/07/13, a disclosure should have been presented at the March 8, 2012 board meeting and should have been reflected in the March 8, 2012 official minutes. (recording of meeting available for review) Additionally, a disclosure to the Secretary of state should have been presented 72 hours prior to this meeting.

IN ADDITION:

CRS 32-1-902(3)(II)(b)

"No director shall receive compensation as an employee of the special district...." (attachment 13)

Mr. Winter received paychecks from the District in December 2011, January 2012, February 2012, March 2012 and April 2012. Therefore, because Mr. Winter voted to pay himself in January 2012, February 2012 and April 2012:

On or about January 12, 2012, in the County of Park, State of Colorado, Jeffery O Winter, a public servant, with intent to obtain a benefit, knowingly violated C.R.S. 24-18-109, lawfully adopted rules of conduct relating to his office, a violation of C.R.S 18-8-404(1)(c), a class 2 misdemeanor. (attachment 14)

On or about February 9, 2012, in the County of Park, State of Colorado, Jeffery O Winter, a public servant, with intent to obtain a benefit, knowingly violated C.R.S. 24-18-109, lawfully adopted rules of conduct relating to his office, a violation of C.R.S 18-8-404(1)(c), a class 2 misdemeanor. (attachment 15)

On or about April 12, 2012, in the County of Park, State of Colorado, Jeffery O Winter, a public servant, with intent to obtain a benefit, knowingly violated C.R.S. 24-18-109, lawfully adopted rules of conduct relating to his office, a violation of C.R.S 18-8-404(1)(c), a class 2 misdemeanor. (attachment 16)

IN ADDITION:

24-18-109(3)(a) A member of the governing body of a local government who has a personal or private interest in any matter proposed or pending before the governing body shall disclose such interest to the governing body and shall not vote thereon and shall refrain from attempting to influence the decisions of the other members of the governing body in voting on the matter.

(b) A member of the governing body of a local government may vote notwithstanding paragraph(a) of this subsection(3) if his participation is necessary to obtain a quorum or otherwise enable the body to act **and** if he complies with the voluntary disclosure procedures under section 24-18-110

§ 18-8-404. First degree official misconduct

- (1) A public servant commits first degree official misconduct if, with intent to obtain a benefit for the public servant or another or maliciously to cause harm to another, he or she knowingly:
- (a) Commits an act relating to his office but constituting an unauthorized exercise of his official function; or
- (b) Refrains from performing a duty imposed upon him by law; or
- (c) Violates any statute or lawfully adopted rule or regulation relating to his office.
- (2) First degree official misconduct is a class 2 misdemeanor.

Therefore: as evidence, the official minutes (attachment 6 and 7) of the Hartsel Fire Protection District show that Mr. Schwartzkopf voted, on each of the below dates, to pay the bills as presented knowing that he was voting to receive a payment (obtain a benefit) with that vote.

On or about March 8, 2012, in the County of Park, State of Colorado, William Schwartzkopf, a public servant, with intent to obtain a benefit, knowingly violated C.R.S. 24-18-109, lawfully adopted rules of conduct relating to his office, a violation of C.R.S 18-8-404(1)(c), a class 2 misdemeanor.

On or about May 10, 2012, in the County of Park, State of Colorado, William Schwartzkopf, a public servant, with intent to obtain a benefit, knowingly violated C.R.S. 24-18-109, lawfully adopted rules of conduct relating to his office, a violation of C.R.S 18-8-404(1)(c), a class 2 misdemeanor.

18-8-308. Failing to disclose a conflict of interest.

- (1) A public servant commits failing to disclose a conflict of interest if he exercises any substantial discretionary function in connection with a government contract, purchase, payment, or other pecuniary transaction without having given seventy-two hours' actual advance written notice to the secretary of state and to the governing body of the government which employs the public servant of the existence of a known potential conflicting interest of the public servant in the transaction with reference to which he is about to act in his official capacity.
- (2) A "potential conflicting interest" exists when the public servant is a director, president, general manager, or similar executive officer or owns or controls directly or indirectly a substantial interest in any nongovernmental entity participating in the transaction.
 - (3) Failing to disclose a conflict of interest is a class 2 misdemeanor.

Jeffery O. Winter, is a member of the Board of Directors for Hartsel Fire Protection District and a Member of Premier Pump Service, a Colorado Limited Liability Company, entered into an agreement for payment from the Hartsel Fire Protection District (attachment 8) for work done on Station #1 of the Hartsel Fire Protection District on March 21, 2012.

Although Mr. Winter did file a conflict of interest previously (09/14/2011) with the Secretary of State, (attachment 9 and 10) it was for a different contract at a different location. Mr. Winter prior filing shows that he and the Board (attachment 11) had full knowledge of the requirements of CRS 24-18-109 and failed to file a conflict of interest with the Secretary of State or governing body of the government which employs him. Therefore:

On or about April 9, 2012, in the County of Park, State of Colorado, Jeffrey O Winter, a Board of Directors for the Hartsel Fire Protection District, exercised substantial discretionary function in connection with receipt of a payment from the Hartsel Fire Protection District, without having given seventy—two hours' actual advance written notice to the secretary of state and to the governing body of the government which employs the public servant of the existence of a known potential conflicting interest of the public servant in the transaction with reference to which he is about to act in his official capacity a violation of C.R.S. 18-8-308(1)(2). Failing to disclose a conflict of interest; a class 2 misdemeanor. (attachment 12)

AND

On or about April 9, 2012, in the County of Park, State of Colorado, Jeffery O Winter, a public servant, with intent to obtain a benefit, knowingly violated C.R.S. 24-18-109, lawfully adopted rules of conduct relating to his office, a violation of C.R.S 18-8-404(1)(c), a class 2 misdemeanor. Former member of Hudson fire board pleads guilty to conflict of interest

STAFF REPORTS

A debate that led to the resignation of the fire chief in Hudson earlier this year has surfaced again, this time with a former member of the fire board being convicted of failure to disclose a conflict of interest in his business.

Elmer Johann, who was a member of the Hudson fire board until his resignation early this year, obtained a plumbing contract on the department's new building last year, despite being a member of the board of directors, and his wife is secretary of the fire department.

Johann was issued a summons by the Weid District Attorney's Office in July, charging him with official misconduct and failing to disclose a conflict of interest. This week, he pleaded guitty to the second charge and the official misconduct charge was dismissed. He was ordered to pay \$198 in court costs, serve 18 hours of community service and received a deferred sentence of 12 months.

According to records, the bid for the new fire department was awarded to a general contractor, and Johann was a subcontractor for the plumbing work.

A phone call to Johann on Wednesday was not returned, and his wife, Vicky Johann, secretary at the fire department, said they did not want to comment on the case.

Johnny Blackston was the fire chief at Hudson until the board suspended him earlier this year. The board never disclosed a reason for the suspension, and members said they were prepared to reinstate Blackston as chief when he resigned in March.

At the time, Blackston said: "I don't know the reason't was suspended. There was no verbal or written warming, i should have at least been brought in before the board to discuss it."

Blackston is now a heavy equipment operator for a private company.

The fire board has advertised for a new chief, but no one has been hired. An interim chief, Leonard Dye, has been filling in.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 6:04 PM when all present stood for the Pledge of Allegiance. Those present were: Bill Schwartzkopf, Linda Bjorklund, Susan Jones, Chief Jay Hutcheson, Administrative Assistant Cleta Grey, Attorney Sean Paris (via Skype) and numerous guests. A motion was made by Linda and seconded by Susan to excuse the absences of Herb and Jeff. There was no opposition, the motion carried.

<u>APPROVAL OF AGENDA:</u> A motion was made by Susan and seconded by Linda to approve the agenda as presented. There was no opposition, the motion carried.



BOARD ELECTION RESULTS - ELECTION OF BOARD OFFICERS

- a. Election results: Linda Bjorklund, Bill Schwartzkopf, Jim Eldridge were elected to the Hartsel Fire Board in the 2012 election.
- b. Election of Officers: A motion was made by Bill and seconded by Linda to elect Jeff as president of the board, Susan as Secretary of the board, Linda as Treasurer of the board. Vote: Jeff/yes, Bill/yes, Linda/yes, Susan/yes and Jim/yes. There was no opposition, the motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Jeff and seconded by Linda to elect Bill as Vice President of the board. Vote: Jeff/yes, Bill/yes, Linda/yes, Susan/yes and Jim/yes. There was no opposition, the motion carried unanimously.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm when all present stood for the Pledge of Allegiance. <u>CITIZENS' COMMENTS:</u> Marie Chisholm commented that board members cannot make money from the fire department. (ie cannot charge fire department more in reimbursements than what the items cost.) There was a letter published that contained only half truths. She voiced her appreciation to the board for their service. Ramon Castro asked the board if they were considering or discussing any mill levy increases. He was assured by Jay and Linda that no mill levy increases have been considered, and that a mill levy increase required a public election. Susan Jones thanked all the voters. - b. Approval of Bills: A motion was made by Bill and seconded by Susan to approve the bills as presented. Vote: Jeff/yes, Bill/yes, Susan/yes, Linda/yes and Jim/yes. There was no opposition, the motion carried unanimously.
- c. Approval of Transfer: A motion was made by Bill and seconded by Susan to approve the transfer of \$72,500 from the Money Market account to the General Fund account (petty cash \$1,000 Debit Card \$2,000 and General Fund to pay bills \$69,500 for a total of \$72,500.) Vote: Jeff/yes, Bill/yes, Susan/yes, Linda/yes and Jim /yes. There was no opposition, the motion carried unanimously.

d. Bank: Bank records need to be updated and changed to reflect the election of Jim to the board and the retirement of Herb from the board. A motion was made by Susan and seconded by Bill to appoint Linda as the Treasured to update the bank records. Vote: Jeff/yes, Bill/yes, Susan/yes, Linda/yes and Jim/yes. There was no opposition, the motion carried unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS:

- a. Command 7/2 has been stripped down and is ready to be sold in Colorado Springs at the dealer' auction. A motion was made by Linda and seconded by Bill to dispose of command 7/2 at the auction. There was no opposition, the motion carried.
- b. Old Dive Van could be sold at the Downare Auction. A motion was made by Bill and seconded by Linda to sell the van at auction. There was no opposition, the motion carried.
- c. Firefighter Maintenance position: Bill and Linda will work with the chief as to a job description for this position. A motion was made by Linda and seconded by Bill to create a job description for a maintenance position. Vote: Jeff/yes, Bill/yes, Susan/yes, Linda/yes and Jim/yes. There was no opposition, the motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Linda and seconded by Bill to retain Chris Tingle as an hourly employee for this position working 40 hours a week. Vote: Jeff/yes, Bill/yes, Susan/yes, Linda/yes and Jim/yes. There was no opposition, the motion carried unanimously. The job description is to be completed and presented at the June board meeting.
- d. Station 7. Station 7 is on hold for now. Sher will be retained as general contractor if necessary. A concrete sidewalk is to be built around the building with a French drain to help with run-off and ice buildup. The board agreed that this was necessary.
- e. Election Judges Compensation. The two election judges were paid \$200 each. But due to the extra long hours it is recommended by Cleta that they get paid an extra \$100 each. Narrow banding for the repeaters to be done in August 2012, Suggestion, replace motorolas and keep but convert to narrow band.

CLARIFICATIONS: Susan: How many radios are we considering purchasing? Possibly 20.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made by Linda and seconded by Bill to adjourn the meeting. There was no opposition, the motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:24 pm.

Part 9. DIRECTORS - ORGANIZATION OF BOARD

Current through 2011 Legislative Session

§ 32-1-902. Organization of board - compensation - disclosure

- (1) After taking oath and filing bonds, the board shall elect one of its members as chairman of the board and president of the special district, one of its members as a treasurer of the board and special district, and a secretary who may be a member of the board. The secretary and the treasurer may be one person, but, if such is the case, he or she shall be a member of the board. The board shall adopt a seal, and the secretary shall keep in a visual text format that may be transmitted electronically a record of all its proceedings, minutes of all meetings, certificates, contracts, bonds given by employees, and all corporate acts, which shall be open to inspection of all electors, as well as to all other interested parties.
- (2) The treasurer shall keep strict and accurate accounts of all money received by and disbursed for and on behalf of the special district in permanent records. He shall file with the clerk of the court, at the expense of the special district, a corporate fidelity bond in an amount determined by the board of not less than five thousand dollars, conditioned on the faithful performance of the duties of his office.
- (3) For directors serving a term of office commencing prior to July 1, 2005, each director may
- (a) receive as compensation for the director's service a sum not in excess of one thousand two
- (I) hundred dollars per annum, payable not to exceed seventy-five dollars per meeting attended.
- (II) For directors serving a term of office commencing on or after July 1, 2005, each director may receive as compensation for the director's service a sum not in excess of one thousand six hundred dollars per annum, payable not to exceed one hundred dollars per meeting attended.
- (b) No director shall receive compensation as an employee of the special district, other than that provided in this section, and any director shall disqualify himself or herself from voting on any issue in which the director has a conflict of interest unless the director has disclosed such conflict of interest in compliance with section 18.8-308, C.R.S. Reimbursement of actual expenses for directors shall not be considered compensation. No director receiving workers' compensation benefits awarded in the line of duty as a volunteer firefighter or pension payments to retired firefighters shall be allowed to vote on issues involving the director's disability or pension payments.
- (4) If a director of any special district owns undeveloped land which constitutes at least twenty percent of the territory included in the special district, such director shall disclose such fact in

Controversy continues at Hartsel Fire

Despite the seating of a new board at Hartsel Fire Protection District on May 10, the board and district continue to be plagued by controversy.

In the chief's report at the meeting on May 10, Hartsel Fire Chief Jay Hutcheson responded to a letter to the editor in the May 4 Flume by Monica Jones, who was one of three reform candidates who were not elected in the May 8 election. Two incumbents, Linda Bjorklund and Bill Schwartzkopf, and a former firefighter who was supported by their supporters, Jim Eldridge, were elected.

In the chief's report, Hutcheson said that a check written to board member Jeff Winter was for valves that Winter had gotten at a good price from his supplier. The letter from Monica Jones (see it at theflume.com) stated that a check for \$1,711.68 was paid to Premier Pump, which is owned by Winter.

Hutcheson said at the May 10 meeting: "When Jeff Winter gives me a bill, that was for valves that he can buy cheaper than I can, because his supplier gives him a better discount to start with, and I've saved like \$130 a valve and he just turned that savings right back to us. And for him to get nailed in the paper because he received money for it is wrong, without an explanation of what it was. Same goes for Bill (Schwartzkopf). Same went for everybody else. If you're going to put something in the paper, put the complete thing in the paper on what it was for." (Hear the recording at theflume.com, this part at 1:13:00 - 1:17:00)

Asked about Hutcheson's comments, Monica Jones said in a May 14 email: "I don't have a copy of the checks or what they were for and I didn't attend the May 10 board meeting, but as usual the Chief or Board always comes up with reasons or excuses for their expenditures or actions after they are questioned. The Board voted to pay bills without indicating that some of the bills that were being paid were to board members. Not one board member that received funds recused themselves from a vote or indicated that payments were being made to themselves individually or as a business."

Marie Chisholm, who does not reside within the district but often comments at meetings, said early in the meeting regarding the letter to the editor from Monica Jones: "I knew for a fact that whoever got money - that's reported in the paper, got supplies for this district. And it was wholesale price. They never made a dime. If they made a dime, that's against the law." (12:00-15:00)

Emails were sent from The Flume to all the board members, to the board's attorney, Sean Paris, and to Hutcheson to provide an opportunity to provide a "complete" explanation of each payment, which Hutcheson had indicated that he wanted in the newspaper.

The emails also asked for clarification as to whether any board member – including Jeff Winter through Premier Pump – had ever made a profit off of work done for Hartsel Fire and whether such a profit would be deemed illegal under Colorado law.

No response was made by Hutcheson, Paris or the board members, including new board member Jim Eldridge. [Note: After the print edition came out, Eldridge told The Flume he had not seen the email prior to the print edition deadline.]

In a May 15 email, Monica Jones stated: "The information obtained through an open records request shows that William Schwartzkopf received checks with nothing written in the memo portion of the checks and that Jeff Winter received paychecks as well as payments to his business. Obviously a paycheck is not a reimbursement for supplies and if nothing is listed in the memo of the check it is impossible to determine what the check was for."

Her letter to the editor shows \$376 paid to Winter directly and \$1,711.68 paid to Winter's company, Premier Pump.

Two documents, one called "general fund reconciliation" and one called "petty cash disbursements" provide details on the payments that the Monica Jones letter describes. They are on The Flume's website at theflume.com with this article.

Hartsel-area resident Connie Gray, who provided the documents to The Flume, said in a May 16 email that anything that says "paycheck" on on the left-hand side is having taxes taken from it. Jeff Winter has payments marked "paycheck," such as the Dec. 7, 2011, check number 36795 for \$143.40.

Gray told The Flume that those are financial documents she gets from the district every month, and they are produced by the district, so the wording "paycheck" is that of the district. She said it is generated for those checks that have taxes taken out and are handled though a software for payrolls.

Winter has been receiving paychecks from the district for quite some time, under what she believes to be the "weekend volunteer payroll program," said Gray. "To me, you can't be a board member and an employee at the same time. It's a conflict of interest."

That's because on the one hand, as a board member Winter is expected to oversee Hutcheson, but as an employee, Winter is expected to do Hutcheson's bidding.

The Monica Jones letter to the editor about the payments follows a considerable history of questions concerning payments made by the district, including \$4,000 paid out of a petty cash fund to Jay Hutcheson's company, Maverick Construction, without a bidding process, as noted in the Aug. 24, 2008, Flume.

Hutcheson also did not address all aspects of the Monica Jones letter, including the following charge: "Five years ago the chief used taxpayer money for his son's wedding in Las Vegas. (See the Sept. 12, 2008 Flume, at this link: http://www.theflume.com/news/article_a4a44929-a65a-5da0-a6f3-657526a317c8.html.)

The Sept. 12, 2008, Flume article cites a 2007 interview (an au dio recording is available at theflume.com) between Colorado Bureau of Investigation Agent Kevin Hyland and Susan Jones, a board member at the time and still a board member. The article states:

"Hyland also presses [Susan] Jones with respect to authorization. He asked her, if Hutcheson didn't pay back the personal expenses before the credit card was due, then would that make that use of the credit card unauthorized? She responded yes.

Then Hyland pointed to Hutcheson's admitting that he charged about \$3,000 in expenses for his son's wedding in July 2006 to the fire department's card. The interview was taking place in January 2007, and at that point Hutcheson had still not repaid.

Hyland: "How about someone using a Hartsel Fire Protection District credit card to pay for a wedding in Las Vegas last summer, and hasn't paid it back to date?"

[Susan] Jones: "That would be wrong."

Hyland: "Would you think that would fall under embezzlement?"

[Susan] Jones: "I don't know, because, like I said, I don't know what the, you know, what the terms mean, or anything like that. I would have to ask our attorney or somebody like that. ..." (See [Susan] Jones audio, part one 46:40.)

Hiring of Chris Tingle

The Monica Jones letter also refers to \$7,188.18 paid to Chris Tingle and states: "Looks like he's their new full-time employee (position never publicly authorized by board or advertised)."

At the May 10 board meeting, the board voted to keep Chris Tingle on as an hourly employee. Bjorklund noted that the paid position was separate from Tingle's volunteer firefighting duties. But Hutcheson stressed: "He works 40 hours a week." (See 42:22 - 46:03).

In a May 14 email to The Flume, Monica Jones said: "A committee was formed a couple of months ago to develop a job description for this new position. It was never indicated by the Board that a job description was completed and the position was never advertised or open to the public

for hire. The Board always does things after the fact. The determination seems to have been made to hire Mr. Tingle about two months ago and now they are just going through the motions. I don't know if there is a legal requirement to post or advertise the position, I just think it would be the right thing to do. As you well know by now, special districts have very few legal requirements and can basically do whatever they want as long as the Board approves what is done."

Gray said that it is a conflict of interest for Tingle to serve on the pension board and also serve as an employee. She also noted that Tingle's wife, Jymie Eskew-Tingle, has been receiving paychecks from the district. (See the paycheck No. 36825 for \$165.21 written on Jan. 31, 2012, to her.)

Officers elected

At the May 10 meeting, Bjorklund, Schwartzkopf and Eldridge joined board members Susan Jones and Jeff Winter, who were not up for election, to complete the five-member board.

In choosing officers, the new board kept Bjorklund as treasurer and Susan Jones as secretary, and it voted for Jeff Winter as the new chairman. Winter replaced Herb Burton as chairman. Burton did not run for reelection to the board.

Bill Schwartzkopf was voted in as vice chairman. (See 0-7:05.)

Old habits

Besides keeping two out of three of the old officers in their positions, the new board at the May 10 meeting also continued to have its board meeting largely run by Fire Chief Jay Hutcheson, who is not on the board.

And the new chairman, Winter, continued the previous practice of the former chairman of failing to repeat the motion that was to be voted on, contrary to a standard under Robert's Rules of Order. Board member Susan Jones has previously told The Flume that the board follows Robert's Rules. (See Robert's Rules of order guidelines at http://arapahoe-sertoma.org/Manuals/Robert's% 20Rules.pdf.) The rule about repeating the motion is designed to clarify exactly what motion the board is voting on. State law does not require that Robert's Rules of Order be followed. (See the June 18, 2010, Flume.)

The failure of any board member to respond to emailed questions submitted by The Flume for this story also indicates the new board will follow the old board's policies of not responding to questions from The Flume.

Reaction to election

The reaction to the election results expressed at the meeting was positive. Hutcheson used the first -person plural in talking about the victory. "We won by more than the provisional ballots," he said. (See 9:45-9:53).

Susan Jones said that she was "very pleased with the turnout we had" and that "the true will of the community has spoken."

Bjorklund said: "They know that we've been working very hard to make this fire department work." (See 17:53-20:00.)

No tax increase being considered

In answer to a question from resident Ramon Castro, Hutcheson and Bjorklund indicated there was no intent to raise the mill levy for Hartsel Fire. Hutcheson said that would take a vote, since the mill levy is locked in and does not float, as it does in some jurisdictions. "We are doing fine. We don't need to increase our mill levy," said Bjorklund. (See 17:20-17:53.)

Legal fees

Bjorklund said that the fire district spent "over \$36,000 last year for legal fees." She added: "I'd like to see this number go down." This year, the district has spent \$6,200 on legal fees so far. (See 20:57-22:36.)

Financials

The board voted to transfer \$72,500 from the district's money market account, with \$69,500 going to the operating account, \$1,000 to the petty cash account and \$2,000 to the debit account. (See 29:14 -32:23.)

The board approved the sale of command vehicle 72 at auction in Colorado Springs and the old dive van at an auction run by the Downare Brothers on June 9. (See 37:29 - 40:35).

Station 7

Hutcheson said he didn't know whether it would be necessary to keep Sher Nelson on as the general contractor on the new station 7 project in order to get a certificate of occupancy from the county. If so, he said, the district would retain her.

Election judges

The board voted to add \$100 each to the pay of two election judges. That was in addition to the \$200 each that they received. Hutcheson said that without the extra amount, he didn't think the judges made minimum wage. (See 52:00 - 55:00.) Gray said that, under the contract with designated election official Elise Bergsten, the payment to the election judges was supposed to come out of the money paid Bergsten.

Meet the candidates

Bjorklund said there will be a meet the candidates meeting on May 31 at the Hartsel Fire station and no vote was needed on the matter.

Purchases

The board approved the purchase of 20 jump suits at \$179 each and 20 helmets and goggles for \$222 each, for a total cost of \$8,020. (See 58:07-103:52.)

The board also passed the library lease. (1:03:52 - 1:04:50).

Award banquet

There will be an award banquet on June 9, with the awards ceremony starting at 2 p.m. and music and food from 4-6 p.m. The public is invited.

Radios

At the meeting, Hutcheson also talked about the need for narrow-band radios to comply with federal requirements, and he noted that he is looking into the matter. No decision was made during the meeting. (See 1:16 - 1:23.)

CORRECTED: The price of the helmets and goggles has been corrected to reflect that each set cost \$222, not \$22, as was indicated in the print edition. In addition, Hartsel Fire board member Jim Eldridge after the print edition was completed that he is a former firefighter rather than a current firefighter and the he had not seen the email with questions from The Flume until after The Flume's deadline.
