PROBABLE CAUSE AFFIDAVIT

The undersigned, of lawful age, being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and states as follows:

1. **Kyle Bruce** is a CLEET certified Police Officer employed by the Stillwater Police Department.
2. **Kyle Bruce** has conducted an investigation and based on the knowledge gained from that investigation of the circumstances, it appears as follows:

Tyreek Hill was arrested at [REDACTED] on 12/11/2014 at 2312 hours. He was arrested because:

On 12/11/2014, at approximately 2139 hours, Stillwater Police Officer Reedy was sent to Stillwater Medical Center Emergency Room for an assault investigation. Officer Reedy made contact with a female victim [REDACTED]. Officer Reedy was told the following information:

- [REDACTED] and her boyfriend Tyreek Hill was involved in a verbal argument which became physical.
- [REDACTED] and Tyreek Hill had been in a dating relationship since June of 2014.
- [REDACTED] stated Hill "threw" her around like a ragdoll.
- Hill punched [REDACTED] face under her left eye causing a visible mark which was starting to turn a dark shade of red/purple during Officer Reedy's time with her.
- [REDACTED] had an injury to her upper lip which was starting to swell. This injury was a result of [REDACTED] being hit by Hill.
- [REDACTED] had visible injuries on the left, right and the front of her neck below the chin. These markings were consistent with [REDACTED] statements of being choked by Hill.
- [REDACTED] stated Hill struck her in the stomach several times. [REDACTED] is 8 weeks pregnant with Hill's child.

On 12/11/2014, I interviewed [REDACTED] about the incident. During my interview I asked [REDACTED] to talk with me about Hill choking her. [REDACTED] said she was choked twice. The first time Hill was standing in front of her and had his hands together grabbing her neck. Hill was pinning [REDACTED] against a wall and "banging" her head against the wall as he was holding onto her neck. I asked [REDACTED] if she felt like she was not able to breathe during this particular time. [REDACTED] responded, "Not this time." I asked [REDACTED] to explain what she meant by the statement. [REDACTED] said she was thrown to the ground. Hill grabbed her by her hair and picked her up from the ground. Hill was standing behind her and grabbed her around the neck using his arm. [REDACTED] was demonstrating with her hands and arms while she was telling me how she was grabbed. [REDACTED] was demonstrating what is commonly referred to as a headlock. [REDACTED] said she cried out to Hill, "Let me go I can't breathe." [REDACTED] repeated this plea several times before Hill released her from the hold he had of her

neck. [redacted] said she was having problems breathing when Hill had a hold of her neck. I observed injuries to [redacted] face and neck and the injuries are consistent with the statements she made about being choked and struck.

The aforementioned offense(s) occurred in Payne County, Oklahoma.

WHEREFORE, based on the above information, your Affiant prays the Honorable Court find that probable cause exists to detain Tyreek D'Shaun Hill
