### Business Session Voting Credentials

Voting Credentials will be available for the Monday Business Session Vote at the Conference Registration Desk, beginning at 7:00 a.m. on Sunday, June 5.

It will be necessary for all Official Delegates who wish to vote to have these credentials in their possession. There is but one credential for each member city. If the mayor of a member city is registered, the credential will be issued to him or her. If the Mayor is not registered and has not been in attendance at the Annual Conference, a registered official from their city must have been designated, in advance, in writing, to be the Official Delegate to receive the city's credentials.

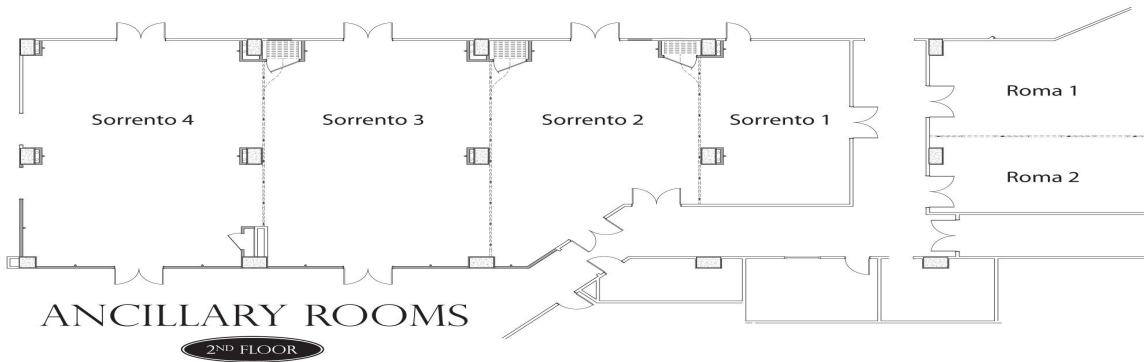
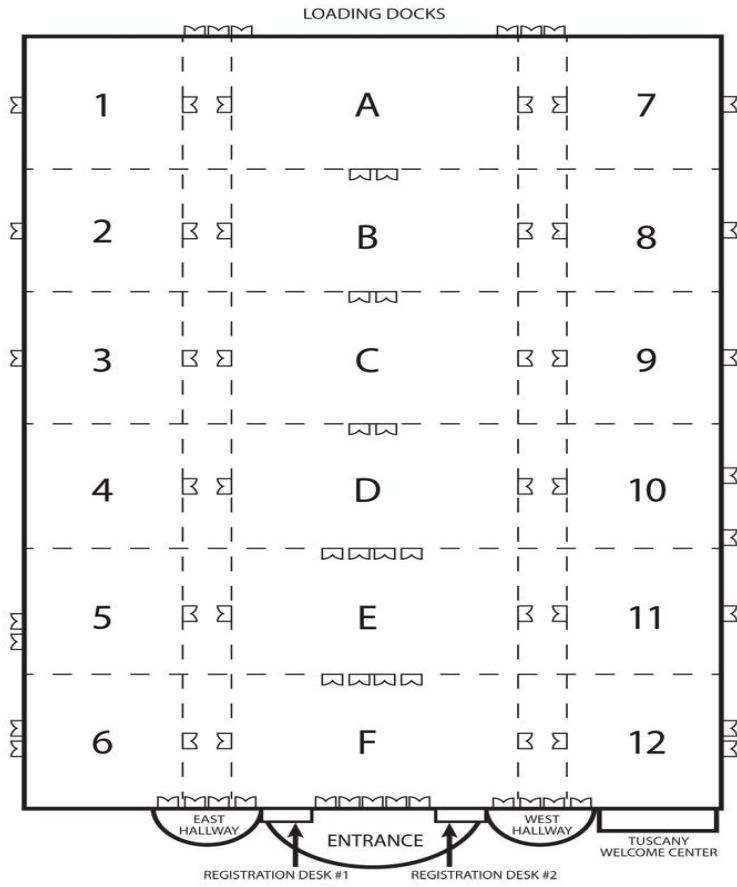

**Complimentary Transportation: Arrivals & Departures from Reno-Tahoe International Airport**

**Arrivals on Wednesday, June 1, and Thursday, June 2**

Attendees and their guests arriving at the Reno-Tahoe International Airport will be met by USCM 2022 volunteers at the bottom of the escalators on the way out, past security. Look for staff wearing the USCM 2022 official volunteer shirts, identify yourselves as attendees to the conference and you will be escorted to baggage claim and the River Room across from baggage carousel 4. **Ensuring Underserved Urban Residents Are Connected to Affordable Broadband**

Research reveals more unconnected Americans reside in urban America than anywhere else. The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act provides \$42.5 billion in BEAD Grants, distributed through the states, Washington, DC, and the Territories, to ensure that unserved and underserved people and households, especially those in traditionally underserved communities, have access to affordable broadband connections. At the federal level, mayors have championed affordable broadband access, reminding policy makers if broadband is not affordable, it is not available.

While broadband passes most urban neighborhoods, many residents are still not connected. The IIJA law allocates significant BEAD funding to the states to connect all Americans, including those in urban areas where millions of Americans are not connected. With the Commerce Department's program rules now in place, funding decisions shift to the states where broadband buildout and adoption plans are being developed.

This session highlights IIJA-established rights for local governments to participate in how these statewide plans are developed and identifies action steps mayors can embrace to ensure unconnected residents are protected and receive an equitable share of the new federal resources that are to be managed by the states.

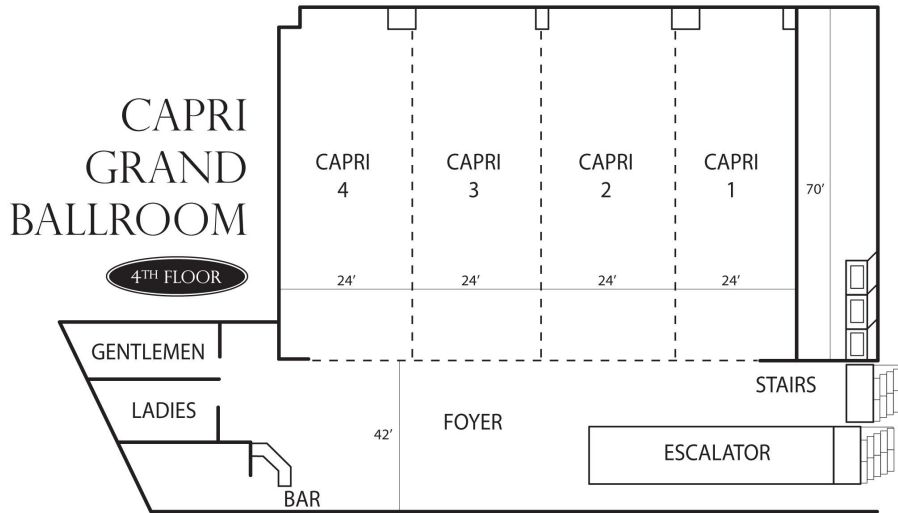
