

NOTICE OF NEVADA REPUBLICAN PARTY OFFICER ELECTIONS

July 12, 2025

Winnemucca Boys & Girls Club, Winnemucca, NV

The election of the Nevada Republican Party's Officers will be held on July 12, 2025, at the NRCC meeting in Winnemucca, NV. The duties of each office are listed in Article 4 of the NRP bylaws. The duties as listed in Article 4 are copied below, and are also available at the NRP website at <http://nevadagop.org/nevada-republican-central-committee-bylaws/>

NRP Bylaws Article 6, Section 1 (A):

The elected officers of the NVGOP in accordance with these bylaws: Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, National Committeeman, National Committeewoman, and the appointed members of the Executive Committee.

NRP Standing Rules Chapter 4, Section 2.0: Nominations

Subsection 2.1 – All nominations for elective party office whether elected by the central committee or the state convention, shall be self-nominations.

Subsection 2.2 – No person shall be a nominee for any elective office delineated in NRCC Bylaws Article 6, Section 1, Paragraph (A), unless they are current voting members in good standing of the Nevada Republican Central Committee.

Subsection 2.3 – Self nominations must be submitted in writing, to the Secretary, by either postal mail or electronic mail, not less than thirty days before the date of election, not counting the day of the election. The time deadline on the date of the deadline shall be 7:00 PM Pacific Time.

Subsection 2.4 – Except as provided for in Subsection 2.5, no nominations shall be permitted from the floor unless there are no nominations submitted pursuant to Standing Rule 2.3 for the vacant offices being filled by election.

Subsection 2.5 – A nomination may be permitted from the floor on the day of the election if submitted in writing and physically delivered to the Secretary prior to the meeting of the Central Committee being called to order. This privilege is restricted to any new member of the Central Committee who was not a member of the Central Committee at the time the deadline for nomination expired.

Subsection 2.6 – In the event that there are proper nominations submitted for vacant offices and these nominations are equal to or fewer than the vacancies being filled, a vote at any such meeting to elect each unopposed candidate by a show of hands shall be held in lieu of a ballot. A majority is required to elect.

DUTIES OF THE NRCC OFFICERS:

NRP CHAIR – Incumbent Michael J. McDonald

NRP Bylaws Article 4, Section 1:

The Chairman shall have the following duties and requirements: A. Shall serve for a term of four (4) years upon election or until a successor is elected. B. Serve as the chief executive officer of the NVGOP, NRCC, and Executive Committee. C. Act as the presiding officer at all meetings of the NRCC and Executive Committee and as the Temporary Chair of the NVGOP Convention. D. Serve as a voting member of the Executive Committee and as a voting member of all standing committees. E. Appoint the Chairmen of all Standing Committees established in these Bylaws subject to confirmation by the Executive Committee. F. Execute the policies established by the NVGOP, the NRCC, and the Executive Committee. G. Act as a signatory on checks or other payments issued by the NVGOP in conjunction with the signature of the Treasurer or other authorized officer when required. H. Serve as a member of the Republican National Committee representing Nevada. I. Keep the Executive Committee advised of the activities and progress of the party.

VICE-CHAIR – Incumbent Jim Hindle

NRP Bylaws Article 4, Section 2:

The Vice Chairman shall have the following duties and requirements: A. Shall serve for a term of four (4) years upon election or until a successor is elected. B. Serve as the deputy-chief executive officer of the NVGOP, NRCC, and Executive Committee. C. Shall assist the Chairman in the duties of his office. D. Act as the presiding officer at all meetings of the NRCC and Executive Committee and as the Temporary Chair of the NVGOP Convention in the absence of the Chairman or at the Chairman's Request. E. Execute the policies established by the NVGOP, the NRCC, and the Executive Committee. F. Advise and assist the counties to ensure that precinct meetings and county conventions are held in accordance with these bylaws and the NVGOP Standing Rules. G. Advise and assist the counties to ensure that precincts are properly manned for voter canvassing, voter registration, voter turnout, and resolving election day challenges. H. Act as a signatory on checks or other payments issued by the NVGOP in conjunction with the signature of the Treasurer or other authorized officer when required. I. Serve as a voting member of the Executive Committee. J. Keep the Executive Committee informed of his activities.

SECRETARY – Incumbent Barb Hawn

NRP Bylaws Article 4, Section 3:

The Secretary shall have the following duties and requirements: A. Shall serve for a term of four (4) years upon election or until a successor is elected. B. Shall act as the chief administrative officer of the NVGOP, NRCC, and the Executive Committee. C. Keep minutes of all meetings of the NVGOP Convention, NRCC, and Executive Committee. D. Deliver a copy of all meeting minutes to the Chairman within thirty (30) days of the meeting, and upon review, make a copy of the minutes available to each member of the Convention, NRCC, or Executive committee, respectively, no later than the call of the next regular meeting or Convention. E. Keep a current list of all members of the NRCC and Executive Committee. F. Act as a signatory on checks or other payments issued by the NVGOP in conjunction with the signature of the Treasurer or other authorized officer when required. G. Distribute a roster of all current members of the NRCC and the Executive Committee to each NRCC member no later than the first regular meeting following a State Convention and at least annually thereafter. H. Serve as a voting member of the Executive Committee.

TREASURER – Incumbent Kathy Njus

NRP Bylaws Article 4, Section 4:

The Treasurer shall have the following duties and requirements: A. Shall serve for a term of four (4) years upon election or until a successor is elected. B. Shall act as the chief financial officer of the NVGOP and NRCC. C. Act as the custodian of all financial assets of the NVGOP and NRCC. D. Pay expenses only in compliance with the NVGOP budget, excepting payments specifically approved by the Chairman. E. Keep a strict accounting of all revenues and expenses in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices, and make those records accessible to the Chairman, Executive Committee, and all members of the NRCC upon request. F. File all statements, reports, and disclosures as required by Federal and State laws in a timely manner. G. Act as the primary signatory on checks or other payments issued by the NVGOP in conjunction with another authorized Officer when required. H. Provide the NRCC and Executive Committee with current financial reports at each of their respective regular meetings and furnish an updated report to the Executive Committee should there be any significant changes in financial condition between Executive Committee meetings. I. Obtain a bond at the expense of the NVGOP with sufficient security to satisfy its requirements. J. Convey all financial assets and accounting records of the NVGOP and NRCC to their successor at the conclusion of their service as Treasurer and provide for any audit of those records requested by the Executive Committee. K. Serve as a voting member of the Executive Committee. L. Issue checks or other payments in accordance with the following guidelines: i. Any check or other payment issued in an amount less than \$1000 shall require the signature or other equivalent authorization of at least one of the following Executive Committee members: the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, or Assistant Treasurer. ii. Any check or other payment issued in an amount of \$1000 or greater shall require the signature or other equivalent authorization of two (2) of the following Executive Committee members: the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, or Assistant Treasurer. iii. Payroll checks prepared by a payroll service shall be exempt from the above limits and requirements and may be signed utilizing a facsimile of the Treasurer's signature only. Manually prepared payroll checks shall be subject to the same limits and requirements outlined above.
