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Glenn County Health and Human Services Agency Announces Location Changes Coming Soon in Willows to Enhance Community Services

Willows, CA – The Glenn County Health and Human Services Agency (HHS) is excited to announce upcoming changes in service locations to provide integrated, co-located services that create a one-stop shop in Willows. This strategic move supports our mission of "Building Healthy Futures- One Agency Accessible to All" and is designed to improve access to vital community resources. Relocations are expected to be finalized by end of June. Official date will be forthcoming. This does not affect any current services located in Orland.

As part of this transition, the current HHS building on Laurel St. will be vacated, allowing for greater efficiency and cost savings while ensuring that all essential services remain accessible to the community. Clients can look forward to a more consolidated experience when accessing services, which will enhance their ability to meet their needs effectively.

The following service relocations will take place:

- **Public Assistance (Medi-Cal, CalFresh, CalWORKs, and General Assistance)** will move to **240 N. Villa St.**, on May 23, 2025 where it will be co-located with Public Health. Contact information remains the same, (530) 934-6514.
- **Child Welfare Services** and **Public Guardian** will relocate to **1035 W. Wood St.**, co-located with First Five.
- **Special Investigations Unit** and **Public Health's Community Assessment, Planning, and Evaluation unit** has moved to **1025 W. Wood St.**

While the administration office will be relocated to Orland, all services will remain intact and easily accessible within their new locations in Willows.

"This move enhances our commitment to providing comprehensive services in a more integrated manner," said Laura Hawkins, Director of HHS. "By co-locating these essential programs, we are not only making it easier for our clients to access the resources they need but also becoming a more efficient agency."

County Board of Supervisor Yoder added, "This is a positive step forward for our community. The new locations will bring multiple services under one roof, allowing families to receive the support they need
