Shasta County Continues Response to Recent Flooding

Ongoing damage assessments from the powerful series of storms that impacted Shasta County in December continue to take place. Due to the confirmed damage to roads, property, and other infrastructure, and the anticipation of the discovery of more damage, Shasta County Sheriff Michael Johnson declared a local state of emergency on December 22, 2025. The Declaration was ratified by the Shasta County Board of Supervisors on December 29, 2025, and remains in effect.

Shasta County's Office of Emergency Services (OES) is assisting the County in compiling a record of significant damage to private property and businesses in **unincorporated areas of Shasta County** for submission to the state in the event the county becomes eligible for assistance in the future. Residents and businesses that experienced flooding in the **City of Redding** are encouraged to complete the damage reporting form on the City's website at **cityofredding.gov/emergency** under "Report Flooding".
