



The Great Pumpkins On Display In Annapolis

The four pumpkins each weighing well over 1,000 pounds, were trucked in from Altoona, Pennsylvania. Grown on pallets, the pumpkins lay flat on one side so that they can be picked up by a forklift. Multiple artists carved the Great Annapolis Pumpkins for spectators strolling through four locations throughout the downtown area.


We spotted artists from Gallery 57 West using hand tools to create this one of a kind design depicting King Kong climbing the St. Mary's bell tower. It's on display in front of the Visitor's Center, along with three other custom designed carves. Was that a chainsaw at Market Space?

This facility was once a beautiful 556-acre estate bought by the State of Maryland and was the first African American mental hospital in America. The hospital was thought to be a state-of-the-art establishment and making history as the premise behind its methodologies were to help the patients regain a sense of self-sufficiency by having the patients "run" the facility.

Oh yes, the patients were left to take the burden of all hard labor and tending the fields for their own food and clothing. All men, women and children were forced to complete strenuous daily living chores without adequate care and support. But worst of all, the "healthcare" facility became a true to life, slaughterhouse of humans (something you would now see on television, similar to the movie, "Saw", but on a macro-level impacting any person that did not fit the society "norm". This "torture and death farm" became the dumping ground for Maryland's minorities, mentally ill persons, criminals (even for minor infractions) and other sick individuals to be forgotten; however not before they were tortured like lab rats and left to die.

The State of Maryland still owns the land, but ironically only uses it to provide space for a few non-profit organizations. There does not appear to be any effort by the State of Maryland to commemorate this site as a National Cemetery or museum to formally recognize the thousands of lives lost in vain. The hope is the location will become a National Landmark and a recognized historical site where all proceeds go directly to the quality care of ALL mental health patients and awareness campaigns.


