Nets 114, Knicks 112

NEW YORK — Kyrie Irving scored 40 points, Jeff Green made two free throws with 3.7 seconds left and the Brooklyn Nets overcome the early loss of James Harden to beat the New York Knicks.

Harden returned after missing two games with right hamstring tightness but lasted just four minutes before having to leave again with the same injury.

Cavaliers 125, Spurs 101

SAN ANTONIO — Darius Garland scored a career-high 37 points, and Cleveland beat San Antonio to snap a five-game skid.

Collin Sexton added 22 points for Cleveland. Isaiah Hartenstein scored a season-high 16, and Taurean Prince finished with 14.

Pistons 132, Thunder 108

OKLAHOMA CITY — Jerami Grant scored 21 points against his former team, and Detroit beat Oklahoma City.

Grant played three seasons for the Thunder, and then was traded after the 2018-19 season. He looked at home during his return, making 7 of 15 shots and adding five rebounds and five assists in just 23 minutes.

Timberwolves 116, Kings 106

MINNEAPOLIS — D'Angelo Russell scored 25 points in his return from knee surgery and Karl-Anthony Towns had 23 points and 13 rebounds for Minnesota in

a win against Sacramento.

Anthony Edwards scored 19 points for Minnesota and Russell scored 13 of his points in the fourth.

Mavericks 111, Jazz 103

DALLAS — Luka Dončić scored 31 points and Dorian Finney-Smith added a season-high 23 as Dallas beat Utah for its season-best fifth straight win.

The NBA-leading Jazz had their nine-game winning streak halted.

Jalen Brunson scored 20 points, Josh Richardson 17 and Tim Hardaway Jr. 16 as Dallas won for the first time in three games versus Utah this season.

Raptors 103, Wizards 101

TAMPA, Fla. — Gary Trent Jr. beat the buzzer with a long 3-pointer and Toronto rallied from a 19-point second-half deficit to beat Washington.

Pascal Siakam led Toronto with 22 points, and DeAndre Bembry and rookie Malachi Flynn led a fourth-quarter charge for the Raptors, who won consecutive games for the first time since Feb. 19-21.

Suns 133, Rockets 130

HOUSTO — Devin Booker scored 18 of his 36 points in the fourth quarter, and the Phoenix Suns beat the Houston Rockets for their sixth straight win.

Deandre Ayton matched a season high with 27 points as Phoenix won for the ninth time in 10 games overall.

Twins 15, Tigers 6

DETROIT — Nelson Cruz hit a grand slam after a near miss and added a solo homer and a double, Matt Shoemaker held Detroit hitless into the fifth inning and the Minnesota Twins rolled past the Tigers.

Akil Baddoo hit a grand slam for the Tigers. He made his big league debut Sunday and homered on the first pitch thrown to him.

Blue Jays 6, Rangers 2

ARLINGTON, Texas — Steven Matz struck out nine in his Toronto debut, Marcus Semien and Cavan Biggio hit back-to-back homers and the Blue Jays won in the home opener for the Texas Rangers before the largest MLB crowd since the pandemic (38, 283).

Toronto, 3-1 for the first time since 2015, went ahead 4-0 in the second after Biggio's solo homer followed a two-out, two-run shot

by Semien off Texas starter Mike Foltynewicz (0-1).

Royals 3, Orioles 0

CLEVELAND — Danny Duffy pitched six innings of two-hit ball to beat a longtime nemesis and Whit Merrifield drove in all of Kansas City's runs with a homer and sacrifice fly, leading the Royals over the Cleveland Indians.

The Indians played their home opener in front of fans for the first time since 2019. The announced attendance of 8,914.

Yankees 7, Orioles 0

NEW YORK — Giancarlo Stanton hit a grand slam over the visitors' bullpen that landed in the left-bleachers 471 feet from home plate, leading the New York Yankees over Baltimore, handing the Orioles their first loss this season.

New York was ahead 1-0 on

Aaron Judge's fourth-inning homer when starter Jorge López (0-1) walked the bases loaded in the fifth inning and Shawn Armstrong forced in a run with a walk to slumping Aaron Hicks.

Reds 5, Pirates 3

CINCINNATI — Nick Castellanos hit a go-ahead homer in the seventh inning hours after deciding to appeal a two-game suspension for his part in a brawl, and the Cincinnati Reds beat the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Jose De Leon tied a career high with nine strikeouts and allowed two runs, three hits and two walks over five innings to help the Reds secure a third straight win.

Cardinals 4, Marlins 1

MIAMI — Yadier Molina hit a bases-loaded double during a three-run first inning, Daniel Ponce

de Leon and the St. Louis bullpen protected the lead, and the Cardinals beat the Miami Marlins.

Molina drove in two runs with his 382nd double, moving past Johnny Bench for eighth place on the career list among catchers.

Phillies 5, Mets 3

PHILADELPHIA — A throwing error by Mets third baseman Luis Guillorme allowed the go-ahead runs to score, and the Philadelphia Phillies used a five-run eighth inning to rally for a win over New York after Jacob deGrom had shut them down through six.

Francisco Lindor was 1 for 4 with a single and a walk in his debut with the Mets.

Red Sox 11, Rays 2

BOSTON — Xander Bogaerts had four hits, including a Little League home run — a double, with two

ill-advised throws that allowed him to score — and the Boston Red Sox got on the board with 16 hits and their first win of the season, over the Tampa Bay Rays.

Franchy Cordero, Alex Verdugo and Hunter Renfroe all had two hits apiece after coming into the game batting .000.

Cubs 5, Brewers 3

CHICAGO — Willson Contreras, Javier Báez and David Bote homered during a four-run fourth inning to lift the Chicago Cubs over the Milwaukee Brewers.

Trevor Williams pitched perfectly until Omar Narváez's leadoff single in the sixth. Narváez added a three-run homer in the seventh.
