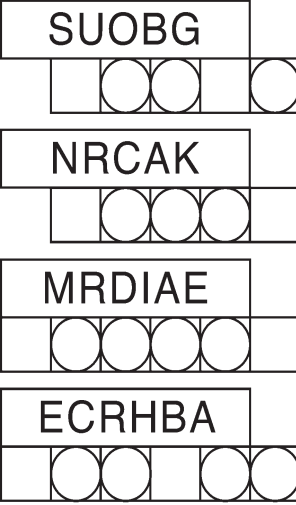

Now arrange the circled letters to form the surprise answer, as suggested by the above cartoon.

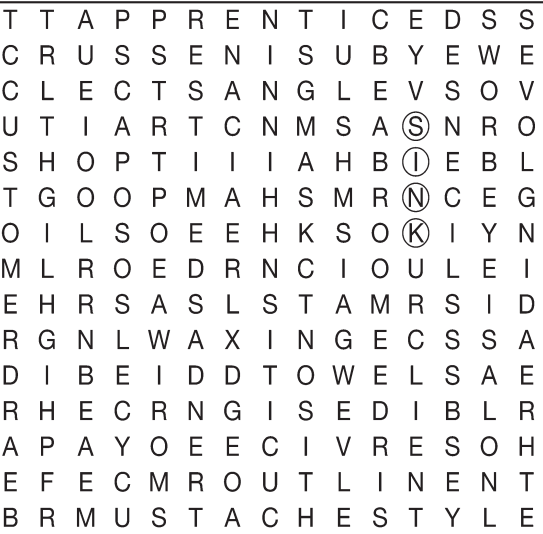

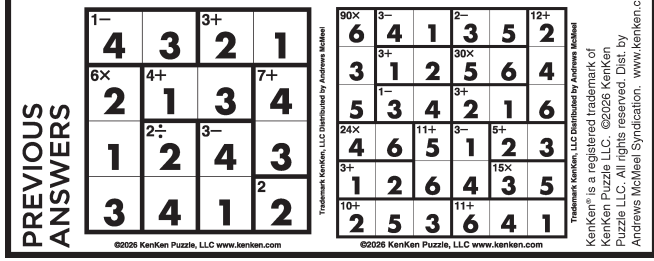
THE LOGIC PUZZLE THAT MAKES YOU SMARTER.
