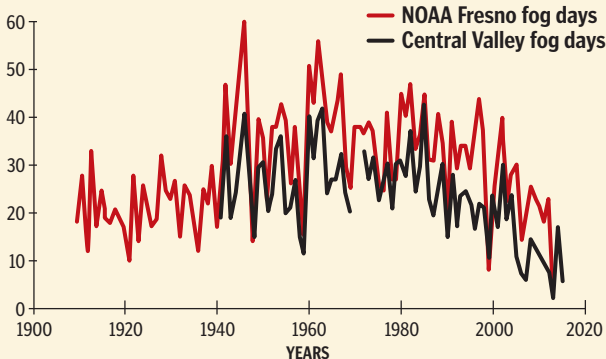


Annual fog days

This graphic shows the number of fog days that occurred over each winter, November through March. A fog day is any day where the visibility went below one-quarter of a mile for at least one hour.

The Fresno record is in red. The black record is an average taken over 15 sites throughout the Central Valley, which is graphed alongside Fresno to show its representativeness. Fresno is one of the foggier locations, therefore, its fog days are more frequent than the valley average.
