
Electoral representation vs. state population

The Electoral College was set up to keep populous states from dominating presidential elections, which has created a disparity in representation advantaging thinly-populated states. In Wyoming, for example, one elector represents 195,000 residents, while an elector in Texas represents nearly 723,000 residents.
