


## Roasted Cauliflower

Work with an adult to make this delicious and healthy cauliflower recipe that can crunch a little like popcorn.

- Preheat the oven to 425°F.
- Cut the cauliflower into florets all about the same size.
- Sprinkle with salt and 2 tbsp of olive oil. Toss these together to coat the florets.



- Spread onto a baking sheet and roast for 10 minutes.
- Turn each floret over and roast for 5 minutes. Take out of oven and allow to cool. Sprinkle cheese or lemon on top for extra flavor.






How do

 pizza crust?


ANSWER: With tomato paste.

### INGREDIENTS:



- Cover a plate with lettuce leaves.
- Break off cauliflower florets to make the sheep's bodies.
- Use pretzel sticks for legs and "glue" with cream cheese or peanut butter.
- To make the head, slice a small section off the back of an olive and "glue" onto the cauliflower using cream cheese.
- Cut tiny slices of olive to make ears.
- Use pine nuts for eyes. Attach with cream cheese. Set out your flock for all to enjoy!
