I recently learned of your training student employees to recognize that people who identify as as male, cisgender, heterosexual, heteroromantic, Christian, White, Western European, American, upper to middle class, thin/athletic build, able-bodied, or ages 30s to early 50s are subjugators and oppress those who identify as Black, Asian, Latinx, non-Western European, LGBTQ+, homoromantic, Muslim, Jewish, working class, overweight, or disabled, among others.

I'm interested in learning more and would appreciate coordinators Jessica Weed and Jennifer Iwerks forwarding specific documentation from primary sources that establish the historical basis for their conclusion, as well as that of historical and current socio-economic and psychological studies that prove the same.

In their response, I'd appreciate particular attention paid to documentation that white Protestant males in the English parliament were not responsible for ending slavery through the Slave Trade Act of 1807; Abraham Lincoln, along with his white cabinet, did not issue the Emancipation Proclamation; that Brown vs. Board of Education (issued by a predominately white protestant Supreme Court) was not an important advance for educational parity across racial lines, the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (enacted by a predominately white, protestant Congress), did not advance the cause for equity and equality among peoples of color; and that a recent report issued by the US Small Business Administration Office of Advocacy documenting a 34% growth in Black or African American owned businesses, (see https://www.mbda.gov/sites/default/files/migrated/files-attachments/SBO_Facts_BOB.pdf) proves the oppression of, for instance, the black community, inflicted by the subjugators defined above.


Dear Dr. Miller -


Hello



Listing some as "targets" and some as "oppressors" without even speaking to them; doing nothing to learn about WHO they are, their character, their integrity. It's amazing that you can make such broad and dangerous judgements on people with a simple question about their gender or the way they might "self identify". Sparking fear into the hearts of young college students making it sound like they're surrounded by possible danger because they might have a class with someone taller and possibly- the shock and horror- that they may be a Christian. The slides clearly show ways to make sure that you identify threats around you with a quick glance and some very woke terms; this does nothing to actually create conversations where students can listen and ask questions about each other and get to know their background and commonalities. Everything is geared towards how different we are and how divisive the university aims to be. In your name of social justice you have quickly and very purposefully driven everyone straight back to racial division and segregation. How truly sad.

When I was a freshman I remember sitting on the floor at Weaver Hall, hearing our resident advisors say to look at your right and left; it is likely that 1 in 5 of you may be raped by the time you graduate from campus. I remember being shocked and a bit frightened by that information, but used it to help me made smart decisions related to the way I behaved and the choices I made. I took responsibility. I made friends with people from very different backgrounds, different ethnicities, different religions, and different ways of life than I'd experienced growing up. We had wonderful conversations sitting together, really listening to how each of us were brought up and what things we had in common. Some of the best friendships I made were from people who would, according to your charts, be considered "agents". They were people of the highest integrity, whom I can trust to always do the right thing, who were selfless, and have gone on to serve their

families, their communities, and their country. Had I been educated as a freshman now, I would have falsely been fearful of talking to them, much less getting to know the kind of person they were.

This kind of indoctrination and teaching, posing as inclusion, does the exact opposite. It divides, it segregates, and it has no room at JMU. This country and this world is more divided than ever right now. People are fighting for the very freedoms we take for granted. I am sad for the future of the alumni coming from universities and colleges that follow this same SJI educational systems. This is NOT the change we learned about while I proudly wore purple and gold.

Ladies (I hope that term is not offensive to any of you) and Gentleman,

A published article came to my attention today which alleges that JMU, my alma mater, has mandated a training video, for <u>student employees</u>, in an effort to "educate them about social justice and inclusion." I would like to receive confirmation, or a denial, as to the validity of this story, from the JMU Administration.

The article alleges that staff coordinators Jessica Weed and Jennifer Iwerks discussed topics relating to "oppression and privilege;" with oppression defined as, "the systematic subjugation of one social group by a more powerful social group for the social, economic and political benefit of the more powerful social group." Thereafter, "Systematic subjugation" was allegedly defined as when a group of individuals, "hold more power and privilege than others." Please confirm, or refute, what has been alleged. I need to assess if my alma mater has actually sanctioned the bigoted, gross-generalizations, allegedly presented by staff coordinators Jessica Weed and Jennifer Iwerks, OR, if there is a malevolent conspiracy afoot to smear JMU's good name.


Hello

James Madison University first-year orientation training chart

The JMU junior confirmed the university will not be implementing diversity, equity and inclusion training (DEI) in freshmen orientation programming. Instead it will be put under review by the <u>university</u> following significant pushback from students and parents after training literature was leaked.

McGrath lamented that impressionable young students could feel "unwelcome" if alienating rhetoric were to be included in their onboarding, agreeing with the school's "good decision" to stop the training. The student said some of her peers who were freshmen orientation group leaders, also known as FROGS, decided to drop out of the program following training.

One orientation leader, who requested to remain anonymous, told Fox News they were "absolutely appalled" after sitting in on the session and expressed concern for students, especially freshmen, being fed this kind of information.

While I personally/professionally may be able to weather the storm should there be a target on my back, I worry about the local adjuncts and untenured faculty we count on to teach this CORE course in the COE. These adjuncts are local teachers and principals who might reconsider teaching the course or the objectives and content they were hired to teach based on the response of JMU for fear of backlash. I have included ELED 310/210's objectives and goals below and highlighted the ones that I see as most relevant to the situation at hand. The final project requires students to be able to identify their identities of privilege and oppression and how they have manifested in schooling and life. They then identify ways to use their privilege to advocate for students. This is the necessary and foundational work of teachers, which is why it is a CORE course for all in the COE. I worry about how many students will be turned off from this important work because of our institutional response.

Additionally, as someone on several search committees, how do we honestly and ethically say that JMU values diversity, equity, and justice when the institution won't publicly support us doing the basic ABCs/Level 1 diversity work with students when things get hard? How do we ethically recruit (and retain) faculty of color and marginalized faculty when we won't publicly be supported for doing the work? How are we living out our mission, goals, and strategic plans related to DEI work in even the most basic way? I (and dozens of marginalized faculty across JMU) feel that JMU had the opportunity to stand by these website words and messaging from the University Faculty Meeting on Friday, but instead chose not to, which has sowed distrust and concern that we will not be supported when it is our course that is sensationalized or taken out of context.

Please show us that you care about all of us that teach this course (or similar courses/content) by having our backs when things get rocky and public. Doing this work means that there will always be pushback because it is uncomfortable and hard, but please show that you value our work with engaging students and faculty with difficult history, conversations, and critical reflection by standing by us in the hard parts...especially the most vulnerable faculty and adjuncts. I desperately want to believe that JMU and the COE want to do this work in ways that matter and are important. I think about the COE's 5 P's Infographic (attached) and College of Education's Statement of Solidarity, Commitment, & Action, and I perhaps naively, think we are progressing in small concrete ways. I then wonder how many faculty will not do the work now because they fear a lack of support from the institution. How do we fix this? How do we support those who will continue to do the work?

I welcome the opportunity to discuss the course, next steps, etc. I don't have all the answers, but I do know that something needs to be done across multiple spheres of influence.
