Littleton Industrial Park Expansion Gains Board Support

LITTLETON — The Littleton Industrial Park could soon expand by nearly 30 acres under a proposed land transfer from the town to the Littleton Industrial Development Corp., a move supporters say would strengthen economic development and grow the tax base.

The Littleton Select Board is expected to vote on the transfer by May 21 following two required public hearings, the most recent held Monday and the first on April 27.

“This is unused and unneeded town land that we’re seeking to get on the tax rolls to generate revenue,” Selectman Ed Cherian said.

Town Manager Troy Brown said the parcel, adjacent to the transfer station and located within the industrial zone, sees little use and is not expected to affect future transfer station expansion.

Wetlands, a stream and a power line limit development on the property, but Chad Stearns said enough usable land remains for one or more businesses.

Stearns said LIDC is regularly in discussions with companies interested in relocating to Littleton and works with partners, including the town and Littleton Water and Light, to identify suitable projects.

The industrial park currently has about 20 businesses employing roughly 1,200 people, according to Stearns, who said the park has generated about \$15 million in property tax revenue over the past 50 years.

LIDC recently used a \$210,000 grant from the Northern Border Regional Commission and about \$250,000 of its own funds to build an access road, install a culvert and extend utilities in prepara-

tion for future development.

“This lot was previously subdivided,” engineer Andrew Nadeau said during the April 27 hearing, describing the proposal as “a simple boundary line adjustment.”

Senior Center Honors Volunteers

LITTLETON — The Littleton Area Senior Center honored its nearly 70 volunteers during a recognition dinner Friday celebrating the people who help sustain the center’s programs and daily operations.

The event featured a meal prepared and served by the White Mountains Regional High School Spartans Paradise culinary team. Each volunteer received a succulent plant symbolizing qualities such as resilience, along with a covered mug donated by Passumpsic Savings Bank.

“You guys are amazing,” center director Amy Goyette told volunteers. “You are planted in this center. You are resilient. You take very little credit. And you’re just giving hearts, giving back to each other, which makes this senior center a great place to be.”

Judy Ash thanked drivers who deliver meals to area seniors regardless of weather conditions.

“They drive through rain, snow, whatever, and they get the job done,” Ash said.

Goyette also recognized head cook Stacy Manville, who was unable to attend, for expanding meal offerings with the help of volunteers. She said volunteer support has allowed Manville to prepare fresh meals, launch a salad bar in January and begin serving breakfast.

“That is because of the volunteers giving her that extra time for her to be able to create the wonderful things she creates for each of us every day,” Goyette said.

Volunteer coordinator Carl Stagg was praised for organizing the center’s volunteer corps.

“He truly is the glue that holds us together,” Goyette said.

Artwork for the evening’s invitations and program was created by volunteer Aiden Mitz.

Goyette said many of the center’s 66 active volunteers are themselves seniors.

Man Accused Of Putting ‘Hard To Get’ Woman In Chokehold At Whiskey Den

ST. JOHNSBURY — A New Hampshire man is facing an assault charge for allegedly putting a woman he said was “playing hard to get” in a chokehold outside the Whiskey Den last month.

Eric Briggs Jr., 36, Easton, NH, pleaded not guilty in Caledonia Superior Court on Monday to a charge of simple assault that carries a maximum penalty upon conviction of a year in jail and a \$1,000 fine.

He is accused of assaulting Olivia Dow, 22, on April 11, while Dow was walking toward the bar on Eastern Avenue.

A report by St. Johnsbury Police Sgt. Steven Hartwell notes that Dow told him that Briggs had grabbed her from behind, wrapping his arm around her neck.

“She further advised that while he had [her] in the choke-

hold, Briggs stated ‘Why are you playing so [expletive] hard to get?’” the sergeant’s affidavit notes.

On a 1 to 10 pain scale with 10 being the most pain, Dow reportedly told Sgt. Hartwell that she felt a 6.

Briggs reportedly gave police a different story about his time at the Whiskey Den. According to the affidavit, Briggs said he was inside the bar and had been “speaking with a girl on and off over the evening.” He said he “thought they were getting along okay so he put his arm around her and some other kid came up and got aggressive.” He said the bar’s bouncer then kicked him out of the bar.

At Briggs’ arraignment on Monday, conditions of his release were ordered. They include requirements that he have no contact with Dow and that he stay out of the Whiskey Den.

Briggs’ criminal past includes a federal sentence for trafficking methamphetamine and an arrest for a robbery of the Circle K in Littleton in 2015.

Border Shooting Suspect Indicted in Federal Case

A federal grand jury has indicted Blu Zeke Daly, 26, on charges related to the February shooting of a U.S. Border Patrol agent near the U.S.-Canada border in Pittsburg.

Daly, formerly of Manchester and also known as Cullan Zeke Daly, faces one count of attempted murder of a federal officer and one count of assaulting a federal officer with a dangerous weapon. The charges carry a maximum possible sentence of 40 years in prison.

A preliminary hearing scheduled for Thursday in federal court was canceled following the indictment. Daly remains in federal custody with limited visitation rights pending a detention hearing that has been continued to May 18.

According to court records,

Daly was shot in the head by a Border Patrol agent during an exchange of gunfire on Feb. 22 and remains hospitalized under armed guard in FBI custody at an undisclosed location.

Federal prosecutors argued in April for continued detention, describing Daly as both a flight risk and a danger to the community. Prosecutors said "only through sheer luck" the agent survived the shooting.

According to an arrest affidavit, the incident began around 11:30 p.m. Feb. 21 when a Border Patrol agent observed a 2012 Honda Civic in West Stewartstown, an area known for illegal border crossings.

Prosecutors allege Daly attempted to evade the agent during a traffic stop after being questioned about using other names. Daly then allegedly drove north on Route 3 at speeds approaching 90 mph toward the closed border crossing.

After reaching the gate shortly after midnight, prosecutors allege Daly made a U-turn and fired a handgun at the agent, who returned fire and struck Daly through the rear window of the vehicle.

U.S. Attorney Erin Creegan previously said investigators are examining whether Daly has ties to a broader ideological group, including the so-called Zizians.

LRH Nurse Caps Career After Nearly Five Decades

LITTLETON — Carrie Way has cared for thousands of patients during her nearly 50-year career as a nurse at Littleton Regional Healthcare, where she has served in multiple departments.

Way, of Littleton, retires on May 29, after 47 years.

“It’s a pretty big feat,” said her daughter, Katie Parent.

Parent and her siblings are proud of their mother and wanted to surprise and honor her with a story in the local paper.

Annually, LRH hosts an awards banquet, and Way has a 45-year pin that was awarded at the Mt. Washington Hotel.

Parent and her siblings offered a narrative of her mother’s accomplishments, as well as her devotion as a mother and grandmother.

“Carrie Way is retiring from Littleton Regional Healthcare after a distinguished 47-year career,” said Parent. “Her service began on June 4, 1979, on the med-surg floor. Over the decades, she served in maternity, the intensive care unit, and the emergency room, and acted as a relief supervisor. She also worked in the PACU/recovery room, same-day surgery, and endoscopy.

“Driven by a passion for hospice and end-of-life care, Carrie later moved to the oncology unit, where she became certified in chemotherapy and served as the palliative care coordinator,” said Parent. “She concludes her career in the case management department.”

Although Way has decided to retire, she plans to remain con-

nected to her colleagues and might return for per diem work in the future.

“She is celebrated by her family, including her three children and six grandchildren,” said Parent.

For Way, new journeys beckon.

“She plans to do some traveling, which is something she hasn’t done in a long time,” said Parent. “She has some friends who are now living in Florida and she’s hoping to go visit them.”

Way is a committed parishioner at the First United Methodist Church of Littleton.

Bath Man Gets Prison in Disabled Veteran Fraud Scheme

A Bath man was sentenced Monday to nearly two years in federal prison for stealing more than \$225,000 from a disabled veteran whose monthly benefits he accessed after gaining the man’s trust.

Donald Estes, 49, pleaded guilty in February to one count of bank fraud. On Monday, U.S. District Judge Paul Barbadoro sentenced him to 21 months in prison, followed by one year of supervised release, and ordered him to pay \$225,200 in restitution.

Federal prosecutors said Estes carried out the scheme from August 2020 through December 2023, steadily draining the victim’s bank account to pay for a snowmobile, vacations, mortgage payments and jewelry.

The victim, a Navy veteran blinded by a brain tumor while serving in 1981, required full-time care and later lived at the Union House Nursing Center after his mother died in 2019. He died in February 2024.

According to prosecutors, the veteran was unable to manage his finances or make informed decisions. After being approached by Union House staff about serving as legal guardian, Estes instead had the victim “scribble a sig-

nature” to add him to the victim’s bank account, giving him full access to the funds.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Alexander Chen said Estes changed the mailing address on the account to his own home so surviving family members would not receive bank statements.

Investigators said the thefts stopped only after the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs redirected the veteran’s monthly payments to a fiduciary.

In a statement, Erin Creegan said the sentence showed that people who exploit veterans “face federal imprisonment.”

LRH, Police Expand Violence Response Collaboration

LITTLETON — Littleton Regional Healthcare is working with local law enforcement and healthcare partners to strengthen responses to violence and behavioral health crises in medical settings as incidents involving aggression continue to rise nationwide.

About 50 participants, including hospital staff, police officers, corrections personnel and behavioral health specialists, gathered Friday at LRH for a five-hour program facilitated by Safer Environments via Collaborative, Unified Response to Emergencies, known as SECURE.

The program focused on improving communication, training and emergency response coordination between hospitals and law enforcement during violent or potentially dangerous incidents.

Retired New Hampshire State Police Lt. Frank Harris, a co-developer of SECURE, said the initiative is designed to foster collaboration before crises occur.

“Really, the key is to learn about each other prior to a crisis,” Harris said.

LRH President and CEO Bob Nutter said the hospital has seen a sharp increase in aggressive incidents, many involving mental health crises or substance use disorders.

“We track it now on a daily basis,” Nutter said. “It’s unfortunate that it’s come down to the point where we sometimes have multiple events on daily occurrence now, but it’s our reality.”

Paul Smith, who also serves on LRH’s board of trustees, said limited mental health resources in the North Country place additional strain on hospitals and police departments.

The discussion included emergency department staff, security officers, nursing administration, case managers and officers from the Littleton Police Department, other local departments, the Grafton County Sheriff’s Department and the Grafton County House of Corrections.

Participants discussed joint policies, communication strategies and the need for ongoing training, monthly meetings and updated memoranda of understanding between agencies.

A second SECURE session is scheduled for May 26 at LRH.
