actually a few friends that had popped in. It was kind of a big deal. It was nice. I was really surprised.

You had an almost two-year engagement. What made you choose that length of time?

Honestly, financially I wish we would have chosen longer because you don't get to plan a wedding all the time. We're going to do this once.

But I'm a big date person - I like the look of numbers. I didn't like 2018 and we were going to be making a lot of shifts. So we found a 2019 day that we liked.

Honestly, my ideal date was Aug. 8, of 2020. But it might be too long to wait. August 2019 was the sweet spot of not too short amount of time, but long

Did Tyler participate in planning the wedding?

We tried to talk at least once a month about budget and what needed to be done. It's really hard to plan a budget when you've never had a wedding before!

The very first thing we did was we went over what was important to us and what we saw for our wedding day, so that we could mesh together our ideas. We were really well on the same page.

What apps or websites did you use during planning?

Pinterest, which everyone told me to stay away from. They said it would give me a mixed sense of reality – that things on Pinterest aren't achievable in real life. But I'm glad that I used it because we ended up doing a lot.

I also used The Knot and a lot of Googling.

Did you know you wanted to use family land or did vou look at venues before deciding?

We didn't look at a lot of venues, and I wish we would have.

I was set that I wanted something different than what everyone else had. I don't want to have a wedding where five other friends had it in the past year.

We thought it would be a cheaper way to host it. But oh my god, it's not!

We didn't have a very clear idea of everything we'd have to bring in.

You think if you're paying for other people to do it, it's going to be more expensive. But then you realize that no, you're bringing everything to you.

We tell people we had a tented wedding and they're like, "Oh it's cheaper!" And I say, "It was not cheaper! Do not have a tented wedding if you're looking for cheaper!"

But it was wonderful. My grandma came up to me and she was so happy and emotional. She said, "Your great-grandpa would love this." I know how much it meant to them for us to have it there.

What did you do for your flowers?

That was the best experience of my whole entire life! I would recommend it to every single bride -Cedar Circle. It was amazing.

We went two days before the wedding - you go and pick flowers. I brought all my bridesmaids and we picked flowers. It was the most therapeutic thing.

They brought us buckets of these flowers and we got to combine and make all the flowers. We brought the mason jars to put them in. They were in the next room making my bouquet and I got to tell them exactly what I wanted. It was amazing.

Food was important to Tyler and photos were important to me. Plus we splurged on the fact that we had 232 people. If you combine the meal and \$3 per chair, you spend a lot on a single person coming to your wedding.

Worrying about missing something and how everything is coming together.

little bit to each other. It meant a lot that we took the time out of our scheduling and planning and working to do that.

What advice do you have for couples who are just starting to plan their weddings?

I liked that we sat down in the beginning and got on the same page. It's easy to get caught up in it all, so I would really think about the parts of your wedding that are important to you. Work around those because you don't want at the end of the day to be disappointed that you didn't do something that you really wanted.

Tips For Finding The Perfect Plate

Because TWO of our brides scheduled their wedding dates around Willy's Catering of East Burke, we reached out to talk to Chris Willy and get the lowdown on what you need to know when choosing a wedding caterer.

What should people be looking for when they're inter-

Make sure they're showing you things in your budget. If your budget is for an entree, an app, and a salad, don't request six appetizers, four entrees and expect it to be a low price point.

When you're comparing caterers, make sure that you're comparing apples to apples, and not apples to oranges. Make sure that you know everything is included and there aren't hidden fees so you're hit with a big rental bill or something like that on the day.

Ask for total transparency, because some people will just give you the food costs and not include taxes or gratuities. Make sure that the percentage of the gratuity is in the contract that you're signing. Somebody could say it's 15 percent today, but then charge 20 percent the day of.

Service fees - you might be hit with a service fee for the waitstaff or the kitchen staff. We do have a service fee, but it's right up front when they request the original quote. It's a percentage of the food cost.

The things to look for are service fees, rental fees, taxes and

How else can people keep costs down?

Do a collaboration with the caterer. We allow people to bring in snacks, or do their own appetizer, or do their own desserts. If you have it at your house, you can do your own bar. That's a big cost.

Do you recommend buffet or sit-down meals?



It's whatever the bride and groom want.

We like to lean toward plated because you get a presented meal placed directly in front of you that's a full portion size. When you do a buffet, it doesn't matter how it's served or how clean you try to keep it. By the 30th person, sauces have spilled, things have been dropped. It tends to look a little chaotic. With plated, everybody's getting that beautiful presented plate right in front of them.

What is something you wish people would do that you don't usually see?

A lot of people just do the steak and the fish or the comfort meals. I wish more brides and grooms would do the food they like, and not what they think their guests would like, or what mom and dad want. A lot of people will want to do chicken, but they'd lean more toward the Oriental cuisine. Branch out and try different cuisines!

anything I needed to change. Even on my bad days – or on the really, really good days – he still was there for me.

How did you choose the date for your wedding?

During the summers I work for Willy's Catering out of East Burke. I knew that no matter what I wanted to have them be our caterers, and I really wanted to get married in 2019. Oct. 19 was the only day that Chris and Carrie had left that also worked for the Alerin Barn, which was my dream wedding location. When that fell into place, it was such a blessing.

I'm lucky that I get to see all the different venues because I cater!

You had six months to plan your wedding – was that enough time?

It was perfect! I think I would have overthought things if it was any longer. It made me hold to specific timelines for booking things and getting things done.

Did you do a wedding website for your guests?

I used The Knot, and it was helpful because I

got to do my registry and wedding website right there.

No matter whether you do paper invites or RSVP digitally – which is how we did ours – you have to track people down anyway. But for the most part it was successful.

Where did you make decisions with budget in mind?

I've been in many different weddings and I always get whatever dress my friends asked me to get. But I've spent \$300 on a bridesmaid dress, and I wanted something where my friends wouldn't have to spend a ton of money and also I could pick the colors that I liked. So all of my bridesmaids got their dresses on birdygrey.com, and all of their bridesmaid dresses are \$99. I picked four different colors and the girls could pick whatever style they wanted.

We did all of the flower arrangements on our own. We ordered our flowers through Bloominous.com. All the plain flowers came and we put them together into the bouquets and boutonnieres and corsages and whatnot. I spent as much for all of

> my flowers as some of my friends have paid for just bouquets.

What personal elements did you include in the styling of your wedding?

For our centerpieces, we used wood slabs with antique bottles that came from our family barn. We put flowers in those.

For wedding favors, Adam made coasters for everyone! Some were birch and some were cedar. He branded our wedding crest into all of them.

Were kids wel-



come at your wedding? Was that an easy or hard decision?

No, and it was easy. We have a lot of friends with young kids.

We wanted it to be a night where they could just relax and have fun and not have to worry about their children.

Were there any unexpected things that happened on the day?

One of my bridesmaids had a dress malfunction and her zipper broke! She used some wardrobe tape to tape the sides over so it looked like an open back. And I had given all the girls a shawl as one of their gifts. So sometimes she wore the shawl!

I think some people would have been extremely angry about it, but I really didn't care. I have a hilarious photo with all of our backs to the camera!

What was the most stressful part of planning your wedding?

Having to make quick decisions because sometimes I like to think about things for a bit longer. But a lot of times I needed to make a decision *right now*.



land was more our type of style.



Topping It Off With A Tasty Treat

Janessa Newton is the visionary behind the cakes at Addison & Alice Bakery Co. in Lyndonville. We asked her what couples should think about when deciding on their wedding cake (or cupcakes!)

What are your first questions for couples when they come to you?

Right off the bat, I want to know their vision and their style so that I can make it come to life. I love planning parties, so I want to hear everything they have to say about their day – it doesn't even have to be about the cake.

You can browse through Pinterest and it can get overwhelming! It's like a black hole.

The most common thing I hear is simplicity – a clean, romantic cake. The most popular right now is a bohemian vibe – white with very simple greenery, or fresh fruit. I've done a few more romantic traditional cakes, but right now the most common thing I'm getting is simplicity. It gives the vibe of their wedding.

What questions do couples ask you?

I get a lot of questions on servings. I think a lot of brides have a vision that they want all these different pastries, or a ginormous cake. But they might have a lower amount of guests and not need that much, and they set their budget higher than they can afford. I like to work with brides and show them a more realistic goal. I want their vision to come to life exactly how they want it, but I think that's really stressful for them. They come to me worried that they're not going to get everything they want for their budget, but I can often make it happen for less.

Is there a good rule of thumb for calculating how much cake you need?

I've been doing this for over nine years, so I have charts that I created that work really well.

An 8 inch cake feeds roughly 20 to 22 people, but that's for birthdays. With birthday cakes, people usually cut pretty hefty pieces. For weddings they're usually cut smaller, so you can stretch your budget further for weddings. That's a general rule of thumb I've always used everywhere I've worked.

Why do you enjoy making cakes?

Making cakes brings out all of my creativity. It's all about someone's vision and I love putting that on to a cake. It makes me very happy and I love seeing the joy on people's faces when they get their pas-





Getting The Perfect Look

Our cover bride, Lauren Davidson, glows in her pictures. It's at least partly thanks to her makeup and hair artist, Courtney Darrington who owns TEASE Hair Salon in Woodsville, New Hampshire. We spoke with Courtney to learn her tips and tricks for creating a beautiful bridal look.

When somebody contacts you about hair and makeup for a wedding, what are your first questions?

Do you wear makeup every day? Because you don't want to give your bride a full face of glamorous makeup if they don't wear that every day. That's not going to portray them in the wedding photos, and they'll look at the photos and see someone different.

Lauren uses more natural makeup. So we kept it subtle, but we made her eyes pop.

So the first question is what is your makeup routine?

For hair, I like to ask what style dress they have – is it open back, high collar, lace? Do you want to have hair pieces that match the dress? Do you want to have pops of sparkles in your hair? What do you want to imagine? Do you wear your hair up most of the time, or do you like to wear it down?

what they like, and then they let me that needs to be fixed. create something out of those pictures.

Do you do a dress rehearsal with the bride before the big day?

Yes. We do the makeup look – that is super important to do before the wedding to see if they like what it looks like, to see if it matches their bridesmaid dresses and wedding colors. You want to learn their skin type.

Same thing for hair – come in a few days before to do a trial run. That's nice because they get to see if they like it and you can make changes.

The nice thing about a trial run is I can make myself a schedule of what I need to do to stay on task. I don't want to get behind and rush through it!

How long do makeup and hair usually take?

I give myself an hour for each. It may not take that entire time, but then I like to get pictures from them of I have enough time to correct anything

> What about women who don't usually wear makeup and might not know what to ask for?

> That's our job! If you don't know what you want, we can definitely give you suggestions. And it makes our job more fun because then we get to create something that nobody has ever created before.

> We'd definitely do something with the eyes – mascara can make the eyes pop, and a little bit of eye shadow. You want the eyes to pop in the pictures.


