Jenks Studio Of Photography — Portrait Of An Evolving Business In The 21st Century

ST. JOHNSBURY — Like a presidential photographer for towns, Jenks Studio of Photography has encapsulated on film more than a 100 years of St. Johnsbury history.

If you grew up here in the 20th century it's a safe bet the Main Street business snapped your photograph, and might even still have a copy of it. Jenks Studio - which is now celebrating its 125th anniversary and is likely the oldest family-owned photo studio in the country – maintains an archive of historic glass-plate images and pho-

erator. He's the fourth generation of Jenks men to fill the role.

Jenks' great-grandfather, grandfather and father witnessed huge changes since the studio started snapping pictures with equipment so primitive it required using braces to keep people still long enough for the oldstyle cameras.

The 21st-century Jenks, however, may be in the throes of the most massive change since the electronic flash, and it's steamrolling the demand for his studio's services.

"Digital photography screwed so

photogramany phers." Jenks said. "People have shut down studios all over the place because everyone is just shooting stuff themselves and not going to the photographer. The whole world has been turned into everyone being a photographer."

Before digital cameras hit the market, Jenks handled up to 500 portraits a year for high school seniors. It's presently down to about 100.

Jenks envisions organizing the photos by year. They date from the 1930s to modern times, and include family portraits, school photos, landscapes, and wedding pictures.

"If your parents got married here in town we probably took their pictures," Jenks said.

There are also a number of photos including some that are a century old – of Vermont icons like Mount Mansfield, Lake Champlain, Killington Peak, Pico Peak, Burke Mountain, Willoughby Gap and The Old Man of the Mountain in New Hampshire's Franconia Notch.

Jenks loves the old stuff and still prefers to shoot in black and white versus color, though he does own a

Studio History

William Jenks opened the Jenks Studio of Photography in Newport in 1886 and operated there until 1902 when he moved to the O. Dean Hale Building on Main Street in St. Johnsbury. The building was suitable because it had a skylight.

Curtains were used to control the skylight on bright days. On gloomy days, subjects used braces to keep still. William handed off the business to his son Zenas, who was Bob Jenks'

grandfather. In the 1940s Jenks Studio got electronic strobe flashes, a huge advance. It allowed the business to abandon the skylight studio and move a few doors down Main Street to its present street-

In 1968, Zenas gave the business to his son Charles, a World War II veteran who served in the South Pacific doing reconnaissance and developing pictures in a mobile darkroom. Charles operated Jenks Studio until 1986, when he passed it to Bob.

"I like to think that I brought us through the end of our first century, and now it's up to my son to take us into the second," Charles, who is now deceased, is recorded as saying upon handing over the business. "Neither Robert nor I were determined to go into photography when we were young, but it has turned out that both of us decided to go into it."







Decades Of Down At Franconia Village Store

FRANCONIA, N.H. — The morning crowd thinned out a while ago, leaving Bob Gilbert and Ron Flynn to ponder the crossword puzzle on a counter in the back of the Franconia Village Store.

"What's a five-letter word for comic queen?" Flynn asked no one in particular.

The question went unanswered, cast aside for conversation and another cup of coffee. The coffee costs a couple of coins, but the conversation is free.

"It's a gathering spot," said Steve Heath, whose family bought the little brown store on Main Street over 50 years ago.

Up until the late 1920s, the Village Store was a blacksmith shop and sometime in the 1930s, it became a store.

William and Ruby Heath, Steve's parents, bought the place in 1956 and since 2000, after his brother, also named William, retired, Steve Heath has kept the store going.

It's the kind of place just about every town has, a place where you can duck in for the morning paper and cup of coffee and the gallon of milk you forgot on the grocery

It's the kind of place where everyone does know your name and your claim to fame, or infamy.

"Every town has a local gathering place and this is it for Franconia," Flynn said.

Observers will tell you that there are two distinct types of people who gather daily at the Village Store, which opens at 6 a.m.

There are the folks who never go past the coffee pot, the ones who pour a cup and jaw for a few minutes about the weather.

Then there are the ones, like Gilbert and Flynn, who head to the back of the store and take a seat at the small counter, under a huge poster of local son Olympic skier Bode Miller.



The Corner Never Goes Dark: Jax Jr. Cinema Enters New Age

LITTLETON, N.H. — When it opened in 1951, the Jax Jr. Cinema received a Merit Award from the motion picture theater industry for international recognition for being one of the most modern and wellappointed of all current theaters.

In the intervening decades, the quest to stay modern has continued, and the Littleton movie house just became the first all-digital 3D movie theater in New Hampshire.

"It's the most modern moviegoing experience at yesteryear's prices," said owner Jack Eames.

Eames began working in the theater at 8 years old, taking tickets and doing post-show cleanup, and by the time he was 16 he was a projectionist as well as a summertime manager.

Located in the 30 Block of Main Street, Jax Jr. Cinema was preceded by the Premier movie theater, owned by Eames's grandfather, John B. Eames Sr., which opened Thanksgiving Day ers. 1926, but was destroyed by fire in

The day after the fire, John B. Eames - known as Jack - set up a sandwich board on the 30 Block that said, "watch this corner grow."

Grow it did, and the elder Jack Eames opened the Jax Jr. Cinema in 1951 in a new fireproof concrete

During his own lifetime, Eames said the first "Harry Potter" installment in 2001 drew the most sales at the theater. "We have yet to surpass that,"

he said. "We were sold out for every show for the entire first week.'

1997's "Titanic" was also a hit at Jax Jr. and some moviegoers had to be turned away for lack of seats, he said.

In 2002, Cinema One in Jax Jr. went to Dolby digital sound, which Eames said is better for digital sound than DTS. "It's a little more precise," he said.

The DTS is now being phased out at Jax Jr. and the new 3D digital system will soon feature Dolby digital sound for both screens.

Eames employs Gordon Fisher as a full-time manager and six part-time people, including Gordon's wife, Barbara, and Phil Rivera, of WLTN, who serves as projectionist.

"What makes this place special, like all the businesses we've been

a part of, is the staff," said Eames. A theater can have all the technology in the world, he said, but it's the staff that makes it a friendly and welcoming place.

In the intervening decades since Jax opened, movie theaters across the nation had to contend with competition, such as the advent of television in the 1950s, video home systems in the 1970s and 1980s and, more recently, the birth of Netflix and Redbox, which offer movie rentals as early as two months after a theater release.

But digital 3D offers an experihome, said Eames.

"The beauty of digital is you get a perfect picture every time you play the movie," he said.

Each time film is played it tends to degrade, he said, and some reels incur emulsion scratches. And 3D is becoming more

available. Eames said it appears the dam for 3D films broke in 2010 with more than 20 being released. "That was the catalyst that made

static for 10 years, they did go up last year and are \$7 for adults and \$5 for seniors and children. Buddy nights are Mondays,

when two moviegoers can buy tickets for \$4 apiece. The only time buddy night is not available is when the movie company prohibits it through a contractual obligation, he said.

The technology is ever-changing, and for the future of Jax Jr. Cinema, Eames sees the possibility of streaming in live concerts on screen and perhaps even Broadway plays.

Jax Jr. Cinema is open every day of the week, and since February 2010, has been offering matinees showings every Saturday and Sun-

NEWPORT CITY — Mark John Hayes II, known as John, started the family car business in 1958.

Hayes plans to expand the front of the building to create a new showroom for his Lincoln line. The dealership currently does not have a showroom. Hayes said that the addition would enhance the dealership.

Hayes Ford is the only Lincoln dealership in eastern Vermont north of Route 100, he said. Hayes Ford also is only one of two dealers authorized to sell and service Class 6 and 7 Ford trucks.

The commercial truck sales and shop segment is a benefit to Hayes Ford, he said.

Hayes loves working in this area, with Quebec out the back door, even though that means the potential market for the dealership is cut in half by the U.S./Canadian border.



St. J Health And Rehabiltation Provides Years Of Patient Care

ST. JOHNSBURY — By 40, we all need a little makeover, and we're not so shy to admit there are things about ourselves we can improve upon.

It's like that for St. Johnsbury Health and Rehabilitation Center, too, which marks its 40th birthday this

For the last few years, the center, located on Hos-

pital Drive, has been getting a face-lift, a few rooms at a time. In December, the physical therapy rooms were made anew and are now filled with new equipment and sunlight streaming in, making a cheerful space for staff and patients recovering from injuries or setbacks because of illness or aging. There are plans for blocks of rooms to continue to


be made over until the entire facility has seen a makeover, said Shawn Hallisey, administrator of the facility, where there are 110 beds, about 80 housing permanent care residents, and the remainder for shortterm rehabilitation patients.

In the rehabilitation program, people can come and stay for a short time, or however long is necessary, and receive full in-house care for everything ranging from physical therapy to occupational therapy, speech and respiratory therapy, explained Hallisey.

In addition to wing by wing plant makeovers, the 40-year-old building, which began as the St. Johnsbury Convalescent Center according to a more than 30-year employee, has also been working hard on improved patient care outcomes, communications with doctors, safety track records for employees and more, stressed Hallisey. The results are bringing in commendations, including an award from the American Health Care Association for dramatically improved

Just how to celebrate a full four decades of patient care in St. Johnsbury is still being planned, said Hallisey. He said the health center is the kickoff concert each spring for the St. Johnsbury Town Band, and that the 40th birthday bash may just coincide with the concert, but there are other ideas floating, too, including a car show after last year's first-ever, successful classic car show, or perhaps even a fireworks display on the Fourth of July.

St. Johnsbury Health and Rehabilitation Center has had a handful of owners over its four decade history here, and is owned today by Canadian-based Revera Health Care Systems, said Hallisey. The health care provider owns 30 homes in the United States, and in Canada, he said, they are the largest provider of elder or senior services in the country, providing everything

from long-term care to home health care in more than 250 facilities and services in Canada. The company is headquartered north of Toronto, he said, and puts a high value on improving patient care, investment in their facilities, and employee appreciation efforts, all of which contribute to a better quality of life for the residents and patients.

in the center's recently remodeled PT room.

Special programs and activities are offered every day, from entertainment to trips outside the center. noted Hallisey. Last year, he and a nurse took two elderly gentlemen to Fenway Park to see their beloved Red Sox, he smiled. One of the two gentlemen has passed away, the other one has been assured if the Sox make the World Series, he'll be going again, Hallisey said smiling

Last year, about half the residents of St. Johnsbury Health and Rehabilitation Center were taken out to Crystal Lake for their first annual summer picnic, said Hallisey.

"It was a really good day, they really enjoyed it," he said. Two buses were rented from RCT and made multiple trips each to accommodate the number of residents who attended the outing, he said.

Local Boy Does Good: The Wes Ward Story

ST. JOHNSBURY — Wes Ward didn't have a problem getting a job

After graduating from Lyndon State in 1986 with a degree in business administration, he quickly landed a position with a growing St. Johnsbury company that would later become a marketplace leader.

Of course, getting the job wasn't all about being young, educated and hard working. Wes Ward also had the inside track to the job. He already knew the boss: an enterprising young fellow named ... Wes Ward.

"I wanted to go to college and I needed something I could do on my own time," said Ward. "I needed something I could work around my school schedule."

So it was incoming college freshman Wes Ward who started Wes Ward Auto Repair as a part-time endeavor in May 1981.

Three decades later, he's still at it. Wes Ward, 53, was born in St. Johnsbury at Brightlook Hospital and is a 1975 graduate of St. Johnsbury Academy. He enlisted in the U.S. Army, where he spent three years as a heavy equipment operator stationed at Army posts in Virginia and Washington State. He came home in 1978 and supported himself doing a series of odd jobs - including a stint as a milkman — before starting his business and entering college on the GI Bill.

Ward worked part time and went to school part time. He got his education and built his little start-up business into what is now the largest independent auto repair shop in the area, with 16 employees, eight bays and enough high-tech equipment to service nearly every size and kind of vehicle. He's also found time to raise two children, remain active in the community and become a national leader in the world of independent

But it all started with two rented

bays in 1981. Wes Ward Auto Repair opened its doors 30 years ago at a service station on the site of what is now the Valero gas station on Portland Street. While attending school he built his business and soon had three employees and two tow trucks. After graduating from Lyndon State he just kept going.

"Things were going really well so I just decided to stick with it," said

He's relocated twice and now oversees a repair shop that not only

services nearly every kind of vehicle A.D. Rossi Inc. known to man but also includes a mobile heavy equipment repair division that services equipment that other repair shops use across New England.

In 1995, his original landlords at the service station decided to sell and he needed a new place to work. So Ward moved his shop from St. Johnsbury to his home in Danville and stayed there until the former Sumner Tire building at 1193 Port- belt repair. land St. became available – and he

"I wasn't looking for a new space," said Ward. "I just saw the potential of that building."

The shop, just up the road from where he started out, features six automobile bays with lifts as well as two truck bays. The truck bays are equipped with a pair of heavy-duty lifts, including a 30,000-pound lift used to service large vehicles and a 60,000-pound lift that can handle even larger vehicles such as commercial tractor-trailer trucks.

The shop and its staff of ASE-certified technicians also do commercial fleet maintenance, alignments and even work on recreational vehicles such as boats and RVs. The shop provides full-service repairs including tire, exhaust, brake repair, engine and transmission repair and overhaul. They work on all makes and models, both foreign and domestic, and Ward has a client list that includes the Vermont State Police, the Vermont Department of Corrections, CALEX Ambulance, Federal Express and scores of local businesses such as Dead River Corp., Palmer Brothers, Vermont Tennis Corp. and

His other business, Wesward Equipment Service, is a regional heavy-equipment repair division that services clients across New England. The equipment-repair division, started in 1991, maintains and repairs heavy shop equipment used at other repair facilities such as wheel balancing machines, bulk oil systems, large scale machinery for corporate customers and even conveyor Ward is civic minded, serving as

past president of the St. Johnsbury Kiwanis Club and the Northeast Kingdom Chamber of Commerce. He also volunteers as a guardian ad litem in the Vermont court system. A Vermont guardian ad litem advocates for abused and neglected children going through the court system.

"I like to help kids and that's what that job is," said Ward. "I'd like to think I can make a difference."

Ward also keeps busy on the national level serving as one of just six members of the Parts Plus National Advisory Council.

"We're from all over the country," said Ward. "I represent the Northeast. We get together a couple times a year and talk about trends in the industry and how we can improve the industry."

But as busy as he seems to be, Ward said his success is less about the complex world of business and more about the simple element of human interaction.

"I've always tried to treat people honesty and ethically," said Ward. "I've found that if you do that, they'll come back."





David A. Lussier Real Estate Enjoys Silver Anniversary

BY AMY ASH NIXON Staff Writer

LYNDONVILLE - In 1980, David A. Lussier first ventured out into the real estate business, working for the first five years of his real estate career for the Gerald Farrington Real Estate Agency, getting enough experience to head out and open the agency in his own name in 1986.

Marking its silver anniversary, the business and Lussier's interest in real estate were a natural outgrowth of the family auctioneering business, he said. "Before he earned his real estate license, he first had obtained his auctioneering license in 1979, he recalled. He said he can't remember the exact moment when real estate became his next step, but said the business of selling property goes well with his family's auction enterprise, which dates to 1953, under his dad Roger's ownership, and his brother Reg's, as well. "They just went together," he said of real estate and auctioneering. "Honestly, I think my father just said, 'It might be nice to have a real estate license to go along with it," he said.

"In the late 1980s, things were rocking," recalled Lussier, sitting in his office on a recent morning where outside, temperatures hovered at about 20 below zero. "People were buying, and then came the S & L problems, and then we had a recession." Now, another recession, tied in no small part to predatory lending practices that led to a nationwide foreclosure crisis and to federal intervention in the housing market as a result.

During his 30-plus years as a Realtor, and starting his 26th year on his own, Lussier has ridden the wave of the ups and downs of the real estate market during some of its highest peaks and lowest bot-

"The changes? Oh God, you used to go from a one-page listing and a one-page purchase-and-sales agreement, and now the paperwork is just astronomical," from the start

of the process to the mortgage papre-approved, so they know how perwork, which is daunting in its much their budget is. dozens of pages requiring signatures, he said.

In the old days, he said, the saying was "Buyer Beware" and now it's "Seller Better Tell."

Also in the old days, he said, buyers didn't have the ability to come in with their own agent representing them, and now buyer brokers are common – meaning an agency represents the buyer and helps them deal with listing agencies for properties being marketed by any other agency, giving the buyer an advocate in a sale rather than just the seller's representative who is looking out for the seller's

Lussier said many people are still not aware of the fact they can turn to an agency with whom they feel comfortable to help them in try. the buying process, and they don't ever agency is handling a property for the seller.

Another major change over his career in the industry is the advent of the Internet and Multiple Listings Service online – people now can do a lot of their property searching and homework before even getting to the Realtor, and do. Another big change is the level of inspections and the disclosures legally required; inspections are a big issue now, where back then, someone might just have a carpenter go through with them, or an uncle, and now you've got licensed inspectors, said Lussier.

Of the housing boom and collapse and down period that the country is still coming out of in terms of real estate, Lussier said the Northeast Kingdom never got as far out of whack on values as other areas, and people didn't tend market, Lussier notes, "You've got to borrow beyond their means as much as in some areas of the country. The credit crunch is very real since the national problems with bad mortgage loans have come to light, and now, Lussier said, he recommends to people before they even start looking that they get

"You've actually got to have credit now," said Lussier. Of the problems that have been in the news a great deal the past few years with the mortgage crisis, Lussier said, "People were just spending more than they should have or they just thought that this was never going to end...that the values were just going to go up and up and up. Well around here, people can only afford X amount of dollars," he said.

In this part of the state, "we plug along, and we're fortunate for the businesses and factories we have," he said of the employment sector. "Most people have stayed within their means. There are some foreclosures, but nowhere near what they are in other parts of the coun-

As for what's coming? Lussier have to simply work with what- said the numbers make now an ideal time to buy. Interest rates are low and prices are down. He believes the sun is coming back out for the market and the economy in general.

"Now is the best time to buy," he said.

Lussier predicts that there will be more listings come on the market as spring nears, and he's optimistic that things are beginning to

"I still have some calls or emails from people out of the area looking," he said. "Some people wait until spring, and then when things turn green, it looks better. Who wants to move in the winter, anyway? I think people are sick of hearing about all the bad things. and feeling like if we're going to do it, let's just do it."







Weeza Much More Than A Bookkeeper

EAST BURKE — Weeza Sanderson is a very busy woman. She is a bookkeeper, farmer, artisan, photographer, fundraiser and volun-

Sanderson started her bookkeeping business in 1986 and it grew to 40 clients. Most of those were businesses including Lyndon Rescue. She handles accounts payable and receivable, balances checkbooks, some payroll and monthly statements and quarterly tax filings.

"Right now I'm booked solid," Sanderson said. "I even have a waiting list."

Sanderson works out of her home on Route 114 north of East Burke Village, where she and her husband, Sam, make wooden bowls and other unique wooden items. Their showroom is filled with beautiful pieces that are not only pleasing to the eye, but useful too. Weeza photographs the items for brochures for the business called Sanderson's Wooden Bowls and Sanderson's Woodturn-

"The showroom is doing really well," Weeza Sanderson said. "A lot of customers come here."

They also come to see the 14 miniature donkeys the couple raises. The Sandersons also raise and sell meat rabbits. Right now they have about 50, but that number will grow as the rabbits breed.

"The Mediterranean-Sicilian donkey is the only farm animal that comes to you for love – no treats needed," Sanderson said. They need to have a buddy, she added. "I won't sell one to someone unless there is another animal to keep him com-

While Sanderson enjoys her work as a bookkeeper and artisan, and loves her animals, it's her work for the American Cancer Society that really grabs her.

"It is my passion," she said.

Sanderson is a two-time cancer survivor. In 1999 she was diagnosed with stage 2 breast cancer. Then in 2001 she developed melanoma. She worked while receiving chemo treatments, which Sanderson described as "intense." She cut her client list down to 20, "which is still plenty," she said.

She got involved with Relay for Life in 2005, an event to raise money for cancer research. The 14hour event honors survivors and caretakers and also remembers those who did not make it. This year the relay will take place on June 11 and 12. Her team, which she named "The Incredible Journey," has been one of the top fundraisers each year. Trophies in her living room attest to that. In five years the team has raised almost \$50,000.

In 2008 Sanderson received the Spirit Award. Last year she was named Volunteer of the Year. "I was totally blown away," Sanderson said. "I had no idea. It really meant

a lot to me."

Sanderson is a member of Survival Committee, a group that meets monthly and raises money throughout the year. She has good words to say about the American Cancer Society because all the money raised goes to research. Sanderson also volunteers for the society as part of the Reach for Recovery, a group that supports cancer patients by answering questions and listening. "I really enjoy that," she said.

Sanderson also helps out at the Willoughby Dip, an event organized by Fred Laferriere of St. Johnsbury after he lost his brother to cancer. Last year she made the plunge, but once was enough, she said. "It was incredibly cold." Now, she helps with registrations and collecting

Oh, one more thing. Weeza Sanderson is an avid Red Sox fan, which can also be exhausting, she





Store Owner Finds Success By Adapting And Growing

News Correspondent

The Barnet Village Store has been part of the fabric of town life since the 1890s and in the same building where the Odd Fellows Hall was located on the third floor. Customers can still buy a selection of customcut meats, dairy products and groceries, as well as a variety of meals to go.

Deb King, celebrating her 25 years of ownership this year, has kept the tradition alive by adapting to changing customer demands.

In 2008, she branched out by buying the Barnet Quick Stop in West Barnet that added gasoline, propane, a large game weigh station and an ice cream window to her offerings.

"You have to be able to adapt, or you won't stay in the business," she said. "When I first bought the store, I was doing custom-cutting meat for people who were raising their own animals for food as well as deer, moose, elk and bear for hunters. I mostly did the wrapping, but I did some custom cutting too."

Eventually Deb's brother Brian Adams took over the custom-cutting part of the business at his Joe's Brook Road facility, and King put in a deli to respond to the growing demand for deli foods, custom made sandwiches and other ready-to-eat dishes.

Deb and her brother grew up in Barnet on the family farm with their parents Winston and Burnice Adams. The farm has been in the family for more than 200 years, King said. Of Scottish descent, the family was one of Barnet's founding settlers. And Burnice still supplies the store with personal-size pies.

Things were gong well until her father died the same day the store's cooler quit, she recalled.

"My husband Armand took a few days off from his job and built a walk-in cooler for me," she said, explaining Armand works for Morrison's Custom Feeds in Barnet. "He can fix anything. He keeps things around here running from changing light bulbs to welding the furnace, doing the mechanics for the van and cutting wood to feed the furnace."

The couple has also beefed up the energy efficiency by insulating the large three-story building so it only takes about three cords of woods to heat, instead of 10 cords it took to heat when she bought it. The building is double-walled which helps, but there is an electric energy cost to run refrigeration compressors that also contribute to the interior heat.

"When I bought the business, I bought only the first two floors," King said. "I bought the Odd Fellows Hall only five years ago."

The third floor was a good place for her two teenage stepsons to be playing pool. But one day they decided to explore and found that the stairs to the stage were movable. Behind the stairs under the stage their exploration revealed a coffin. Then they opened the coffin and much to their surprise - and perhaps terror - they found a skeleton.

As it turns out, it was a fake skeleton and not the real thing, although it was real enough to later fetch \$175 along with the coffin at a cleaning-out auction.

The West Barnet Quick Stop also has a history, but not as long. It was once a machine shop owned by John Bishop, then renovated into a convenience store by Richard and Paula Stevenson. It was later sold to

a couple from Marshfield and known as Aunt Dees before it was sold to King, who then doubled its inventory of groceries.

The ghosts of the past are gone and only the good food and friendly service offered by Deb and her staff of from 12 to 20 employees, depending upon the sea-

Longtime employee Sue Robinson, who started working for King in August 1998, is the capable manager of the West Barnet Quick Stop. Robinson is a top-notch cook, who is often behind the scenes in the kitchen during regular community benefit dinners.

Carroll and Donnalee Sherburne of Sutton, owners of Carroll's Automotive, located on the Lyndon-St. Johnsbury town line at 4772 Memorial Drive on Route 5 is enjoying 25 years of business.

The business was founded at Carroll's home on Sutton River Road in Sutton when Carroll was 18 years old. When he was 10, he began working for the late Warren Fox at Fox's sawmill. Fox mentored the young Sherburne and was always helping him tinker with something and instilling a good work ethic and a love for everything mechanical.

Sherburne followed through on his interest in auto mechanics at Lyndon Institute, where he was fortunate enough to have another great teacher, John Emery, who taught auto mechanics at LI for many years.

Carroll's father, Ronald Sherburne, was an auto mechanic who ran his own shop for many years on Broad Street in Lyndonville before retiring.

After driving a truck for a year to save up enough money, Carroll built a one-bay garage at his home and launched his own business while still a teenager. After building up his business on the Sutton River Road, Carroll decided he wanted to expand and moved to his present location 12 years

He runs the business with his wife, Donnalee Sherburne, who did all the garage's administration and bookkeeping in a small office area at the garage until recently. Now, she's moved into a spacious modular home converted into an office just down the road from the shop. She runs her own business, Northridge Bookkeeping, and continues to be Carroll's partner in the auto repair business.

The one-bay garage has given way to a spacious three-bay garage with a large lot. No longer a solo act, Carroll continues to turn wrenches in one of the bays while Mike Davis does mechanical work in another bay. Chad Bigelow is the garage's service manager and Scott Hershey is interning at the garage and planning to go off to college soon. Hershey has developed an enthusiasm for the repair business and has developed excellent skills while learning on the job, much like Carroll learned on the job 30 years ago.

Keeping up with the times, Carroll and Donnalee added a website for their business at

The Sherburnes take pride in their legions of longtime, loyal customers who have been bringing their vehicles to the shop for years. To stay competitive, the Carrolls are constantly investing in the business, recently acquiring an all-new, state-ofthe-art alignment machine. In addition, they invest in all of the electronic and computer technology needed to read the electronic diagnostic signals sent out by today's newer cars and trucks. Buying new equipment is a constant as automobile technology changes and the multiplicity of cars and trucks, each with their own systems, increases.

There is not much that Carroll's Automotive doesn't fix and, actually, the term "Automotive" may be a bit limiting: Carroll's works on the biggest over the road diesel trucks, log skidders, tractors and even motorcycles. In addition to the kind of car repair one is accustomed to, Carroll's also replaces glass, sells tires, does alignments and diagnostic work, state inspection, brake jobs and everything else except for automatic transmission rebuilding. Carroll will take the transmission out and install an overhauled or new transmission, but he arranges to job out transmission overhauls to a shop specializing in transmissions.


Donnalee laughs as she recalls one of Carroll's earlier mechanical triumphs was repairing a customer's bean pot pressure cooker.

Another large component of the Sherburnes' business is commercial and fleet maintenance and repair with companies owning multiple vehicles bringing their work to Sherburne. Since Carroll built his one-bay garage in Sutton 25 years ago, the Sherburnes have seen lots of growth. They've raised two daughters and have always been willing to give back to the communities they serve, participating in food drives and supporting local groups and community projects.

The firm is introducing its own kitchen and bath contractors, lumber line of solid-surface vanity tops under the brand Green Mountain Vanity Tops, a solid-surface product made to look like natural stone.

> When the Baxters first got into the business on their own, the housing industry was strong, but the 2008 downturn in the economy turned their focus to commercial work. Last year, Creative Counters was awarded a large commercial project with an architectural mill works company in Quebec, for the Methodist West Houston hospital in Houston, Texas. For that project, the Baxters purchased a huge routing machine, which allows them to improve lead times and work flow for residential work.

Closer to home, they have done work for Central Vermont Hospital and Fletcher Allen, they said. The company today is located in a private location on Northern Circle, off Route 122, in Lyndonville.



The Wine Gate – Welcoming **Diners For Five Years**

ST. JOHNSBURY — The Wine Gate has become a favorite lunchtime destination

The restaurant, located in the former Murray's Meat building off of Railroad Street in downtown St. Johnsbury, is open Monday through Saturday from 11 a.m.-2 p.m. and offers made-from-scratch panini sandwiches. soups and salads. It also serves dinner on Friday nights from 5 to 10 p.m.

Co-owner Lauren Chamberlin realized a lifelong dream when she opened The Wine Gate in December 2006. She was inspired by her family's passion for cooking and wine. Many of the menu items are based on old family recipes.

"There's a long line of great cooks in our family," said Chamberlin. "A lot of the recipes we use are from my grandmothers [Lucille West and Faith Godfrey]."

Today, she and her husband, Tim, run the restaurant. The dining room seats 65 and an outdoor patio can accommodate another 40.

Popular items include the freshly made soups (including butternut squash and apple, cream of broccoli, minestrone and tomato bisque), the chicken florentine panini sandwich (grilled chicken, provolone cheese, garlic and herb mayonnaise, spinach, tomato and caramelized onion) and dinner entrees such as the ribeye steak.

The restaurant has experienced steady growth over the past five years. It began by serving local customers. Today it draws passing tourists and people from outside the area. Chamberlin said the secret to its success has been the dedication of its staff.

That dedication has not gone unnoticed. Regular customers have joked that Chamberlin and her staff practically live at the restaurant.

"Everyone jokes that we live here, which is very true, it does feel like we live here," said Chamberlin. "We put our heart into everything that we do."

Laurajean "LJ" Stewart and her husband, Jack, used to pass the Barnet Tradepost all the time.

"Every time [we passed by] we said 'Gee, that would be a perfect place for us," said Stewart, "and one day we saw a for-sale sign.

They quickly bought it and planned to move Stewart's private massage therapy and kinesiology practice there. That was the beginning.

Five years later the Barnet Tradepost Wellness Center is a regional hub for Eastern medicine and meditation.

Soon after buying the property, Stewart was approached by other potential tenants. The first were a husband and wife who were board-certified acupuncturists. Today the four-building campus houses nine private practices. Others include a Reiki healer, a midwife and a physical therapist.

There is also a workshop space – a converted barn which hosts classes including tai chi, Zen archery and tap dancing - and an art studio where Jack creates art and teaches art classes.

In the beginning, some people questioned Stewart. They wondered if creating a Wellness Center, in the middle of an economic downturn, was a good investment.

Stewart said customers sought out the center, though. She said the Wellness Center met a regional need for alternative and holistic healing. Through word of mouth it has drawn customers from "long distances." Today,
