
George waited six years to make sure the relationship was right before proposing. But once he decided, he went big!

The COVID of it all

HOLBROOKS

The Holbrooks originally planned their wedding for 2020 at Jay Peak.

They were grateful for the communication from resort as COVID cases began to rise. "They were really good about it. They reached out and told us exactly how it would have to be," Erika said. "They said they totally understood if we wanted to cancel and they gave us all our money back."



With restrictions like not being able to have their masks off except when they were kissing or eating, Kirsten and Caleb felt they wouldn't be able to have the wedding they wanted.

"We decided to do it the following summer and have less people and keep it more low key."

They ended up with their wedding at their home with about 65 people rather than the 100-plus they had originally planned on. They gave guests small bottles of hand sanitizer as favors.

OUIRIONS

"We were supposed to get married Aug. 1, 2020. In March and April, I was in the midst of COVID patients working at the hospital. I was on the computer look at the different guidelines and we wanted this big wedding because Marc comes from a big French family and I'm one of 11 grandkids. So in April we made the hard decision to push it out a year.

I contacted all the vendors and everyone was over the moon okay with it. I contacted Marion at My Vermont Wedding Barn. I was like, 'This sucks!' She said, 'It does, but I promise you, this will be even better next year.' All of our vendors honored their prices.

I asked about having the wedding outside, but in the Catholic church you're supposed to have

the wedding inside or you can't do communion. Thankfully there was a lull and we didn't really have to deal with it."

LANGLEYS

"I didn't want to get married in 2021 because I didn't want to deal with the COVID stuff. But my mom is terminally ill and I was reminded that she might not be here next year. So I was like, 'Okay, let's do it. I'll figure it out.' I'll deal with the dress shopping with the masks and all so I can make sure my mom is there.

The ceremony was outside and we were in a barn that had big open doors. And it was a nice lull during the summer where it seemed like things might be getting better. Most people took their masks off. One person kept their mask on, that was

"Our original plan was for 2020, and then we made a decision very early in the pandemic that we needed to hold off. I had done a lot of the footwork, but I hadn't confirmed any vendors at that point, so it was easy for us to extend the date. We reset it to Aug. 21, 2021 and it was great. It was that lull in the pandemic where things were opening up and it worked out nicely."

"We had originally been going back and forth on whether we wanted to get married this year or wait until 2022. At the end of it, we were just sick of dealing with COVID, so we just said screw it! We only invited close friends and family. Everyone was vaccinated and everything was outdoors, so it made people feel comfortable. We had hand sanitizer everywhere, and everyone was good about it.

A lot of people were pretty booked when we started planning things, but honestly, I wouldn't change anything about how it turned out. I loved every single one of our vendors. And I knew that if I stuck with local people that I knew, I might have a better chance of them being able to do our wedding."

Sweet Creations By Faith

f there is such a thing as a Renaissance Child — a pre-teen with wide interests and Lexpertise in multiple areas — Faith Packard is it.

You're as likely to find the Whitefield, N.H. 12-year-old in the ballet studio or flying on the aerial silks as you are on her snowboard, dirt bike or four wheeler.

But what makes Faith stand out even more is that she's a business owner. And not just any business owner — she's a professional baker who makes cupcakes and cakes for weddings and other events. We found out about her thanks to Jonna and George, who hired Faith for their wedding.

"She did cupcakes for the guests and a sixinch cake for us," Jonna told us. "It was amazing!"

Faith started baking at age nine and her business began at age 10 when a local teacher hired her to make a smash cake for her daughter's first birthday.

"After that we started the Facebook page," Faith said. "My grammy works at a school, so she would bring in cupcakes I made for the staff. People slowly started asking for orders."

At first, most of the orders came from people Faith already knew. But as her work became more popular, she started hearing from strangers.

"It was harder because I would have to call them and ask them how many, what flavor," she said. "And then when I had to go meet up with them and talk to them in person, that was definitely hard at first. My mom would drive me and she would help me start the conversation a little bit, because I wasn't good at that yet."

Faith is largely self-taught, learning from videos on YouTube and the occasional lesson from other local bakers. She especially loves hand-piping roses, talking excitedly about a cake that required 30 or 40 roses. "Once I got the hang

of it, it definitely went faster," she said. "But my first couple were kind of crazy."

Recently she learned a trick from an online video that lets her create a different color along the top edge of the roses.

But she smart enough to know her limits. "If someone asks for a pomegranate-flavor cake, I would probably say I couldn't do that. I would be able to figure it out, but not for a first order."

Chocolate cake with peanut butter frosting is a favorite among her clients. Given her preference, though, she loves when people order chocolate cupcakes with a raspberry coulis or raspberry frosting in the middle. "That's my favorite because I would make extras and then I'd get to


eat them."

Faith manages her baking business while also taking up to nine dance classes a week at her mother's Lancaster, N.H. dance studio.

At home the family has aerial silks hung with a huge crash pad under it. She has balance beams and ninja lines to practice on. Last year, Faith tried out for America Ninja Warrior Junior and made it to the very last cut before she was let go.

In fact, Faith is so busy that she has transitioned to an online school so she has the flexibility to run her business, dance, and anything else she sets her mind to.

took me on a date to look at the stars in the middle of a cornfield in Barnet. It was so sweet."

The Langleys had already been together for eight years without getting married, so Alicia assumed a proposal would never come.

"It's a conversation we'd had over the years because we'd been together so long," she said. While she wanted something like a promise ring to demonstrate their commitment, Connor didn't believe in it. "He always told me it was stupid."

Then one morning when they were in the kitchen, he said he wanted to spend their lives together. "He pulled out a ring," Alicia remembers. "And I responded, 'You got me a stupid ring!'"

Dress shopping

TAYLORS

"I have worn a dress four of five times in my life total. I refused to spend money on my dress because I knew I would never wear it again. I ordered from a third-party website and then had it altered. In total I spent about \$160 on my dress.

We got bridesmaid dresses for a friend's wedding there before, so I was familiar with how their sizing works. I sized up so that if anything happened it would still be okay. In the end all that needed to happen was it needed to be shortened. I'm 5'9" but it's for a 6'2" woman."

LANGLEYS

"We went to Needleman's in Newport. I tried on as many dresses as they allow you to, then left to have lunch without having decided. The woman stayed open for me and kept the two dresses in the dressing room for me.

When we went back, I told her that I loved the top of one and the bottom of the other. She grabbed another dress and said, 'Why don't you try this one?' I put it on and we all cried. It was super light and had pockets! And then it turned out it was on clearance.

Help your venue help you

Resort they continue to make it look beautiful.

We asked Director of Sales Susan Scheibenpflug about what couples should be thinking about when touring venues, as well as one innovation couples have been employing in the age of COVID.

What's your budget?

Scheibenpflug recommends being clear on your budget before setting up an appointment with the venue.

"We can build an event around what their budget is," she said. "We can look at a la carte menu options, or maybe help them with adjusting their guest count to fit within their budget."

While the average couple spends about \$15,000 for a 150-person wedding at Burke, they've done small weddings for 20 people that came in closer to \$3,500.

What's your vision?

You'll also be ahead of the game if you come to your meeting with an idea of what you want your wedding to look and feel like.

Do you want an indoor reception with an outdoor reception? Everything inside and safely protected from the weather? Or perhaps you want your wedding to happen on the trails with your wedding party on skis beside you.

Whatever you want, Burke can make it happen.

"What is the theme they're trying to achieve?" Scheibenpflug asked. "Look on Pinterest and get lots of ideas before they come, because we

can help them achieve that, but we need to know what their thoughts are so we can put them in the right space."

What's included?

Black

When you're speaking with a venue, be sure to ask what's included with the rental. Do they provide tablecloths? Servers? Water pitchers?

At Burke, a lot is included in the base package, and then there are many options to add on.

"Our packages come with the ceremony site, either outdoors or indoors, your reception site, and your cocktail hour," Scheibenpflug said. "It also includes all your linens, tableware, flatware and glassware. A lot of places you have to rent that separately, but ours is all included."

The meal is also included, as are the bartenders and servers. You can bring your own cake from a licensed caterer.

The couple also gets a complimentary stay in the bridal suite the night of their event.

"Everything is included in the package, and then they just pick whatever level package they want. And there are plenty of add-ons to include, like doing an open or cash bar," Scheibenpflug said. "We have the facilities to do every aspect, from allowing their guests to stay, to a welcome party, to a brunch the day after. We can follow them all the way through an entire weekend."

Virtual guest

"We've had some interesting events where people prepare Zoom for their ceremony and part of the reception so people [who can't travel during COVID] can participate virtually," Scheibenpflug said.

While the venue is prepared to provide any A/V needs people might have, she said that most people are Zoom-savvy enough now that they do it themselves.

"I would suggest they have someone who is computer savvy to be the point person the day of the wedding," she said. "And it should be someone who is *not* in the wedding party."

Yes, that's a lesson learned from experience.

When planning to involve virtual guests, you'll want to have a clear itinerary and stay as close to the schedule as possible.

This allows you to turn the camera on for the most important parts of the day, but not subject those on Zoom to an hour of watching people eat. "Provide [virtual guests] with a whole itinerary," Scheibenpflug suggested. "Then people can come in to see what they want to see."

Minding their money

BERRYS

"Each receipt would come in and I'd store it in my book, but I found I lost track with the Amazon purchases. You don't think about the little things you spend to get our ring bearers their suspenders, that type of stuff.

Originally it was supposed to be around \$5,000. It ended up around 12 or 13. We ended up having to put a couple extra tables in, so the tent rentals went up a little bit. I originally budgeted one port-a-potty and we upgraded to a larger port-a-potty and a hand-washing station. We made improvements to what I originally envisioned."

TAYLORS

"Once we knew we weren't renting a venue, we knew we had some room to play with because it can be up to \$10 to \$12,000 for just the venue. And I didn't get a really fancy dress, so that's when we started to invite a couple more people that we might not have before.

Food was the biggest thing for us. We love food, so we wanted that to be stellar. The tent came with tables, chairs, dance floor, the lighting. That was the other biggest chunk of it. It was great because all those things were included and they put it up and took it down so we didn't have to do any crazy cleanup."

HOLBROOKS

"She had a list – DJ, photographer, tents. She basically had it all listed," Caleb said. "Yeah, I just had a notebook. We didn't really do a spreadsheet or anything. Everything adds up very quickly!" said Kirsten. "We wanted to splurge on food and the DJ. We got a photo booth, which was really fun and we have so many fun pictures to look back on. We were going to do an open bar, but that ended up being an insane amount of money."

"We did kegs, so that saved on alcohol."

BATHALON-PIERCE

"We tried to be logical, but we definitely went over budget," Erika said.

"We had connections that helped make it more inexpensive," Rene agreed.

"Our caterer gave us a really good deal because he was just starting out. Before us he had only catered one other wedding. He did a phenomenal job. My old boss owns a distillery, so St. Johnsbury Distillery did our bar service and treated us really well," Erika continued.

"The photographer was my math teacher in school," Rene said. "It was a hobby for her, but she does phenomenal stuff."

LANGLEYS

"I kept a binder and every time I paid for something, I put it in there and it had the total amounts in it. I also used an app so I knew what we were spending.

I made sure we had the venue,

food and DJ. I definitely went back and forth with the florist to go the cheapest I could and still get real flowers."

OUIRIONS

"We wanted a really good meal. We had done boirsin chicken and a filet mignon.

The bar was pretty enough, so we didn't do any decorations. We rented the table-cloths from the barn because I didn't need to buy 23 tablecloths."
