




The idea had been planted. Next was planning a costumed wedding to be held on Oct. 31. It turned out to not only be fun, but good for their budget as well.


"It was fun because it was a bunch of adults having fun like little kids." Kim said.

I still have the old one that I need to get rid of.




And then the original date came and went. (See Page 12.) The weight fell away.

Flowers, tablecloth colors, seating charts - these are the preoccupations of many brides in the weeks and months leading up to their wedding.

Courtney Vashaw, 38, and Jessie Lanham, 33, of Whitefield, N.H., had very different preoccupations as they thought about getting married: surgeries, radiation appointments, legal documents.

The two women had been talking about getting married for about a year when Courtney was diagnosed with a rare and ag-

Courtney reads the vows Jessie wrote for her. "We gave them to each other and we read them after the ceremony," Courtney said.


Courtney said. "We just didn't have that kind of time to be able to plan a big anything. And not a lot of energy to do that either."

They were traveling to Hanover and New York for various appointments and surgery, plus daily radiation appointments in St.

"I was spent," Jessie admitted. "And I was still working. And I was going with her almost every day to radiation."

Despite the time and energy crunch that made planning a traditional wedding impossible, there were some more pressing realities on the horizon. "As we got closer to that second surgery date, there were all of these logistics of writing a will and getting prepared for something that was potentially really scary," Courtney said. "I absolutely love this person more than I have ever loved anyone in my life, other than the one who came out of me [Courtney's son, Sterling]. I want this spiritual union thing to happen. But legally and logistically, I'm a realist as well. And I wanted to make sure that she was protected and that our relationship was protected in a legal sense before going in for surgery in September. So that left a pretty small window."

During their Aug. 18 trip to New York for her final pre-surgical appointment, Courtney turned to Jessie with an idea. "I was like, you know, we can totally get married this weekend!" Courtney



said with a chuckle.

"She wasn't kidding," Jessie said with an answering smile.

They started talking through details - most importantly, what was the weather going to be like that weekend?

"We got home on Friday from New York and we're going through all the logistics of the surgery with my parents and trying to plan everything," Courtney said. And then she popped the big question: "Oh, and by the way, what are you guys doing Sunday? They're like, Why? And I'm like, Well we're going to get married."

The only missing link on the date was that Courtney's brother, who had just gotten married himself, was still away on his honeymoon. But everything else pointed to this being the right day. Including that it is Jessie's grandmother's birthday, which was very special to Jessie.

They called upon their friends to help - one friend got an online reverend certificate so she could officiate the ceremony. Another took pho-

The ceremony was held at Martin Bridge Park in Marshfield, Vermont, in the middle of a circle of rocks. There's a covered bridge down the path in case it rained, but luck was on their side for weather.

"I ended up with a sunburn!" Jessie said.

They had designed their rings online several months earlier when Courtney was diagnosed, so those were ready to go. There were other small wedding details that they'd been putting together for months - things like ordering Chuck Taylor shoes in their favorite colors for the reception. There definitely wouldn't be a reception this time around, but the shoes would make an appearance. "Those shoes are too cute to not wear!" exclaimed Courtney.

Neither woman went to her own high school prom, so they refer to the reception - which will

happen at some undetermined time when Courtney has enough energy to dance the night away as their "prom."

Ultimately, they were happy with separating the ceremony from the reception. "I'd been to a lot of big weddings and weddings with a lot of pomp and circumstance and that wasn't really us anyway. And we had been talking all along, if we do our prom, do we want the wedding to be something separate anyway? Something that's pretty intimate and just ours? So the timing made the decision for us.'

Besides, they said, they're not eager for the gifts that come with a traditional reception. "We're adults. We have an established house. We don't need anything," Courtney said. "If you feel like you need to do something, supporting a few of the organizations that we really care about and maybe even finding a way to turn it into a

fundraiser and a fun thing that gives back, rather than getting more stuff. We don't need more

"We don't need a toaster," agreed Jessie. "But my dancing shoes are getting anxious!"

They continue to do special little things to prepare for their "prom," things that help them to focus on something fun amongst ongoing medical appointments. "We've been putting together a playlist for at least a year," said Courtney. **Love When Time Is Finite**

After our formal interview, Courtney sent an email sharing more about how her relationship with Jessie has grown and deepened through cancer.

"Even before I was sick, I loved her so much it sometimes hurt: my face would hurt from smiling or that place in your chest that is not your heart, but should be, would ache with joy. Now we have experienced the reality of potentially losing each other, and that hurt takes on an entirely different quality. She has been a cheerleader, wound dresser, and the ultimate shoulder to cry on, as well as my partner and love. I can't tell you how many times we have cried, how many times we have wished and prayed for a long life together - just the chance to be cute little oldsters together. Love like this hurts, but for all the best reasons.

While the actually ceremony was planned quickly, the commitment was not. We have known it was the right decision for some time, but when time is suddenly finite, you don't waste it. You don't fret over linen colors or flowers, you don't worry about that perfect venue that is booking two years out. You do what is essential, and that is proclaim your love, and luckily, we live in an age where we can make it legal."

"Adding songs to the playlist, that's a fun thing. ... They're all things that are meaningful to us and that are part of our journey as people and as a couple. Like designing rings, picking out cool shoes - those are the fun things. We didn't have a lot of time to focus on picking the right napkins."

"The cancer journey has been a killer for time frame, but I think it aligns your priorities," Courtney continued. "I want to spend the rest of my life with this person, no matter how long my life is."
