

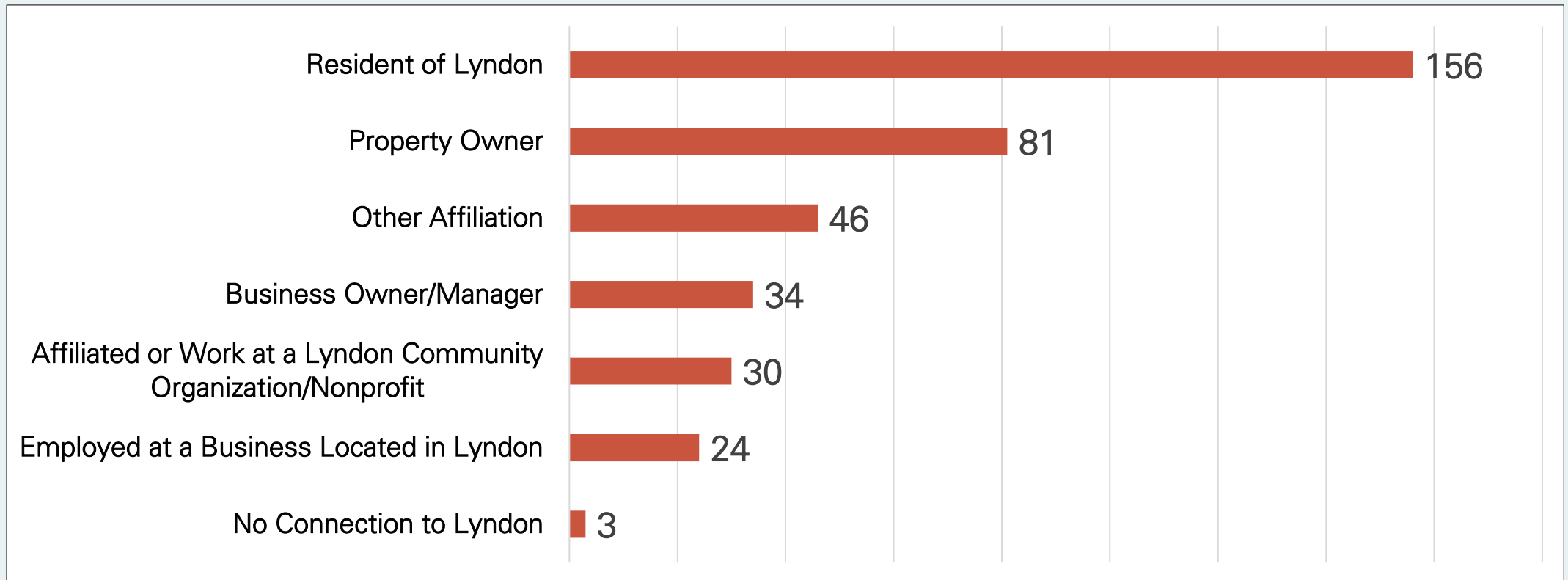

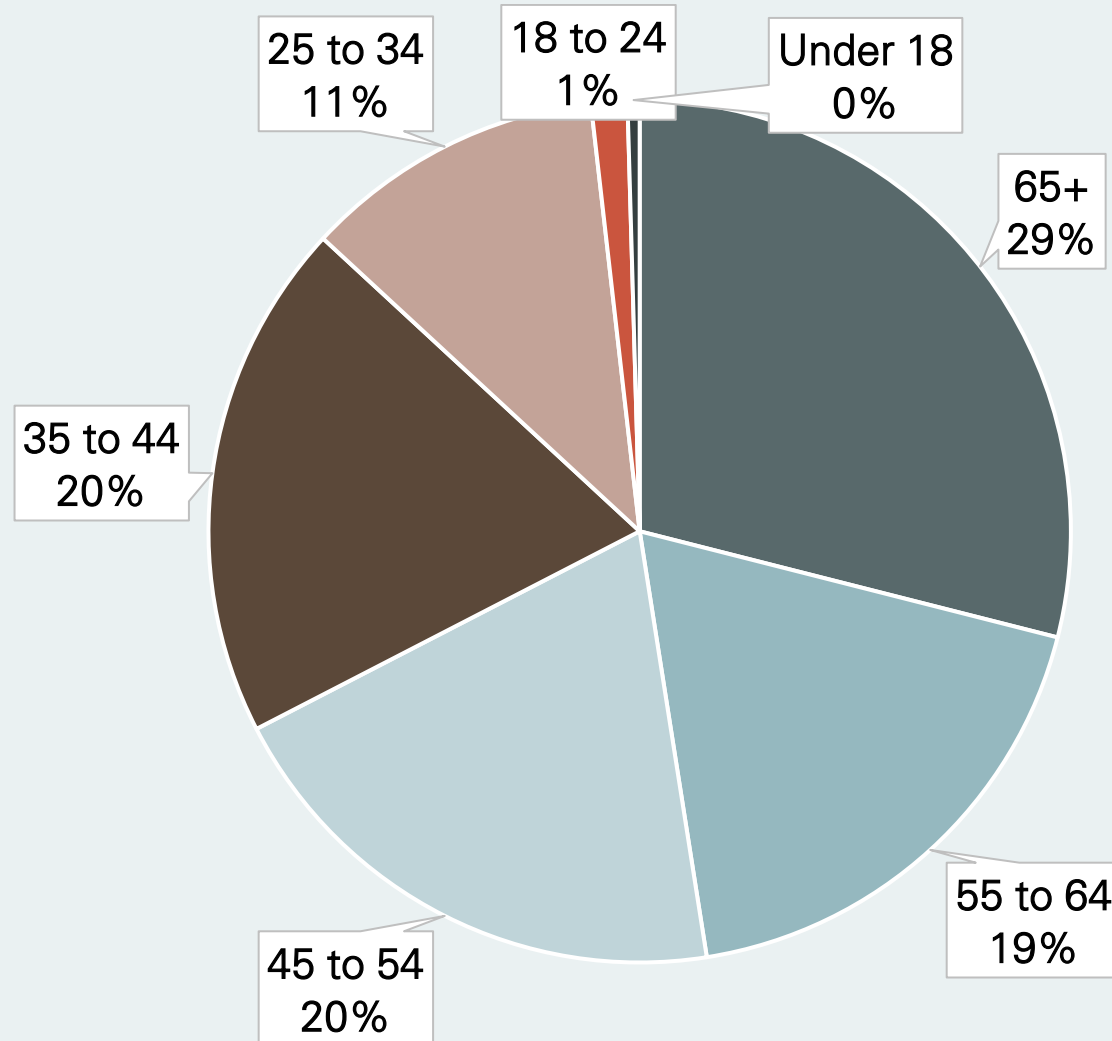
Community Engagement

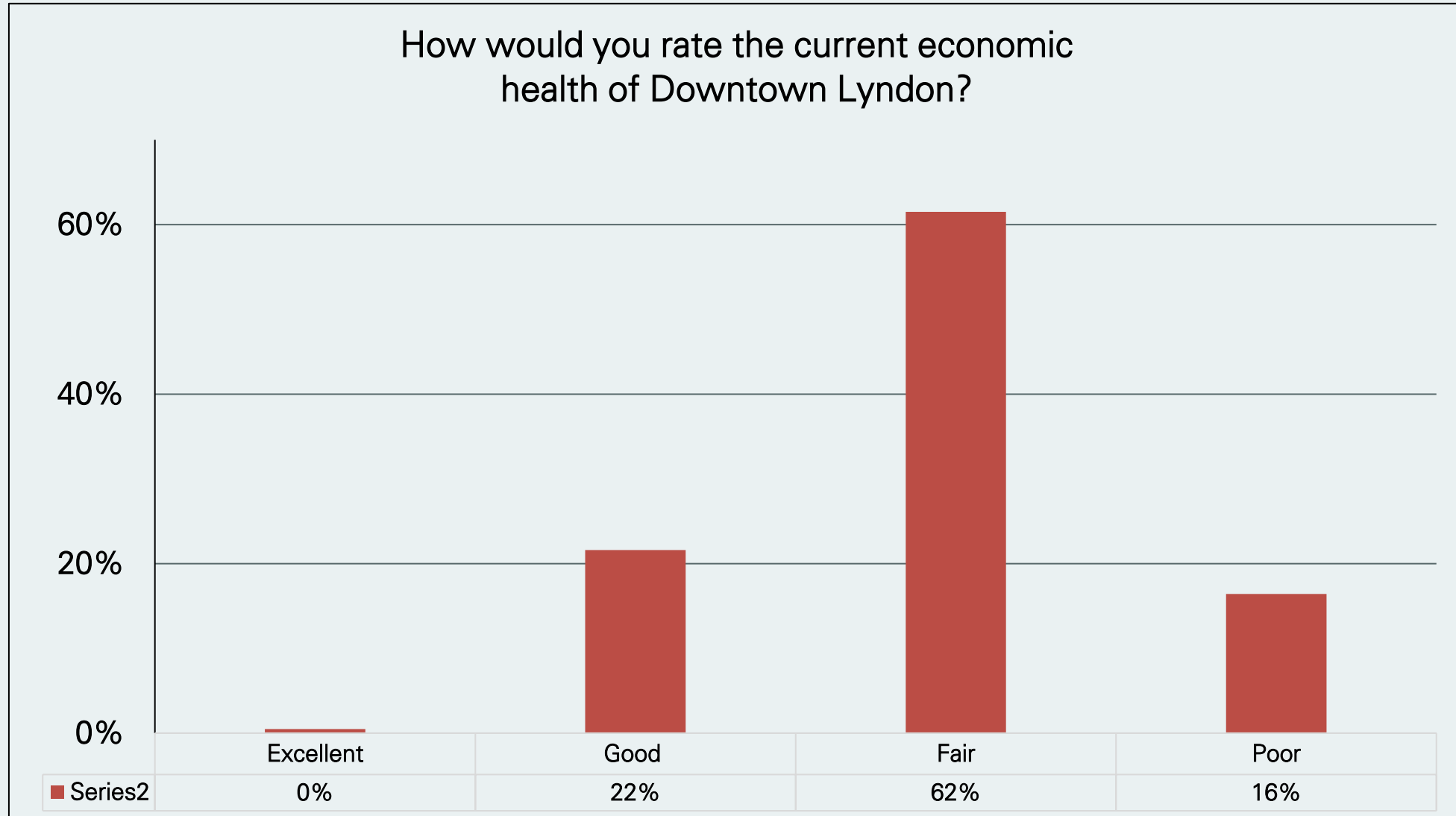
Respondent Demographics

Of the 221 respondents, individuals span the following diverse age ranges:



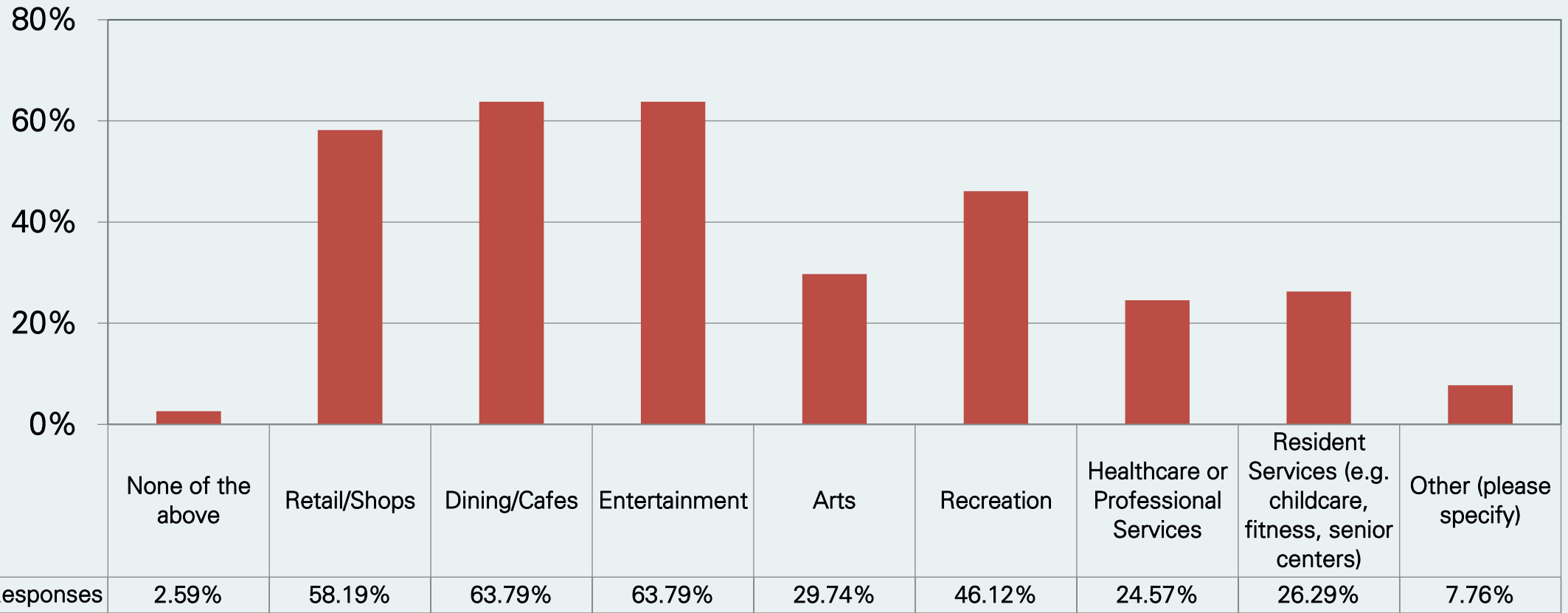

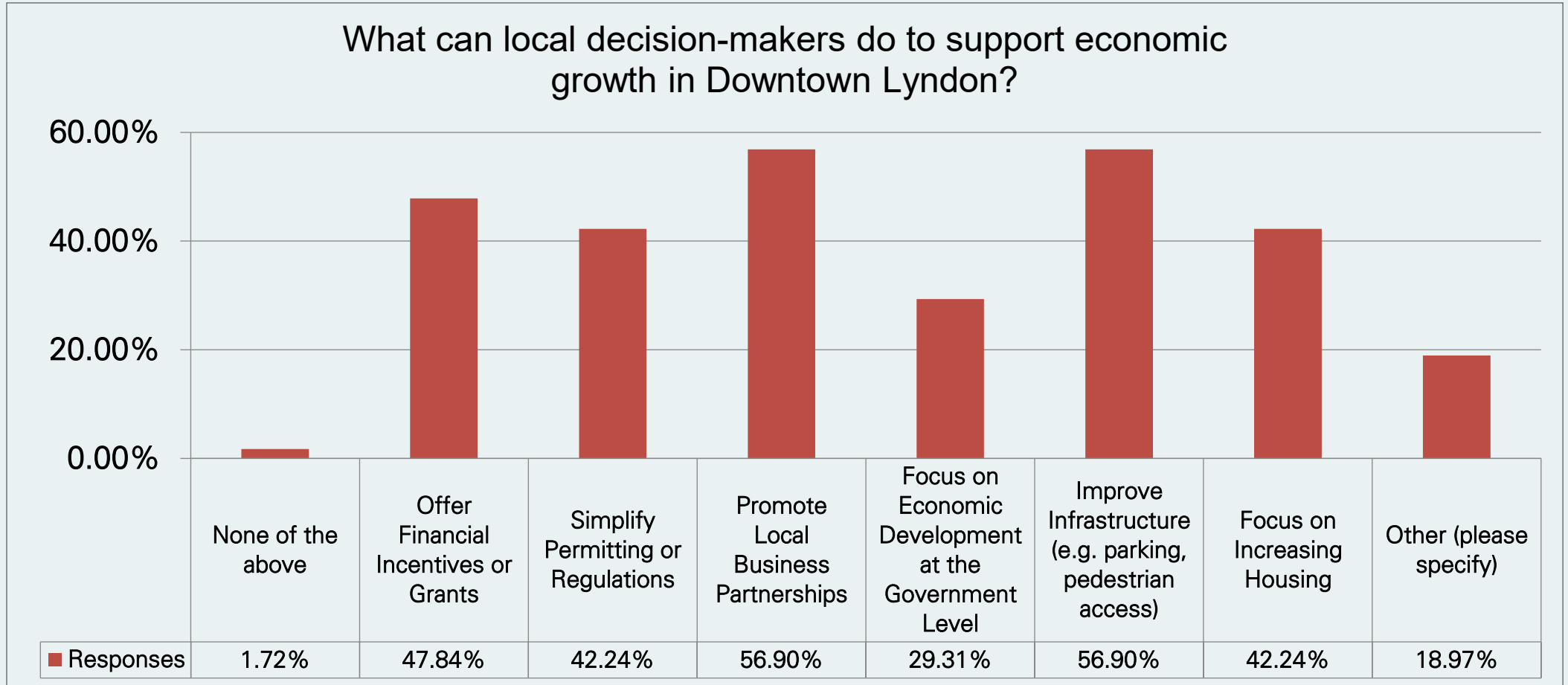

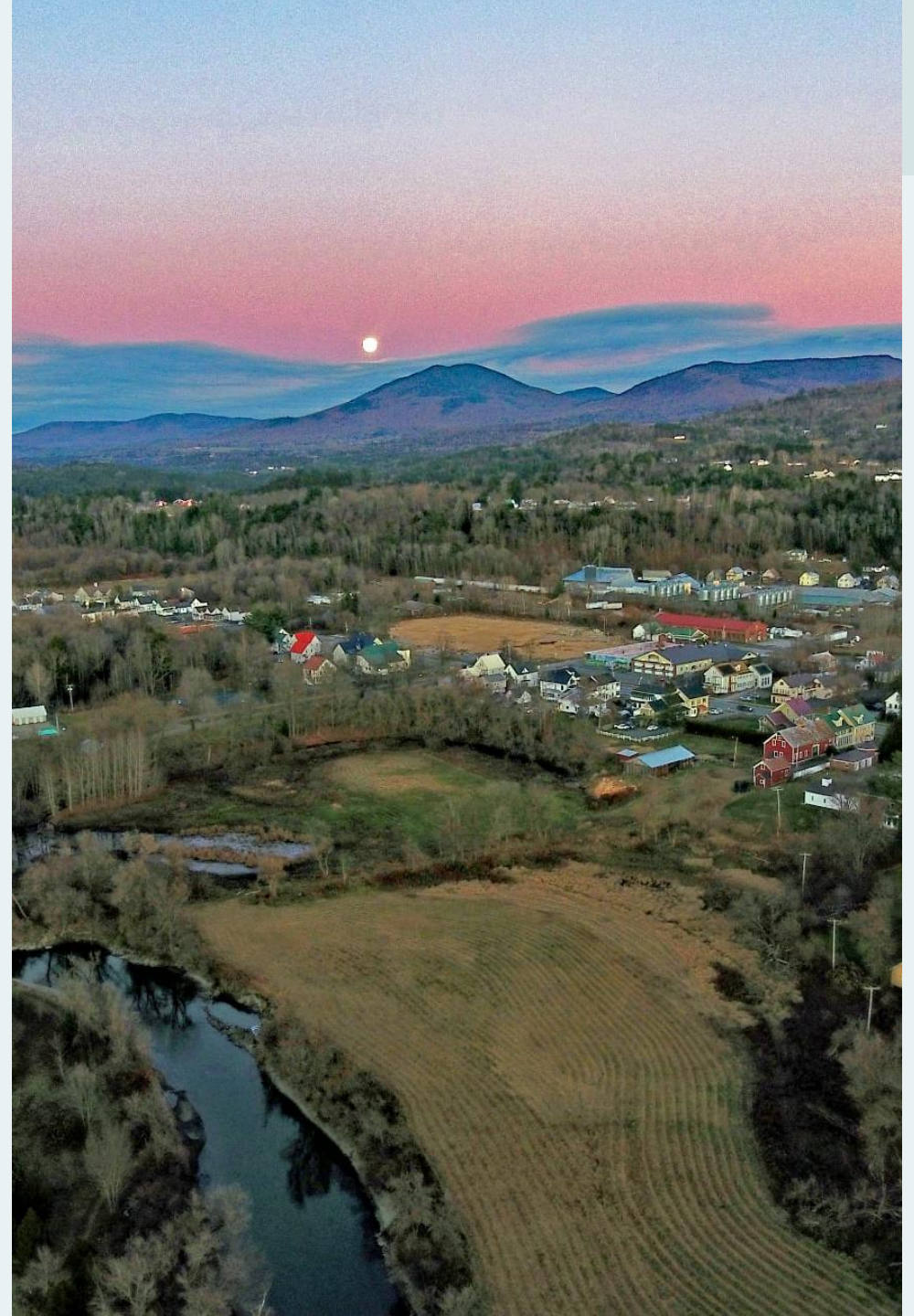

1. Walkability & Infrastructure

- Activate parks and public spaces

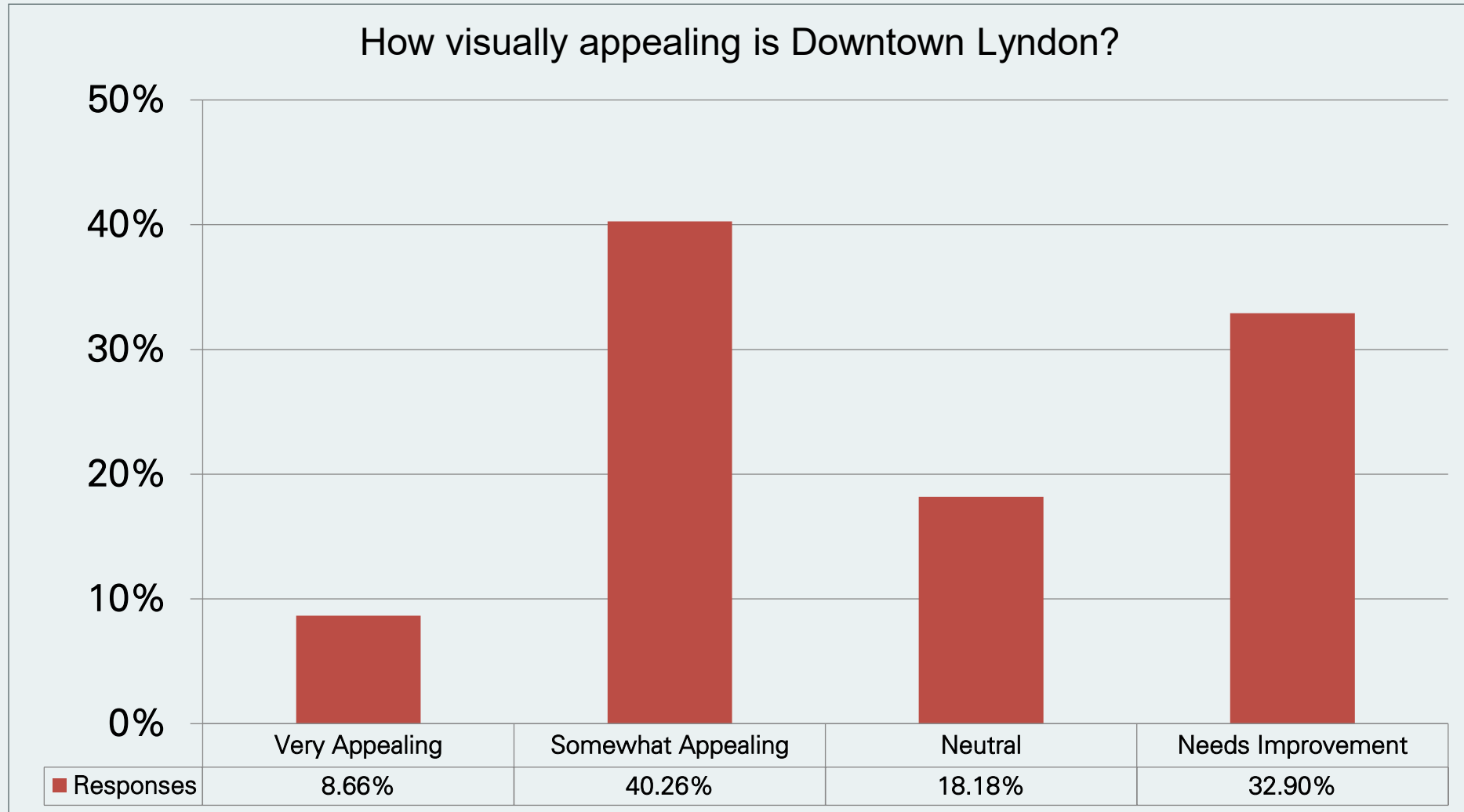


5. Business Climate & Regulations

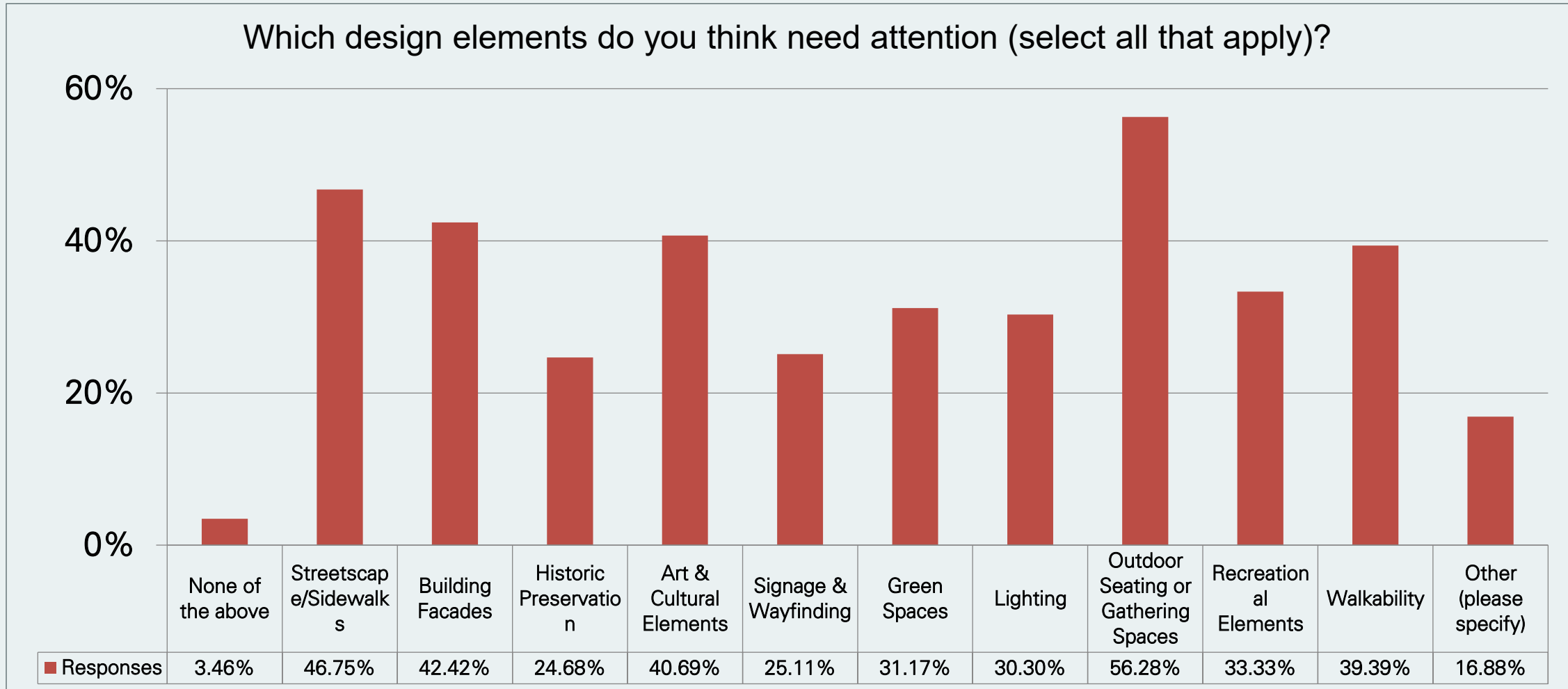
- Concerns with zoning and signage rules

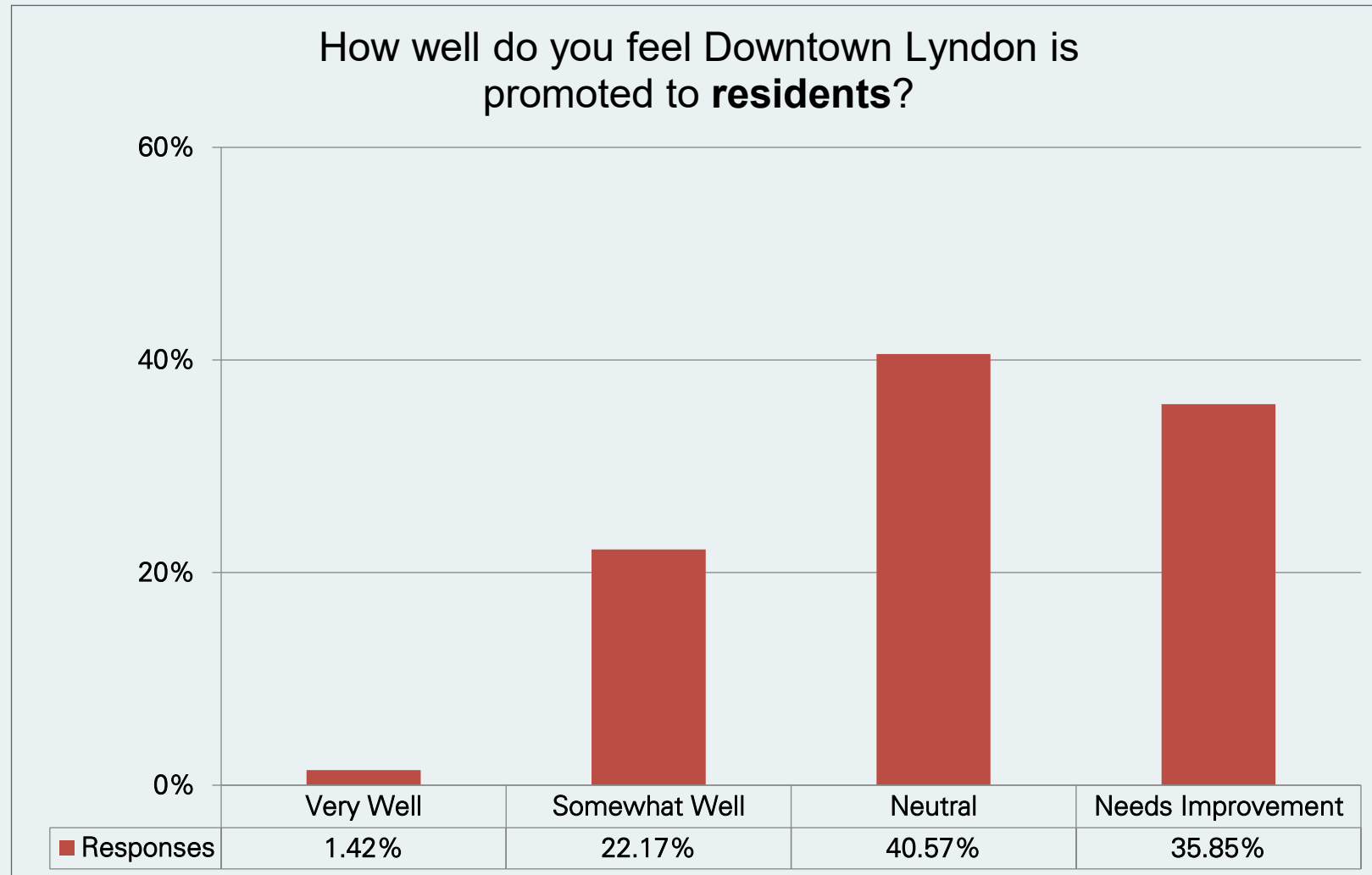

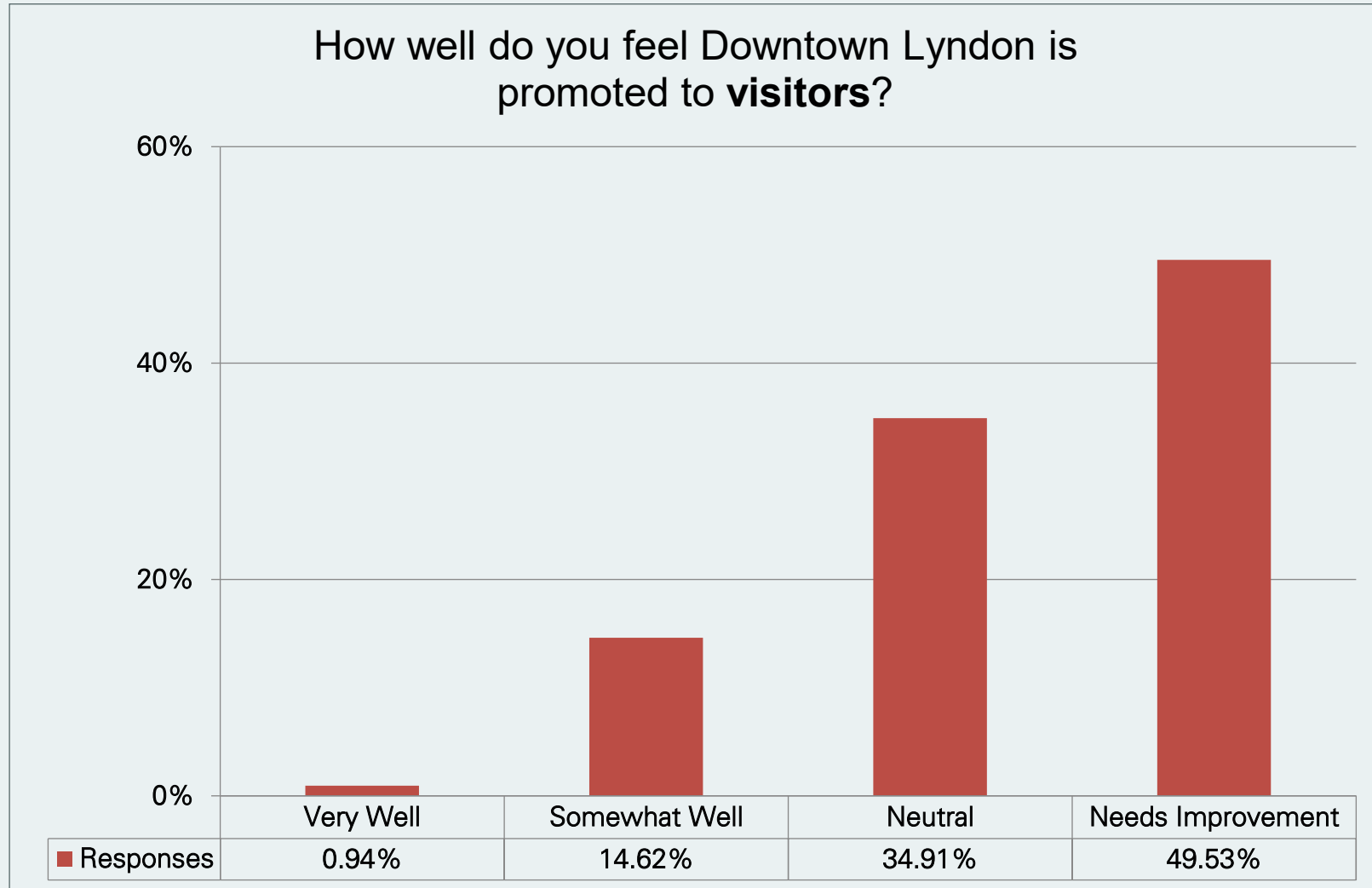

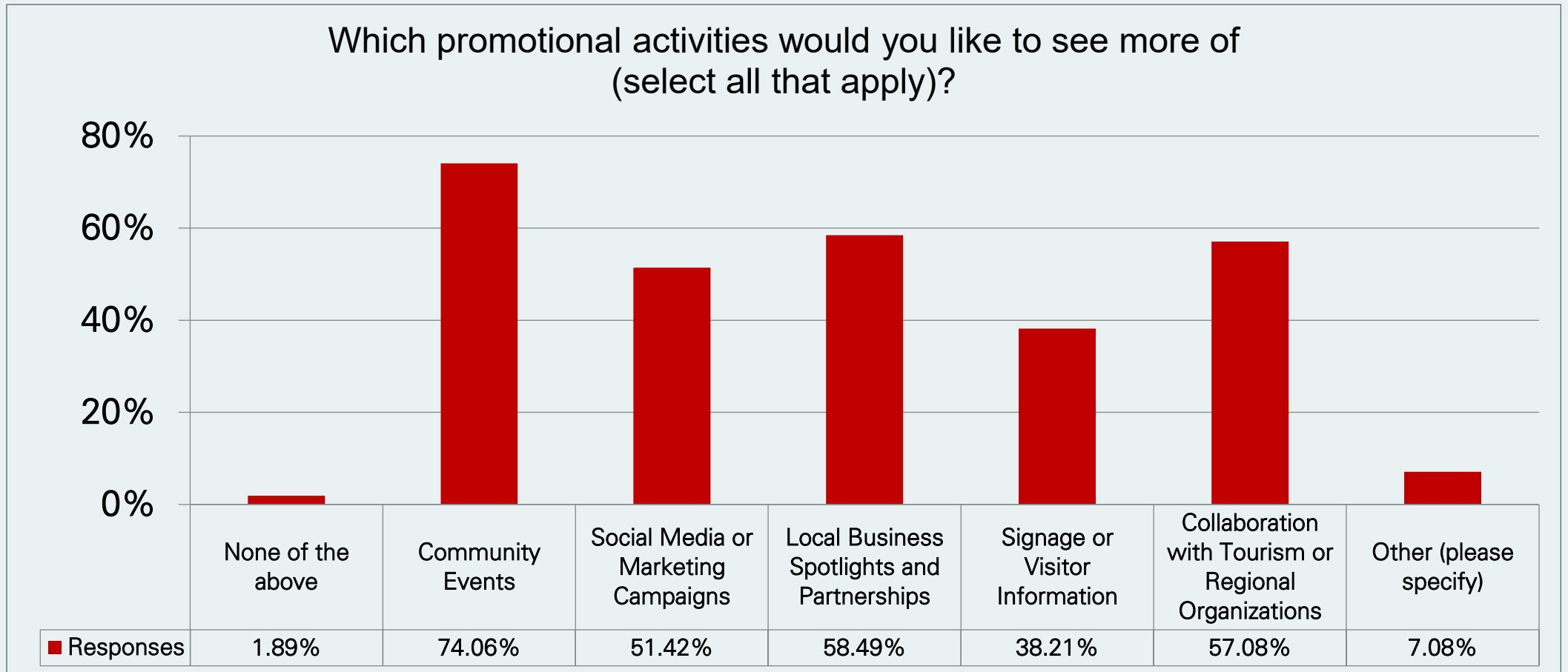
Downtown Promotion - Residents



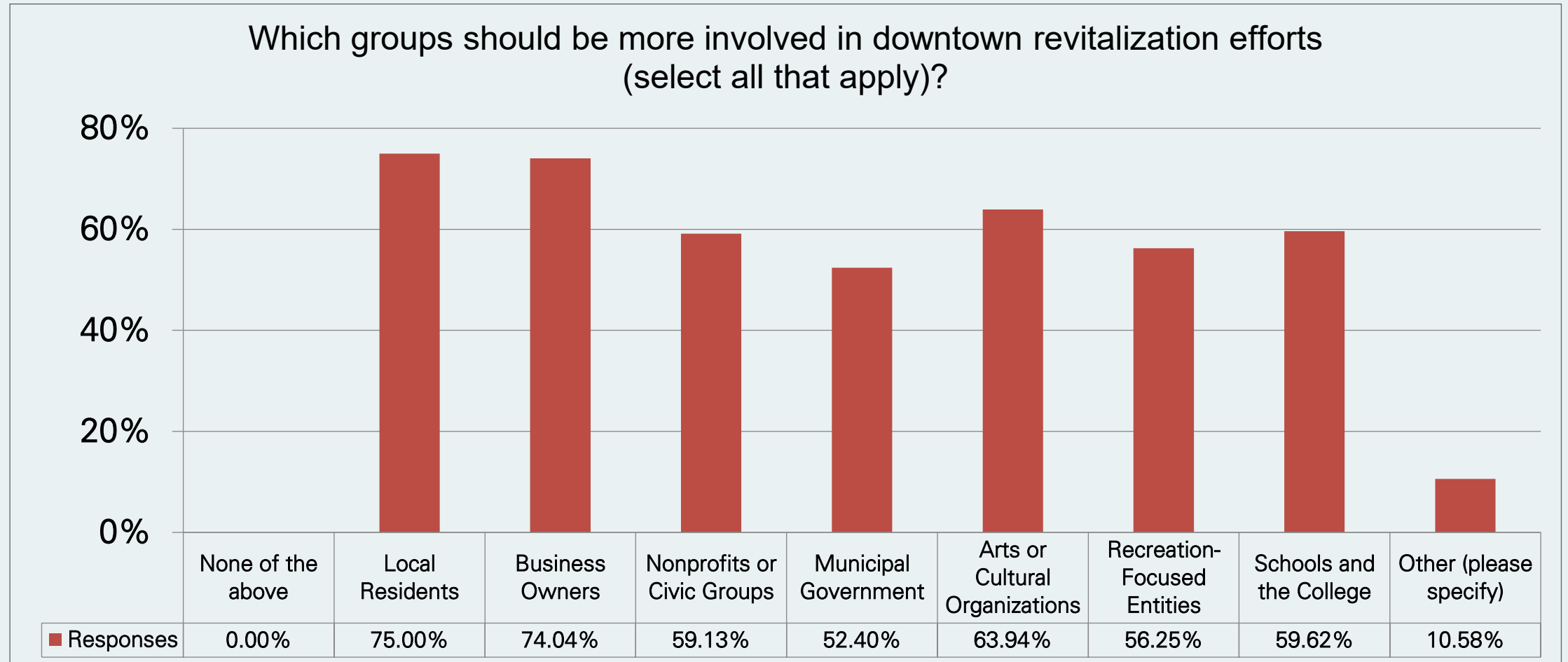
Downtown Promotion - Visitors



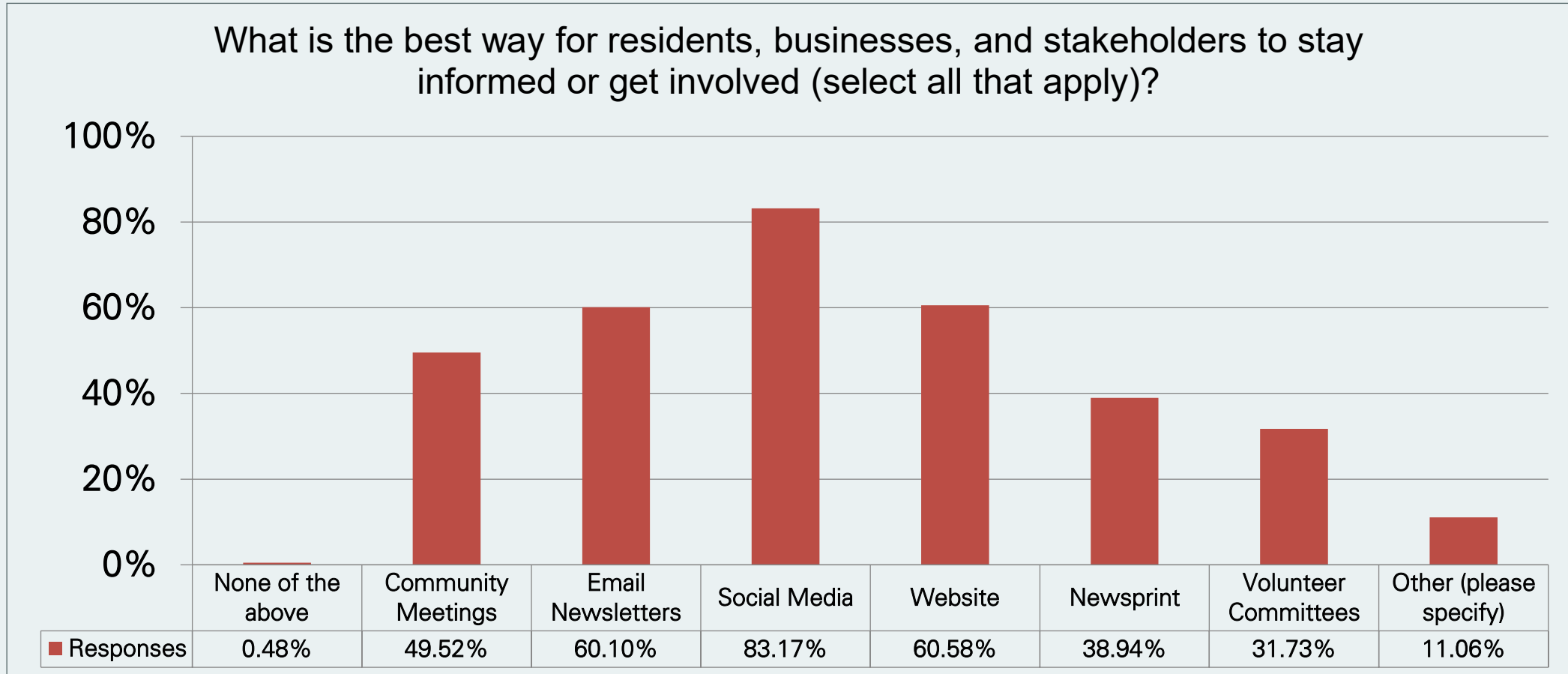

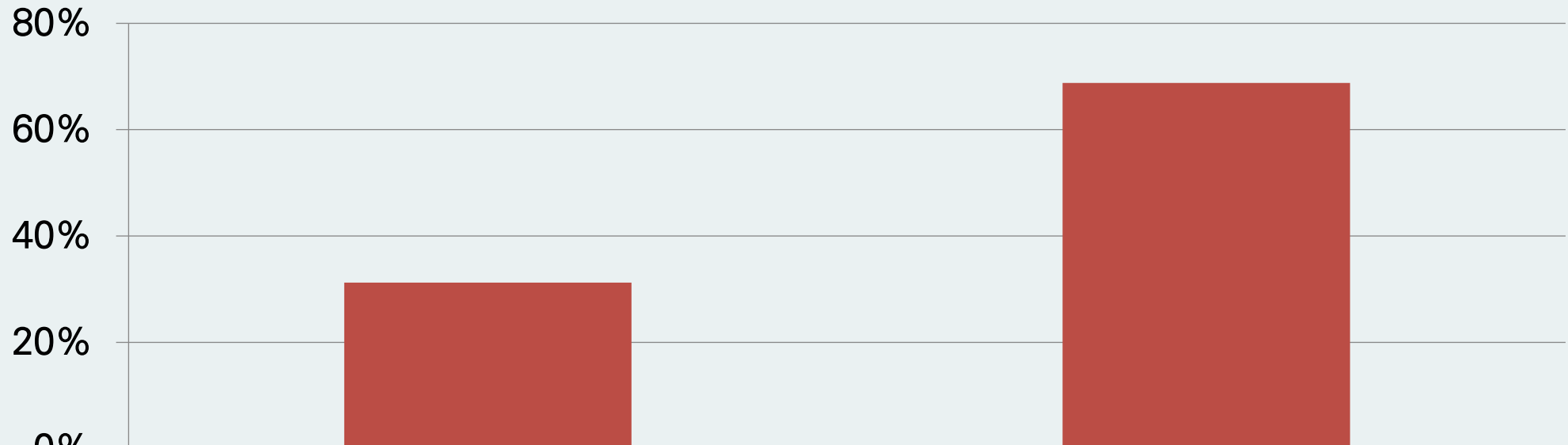
