Re: Notice of Resignation and of Intention Not to Seek Contract Renewal as Head Football Coach

Dear Mr. Coco:

Since 1997 I have served as the head football coach for Jackson Preparatory School. During that period it has been my honor and privilege to help to build, and to be associated with, a high school football program with a sustained track record of success that is unmatched in Mississippi.

I am not motivated by pride to make that statement. I am instead inspired by the pleasures and satisfactions of reflecting upon the good fortune that I have enjoyed by coaching innumerable talented, hard-working, and competitive athletes, and by helping them to attain their goals as individuals, on and off of the field, over the course of more than two decades. My sense of honesty requires me to freely admit that I learned more from them than they did from me. The rewards of these relationships truly became magnified over time, as they transformed and strengthened into cherished, enduring, and loyal friendships.

When I think about the sacrifices made by our players' families, and of the unwavering support that they provided to our program over the years, I cannot help but to smile, and to be moved by my appreciation, awe, and respect for them. I also reflect with wonder upon the countless moments, shared with educators, administrators, and parents, as we remarked upon the personal growth, increased maturity, and deepening of character that we witnessed in the young men who played on Prep's football teams.

train together, they win together, they experience disappointments and losses together -- and the coaches, family members, faculty, administrators, and fans are with them, providing positive spirit and encouragement, every step of the way.
