FDOT answers U.S. 19 questions

New developments for stalled widening project

The abrupt halt to the U.S. 19 road widening project left residents in Homosassa and Crystal River wondering how long they'll be stuck dodging orange barrels and lane closures.

When will the project resume? Who will be the new contractor? Will we have to wait even longer for completion? When will all the road barrels go away?

Questions have abounded since Inglis-based D.A.B. Constructors surprised everyone by closing its doors, leaving road unfinished, including the much-delayed U.S. 19 one going through Homosassa and Crystal River.

Kris Carson, spokeswoman for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), supplied some answers about what's been done so far and what's to come:

Q: What is the FDOT's plan to complete the U.S. 19 widening project?

A: The FDOT projects have contract bonds issued by surety companies, which are now procuring completion contractors, she said.

Once those contracts are awarded, completion dates can be better determined. The FDOT and contractor will then agree on a schedule to end the project.

Q: What is the expected time frame for FDOT to replace D.A.B. with a new contractor?

Olympian a true 'Florida Man'

Takes airboat ride in Dunnellon

DUNNELLON — When NBC needed a location that would represent authentic Florida for a background segment on seven-time Olympic gold medalist Caeleb Dressel, Dunnellon was the spot.

In the spring, the network arranged for Dressel to pay a visit to Capt. Bob's Airboat Tours in Dunnellon to bolster his "Florida Man" bona fides. When the piece aired during the Olympics coverage, "Capt. Bob" Jewett's phone blew up.

"A buddy of mine in Colorado called me and said, 'Man, I sat down, and I seen you on the Olympics and about passed out.'"

"I'm thinking he's making fun of me. He knows I'm not in the Olympics with the state I'm in."

Jewett later received a link to the video — <https://tinyurl.com/2p5csjtw> — of him giving one of his signature tours to the Olympic champion and Dressel's wife, Meghan, and was stunned.

"I honestly forgot about it," Jewett said, "and I didn't think they were going to actually show it during the Olympics."

"I was pretty impressed. It was pretty cool."

In the video, Dressel describes his love for the weirdness of Florida, which has inspired the popular meme, Florida Man. Dressel is originally from Green Cove Springs and was an NCAA champion at the University of Florida.

"THIS is Florida!" Dressel could be heard yelling over the airboat fan in the video.

Dressel jokingly admitted Capt. Bob's ride was faster than his own world-best swimming speed.

"Capt. Bob was like, 'Yeah, we're going about 50 mph. That's not what we expected,'" Dressel said. "I can't really compare swimming to launching on an airboat, but I think it definitely increased my Florida Man stats."

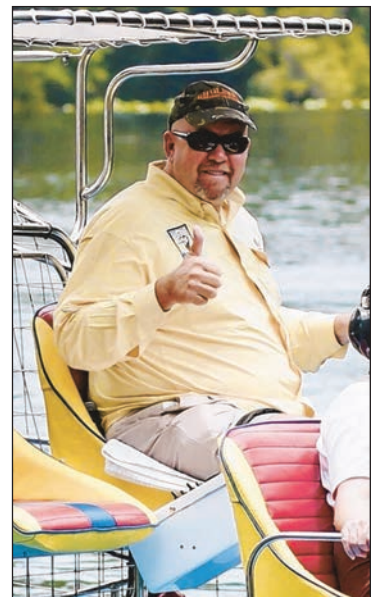
"I drive the airboat like that pretty much every time I drive it," Jewett told the Riverland News. "I give everybody a good

ride, and I gave him a good ride. He'd never been on an airboat, and he absolutely fell in love with it."

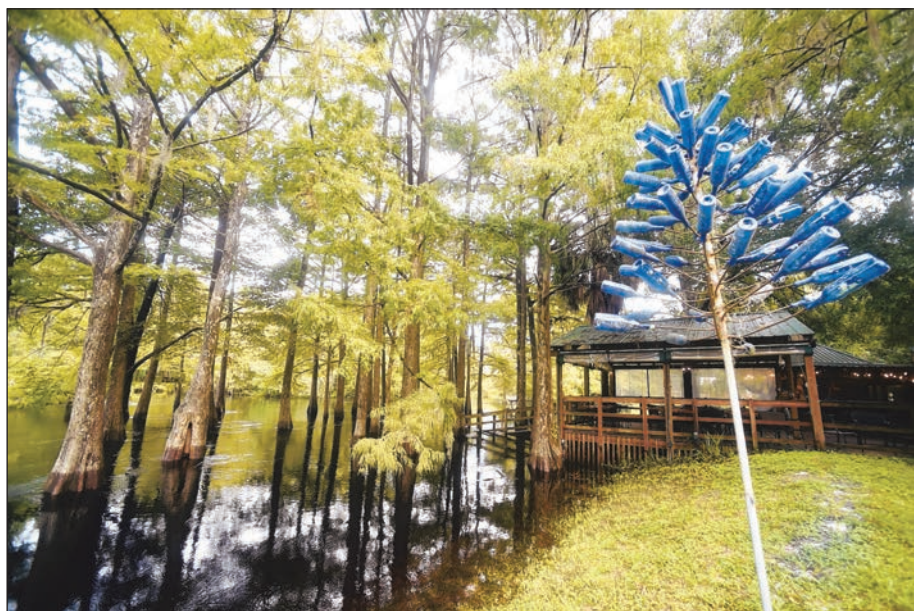
Jewett's tours cover mostly the Withlacoochee River, while he also shows passengers the clarity of the Rainbow River. He's owned the airboat business since 2007 and has owned Angler's Resort since 2008 and the Blue Gator since 2009. They're located at the south tip of Dunnellon, across the street from City Hall.

Lake, river levels high

This summer has been one of the wettest in recent memory, and lake and river levels throughout Citrus County remain high.

Parts of Arrowhead Estates, at State Road 200, are still seeing significant flooding, according to the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD). All three pools of the Tsala Apopka lake chain are still high.

"The water control structures remain open, moving water out of the lakes to help get them back down to their

normal high levels," said Dr. Mark Fulkerson, SWFWMD's chief professional engineer.

From the Green Swamp downstream past State Road 200, there are no structures that can be opened to help lower river levels.

The Green Swamp is the headwaters for several of Central Florida's rivers, including the Withlacoochee.

"River conditions are naturally high right now, due to above average rainfall and are expected to remain high throughout the remainder of our wet season," Fulkerson said.

Lack of witnesses put cases at risk

Floral City man faces first-degree murder charge

State prosecutors' case against an 18-year-old Floral City man accused of attempted first-degree murder could be in peril.

The state appointed public defender, Charity Braddock, told Circuit Court Richard Howard that numerous attempts to talk with the victim and a witness failed and the two ignored Howard's order to appear in court Tuesday to explain why they are not cooperating. Braddock requested the witnesses to take depositions as to the events that led to the attempted murder charges against Vincent Irvin Jr.

Braddock asked Howard to strike the two witnesses and Howard obliged, setting a Nov. 29 trial date, but removing the two witnesses from the proceedings.

Assistant state attorney Nicholas Caporicci told Howard "I know they're out of the county," but couldn't

give Howard assurance he could produce the two.

Howard's decision means the prosecutors can continue with their case if they choose to but without the two witnesses. Prosecutors could appeal Howard's ruling.

Members of the Citrus County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) Major Crimes and Tactical Impact units arrested Vincent Irvin Jr. on

Nov. 5, 2020, on a warrant charging him with firing a weapon into a vehicle, aggravated battery and aggravated assault. The alleged shooting occurred Oct. 28, 2020.

Irvin posted bail Sunday on a \$25,000 bond a judge set while signing the warrant, according to the Citrus County Detention Facility.

Power restored to Florida counties after Tropical Storm Fred

Gulf Power, the largest utility in Northwest Florida, said Tuesday morning it had restored electricity to about 20,000 customers who lost power because of Tropical Storm Fred.

The utility said in a news release that "essentially all" customers had regained electricity, after outages primarily occurred in Bay, Washington,

Holmes and Jackson counties. It said the average customer had power restored in less than two hours.

Tropical Storm Fred made landfall Monday afternoon in the area of Gulf County's Cape San Blas with maximum sustained winds of 65 mph.

Man flees after crashing car, fighting off Florida trooper

ORLANDO — Authorities are searching for a man who fled into the woods after

crashing his car and fighting a Florida Highway Patrol trooper early Tuesday near Orlando.

The crash was reported around 5:45 a.m., and the driver got into an altercation with a trooper responding to the scene, according to Lt. Kim Montes.

The man was able to fight off the trooper and run into the woods, she said. The trooper

was taken to the hospital with minor injuries.

The highway patrol and the Orange County Sheriff's Office began searching for the man, but he had not been spotted by late morning, Montes said.

She advised drivers to use caution in the area until the man is captured.

County criminal cases move forward

Citrus County criminal cases made some progress Monday and Tuesday moving toward trial or settlement.

Circuit Court Judge Richard Howard scheduled an October hearing date after Aaron Cornelius Barrett, 30, who is charged with aggravated animal cruelty, declined prosecutor's offer of four years of probation and during that time no owning animals.

Barrett had a publicly appointed defender but told Howard he was planning to hire an attorney and wasn't interested in taking the offer.

The Citrus County Sheriff's Office arrested the Crystal River man on May 26, accusing him of letting his dog suffer from a broken bone for two weeks without seeking care.

Animal control officers found

the female pit bull terrier with an open wound and an exposed broken leg bone in a backyard without water or shelter.

According to Barrett's arrest report, Barrett told investigators that the dog got into a fight with another pit bull two weeks before.

He said he rinsed the canine's wounds, which had been infested with maggots, with water and injected it with penicillin he bought himself, according to the records.

Deputies arrested and charged a third-degree felony charge of animal cruelty.

■ Howard scheduled Oct. 20 as another court date and status update for Jose Dorta III, the Inverness 34-year-old and former Citrus County Fire Rescue firefighter accused of fatally beating his infant son.

Dorta's attorney, Michael Giasi, asked Howard for the continuance so

he could conduct more depositions and then meet with prosecutors.

Dorta is charged with child neglect and aggravated child manslaughter.

Citrus County Sheriff's Office deputies arrested Dorta on May 21, 2020, following a year-long investigation into the death of his infant son.

■ Howard set an Oct. 20 tentative trial or plea date for Carol Bonita Kelly, the Beverly Hills woman charged with sexually exploiting a girl in exchange for drugs.

Kelly was charged with using a child in a sexual performance, child neglect, unlawful use of a communication device and failure to report child abuse.

State prosecutors say that for three years Kelly threatened

and coerced the victim into taking nude photographs she'd then give to another defendant in exchange for prescription medication, money, nicotine products and electronics.

Kelly would also setup meetings between the girl and the other defendant, who'd then molest the girl.

Kelly's lawyer, Michael Blackstone, said his client might also have been a victim of the other defendant and was willing to cooperate with prosecutors in the two cases.

■ Judge Howard set a Dec. 6 trial date for a Crystal River man facing 13 charges of possession of child pornography. A pre-trial hearing is set for Nov. 27.

At issue is 58-year-old Wayne Adams who was arrested by Citrus County Sher-

iff's Office deputies on Oct. 9, 2020.

Acting on information received from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the sheriff's office high tech crimes unit was able to locate images of child pornography in electronic storage belonging to Adams, according to the sheriff's office.

Further investigation revealed the images had been uploaded from Adams' residence in Crystal River, according to the local agency.

Based on information developed during the course of the investigation, a search warrant was executed at Adams' residence by the sheriff's office. Multiple items were seized as a result of the search and will be examined in an attempt to locate additional evidence.

While the search warrant was being executed, detectives interviewed Adams, which Adams confirmed he utilized the internet to search for, download, and view images of child pornography, the sheriff's office agency media release stated.

Road reclamation project along Colonade in Inverness

Heavy equipment levels dirt Tuesday, Aug. 17, on Colonade Street near Whispering Pines Park in Inverness. The 1-mile long road, connecting State Road 44 and Forest Drive is open only for local traffic while construction continues. The road reclamation project, which began on July 19, includes the construction of approximately 0.15 miles of sidewalk along the north side of Colonade Street from the east driveway of First Christian Church to the existing sidewalk along East Gulf-to-Lake Highway. Associated stormwater improvements along with signage, striping and the installation of a four-way stop will improve traffic calming and safety to nearby residents. The project, which is expected to be completed by the end of September, cost \$208,000.

Commissioners selected to serve on committees

Commission Chair Scott E. Carnahan, Commissioner Holly L. Davis and Commission second vice chair Ruthie Davis Schlabach have been selected to represent Citrus County on several state and national committees in the upcoming 2021-22 fiscal year.

Carnahan will serve on the Florida Association of Counties (FAC) Agriculture and Rural Affairs (ARA) committee, as well as the Finance, Tax and Administration (FTA) committee.

Committee members are tasked to develop and recommend an annual statewide legislative platform for counties based on issue areas under their jurisdiction.

The ARA committee will consider and address issues regarding agriculture, rural development programs, rural infrastructure,

rural housing, fiscally constrained counties and food access.

The FTA addresses issues regarding taxation, local revenue, state shared revenue, economic development, local fiscal administration, local administrative and management issues, intergovernmental relations, public records, elections, ethics, Florida retirement system and utilities.

"I'm humbled and excited to have been chosen to serve on the Agriculture and Rural Affairs committee," Carnahan said in a news release. "Agriculture is very dear to my heart.

"I look forward to serving my fifth year on the Finance, Tax and Administration committee and working with my colleagues to draft good policy for our 67 counties."

Schlabach was also appointed to serve on the ARA committee, which is

tasked with developing and recommending an annual statewide legislative platform for agriculture, rural development and infrastructure, rural housing and food access-related issues.

"It is my honor to represent Citrus County," Schlabach said. "I will put my best foot forward and make sure that the state doesn't forget the needs of our citizens."

Davis has been selected to serve on the FAC Community and Urban Affairs (CUA) committee, as well as the National Association of Counties (NACo) Community, Economic and Workforce Development (CEWD) steering committee.

The CUA committee considers and addresses issues of growth management, development, planning, zoning, state and regional transportation, strategic intermodal

system issues and affordable housing.

The CEWD committee is responsible for all matters pertaining to housing, community and economic development, public works and workforce development, including the creation of affordable housing.

"I'm excited and honored to be selected for these committees so I can help influence legislation pertaining to economic development and affordable housing, that directly impacts us in Citrus County," Davis said.

"For example, when it comes to

workforce development and combatting generational poverty, one of our biggest impediments is the so-called 'benefits cliff' where lower-wage workers often net less income if they accept a promotion that comes with a higher wage," Davis said.

"This strangles an individual's professional and personal growth and keeps them on one or more public assistance programs rather than allowing them to advance as far as their talents and opportunities allow," Davis said. "Our voices must be heard to fix this."

Sudoku maker Maki Kaji, who saw life's joy in puzzles, dies

TOKYO — Maki Kaji, the creator of the popular numbers puzzle Sudoku whose life's work

was spreading the joy of puzzles, has died, his Japanese company said Tuesday. He was 69 and had bile duct cancer.

Known as the "Godfather of Sudoku," Kaji created the puzzle to be easy for children and others who didn't want to think too hard. Its name is made up of the Japanese characters for "number" and "single," and players place the numbers 1 through 9 in rows, columns and blocks without repeating them.

Ironically, it wasn't until 2004 when Sudoku became a global hit, after a fan from New Zealand pitched it and got it published in the British newspaper The Times. Two years later, Japan rediscovered its own puzzle as a "gyakuyunyu," or "reimport."

Kaji was chief executive at his puzzle company, Nikoli Co., until July and died Aug. 10 at his home in Mitaka, a city in the Tokyo metro area.

Maki traveled to more than 30 countries spreading his enjoyment of puzzles.

Sudoku championships have drawn some 200 million people in 100 countries over the years, according to Tokyo-based Nikoli.

Sudoku was also never trademarked except within Japan, driving its overseas craze, Nikoli said.

"Kaji-san came up with the name Sudoku and was loved by

puzzle fans from all over the world. We are grateful from the bottom of our hearts for the patronage you have shown throughout his life," the company said in a statement.

Originally, Sudoku was called "Suji-wa-Dokushin-ni-Kaguru," which translates to, "Numbers should be single, a bachelor." In recent years, Sudoku, believed to be the world's most popular pencil puzzle, has come out in digital versions.

Born in the main northern island of Hokkaido, Maki started Japan's first puzzle magazine after dropping out of Keio University in Tokyo. He founded Nikoli in 1983, and came up with Sudoku about the same time.

Yoshinao Anpuku, who succeeded Kaji as Nikoli's chief executive, said Kaji made friends

easily and had a "unique and playful approach toward life."

"Our mission is to pursue Maki's vision and possibilities," Anpuku said.

Nikoli has provided original puzzles to more than 100 media companies, 10 of them foreign ones.

Major Japanese newspaper Mainichi in its obituary credited Kaji for starting the puzzle sections at bookstores, as well as introducing the word "Sudoku" into the Oxford English dictionary.

Kaji is survived by his wife Naomi and two daughters. Funeral services have been held among close family. A separate memorial service is being arranged by Nikoli, but details were still undecided.

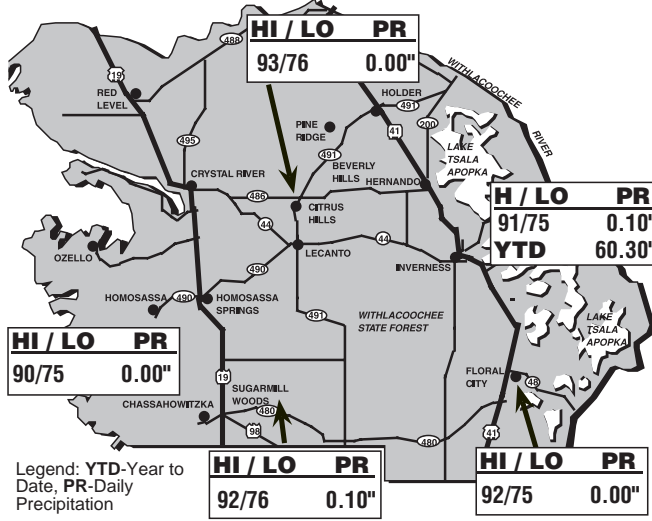

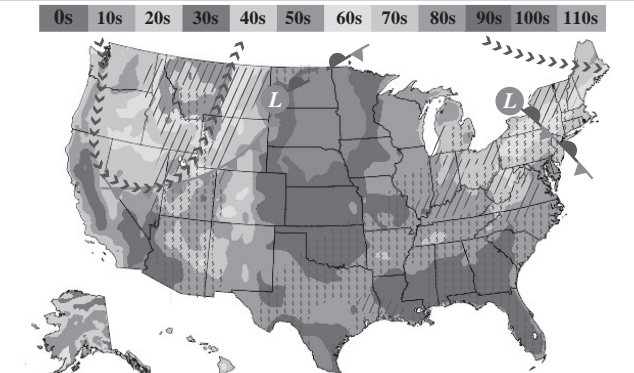

Task force recommends face masks for Miami-Dade students

FORT LAUDERDALE — Florida's largest school district will likely require students to wear face masks when classrooms open next week, following the recommendation of a task force of medical experts and defying Gov. Ron DeSantis' attempt to block mandatory face mask rules.

The Miami-Dade County School Board is expected to approve the measure on Wednesday. "My mind is pretty made up on the way to move forward," Superintendent Alberto Carvalho said.

Students in neighboring Broward County will also be wearing masks when they return for the fall semester on Wednesday, and people in both districts have been keeping an eye on the Tampa area, where classes started last week. The Hillsborough County School Board, which has not required masks in classrooms, scheduled an emergency meeting for Wednesday to discuss additional protections against COVID-19.

"We're at that place. It's unavoidable," board chairperson Lynn Gray said Monday.

Hillsborough's COVID-19 case count stood at 731

at midday Monday, nearly 20 times higher than it was after the first week of fall classes in 2020. On Monday, the district reported 5,599 students and 316 employees were either in isolation, having tested positive for COVID-19, or in quarantine, which means they had close contacts with a positive case.

Miami-Dade has the nation's fourth-largest school district with 334,000 students, while Broward is the sixth-largest district with 261,000 students. Both counties were hotspots before, but now the delta variant has spread across so much of Florida that the entire state is considered high-risk. On Monday, about 15,600 people were hospitalized with COVID-19 in Florida, nearly eight times more than in June, according to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

President Joe Biden called school district superintendents in Florida and Arizona last week to praise them for doing "the right thing" in defiance of executive orders from their governors. The Biden administration also promised federal money if DeSantis carries out a threat to withhold some state funds from districts imposing mask mandates.

Carvalho said he came to his conclusion despite criticism from some parents, noting that a 13-year-old student and four district employees have died of COVID-19 in recent weeks. Two teachers and an assistant teacher died from the virus last week in Broward County.

"I don't know what the threshold of acceptable pain in this community is. I don't know what the acceptable threshold or statistical probability of a single child dying is in this community," he said. "Just like I don't know what the threshold that anyone should accept as appropriate for teachers, custodial staff, police officers who may have underlying conditions ... who may be hospitalized, who may be intubated or who may perish."

The Miami Herald reported that school board members met virtually on

Monday and appeared to agree with requiring masks.

"Our children will be fine," said school board member Dorothy Bendross-Mindingall. "We're going to see to that."

In Palm Beach County on Tuesday the county commission declared a state of emergency as the number of people hospitalized with COVID-19 continues to strain hospitals.

The unanimously approved order allows the county to obtain data from hospitals that includes the ICU capacity and number of beds available for COVID-19 patients.

The daily reports will be posted online, which will also help "the public understand the critical situation we are in right now," Dr. Alina Alonso, director of the county's state-run health department, told the commission. "We are really at a very critical point."



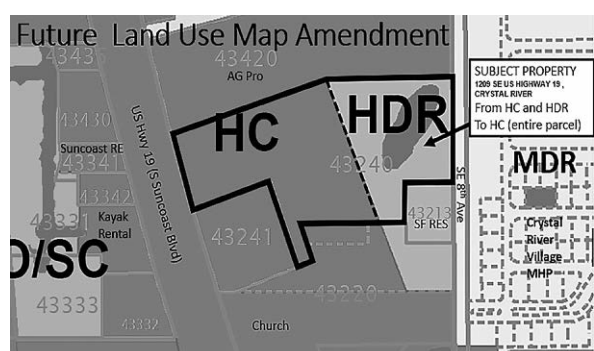

Judge won't close hearings in Florida school shooting case

ST. PETERSBURG — A Florida judge refused Tuesday to close pretrial hearings to the media and public in the case of the man accused of killing 17 people in a 2018 high school mass shooting.

Broward County Circuit Judge Elizabeth Scherer rejected a motion by defendant Nikolas Cruz's lawyers claiming that intense media coverage jeopardizes his right to a fair trial.

Scherer did not elaborate on her reasons for denial, saying she would detail them in a written

order later. But Dana McElroy, attorney for The Associated Press, said it was the correct decision.

"It allows access to all of the hearings and filings in this case of great public concern, which is both contemplated and required by the Constitution," McElroy said after the hearing.

Several media outlets, including the AP, ABC, CBS, NBC, Fox News and CNN had challenged the closure motion. Cruz's lawyers contended that open hearings might publicly reveal inadmissible evidence that will never be heard at

trial and that news coverage could otherwise create bias among jurors.

The Florida Supreme Court ruled in 1982 that pretrial hearings are presumed to be open in most circumstances and can be closed only when there are no alternatives available except moving the trial elsewhere in the state.

Cruz, 22, faces the death penalty if convicted in the Valentine's Day 2018 massacre at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida. Seventeen people were slain and 17 others wounded in that shooting.

A: There is a need, she said, to complete this project "in a timely manner."

"It is in the best interest for the surety to move quickly as they are still subject to delay penalties," Carson said.

Once the completion contractors are under contract, "we will have a better idea of new completion dates and will provide updates."

Q: What has been done along U.S. 19 to make it easier for motorists?

A: Non-essential traffic control devices (such as barrels) have been removed from the project, and mowing of the medians throughout the project is complete, Carson said.

Q: What about the faulty, unfinished drainage system at one of the pools along the route, which was causing untreated water to pour into the Halls River?

A: "Additional erosion control measures have been installed on the south end of the project on the eastside of U.S. 19 and immediately west along a creek leading to Halls River in order to harden the area against further erosion," Carson said. "Minor maintenance mowing is underway throughout the project."

Q: Will the new contractor hired to finish the job be held to the same contract terms as D.A.B.?

A: Yes.

Q: Who will maintain and be responsible for the job sites until a completion contractor takes over?

A: The surety is responsible and FDOT is responsible for ensuring the surety meets those obligations.

OUT OF WORK

About 400 D.A.B. Constructors employees lost their jobs when the company closed.

Many have since found other work, albeit out-of-county.

The Chronicle talked with two workers who were fortunate to find jobs and asked them to share their comments about that day they learned D.A.B. had shut down operations.

Kevin Thacker, 47, Beverly Hills

Kevin Thacker was a lead carpenter and operator on the Homosassa widening project.

He and other D.A.B. employees have found jobs with RIPA Construction in Tampa.

Despite the longer commute, the job pays more and, so far, is working out, Thacker said.

But between losing his job and starting his new one, Thacker and his wife caught COVID and had to quarantine.

Thacker said D.A.B. handled the matter badly. There was no prior indication that the company was closing.

"They didn't tell us anything," he said. "It was very non-professional for a company to be in business as long as they have to not even care about their employees."

Thacker said he got a call from his foreman on the weekend before the closing.

"He gave me a heads-up, 'Don't show up for work Monday and start looking for another job,'" he said.

Thacker said most of the D.A.B. employees on the

Homosassa road-widening project were hard-working. He put in 80-90 hours a week.

He believes D.A.B. over-extended itself.

"They definitely took on way too much," he said.

Trams, a pipe layer on the road widening project, showed up for work the day D.A.B. announced its closing and was greeted by his foreman who said there was an impromptu meeting called at the Crystal River yard.

Trams figured it was another safety meeting and didn't worry.

When he and the others got to the site, he noticed something seemed amiss.

"Everybody who worked on the Homosassa project was there," Trams said. "Nobody knew anything until the higher-ups started talking. They said: 'As of now, you guys are unemployed.' They didn't really give us any reason."

"I was shocked," Trams added. "I'm still in shock. I had all the intentions of making my career with this company."

Trams has since found a job at West to West Construction in Ocala and it's a good thing, he said. He was down to his last \$5.

Despite everything, Trams defends D.A.B. Constructors and said the owners were victims of circumstances: the pandemic caused severe delays of workers and supplies.

"I'm sorry they went out of business," he said.

RECORD RAIN

These numbers from the water district show how wet it's been in Citrus County?

■ From June 1 to Aug. 16, Citrus received an average 36 inches of rain. The historical average is 25 inches.

■ Citrus County got 11 inches of rain in June, 12 inches in July, and over 13 inches so far in August.

■ From January through August, Citrus has received about 48 inches of rain – the highest amount of any of the 16 counties encompassing the water district.

■ That 48 inches is more rain than Citrus received in all 12 months of 2020 (46.5 inches).

■ If Citrus County receives an average rainfall for the remainder of the year, it will reach about 64 inches, 10 inches above average for the year.

TSALA APOPKA CHAIN-OF-LAKES

All three pools of the Tsala Apopka Lake Chain are still very high, due to continuous rainfall this summer, Fulkerson said.

The district's water control structures remain open, moving water out of the lakes to help get them back down to their normal high levels.

The Inglis Main Dam, opened in early July to send excess water out of Lake Rousseau, is also open.

Fulkerson said water levels on the west end of Lake Rousseau remain about 4-6 inches lower

than normal, due to high water conditions upstream near Dunnellon.

GIVE ME A BREAK

Citrus Countians are weary of almost-daily thunderstorms and recent tropical storm threats.

Fortunately, it looks as if the rain will take a break for a bit.

"A little tropical reprieve (is) coming as (Tropical Storm) Fred is moving away and Tropical Storms Grace and Henri are of no threat to our area," according to the National Weather Service.

Citrus can expect the normal weather pattern for now: plenty of sun in the morning and afternoon storms.

Amid new virus surge, Florida skeptics reconsider vaccines

CALLAHAN — In a rural stretch of northeastern Florida where barely half the people have gotten a coronavirus shot, Roger West had no problem telling others he was “adamantly anti-vaccination.”

The co-owner of the Westside Journal weekly newspaper used his voice as a columnist to widely share his doubts about the vaccine and his mistrust of the health experts in the U.S. who have been urging everyone to get it.

“I do not trust the Federal Government,” West wrote recently. “I do not trust Dr. Fauci, I do not trust the medical profession, nor the pharmaceutical giants.”

But something happened to change his mind: Two of West’s close friends became ill with the virus, and a third died. Rattled and stressed, he prayed for guidance. Then, when his mother and another relative both urged him to get vaccinated, he took it as a sign from God. West drove to the Winn Dixie supermarket and rolled up his sleeve for the first of two injections of the Moderna vaccine.

“All of a sudden, it hit real close to home,” he said.

West is not alone. In this inland area of Nassau County, sandwiched between Jacksonville and the Okefenokee Swamp at the Georgia-Florida line, a devastating resurgence of the coronavirus is making even some die-hard vaccine skeptics reconsider the shots.

For the week ending July 29, the county of 89,000 logged 810 new cases of the coronavirus. At that time it was the highest rate in Florida, one of the epicenters of a nationwide spike in infections driven by the highly contagious delta variant.

Some county residents who thought the pandemic had all but ended have seen multiple family members suddenly infected during the latest wave. One young woman in Callahan, a town of about

1,000 people, saw her fiancé, her mother and her grandmother all die from COVID-19 within a week.

“I’ve seen fear grip people like never before,” said Dwight Allen, pastor of a 200-member congregation at The Anchor Church of God. When members ask him questions about the shot, Allen tells them he got jabbed with no ill side effects.

Dr. Phillips Cao, a family practitioner who treats patients at a University of Florida Health clinic in Callahan, said many older people in the area got coronavirus shots months ago, while younger adults put them off as infections declined sharply in the spring.

“Everybody thought it was kind of dying out or going away. ... Then you had this new variant come in,” he said. “It was just ripe for another bad surge.”

Before the Fourth of July, Cao said, he was seeing maybe one coronavirus patient every two weeks. Now, he said, he often tests seven patients each day. Five of them typically come back positive for the virus, and often two are so sick he sends them to a hospital.

The spike in infections could be pushing more people to get shots. State health data shows that nearly 4,400 people got vaccinated in Nassau County in the three-week period ending Aug. 12 — enough to increase the county’s total vaccinations by nearly 11%.

Prior to this latest wave of the virus, Callahan Funeral Home had not handled arrangements for any COVID-19 victims since April. That has since changed. Owner Ellis McAninch said he’s overseen funerals for five people who died from the virus since July — more than half his total business in the past month.

Despite his age, his proximity to virus deaths, a chronic lung illness, and his own recent bout with COVID-19, the 61-year-old McAninch had still not been vaccinated when he spoke to a reporter

recently. He said at first he was wary of how quickly the shots were developed. But then he decided he had spent too long waiting to make up his mind.

“I should have already had this done,” he said. “Now it’s just time to bite the bullet.”

While the development of the vaccines was unusually fast, it was the culmination of many years of research. The vaccines went through clinical trials involving thousands of people and have since been given to tens of millions of people over the past eight months with no serious safety concerns.

Still, there are some who won’t be swayed.

In Hilliard, a town of 3,100 in Nassau County, 80-year-old Frances Sims refuses to get vaccinated. Long before COVID-19, Sims said, she feared vaccines required for school children might have harmful side effects and pushed for some of her grandchildren to get exempted based on religious beliefs.

After some members of her large family fell ill with the coronavirus, two of Sims’ children persuaded her husband to get vaccinated. But she won’t budge.

“Some of them are kind of aggravated with me,” she said. “They say, ‘Mama, if you get it, you might die.’” Sims said. “I do trust the Lord to take care of me. If I die, it’s my time.”

Her son Kenny Sims, a Hilliard town councilman, ended up getting jabbed in the spring after his employer announced plans to scale back paid leave for workers exposed to the virus.

He’s glad he did. When the summer surge hit, Sims and his wife had to care for their grown son and daughter and a 1-year-old grandson who caught the virus. He believes the vaccine protected him and his wife from getting sick, though he’s still not convinced the shots are completely safe.

“I ain’t sold that this vaccine is the answer,” Kenny Sims said. “But I believe it’s the lesser of two evils.”

The events leading to the arrest began when the Sumter County Sheriff’s Office contacted Citrus County on Oct. 28 to report its deputies had responded to a 33-year-old Bushnell man with a gunshot wound to his arm.

When a CCSO detective interviewed the man, the victim said he was parked near the intersection of East Orange Avenue and U.S. 41, where he got into an argument with a man later identified as Irvin, according to Irvin’s arrest record.

The victim told the investigator that Irvin then brandished a handgun and ordered him to get back into his vehicle.

But before the victim could drive away, the victim told the investigator that Irvin fired through the passenger window, missing a 32-year-old

woman from Floral City before striking the driver.

The detective was able to gather enough probable cause for a warrant to arrest Irvin and search his house off on the 8300 block of East Orange Avenue, where deputies found property belonging to the injured man, according to court records.

Deputies also recovered the firearm Irvin allegedly used.

Prosecutors also charged Irvin with firing a gun into a vehicle and aggravated assault with a deadly weapon without intent to kill.

State prosecutors are facing a similar dilemma in another case involving a Citrus County man charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, battery, strong armed robbery, and violation of the condition of his pre-trial release.

Braddock, public defender for Christopher Schultz Gilles, told Judge

Howard that numerous attempts to contact Gilles’

alleged victim to take depositions have failed.

Assistant state attorney Nicholas Caporicci told Howard that his office has tried to get the victim to court. Howard asked Caporicci how confident he was about getting the victim to cooperate and the prosecutor replied that his investigators could find her but that he wasn’t confident they could make her appear in court.

Howard gave Caporicci a Oct. 12 deadline for the victim to appear in court and show cause as to why she hasn’t met with court officials.

Howard said that without the victim there was a 99.9% likelihood he would dismiss the case.

Not all interest on a reverse mortgage is tax-deductible and to the extent that it is, such deduction is not available until the loan is partially or fully repaid.

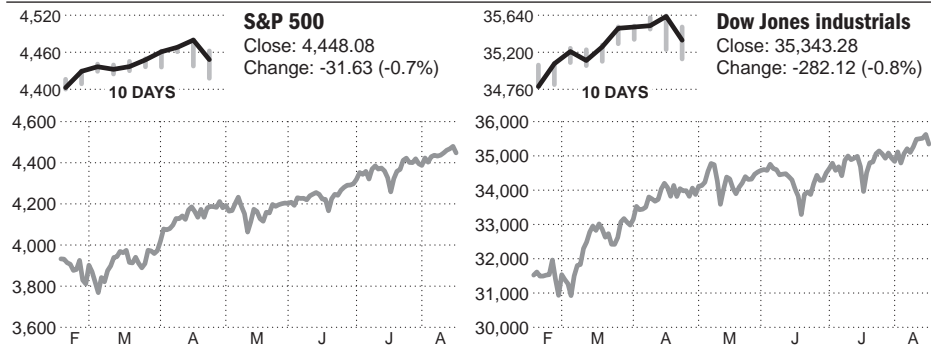

Company Spotlight Leaving home

Home Depot shares had their worst day of the year Tuesday after the home improvement giant reported slower same-store sales than investors projected. Atlanta-based Home Depot, which thrived during the pandemic as people took on more home improvement projects, hit \$40 billion in quarterly sales for the first time ever. That beat Wall Street expectations and was better than the same period a year ago, but investors focused on same-store sales, which

were up 4.5%, missing analysts' target of 5.4%. The company said consumer habits have shifted since the vaccination rollout, with sales strengthening during the week.



"We attribute this to consumers returning to travel and other recreational activities, and while the consumer is returning to pre-pandemic activities, we continue to see them engaged in home improvement projects," said CEO Craig Menear.

Planned RV resort raises red flags

With RV parks among the highest-yielding of all real estate asset classes, an RV park featuring a clubhouse, pool, tennis courts, gazebo and laundry building would be considered an asset for most communities.

Unfortunately, the Plantation Outpost Club and Resort currently proposed by Kingwood Crystal River Resort Corporation, which acquired the Plantation on Crystal River in January 2017, is a potential community liability.

After Kingwood gained approval in 2018 from the Crystal River City Council for a gated RV park between West Fort Island Trail and West Plantation Lane, ground was never broken and the project appeared to be dormant until this year.

With the popularity of golf declining, Kingwood submitted an expanded RV resort design in May of this year that incorporates the Plantation's nine-hole Lagoons course, which increases the project from 61 to 68 acres and the RV lots from 294 to 322.

The expanded RV resort design, which requires city approval for zoning and development changes, sparked strong opposition from both city officials and residents because of the red flags it raised.

Wedge between West Fort Island Trail and West Plantation Lane, the location is already bustling with activity. The addition of several hundred RVs promises to create long-term density ramifications for an already congested area, especially when hurricane evacuation

becomes necessary. As for hurricane evacuation, Kingwood's plan is that RV tenants "would be responsible for the removal and evacuation" of their trailers. Knowing how most procrastinate until the last minute, this could be an

evacuation nightmare. The placement of 400-square-foot trailers on 150 lots anchored to the ground in a flood prone location could require excavating the property's uplands and elevating the fill above the highest

base-flood level of 12 feet. If elevated, nearby residents fear the lots could act as a barrier that would flow excessive rains and tidal waters to surrounding neighborhoods.

Reminiscent of Florida's environmentally intrusive developments of the past, the planned widening and lengthening of existing drainage canals plus the construction of four water bodies in a highly sensitive natural ecosystem, where the breaching of the aquifer is a real possibility, risks irreparable harm.

Rightfully viewing the red flags raised by the current project design as a community liability, city staff, the city planning commission and city residents vociferously oppose it.

In light of the broad community opposition, Kingwood, rather than forcing a square peg into a round hole, is encouraged to be a good neighbor by seriously considering the project's red flags and tailoring the design to the location to make the RV resort a community asset — not a community liability.

Heir: Sacklers won't settle unless freed from opioid suits

Members of the family that owns OxyContin maker Purdue Pharma won't contribute billions of dollars to a legal settlement unless they get off the hook for all current and future lawsuits over the company's activities, one of them told a court Tuesday in a rare public appearance.

David Sackler, grandson of one of the brothers who nearly 70 years ago bought the company that later became Purdue, testified at a hearing in federal bankruptcy court in White Plains, New York, that unless the settlement is approved with those protections included, as they currently are, "I believe we would litigate the claims to their final outcomes."

"We need a release that's sufficient to get our goals accomplished," Sackler said in response to questions from a lawyer for the U.S. bankruptcy trustee. "If the release fails to do that, we will not support it."

That's the heart of argument over the settlement plans of the family and the company, based in Stamford, Connecticut.

The U.S. Bankruptcy Trustee, nine states and the District of Columbia are objecting to the company's settlement plan largely because it would grant legal protection to members of the wealthy Sackler family even though none of them are declaring bankruptcy themselves.

Tropical storm feeds growing anger in quake-stricken Haiti

LES CAYES, Haiti — Heavy rain from Tropical Storm Grace forced a temporary halt Tuesday to the Haitian government's response to the deadly weekend earthquake, feeding the growing anger and frustration among thousands who were left homeless.

Grace battered southwestern Haiti, which was hit hardest by Saturday's quake, and officials warned some areas could get 15 inches of rain before the storm moved on.

Intermittent rain fell in the earthquake-damaged city of Les Cayes and in the capital of Port-au-Prince.

The storm hit late Monday, the same day that Haiti's Civil Protection Agency raised the death toll from the earthquake to 1,419 and the number of injured to 6,000.

Patience was running out in the Western Hemisphere's poorest nation. Haitians already were struggling with the coronavirus, gang violence, worsening poverty and the July 7 assassination of President Jovenel Moïse when the quake hit.

US likely to authorize booster shots

Would provide longer-lasting protection from COVID-19

WASHINGTON — After struggling for months to persuade Americans to get the COVID-19 vaccine, U.S. health officials could soon face a fresh challenge: talking vaccinated people into getting booster shots to gain longer-lasting protection as the delta variant sends infections soaring again.

As early as Wednesday, U.S. health authorities are expected to recommend an extra dose of the vaccine for all Americans eight months after they get their second

shot, according to two people who spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity to discuss internal deliberations.

That means the biggest vaccination drive in U.S. history is about to get even more extensive.

The move is being driven by both the highly contagious variant and preliminary evidence that the vaccine's protective effect starts dropping within months.

Last week, U.S. health officials recommended boosters for some people with weakened immune systems, such as cancer patients and organ transplant recipients. If the shots are expanded as expected to other Americans, among the first to receive them could be health care workers, nursing home residents and other older people.

Some experts have expressed concern that a new campaign calling for boosters could muddle the public health message and undercut the continuing drive to win over the tens of millions of Americans who are hesitant to get their first

COVID-19 shots.

Calling for third doses could discourage people who had been skeptical of the shot's effectiveness in the first place, Lawrence Gostin, a public health specialist at Georgetown University, warned on Tuesday.

"We have to really make sure that while we're spending a lot of time and effort on third doses that we don't undermine our campaign for first vaccinations," he said. "That's truly the existential crisis in the United States."

The booster campaign could also cause ill will toward the United States: Global health officials, including the World Health Organization, have called on wealthier nations to hold off on booster shots to ensure poor countries have enough vaccine for the initial doses.

Dr. Tlaleng Mofokeng, a South African expert advising the United Nations, condemned the move toward booster shots in the U.S., saying it will have the effect of

"advancing and deepening the existing inequities" when "there are people who are yet to receive a single shot."

But White House press secretary Jen Psaki said the question of whether to distribute boosters or help other nations "is a false choice. We can do both."

She said the U.S. is "far and away" the biggest contributor to the global fight against COVID-19 and will "continue to be the arsenal for vaccines" to the world.

"We also have enough supply, and we have long planned for enough supply, should a booster be needed for the eligible population," Psaki said.

Booster shots would only begin to be administered widely once the U.S. Food and Drug Administration formally approves the vaccines, which are being dispensed for now under what is known as emergency use authorization. Full approval of the Pfizer shot is expected in the coming weeks.

Big publicity blitz

Taliban promise women's rights, security under Islamic rule

KABUL, Afghanistan — The Taliban vowed Tuesday to respect women's rights, forgive those who fought them and ensure Afghanistan does not become a haven for terrorists as part of a publicity blitz aimed at reassuring world powers and a fearful population.

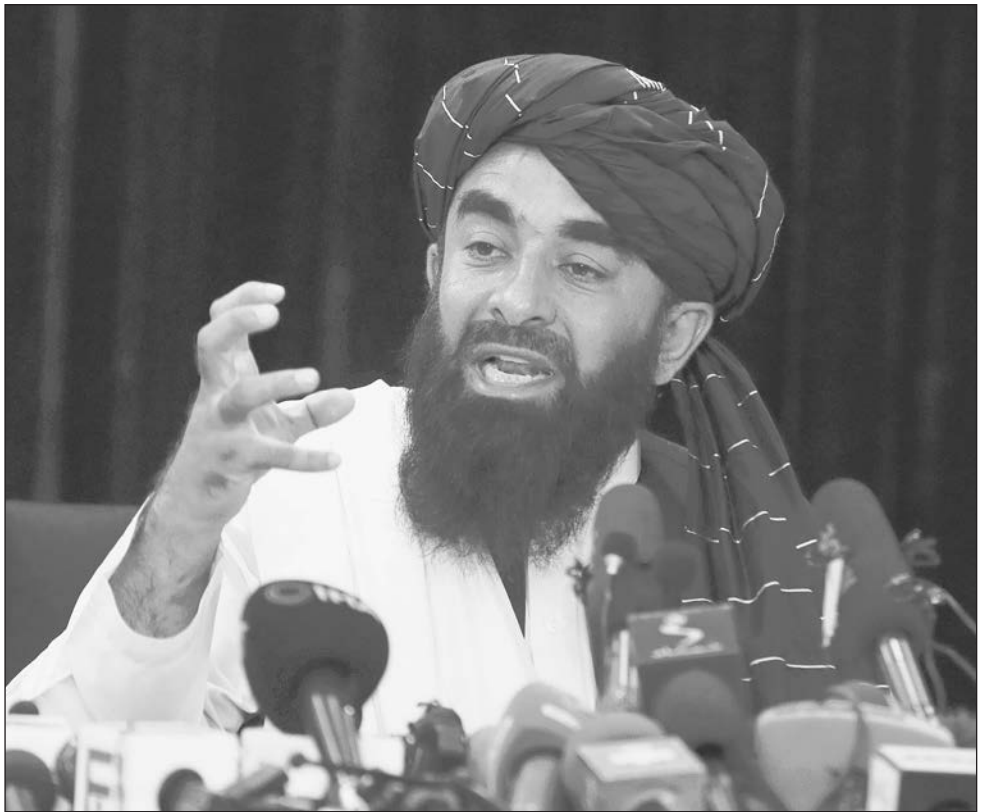
Following a lightning offensive across Afghanistan that saw many cities fall to the insurgents without a fight, the Taliban have sought to portray themselves as more moderate than when they imposed a strict form of Islamic rule in the late 1990s. But many Afghans remain skeptical — and thousands have raced to the airport, desperate to flee the country.

Older generations remember the Taliban's previous rule, when they largely confined women to their homes, banned television and music, and held public executions. A U.S.-led invasion drove them from power months after the 9/11 attacks, which al-Qaida had orchestrated from Afghanistan while being sheltered by the Taliban.

Zabihullah Mujahid, the Taliban's longtime spokesman, emerged from the shadows Tuesday in his first-ever public appearance to address those concerns at a news conference.

He promised the Taliban would honor women's rights within the norms of Islamic law, without elaborating. The Taliban have encouraged women to return to work and have allowed girls to return to school, handing out Islamic headscarves at the door. A female news anchor interviewed a Taliban official Monday in a TV studio.

The treatment of women varies widely across the Muslim world and sometimes even within the same country, with rural

areas tending to be far more conservative. Some Muslim countries, including neighboring Pakistan, have had female prime ministers, while ultraconservative Saudi Arabia only recently allowed women to drive.

Mujahid also said the Taliban would not allow Afghanistan to be used as a base for attacking other countries, as it was in the years before 9/11. That assurance was part of a 2020 peace deal reached between the Taliban and the Trump administration that paved the way for the American withdrawal.

The Pentagon said U.S. commanders are communicating with the Taliban as they work to evacuate thousands of people through Kabul's international airport. It said the Taliban have taken no hostile

actions there.

Mujahid reiterated that the Taliban have offered full amnesty to Afghans who worked for the U.S. and the Western-backed government, saying "nobody will go to their doors to ask why they helped." He said private media should "remain independent" but that journalists "should not work against national values."

U.S. national security adviser Jake Sullivan said the U.S. and other governments will not simply take the Taliban at their word when it comes to women's rights.

"Like I've said all along, this is not about trust. This is about verify," Sullivan said at a White House briefing. "And we'll see what the Taliban end up doing in the days and weeks ahead, and when I say we, I mean the entire international community."

Archaeologists find skeleton in Pompeii

ROME — Archaeologists in the ancient city of Pompeii have discovered a remarkably well-preserved skeleton during excavations of a tomb that also shed light on the cultural life of the city before it was destroyed by a volcanic eruption in AD 79.

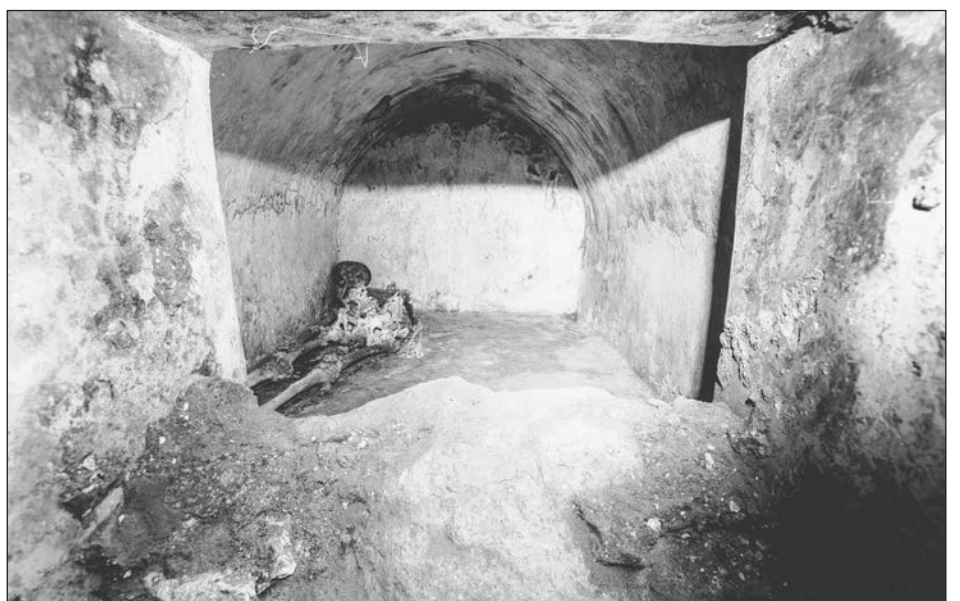
A skull bearing tufts of white hair and part of an ear, as well as bones and fabric fragments, were found in the tomb in the necropolis of Porta Sarno, an area not yet open to the public that is located in the east of Pompeii's urban center. The discovery is unusual since most adults were cremated at the time.

An inscription of the tomb suggested that its owner, a freed slave named Marcus Venerius Secundo, helped organize

performances in Greek in Pompeii. Experts said it was the first confirmation that Greek, the language of culture in the Mediterranean, was used alongside Latin.

"That performances in Greek were organized is evidence of the lively and open cultural climate which characterized ancient Pompeii," the director of the Archaeological Park of Pompeii, Gabriel Zuchtriegel, said in a statement announcing the discovery.

In an interview with The Associated Press, Zuchtriegel said Marcus Venerius clearly had been able to make a living for himself after he was freed as a slave, given the "monumental" size of his burial tomb. "He didn't become super rich, but certainly he reached a considerable level of wealth,"

Lessons in back-to-school shopping

For parents, the return to school means a return to spending: NerdWallet recently found that, in spite of the pandemic, about half of parents who plan to back-to-school shop this year expect to spend about the same as they normally would, with more of that spending going toward clothing than in 2020.

The pandemic has added new items to shopping lists. More schools are asking students to bring their own water bottles and in some cases larger quantities of items like pencils and crayons as teachers try to restock classrooms, says Charles Field, CEO of TeacherLists, which publishes close to 2 million supply lists provided by schools. It's also harder to find discounts on back-to-school items this year, he says, because of supply-chain challenges. "As retailers run out of stock, they're less likely to do super-low pricing, especially for things produced overseas," he says.

Despite those challenges, there are ways to keep costs under control. We asked parents and educators for their best strategies.

TAKE INVENTORY

Given that so many students have been in virtual or hybrid school during the pandemic, Nedra McDaniel, mom of two and founder of the blog Adventure Mom, suggests combing through what you currently have, both for school supplies and clothing. Kids might have outgrown some school clothes but not others, and you want those details before hitting the stores. "Or else you end up buying things you really don't need," McDaniel says. "I've come back and seen we have brand new scissors from last year."

She also suggests waiting to buy fall and winter clothes. They're likely to be on sale later in the season — and children might have grown by then anyway. "You don't have to rush out and get everything all at once," she says. Jeans, for example, tend to go on sale in October. Keep a running list of what you need and sizes on your phone so you can take advantage of deals when you find them, McDaniel advises.

STOCK UP

Because of the pandemic's strain on the supply chain, Field says that retailers are running out of

standard items kids may need, like binders, backpacks and notebooks. "Shop early this year," he advises, and if you see discounts, don't wait to take advantage of them, because the products might be gone soon or restocked at higher prices. He also noticed back-to-school sales started earlier this year, perhaps as a result of Amazon Prime Day in June.

Alissa Davis, a parent and first grade teacher in Indianapolis, says that she finds deals by making bulk purchases of items like glue sticks, paper and pencils and then slowly using them up throughout the school year. "You never know when you'll have projects you need to work on at home, so it's handy to have. You can buy in bulk and then spread it out over the next year or two," she says.

Davis, who also shares tips on her website, teachermomlifeblog.com, says you don't need to wait until you get the supply lists. She buys when she sees discounts: "You can predict some things he will need or want, so watch the sales," she suggests. Some stores also offer bundled items at a discount, but sometimes they contain extra items you don't need. Similarly, schools sometimes offer a supply bundle for parents to purchase, but you may be able to pay less by shopping sales.

CHECK THE GROCERY

Davis says she's found some big sales recently at local grocery stores. "They get their back-to-school supplies and then want to make room for fall decor," she says,

adding that grocery stores often have loyalty programs that give additional discounts. Some cash-back credit cards also offer grocery stores as a bonus category, which can layer on even more savings.

IN-STORE SHOPPING

With online shopping, it's easy to compare prices and quickly add items from a school supply list. But that way, Field points out, you might not be able to purchase just one or two glue sticks, for example; you may have to buy a package with several. That approach might work if you're buying for multiple children, but if you want only one glue stick, then you'll likely find better deals when shopping in person.

ASK FOR HELP

Some items on the school supply list may not be essential or may not be needed until later in the school year. Davis suggests asking your child's teacher to help prioritize what they really need for the first day and what you can wait to buy. "There are some things I have stashed in a closet or leftovers I could distribute to students. Teachers can help you triage if you're in a jam," she says.

She adds that teachers may be able to point you toward community organizations that host supply drives if you need additional help.

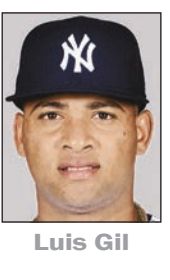

Tebow's comeback ends in Jacksonville

Jaguars cut tight end on Tuesday

JACKSONVILLE — Tim Tebow's comeback and NFL career are over. The Jacksonville Jaguars waived Tebow on Tuesday, parting with the 2007 Heisman Trophy winner who switched from quarterback to tight end in hopes of rejuvenating his pro football career.

"We knew that was an uphill battle for Tim," said coach Urban Meyer, who recruited Tebow to nearby Florida. "Players loved him, locker room loved him, but it was the right thing (to do)."

Tebow's blocking ranged from

awkward to awful in Jacksonville's preseason opener against Cleveland on his 34th birthday. The polarizing player went viral for two botched attempts on the opening drive of the third quarter Saturday night, the second one more egregious than the first.

"He has a bunch of good plays but can't have a bad play at that position," said Meyer, who spoke to Tebow about the roster decision Monday night and again Tuesday morning.

Cruz, Tampa Bay hand Baltimore 13th straight defeat, 10-0

ST. PETERSBURG — Nelson Cruz homered twice, three pitchers combined on a four-hitter, and the AL East-leading Tampa Bay Rays extended the Baltimore Orioles' losing streak to 13 games with an 10-0 victory on Tuesday night.

Cruz moved past Dave Kingman into 42nd place on the all-time home runs list with 443. His three-run shot off John Means (5-5) during a five-run fifth inning made it 8-0, and he hit a two-run

shot in the sixth against Tanner Scott. The slugger, acquired from Minnesota on July 22, has seven of his 26 homers this season with Tampa Bay and has 39 career multi-homer games.

Drew Rasmussen allowed one hit over four innings, Adam Conley worked a hitless fifth and Chad Ellis (1-0) got his first major league win with three-hit ball over the final four innings.

Mike Zunino homered in his fifth consecutive game for the Rays, who are 13-1 against Baltimore this season. Tampa Bay has scored at least nine runs nine times and reached double digits five

times in the season series.

Baltimore has been outscored 123-36 during its current skid and is in danger of overtaking Arizona as the majors' worst team. The Orioles lost 14 in a row from May 18-31.

The announced crowd of 4,795 was the smallest for a Rays game at Tropicana Field without COVID-19 restrictions. Monday night's opener of the four-game series drew 5,460.

Wander Franco reached leading off the fourth when shortstop Jorge Mateo

Top 25 reality check

How often do preseason ranked teams flop?

The preseason AP Top 25 is all about hope and optimism.

Reality Check is all about, well, being realistic. Sometimes the truth can be painful.

As has become tradition, the first AP Top 25 Reality Check of the season is a reminder that your promising college football team, newly minted with a cool ranking as it heads into the season, might turn out to be not as good as you and the poll voters thought.

Alabama is No. 1, followed by Oklahoma, Clemson and Ohio State in the poll presented by Regions Bank and released Monday.

From 2010-2020, on average, 9.5 teams that appeared in the preseason Top 25 finished the season unranked — about 38% of the picks. During that time, the fewest preseason ranked teams to finish outside the final Top 25 was seven in 2011; the most was 12, in 2010.

Even in an anything-but-normal 2020 season played through the pandemic, the number of teams that started the season ranked only to finish unranked was a typical 10.

What was unusual about last season was the number of flameouts that came from the upper half of the preseason Top 25.

Over the last 11 seasons, 17 teams that started the season ranked in the top 10 finished unranked, just 1.5 per season. But last year, three top 10 teams — and five among the top 12 in the preseason rankings — did not finish the season ranked, led by 2019 national champion LSU, which was No. 6 going into last season.

As expected, most of the preseason ranked teams that fail to make the final Top 25 come from the bottom of the rankings. Teams ranked 21-25 in the preseason make up 27% of the teams (28 total) that finished unranked.

To put it another way, a little more than half the teams that started the season ranked between 21-25 from 2010-20, finished unranked.

At the top of the poll? Only seven preseason top-five teams over that span have failed to be ranked somewhere in the final Top 25.

at-bat for a gutsy two-inning save after New York capitalized on a wild outing by Red Sox relievers for a 5-3 victory.

The Yankees have won five straight and 12 of 15 to narrowly overtake Boston

for second in the AL East — New York is 68-52 and the Red Sox 69-53, a difference of .001 percentage points. The Yankees were 10 1/2 games behind first-place Boston on July 5 but have gone 26-11 since.

Tebow also failed to record a catch against the Browns and got no snaps on special teams. Meyer said Tebow's play lacked consistency, especially in tackling. And if Tebow were going to make Jacksonville's 53-man roster, he needed to be a special teams contributor.

Meyer said he expects this to be the end of Tebow's playing career.

"I would guess it is," Meyer said. "We didn't get that deep with it. Obviously he's his own man, elite warrior, elite competitor. But he's also 34 years old."

Tebow was shielded from the media circus that followed him during other NFL stops and never publicly addressed his return after nearly six years away from the game. The Jacksonville native responded on Twitter and thanked his hometown team for a chance.

"Thankful for the highs and even the lows, the opportunities, and the setbacks," Tebow wrote. "I've never wanted to make decisions out of fear of failure and I'm grateful for the chance to have pursued a dream."

Tebow opened training camp as Jacksonville's fourth- or fifth-string

tight end after switching positions this year. He was trying to return to the NFL after spending the previous five years in the New York Mets' organization. He hit .223 with 18 home runs and 107 RBIs while never making it to the big leagues.

He asked Meyer for a tryout after retiring from baseball in January. Meyer obliged and ended up giving him a one-year contract worth \$920,000, the minimum for a player with three accrued NFL seasons. The low-risk deal included no guaranteed money, so Tebow had to make the team to earn a dime.

And that was always the uncertain part. Jacksonville entered camp with three tight ends essentially locked into roster spots: run-blocking specialist Chris Manhertz, fellow veteran James O'Shaughnessy and fifth-round draft pick Luke Farrell.

Tebow flashed early during organized team activities and rarely dropped balls thrown his way. But once camp began and players donned full pads, Tebow faded. It quickly became clear that Tebow was less of a pass-catching option than Tyler Davis, a sixth-round selection in 2020, and second-year pro Ben Ellefson.

His blocking woes and lack of experience on special teams made Meyer's decision a relatively easy one.

no reason to believe this season's defending champion is vulnerable to an LSU-type tumble.

No. 2 Oklahoma (9-2)

Opener: at Tulane, Sept. 4.

Reality check: The Sooners have their most balanced team in years, with a quality defense to go with Lincoln Riley's usual potent offense. For whatever it's worth: Twice in the last 12 seasons (2009 and '14) Oklahoma has been a preseason top five team and finished unranked.

No. 3 Clemson (10-2)

Opener: vs. No. 5 Georgia in Charlotte, North Carolina, Sept. 4.

Reality check: The Tigers are on a six-year run of top four finishes and haven't finished unranked since 2010. Coach Dabo Swinney's team has lost one ACC game since October 2017 and it's to a team (Notre Dame) that is not in the conference this season.

No. 4 Ohio State (8-1)

Opener: at Minnesota, Sept. 2.

Reality check: The Buckeyes have finished unranked just once since winning the national title in 2002, and have 16 top-10 finishes over that span. Coach Ryan Day has yet to lose to a Big Ten opponent in 16 games.

No. 5 Georgia (8-2)

Opener: vs. No. 3 Clemson, Sept. 4.

Reality check: The Bulldogs have been recruiting like the perennial playoff teams ranked in front of them and have four straight top-seven finishes under Kirby Smart. Georgia is a better bet to break its four-decade national title drought than to tank and finish unranked.

No. 6 Texas A&M (9-1)

Opener: vs. Kent State, Sept. 4.

Reality check: Heading into Jimbo Fisher's fourth season as coach, all signs are pointing in the right direction for the Aggies. But A&M has only finished the season ranked five times this century and hasn't had consecutive top-10 finishes in 27 years.

No. 7 Iowa State (9-3)

Opener: vs. Northern Iowa, Sept. 4.

Reality check: This whole ranked in the top-10 thing is new and different to the Cyclones. Iowa State finished last season ranked for just third time in program history. Can Matt Campbell's program continue to outperform its DNA?

No. 8 Cincinnati (9-1)

Opener: vs. Miami, Ohio, Sept. 4.

Reality check: The Bearcats have finished ranked each of the last three seasons under coach Luke Fickell, improving each season. They're loaded for another run in the American Athletic Conference, with nonconference games at No. 17 Indiana and No. 9 Notre Dame likely to determine just how high they can go in 2021.

No. 9 Notre Dame (10-2)

Opener: at Florida State, Sept. 5.

Reality check: The Fighting Irish have finished the season ranked four straight seasons. The last time that happened was when Lou Holtz's teams ended seven straight seasons ranked from 1987-1993.

No. 10 North Carolina (8-4)

Opener: at Virginia Tech, Sept. 3.

Reality check: Coach Mack Brown tries to make it two straight seasons with a ranked finish for the Tar Heels. That hasn't been done in Chapel Hill since the final two seasons of Brown's first stint at UNC in 1996-97.

No. 11 Oregon (4-3)

Opener: vs. Fresno State, Sept. 4.

Reality check: There has been a lot of buzz around the Ducks because of the way coach Mario Cristobal has been recruiting, but Oregon has finished a season ranked just once in the last five years.

No. 12 Wisconsin (4-3)

Opener: vs. No. 19 Penn State, Sept. 4.

Reality check: In two of the last three seasons, Wisconsin started ranked and ended unranked. It's happened a total of four times to the Badgers in the previous

13 seasons, but the last time Wisconsin went two straight seasons finishing outside the Top 25 was 2003.

No. 13 Florida (8-4)

Opener: vs. Florida Atlantic, Sept. 4.

Reality check: Coach Dan Mullen has brought some consistency with three straight ranked finishes, a first for Florida since Urban Meyer left after the 2010 season.

No. 14 Miami (8-3)

Opener: vs. No. 1 Alabama in Atlanta, Sept. 4.

Reality check: There are many ways to describe how underwhelming the Hurricanes have been since joining the ACC in 2004, but how about this? Miami has finished the season ranked just six times as a member of the ACC and never better than 11th.

No. 15 USC (5-1)

Opener: vs. San Jose State, Sept. 4.

Reality check: Since 2010, the Trojans have had four seasons that started ranked and ended unranked. Coach Clay Helton could have a hard time surviving another season at USC that doesn't live up to expectations.

No. 16 LSU (5-5)

Opener: at UCLA, Sept. 4.

Reality check: The Tigers became the first defending champions since Auburn in 2011 to finish the season outside the Top 25. There is talent for a bounce back in Baton Rouge.

No. 17 Indiana (6-2)

Opener: at No. 18 Iowa, Sept. 4.

Reality check: Coach Tom Allen's Hoosiers will try to become the first team in the history of the program to start and end the season ranked.

No. 18 Iowa (6-2)

Reality check: In 22 seasons under Kirk Ferentz, the Hawkeyes have neither finished four straight seasons ranked, nor had three straight seasons that began and ended in the AP poll. Iowa can accomplish both of those this season.

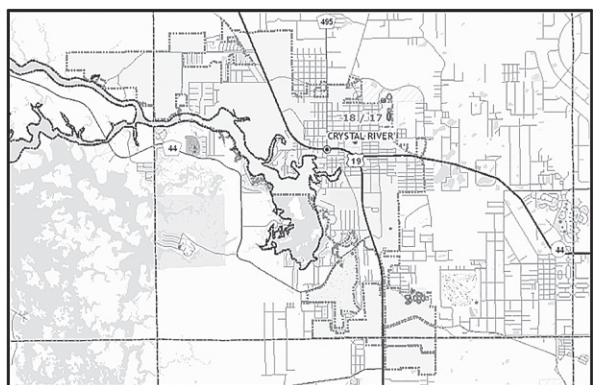

We went a year and a half without one positive test and two weeks ago, it seemed to let loose.

Friends of mine were seeing cases everywhere. Within a day or two, we had some children showing signs and one day it was one child and the next day it was six.

We quarantined as quickly as possible and masked up and it was not long before seven adults were positive. I stopped fault-finding and tracing a long time ago because so much of this does not meet logic. There are those who get it and those who don't.

There is also a point where I don't want to talk about it

anymore because nothing breaks your heart more than to see one of your kids who you have poured so much love into get sick and suffer.

I'm so proud of our gang. Our staff and our parents have hung in there and fought the good fight to take care of each other. Everyone put on masks in hopes of protecting our children who were not sick.

One of our clients wanted to go the hospital and the ambulance worker refused her. I'm guessing her symptoms were not severe enough and we were told the hospitals were full of

severe cases.

I noticed on the same day our local Quick Care Med had a line outside the door. Our volunteers agreed to stay home and not once did I hear anyone mention shutting down our services to our community.

I'm sure we were a microcosm of our county and country and there was a lot of suffering these past couple of weeks.

There is a scripture where apostle Paul says "When I am weak, He is strong." I don't think I have ever felt more weak or helpless, and yet God's power was still the same. Good

things were happening while people were suffering.

I was not the only one who cried out to be closer to God. I was not the only one who spent a lot of time in quiet solitude contemplating my journey.

I love my God a little more and I love my fellow human being a little more. Let's strive to hold each other up and help each other out.

This is not a battle for us to blame each other, but make no mistake, we have been in battle together.

Backpack safety

To keep your back healthy, follow these tips:

- Always wear both straps. Using only one strap can cause back and shoulder pain or posture problems.
- Be sure the straps have good padding.
- Adjust the straps so they are the same length to spread the weight evenly.
- Make sure your backpack is not too heavy. Your backpack should weigh less than 20% of your body weight. (If you weigh 90 pounds, your backpack should be less than 18 pounds.)
- Be careful when getting on and off the bus. If your straps get caught, tell the driver immediately. Then free the strap.



Start with breakfast

Experts say that having a nutritious breakfast helps kids stay focused and able to concentrate. It also helps kids to have a better attitude about school.

What is a nutritious breakfast? It's a meal that is balanced — it includes fruit, whole grains and protein. You might eat:

Back-to-School Wraps

- 2 tablespoons light mayonnaise
- 2 tablespoons mustard
- 3 large (8-inch) multigrain tortillas
- 5 ounces sliced turkey or ham
- 6 slices cheddar cheese
- 1/2 red bell pepper, cut into strips

- 1/2 cup peeled and chopped cucumber
