Local COVID rules eased in state

ORLANDO — A local government and courts in Florida are easing up on COVID-19 restrictions as the state's virus caseload has declined in recent

Starting Monday, wearing face masks and social distancing became optional in Florida's courthouses.

In an order, Florida Supreme Court Chief Justice Charles Canady cited the fact that almost 70% of eligible Florida residents were fully vaccinated and the number of cases in the state has

dropped sharply. Meanwhile, in Orange County, Mayor Jerry Demings said Monday that county employees would no longer be required to wear masks in county facilities, though it is still recommended. The change was prompted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention downgrading the transmission risk in the county from sub-

stantial to moderate. The positivity rate in Orange County, home to the city of Orlando and the nation's largest theme park resorts, is now 2.5%, and 73% of the population 12 years and older is fully

vaccinated. "I also encourage you to continue taking safety precautions such as frequent handwashing and staying home when you don't feel well," Demings said in an email to employees.

Pirate's Cove bid rejected

Commissioner Kinnard hopes to bring in community support for purchase

The county's bid of \$616,000 to buy the Pirate's Cove property off Ozello Trail has been rejected.

The county had received two appraisals: one for \$616,000 and another for \$700.000.

"The seller has decided to decline it," local Realtor Steve Varnadoe advised the board. "The price and undefined terms just doesn't interest her at this time."

They did not provide a counteroffer, County Administrator Randy Oliver said. The property owner died in 2019 and his heirs seek to sell it.

County Commissioner

Jeff Kinnard told the Chronicle Tuesday it's time for another tactic. He didn't want to divulge much before the board had a chance to meet, but he did say it would in-

volve private support. "Obviously, there will need to be a significant amount of private money to come into this," said Kinnard, the board's strongest supporter of the county buying Pirate's Cove. "People who want

Local resident has memorable experience fighting blazes in western US

rom a ridge across a valley in northwest California, Citrus County native Luke Hogan and his fellow wildland firefighters watched a large front of flames linger on a lush mountainside.

Funneled by the ranges and guided by winds, the fire in early September began burning toward a small town under the watch of Hogan and the 20-man forestry handcrew he had been with for

around three months. After a grueling standstill, the team was able to keep the fire from destroying the township as it scorched the lands

around it. It was a happy ending to Hogan's first season fighting wildfires in Oregon, Washington and California. He returned to his Beverly Hills

home in mid-October.

"It was eye-opening how much damage those fires do; it's kind of mind-blowing," the 28-year-old said. "We almost got burnt up out there; it makes you not take life for granted."

Hogan couldn't pass up an opportunity in January — a few months after becoming a U.S. Army veteran — to travel across the country to help safeguard other states against feral

Times Square is back open on **New Year's Eve** with vax proof

NEW YORK — Crowds will once again fill New York's Times Square this New Year's Eve, with proof of COVID-19 vaccination required for revelers who want to watch the ball drop in person, Mayor Bill de Blasio announced Tuesday.


"Yes, we are proud to announce that Times Square, wonderful celebration in Times Square, the ball drop, everything, coming back full strength the way we love it," de Blasio said at a virtual news briefing. "Hundreds of thousands of people there to celebrate. We can finally get back together again. It's going to be amazing."

Tom Harris, the president of the Times Square Alliance, said all spectators aged 5 and over will be asked to show proof of full vaccination. People who can't be vaccinated because of a disability will have to provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test, he said.

The New Year's Eve celebration, perhaps the city's most iconic public gathering, was a socially distant affair during the height of the pandemic last year.

There were no packed crowds of giddy revelers, jammed together cheek-by-jowl. Instead there were mostly empty streets as officials told people to stay home and watch the ball drop on television. Entertainers including Jennifer Lopez performed behind police barricades to small groups made up of essential workers.

With the advent of vaccines, the city's public celebrations have been on the upswing in



something Hogan sees

"I think this is burned into me for the most part," he said.

In between wildfire seasons. Hogan is pursuing a career to possibly work at a hospital emergency room. First, he's planning to clock in hours as an EMT before graduating from nursing school.

"It's fast-paced," he said, "and you get to help people."

A similar selfless mind-Hogan to accept an invite from Andrew Kent to join the fight in the West against the region's summertime wildfires.

"It's the closest thing to the military,' was the way he described it," said Hogan, who had served four years with the Army, stationed at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. "He said, 'It's really exciting, and you're going to have the time of your life."

Kent, who was born in England, has been fighting fires for seven years, starting in Victoria, Australia. He came stateside roughly five years ago to continue the job, and lives in Inverness.

Kent said Hogan's build and military background were assets for forestry.

"Luke's a big guy, a big character," he said. "I thought he'd be a good fit."

Hogan left for the Pacific Northwest in late June to replace a member of the forestry handcrew with a private firefighting company based in southern Oregon.

For privacy reasons, Kent and Hogan would not disclose either the forestry agency they were with, the names of the fires they fought or specifically where they fought them.

Forestry handcrews use shovels and other tools to dig in fire lines, which provide a break in the ground ahead of the blaze to keep its flames from spreading.

Wildland firefighters set was what helped push also use chainsaws, axes and drip torches to cut, chop and burn away flammable vegetation in the fire's path to curb its fuel sources.

> It's hard to keep track of the fire moves through a landscape, and its ever-changing track can quickly shift to surround whatever or whoever is in its way.

Trees weakened by fire can also topple without warning on unaware firefighters below.

'It's among everybody to keep an eye on every guy, and making sure he's not fatigued," Hogan said. "The personal safety and wellbeing of everybody else is a major thing between everybody.

Hogan said there's one day from the latter part of his first wildfire season he won't forget.

It began the night before, when a massive wildfire started making its way down a mountain toward a valley and a tiny town on the other side of a river.

'There's only 400 people in the town," Hogan said. "It's in the middle of absolutely nowhere."

Contingencies were in place in case the fire made a move that evening, but the high humidity and low winds stalled the blaze in the dark.

"It was magical, actu-

that," Kent said. "We kind of expected it to blow up just sitting there."

Kent went out the next the fire, to measure weather conditions and gauge how likely future ignition would be.

Kent said he was feeling hopeful, but his opinion changed when a crew member said he felt an ember strike his face Flames as high as 60 feet were throwing small cinders over the river.

"I looked down," Kent said, "and, at that moment, the grass started sparking all around us."

Several spot fires began to rage, forcing the forestry crew to retreat back to its safe zone at a farmstead with the farmer and his workers who refused to evacuate.

"If we weren't there," Hogan said, "they would have been gone.'

Hogan understands why someone might want to stay and protect their property against a threat, but risking either their own life or the lives of others isn't worth it.

"You're going to possibly get 20 guys killed instead of having to try and evacuate," he said.

Nonetheless, the wildland firefighters had a duty to hold the line to protect the residents, their buildings, vehicles and Hogan said. livestock. They were also asked to defend a lone tree planted in the early 1800s.

Hogan said the crew went through daily debriefings, but its members rarely discussed the life-threatening scenes crew dug in fire-break they encountered with the gratitude of those each other.

"I guess we don't really talk about it," he said. "I think everybody copes with it in they're own different way; it brings everybody closer together because tensions rise between 20 guys that sleep in more of his stories. tents and spend together for weeks at a time.'

There are moments to enjoy between the firefighting, like appreciating saved from wildfires,

including a horse that couldn't stop resting its head on Hogan's shoulder.

Hogan said the experience and chance to serve beyond the borders of home should be enough for someone to try out as a wildland firefighter.

"It's very rewarding; everybody appreciates you," he said. "It feels really good.'

Kent said Hogan was the second Citrus County resident he's asked to battle fires with him, and he's looking for more like Hogan to join for future seasons.

"I see a lot of potential in him," Kent said about Hogan. "You've got a lot of good guys out in this county.







rivers would dry up. That's - rain."

Throughout 16-county region, the water management district (SWFWMD) monitors solar-powered 170rainfall-gauge sites, which capture rain levels every hour within a secured data-logger nearby.

"It gives us an idea of how we're doing — how the outlook is by keeping track of how much rainfall we're getting all year," Eldridge said. "Then we can compare that to the aquifer levels and usages in since. the area, and make decisions from there."

Since October, SWFWMD has been outfitting its rainfall gauges with Internet Protocol modems, allowing the devices to transmit data wirelessly to the district in near real-time.

"Not immediately," Eldridge said, "but every

hour.' SWFWMD has also been equipping its rainfall gauges with 100-watt solar panels and larger batteries to guarantee power for at least two weeks instead of one, Eldridge said.

There are 41 sites left for SWFWMD to upgrade, and 10 of the district's 12 gauges in Citrus County have been updated.

Data like this is invaluable for SWFWMD to better predict and respond to flooding events.

"Upgrading our rain gauges to near real-time

will allow staff to more accurately collect high water information that is crucial for verifying these flood SWFWMD's models," Chief Professional Engiwhere it all starts for us neer Dr. Mark Fulkerson said. "It also allows staff to know what areas have been impacted sooner which improves our communication with local officials and citizens."

To collect data from an older-model gauge, a SWFWMD technician had to visit it each month to upload its recordings onto a laptop.

Sometimes, rainfall-gauge site might lose power in between the monthly data collections, erasing the data it stored

Eldridge said the near real-time uploading helps prevent data collections from being interrupted, and the programming informs SWFWMD about a malfunctioning gauge a lot faster.

"It's very rare, but the sites don't go down," he said, "but it does happen, and this lets us catch it right away."

SWFWMD technicians still go out each month to check on the site's instruments, regardless if it's upgraded. They especially make sure the rain gauge itself isn't blocked with any debris or bird

droppings. "They perch up there and clog up the rain

gauge," Eldridge said. There are

safeguards in place to catch errors in data, like notifications to SWFWMD when sites haven't recorded rainfall in 10 days during an obvious storm, and an outside group also double checks the numbers.

SWFWMD's Some of rainfall gauges are attached to well-monitoring system, which gives the district information about water elevations.

Eldridge said SWFWMD is looking at where else it can install more rainfall

gauges to help cover its gaps. "We're where we want to be with the technology," he said, "but we're trying to expand the network."







Deputies fatally shoot man during confrontation

OCALA — Deputies in north Florida fatally shot a man after he refused to drop his weapon during a confrontation, officials said.

Three Marion County Sheriff's deputies responding to a call about shots being fired on Monday night found a dead man in a driveway. As they were investigating, a man armed with a shotgun approached them, the agency said in a Facebook post.

They told the man to put down the gun, but he refused and confronted the deputies.

At least one deputy fired at the man, who died of his injuries, the agency said.

The deputies, who were not injured, were placed on administrative leave, pending an investigation by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.

Officials have not released the names of the two men or the deputies. They have also not said what happened to the man who was dead in the driveway.

Woman who sued for ivermectin dies from COVID

PALM BEACH GARDENS A Florida teacher hospitalized with COVID-19 has died after her husband unsuccessfully sued to force doctors to treat her with ivermectin, a drug popular among some skeptics of accepted coronavirus treatments despite a lack of studies proving its effectiveness.

Tamara Drock died Friday, 12 weeks after being admitted to Palm Beach Gardens Medical Center, Ryan Drock told the Palm Beach Post.

He sued the hospital last month in an attempt to require doctors to administer ivermectin, a drug used to treat conditions caused by parasitic worms. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has not approved the drug to treat COVID-19, saying it hasn't proved effective in pre-clinical

Palm Beach County Circuit Judge James Nutt rejected Drock's lawsuit last month, saying allowing judges to countermand doctor's deci-

sions could set a dangerous

precedent. He urged the Drocks and the hospital to try to reach agreement on their own. A deal fell apart after a doctor agreed to administer ivermectin at a dosage the family's attorney said was too low, the

newspaper reported. Tenet Healthcare, which owns the hospital, did not respond to messages seeking comment, the paper reported.

Ryan Drock, who also was infected but recovered from COVID, told the Post he's not giving up.

"I'm hoping they name a law after her so no one has to go through this," Drock said. "If she had walked out of the hospital she could have had the medication."

DeSantis wants over \$1.5B for environment

NAPLES — Republican Gov. Ron DeSantis on Tuesday proposed spending more than \$1.5 billion for Everglades restoration, coastal resiliency efforts and other environmental projects in the coming state budget.

The governor outlined the proposed environmental spending at separate news conferences in Naples and

the Legislature.

"We are excited to announce this historic support for Florida's environment, Everglades restoration, and our water resources," he said. "We have seen great results so far, but we are not yet at the finish line."

The proposals include \$960 million for Everglades restoration and other water quality projects, as well as \$550 million aimed at resiliency projects for sea level rise, storms and flooding.

The governor has until Dec. 12 to announce his state spending plan and has previously outlined a proposal to increase teacher wages and give educators bonuses. The Legislature doesn't have to approve the governor's budget requests, but Republicans control the House and Senate and have worked closely with DeSantis in the past.

5 convicted of stealing vet, Social **Security payments**

FORT LAUDERDALE -Five men have been convicted in South Florida of running a scheme to steal more than \$1.8 million in veteran and Social Security

A federal jury in Fort Lauderdale found Omar Shaquille Bailey and Ronaldo Garfield Green guilty last week of

Miami. The spending requests conspiracy to commit fraud would need to be approved by following an eight-day trial, according to court documents. They're scheduled to be sentenced in January.

Jamare Mason pleaded guilty to his role in the scheme on the second day of trial. Two others, Kadeem Gordon and Mario Ricketts, had pleaded guilty before the trial. Two other men suspected of participating in the fraud haven't been captured.

From 2012 to 2017, the group attempted to redirect over \$1.8 million in benefits from more than 100 disabled veterans and Social Security beneficiaries, officials said. The scheme resulted in the actual loss of nearly \$1 million, though the federal government reimbursed the victims for the full amounts of their stolen benefits.

According to testimony at the trail, the group obtained the victims' personal information and used it to fraudulently open bank accounts and prepaid debit cards in the victims' names. The conspirators also forged documents that directed the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and the

Social Security Administration to deposit benefit payments into those fraudulent accounts, officials said.

Funds were withdrawn from ATMs and banks throughout South Florida and Georgia, investigators said. Much of the funds were ultimately funneled to the architects of the scheme in Jamaica, officials

City leader won't lose job for remote attendance

MIRAMAR — A 73-year-old city commissioner will keep his job after a colleague withdrew a motion to oust him for attending meetings remotely during the coronavirus pandemic.

Miramar Commissioner Winston F. Barnes had attended meetings virtually since May 20, 2020 before returning to the chambers in October, when he shared his medical conditions and said a family member remains hospitalized in a coma, the South Florida SunSentinel reported.

Before withdrawing his motion to oust his colleague, Commissioner Maxwell Chambers said staff had tried their best to provide a safe environment, including plexiglass shields and mask requirements in the chamber.

"When you're here to do the people's business, you have to be responsible, that's why we are here ... We all came back, staff came back, and there's no excuse," Chambers said.

Barnes, meanwhile, filed a motion to fire City Attorney Burnadette Norris-Weeks after asking for her legal opinion on whether commissioners must attend meetings in person and not online. Her resulting memo said that a failure to attend for three consecutive months can justify removing the person from office.

A letter from Barnes' lawyer said he had been marked "present" in the minutes for each meeting he logged into from May 20, 2020, through Sept. 1, 2021, and that he was never told he may be violating the city charter for participating virtually.





Stocks rise on Wall Street after retail sales post big gain

Stocks closed higher on Wall Street Tuesday as investors reviewed solid earnings reports from big retailers and a surprisingly strong report on consumer spending.

The government reported that Americans largely shrugged off higher prices last month and stepped up their spending at retail stores and online. The Commerce Department said retail sales rose 1.7% in October. That's the biggest gain since March and up from 0.8% in the previous month.

"It reiterates the strength of the U.S. consumer, but you have to wonder a bit as inflation expectations rise, are people rushing to get in front of that," said Mike Stritch, chief investment officer at BMO Wealth Management.

The S&P 500 index rose 18.10 points, or 0.4%, to 4,700.90 and is sitting just below the record it set on Nov. 8. The Dow Jones Industrial Average rose 54.77 points, or 0.2%, to 36,142.22. The Nasdaq rose 120.01 points, or 0.8%, to 15,973.86.

Technology stocks did much of the heavy lifting for the benchmark S&P 500, which had slightly more gainers than losers. Chipmaker Qualcomm rose 7.9%.

A wide range of companies that rely on consumer spending made solid gains. Home Depot rose 5.7% after the home sales and solid profits in the third quarter amid a hot housing market. The results also lifted competitor Lowe's by

Several companies that depend on consumer spending rose. Online crafts marketplace Etsy rose 5.1%. Nike rose 1.8% while Coach and Kate Spade parent Tapestry gained 1.5%.

The nation's largest retailer, Walmart, also reported solid financial results while raising its profit forecast, but the stock fell 2.5% and gave back some of the big gains it's made in the last few weeks.

Several other large retailers will release their latest financial results this week. Target reports its results on Wednesday and Macy's reports results on Thursday.

Health care companies also rose. Com-

improvement retailer reported surging household goods and other consumer staples lagged the market.

Bond yields edged higher. The yield on the 10-year Treasury rose to 1.64% from 1.62% late Monday.

Investors received another encouraging economic update from the Federal Reserve, which said industrial production rebounded in October with a 1.6% gain. The gain followed a 1.3% plunge in September.

Wall Street is closely monitoring the latest economic reports for more clues as to how businesses and consumers are dealing with rising inflation. Companies have been raising prices as they face higher raw materials costs and supply chain problems. Consumers have been willing to pay the higher prices on many goods, though analysts are concerned that consumers could eventually pull munications companies and a makers of back on spending because of inflation.

Just this last weekend while she knew I would be playing cards, she entered and took a new lock box she had given me and also a \$50 bill; she knew where I kept money.


After a few more weeks of entering my apartment, I remembered she had told me she had an extra key made. So I changed my locks on both doors. No more entry!

Pfizer: Others can make its COVID-19 pill

Could help to end the pandemic quicker

LONDON — Drugmaker Pfizer Inc. has signed a deal with a U.N.-backed group to allow other manufacturers to make its experimental COVID-19 pill, a move that could make the treatment available to more than half of the world's population.

In a statement issued Tuesday, Pfizer said it would grant a license for the antiviral pill to the Geneva-based Medicines Patent Pool, which would let generic drug companies produce the pill for use in 95 countries, making up about 53% of the world's population.

The deal excludes some large countries that have suffered devastating coronavirus outbreaks. For example, while a Brazilian drug company could get a license to make the pill for export to other countries, the medicine could not be made generically for use in Brazil.

Still, health officials said the fact that the deal was struck even before Pfizer's pill has been authorized anywhere, could help to end the pandemic quicker.

"It's quite significant that we will be



Since the pandemic erupted last year, researchers worldwide have raced to develop a pill to treat COVID-19 that can be taken at home easily to ease symptoms, speed recovery and keep people out of the hospital. At the moment, most COVID-19 treatments must be delivered intravenously or by injection.

Britain authorized Merck's COVID-19 pill earlier this month, and it is pending approval elsewhere. In a similar deal with the Medicines Patent Pool announced in October, Merck agreed to let other drugmakers make its COVID-19 pill, molnupiravir, available in 105 poorer countries.

Doctors Without Borders said it was 'disheartened" that the Pfizer deal does not make the drug available to the entire world, noting that the agreement announced Tuesday also excludes countries including China, Argentina and Thailand

BRUNSWICK, Ga. — Prosecutors rested their case Tuesday in the trial of three white men charged with chasing and killing Ahmaud Arbery after the jury saw graphic photos of the shotgun wounds that punched a gaping hole in his chest and unleashed bleeding that stained his white T-shirt entirely red.

Prosecutors called 23 witnesses during eight days of testimony. They concluded with Dr. Edmund Donoghue, the state medical examiner who performed the autopsy on Arbery's body, followed by the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's lead investigator in the case.

Donoghue testified that Arbery was hit by two of the three shotgun rounds fired at him. He said both gunshots caused such severe bleeding that either blast alone would have killed the 25-year-old Black man.

Donoghue performed an autopsy on Feb. 24, 2020, the day after Arbery was slain. The jury saw close-up photos of his injuries, which included several large abrasions to Arbery's face from when he fell facedown in the street following the third gunshot.

Superior Court Judge Timothy Walmsley said defense attorneys would begin their cases Wednesday.

Father and son Greg and Travis McMichael armed themselves and pursued Arbery in a pickup truck after spotting him running in their neighborhood. Their neighbor William "Roddie" Bryan joined the chase and took cellphone video of Travis McMichael shooting Arbery. All three men are charged with murder and other crimes.

Jury begins deliberating at Kyle Rittenhouse murder trial

KENOSHA, Wis. — The jury began deliberating Tuesday at the murder trial of Kyle Rittenhouse after listening to dueling portrayals of him as a "wannabe soldier" who went looking for the trouble, or a concerned citizen who came under attack while trying to protect property.

The case went to the anonymous, 12-member jury after Rittenhouse himself, in an unusual move, was allowed by Judge Bruce Schroeder to draw the numbered slips of paper from a raffle drum that determined which of the 18 people who sat in judgment during the trial would decide his fate and

which ones would be dismissed as alternates. That task is usually performed by a court clerk, not the defendant.

Rittenhouse, 18, faces life in prison if convicted as charged for using an AR-style semi-automatic rifle to kill two men and wound a third during a night of protests against racial injustice in Kenosha in the summer of 2020. The former police youth cadet is white, as were those he shot.

Rittenhouse testified he acted in self-defense after coming under attack, while prosecutors argued he instigated the bloodshed. The case has become a flashpoint in the U.S. debate over guns, protests, vigilantism and law and order.

The jury appeared to be overwhelmingly white. Prospective jurors were not asked to identify their race during the selection process, and the court did not provide a racial

Buck takes shelter inside church on season's first day

STURGIS, Mich. — A 10-point buck sought sanctuary inside a southern Michigan church on opening day of the state's firearm deer hunting season.

Pastors at Grace Sturgis encountered the buck inside the church's auditorium on Monday before it leapt through a window and back into the wild.

A video the church posted on Facebook shows the buck wandering around the church. Pastors Amanda and Luke Eicher and Justin Wickey erected barricades in a hallway to try to keep the animal from the rest of the church. At one point, it climbed stairs to a balcony.

"I was just shocked by how high he could jump," Amanda Eicher said. "I was amazed at how big he was."

The buck didn't appear to have any gunshot wounds and was bleeding just a bit from what appeared to be cuts from the glass, she told the Kalamazoo Gazette. Besides the broken window, the only other damage was blood stains on the carpet.

"We all need reasons to laugh, especially with the hard seasons from the past two

years," Eicher said. "I'm glad we could provide some laughs.'

At least 1 dead from mudslides in Canada

VANCOUVER, British Columbia — The body of a woman was recovered from one of the mudslides caused by extremely heavy rainfall in the Pacific coast Canadian province of British Columbia, authorities said Tuesday.

Police said search and rescue personnel were continuing to look for other possible victims from Monday's slides.

"Our team did recover one person," said David MacKenzie, the Pemberton District Search and Rescue manager.

He said his team came across seven vehicles at the slide site on Highway 99 near the town of Lillooet and police were trying to determine if there were any other bodies.

"It is a significant amount of debris. It makes it very difficult for our search crews. The mud is up to their waist. I can't recall our team being involved in anything like this in the past," he said.

Royal Canadian Mounted Police Staff Sgt. Janelle Shoihet said the total number of people and vehicles unaccounted for had not yet been confirmed. She said investigators had received reports of two other people who were missing but added that other motorists might have been buried in the slide.

No change in top 7 of rankings

Georgia, Alabama, Oregon and Ohio State held their places in the College Football Playoff ranking Tuesday, with Cincinnati still sitting at fifth.

There was no movement in the selection committee's top seven after all those teams won last week. Michigan was still No. 6 and Michigan State seventh, heading into the Spartans' big game Saturday at Ohio Notre Dame moved up a spot

to eighth. Oklahoma State (9-1) is now the highest-ranked Big 12 team at ninth after Oklahoma was handed its first loss last week.

Wake Forest (9-1) is No. 10, the highest-ranked team from the Atlantic Coast Conference with three rankings left until selection Sunday.

In the seven-year history of the College Football Playoff, no team has come from farther back than ninth to reach the final four with two rankings remaining before selection Sunday. Michigan State did that in 2015, propelled by a victory at Ohio State.

Oklahoma was the one top-10 team to lose this past weekend and the Sooners fell to 13th.

Notable for Cincinnati, which is trying to become the first team from outside the Power Five conferences to make the playoff, was Houston moving into the rankings at 24th.

The Cougars have already clinched a spot in the American Athletic Conference championship game, where the Bearcats could be an opponent if they keep winning.

"When I talk about how firm (Cincinnati's) position is, this week it's rock-solid at No. 5," selection committee chairman and Iowa athletic director Gary Barta said.

The Bearcats' only victory gainst a team ranked in the s lection committee's top 25 is Notre Dame (9-1). They host SMU (8-2) on Saturday and then go to East Carolina (6-4) on the Friday after Thanksgiving.

WHAT'S OBVIOUS

■ Barring a historic upset in one of its next two games, Georgia is going to enter the Southeastern Conference championship game — most likely against Alabama — playing for seeding.

■ If Alabama wins out, including an SEC championship victory against Georgia, it's in.

■ Ohio State and Oregon simply need to win out to get in. The Buckeyes have potentially the most difficult closing stretch in the country with Michigan State, Michigan and a Big Ten title game most likely against No. 15 Wisconsin or

At Jamaica in World Cup qualifier

KINGSTON, Jamaica — Tim Weah's 11th-minute goal was matched by Michail Antonio's spectacular 34-yard strike in the 22nd minute, leaving the United States with a 1-1 draw against Jamaica in a World Cup qualifier on Tuesday night.

Coming off Friday's 2-0 home win against Mexico, the U.S. was looking to move into strong position to reach the World Cup as qualifying passed the halfway point. But a point on the road still left the Americans on track to claim one of three spots from North and Central America and the Caribbean.

The U.S., which survived a disallowed

Jamaican goal in the 84th minute, has 15 points going into its final six qualifiers. Pending late games, Mexico was next with 14 followed by Canada (13), Panama (11), Jamaica (seven), Costa Rica and El Salvador (six each) and Honduras (three).

Canada played Mexico in 20-degree weather with snow expected in Edmonton, Alberta. Costa Rica hosted Honduras and Panama was home against El Salvador.

Loud reggae played on speakers during warmups before a crowd of 1,100 at 35,000seat Independence Park, known as The Office, where a statue of Bob Marley sits outside. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, this was Jamaica's first home game with fans since October 2019.

The scoreboard was off, and there was no visible game clock. The temperature was a comfortable 83 degrees for the 5 p.m. start.



Popcorn is a popular treat for kids and adults. According to industry experts, since the COVID-19 pandemic began, we're popping a lot more at home.

This week, The Mini Page learns more about this favorite snack.

A tradition of the Americas

Thousands of years ago, popcorn popped up in South and Central America. It became such an important food to the Aztecs that they used it in religious ceremonies. (The Aztecs were Native Americans who lived in the area that is now Mexico.)

They decorated their headdresses with popcorn and put popcorn necklaces on statues of their gods.

In the 1500s, the Spanish saw Aztec women wearing strands of popcorn in their hair and dancing a popcorn dance. A Spanish explorer described popcorn as a "kind of corn which bursts when parched and ... makes itself look like a very white flower."

Popcorn takes off

In 1893, at the Chicago World's Fair, a businessman showed fairgoers the first movable popcorn popper. The machines were powered by steam or gas.

Street vendors began selling popcorn wherever a crowd gathered, such as at fairs and parks. During the Great Depression in the 1930s, popcorn was often the only treat people could afford. Popcorn businesses boomed.

What is popcorn?

Corn is a member of the grass family, and it is a cereal grain. Popcorn is a type of corn, or maize (maze). Here are the four most common kinds of American corn:

Sweet corn is the corn we eat as corn on the cob.

Field corn is not as tender and sweet as sweet corn. It is used mainly to feed livestock and to make corn products such as corn syrup, cereal or ethanol fuel. Most of the corn grown in the United States is field corn.

Indian corn has tough black, brown and yellow kernels. It is used for decoration and is not usually eaten as it is. Some forms are ground to make tortillas or taco shells.

Popcorn is the only corn that pops.

What makes it pop?

There is a small drop of water inside the starch in each kernel. When the kernel is heated, the water starts to expand, or get bigger. When the water gets hot enough, it turns to steam. It starts to melt the starch. The starch turns into a super-hot, jelly-like goop.

The kernel keeps getting hotter until it reaches about 450 degrees. As the goop boils inside the kernel, the pressure grows and grows. Finally, the hull can't hold everything in anymore, and it explodes. The mushy white starch spills out and cools immediately.



Popcorn facts

Popcorn is a whole grain and is good for you.

Most of the popcorn in the world is grown in the United States Corn Belt: Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan, Missouri, Nebraska and Ohio.

Popcorn kernels 1,000 years old have still popped.

Microwave popcorn kernels are coated with oil so they will get hot enough to pop.

Parts of popcorn

The unpopped kernel is the actual seed of the popcorn plant.

The **hull** is the outside brown covering over the seed, or kernel.

The white part we love to eat is the food for the growing part of the seed. The food is called starch.



West leads the diamond king. How


should South plan the play? He has five clubs and the heart ace, so he must win seven trump tricks. These can come only from four winners and three ruffs in hand. Declarer ruffs the diamond lead and cashes the spade ace, getting the bad

Now he plays a club to dummy, ruffs a diamond high, crosses back to board with a heart to the ace and ruffs the last diamond high. South leads the spade eight to dummy's nine, draws the last two trumps, discarding the two heart losers from hand, and claims. It is a textbook

dummy reversal. It would be a different story if West were to lead his club (or a heart or a spade!). Often, leading a singleton against a grand slam is a bad idea because you cannot hope to get a quick ruff. However, here the lead removes a dummy entry prematurely. Declarer wins trick one on the board, ruffs a diamond, cashes one top trump, plays a heart to the ace and ruffs another diamond. But now South cannot both get to dummy to ruff the last diamond and return to dummy to draw trumps without letting West score a club ruff. Declarer would be left to rue the lack of the spade seven or eight in the dummy.






