# Idea? Share it at charrette

Crystal River kicks off weeklong workshop June 21 to draft 50-year masterplan

Want to shape Crystal River's future? This could be the last chance for a while.

On Monday, June 21, the city is launching its weeklong and intensive public brainstorming workshop, known as a charrette, to

help draft its 50-year civic masterplan.

All are welcome to attend the charrette's 6 p.m. kick-off event Monday at Crystal River High School, 3195 Crystal River High Drive, Crystal River.

Dover Kohl & Partners, the city's hired planning consultant, and its team of architects,

engineers, traffic experts, economists and designers are facilitating the charrette. Since June 14, Dover Kohl has been touring Crystal River with city staff.

Dover Kohl, Crystal River and almost 4,200 participants went through a three-day charrette before in June 2020 to gauge how the state should resurface State

Road 44 within city limits.

"You've done so much already," Dover Kohl Senior Project Director Jason King told City Council June 14, "and we want to be part of that history."

Between Monday and Friday, Dover Kohl will be gathering

# There was something about Mary

Former resident dies abroad in Bali; couldn't return during pandemic

Mary Castro spent the early teenage years riding horses at her rural Homosassa home, and excelling in Lecanto schools.

She left Citrus County for a jet-set life — modeling in Miami, surfing at Malibu, living overseas — but would return on occasion to visit with her mother, Joan Bracken. Sometimes she stayed a few months, sometimes a year.

Then off again: the last nearly two years in Bali, where she was working as a freelance journalist and dating an Australian.

Her mother would hear bits and pieces. A phone call, sometimes text messages. Mary stayed in touch, at least on the surface.

"She kept her adult life very secret," Joan said.

And so when one of Mary's friends called shortly before dawn on May 28, 2021, to say her 41-year-old daughter was dead, Joan plunged into grief and confusion.

"Her death is so mysterious," she said. "She wasn't the way those articles depicted her."

The Bali media said she was drinking. It said drugs were found in the villa. Stories reported she was out late, at a nearby bar, with two men.

The men accompanied her back to her villa and they relaxed out by the pool. The next morning, one of the men said, Mary didn't wake up. The authorities were called. She never regained consciousness.

# Scott questions deployment of officers to border

U.S. Sen. Rick Scott is questioning and Democrats are denouncing Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis' decision to deploy state and local law enforcement officers to the U.S.-Mexico border.

On Newsmax's "Spicer and Co." Wednesday and Panama City's News Talk 101 Thursday, Scott said the border's "national security threat" is causing a surge in human trafficking and fentanyl overdoses in Florida.

"What I would be doing is

focusing on how we can help law enforcement in Florida stop this fentanyl," he said. "The biggest problem I see in Florida is on the fentanyl side. I'd be focused on the fentanyl problem in our state."

Flanked by sheriffs and police chiefs Wednesday in Pensacola, DeSantis announced Florida will send law enforcement to the border in response to a June 10 letter from Texas Gov. Greg Abbott and Arizona Gov. Doug Ducey asking their

fellow 48 governors for assistance.

Just as Florida sent first-responders to assist Louisiana in hurricane recovery and to fight California wildfires, the governor said the state is obligated via mutual-assistance pacts to render aid.

"There's certain disaster emergency situations where we just tend to step up and help one another, so that's what we're doing here," DeSantis said, saying that since President Joe

Biden stopped deporting those in the country illegally, violent crime and drug-related deaths have increased, including in Florida.

"It's (unlike) anything anyone's ever seen down there. You have caravans that are making their way and pouring across the border," DeSantis said. "You absolutely have the cartels taking full advantage of what is going."

The Florida Highway Patrol, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, Florida Fish & Wildlife Commission and several sheriffs' offices have agreed to

# Former Citrus resident faces child molestation, pornography charges

A former Citrus County woman faces charges of lewd or lascivious molestation of a child under 12 and promoting the sexual performance of a child.

The felony charges against Trinity Hannah Estevez, 20, of Tampa, stemmed from a 2020 investigation by Citrus County Sheriff's Office deputies.

The deputies went to the Hillsborough County jail and retrieved Estevez using a Citrus County issued arrest warrant.

According to the warrant, the arresting deputy received a cybertip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. The tip disclosed that someone was using an app to share and transmit child

pornography.

According to the arrest warrant, the arresting deputy obtained a warrant for the suspect's online account to trace where they lived.

In the heavily redacted warrant, the deputy reported that another person was arrested in the home and that the sheriff's office also collected electronic equipment including Estevez's cellphone.

On the phone the arresting deputy discovered child pornography and a sadomasochistic video involving the child victim. Materials in the video were also found in Estevez's bedroom, according to the arrest warrant.

A second video also included the same child

and Estevez engaging in a sexual act, according to arrest warrant. The child is shown also watching cartoons and the video shows it was recorded in Estevez's bedroom, according to the arrest warrant.

The GPS data also shows the videos were filmed at the Estevez home.

According to the arrest warrant, Estevez left for Tampa after the arrest of the other unnamed person associated with the case and the child being taken away from the home.

Citrus County deputies learned of Estevez being at the Hillsborough County jail and arrested her on local charges on Tuesday, June 15.

send officers for up to 16 days to Texas and Arizona, he said.

Through May, the U.S. Border Patrol logged nearly 930,000 enforcement encounters at the border this year, more than double 2020 encounters.

DeSantis said the state's spiking crime rate isn't "organic to Florida" but spurred by the new administration's reversion of Trump immigration policies.

"This was a crisis created by going against policies that would be working just 'cause you don't like your predecessor," DeSantis said, noting Florida is first state to respond to the call for mutual assistance.

Texas Gov. Greg Abbott said Wednesday seven states in addition to Florida have pledged assistance. He said Oklahoma, Arkansas, Iowa, North Dakota, South Dakota, Georgia and South Carolina are sending law enforcement officers and/or state national guardsmen.

Florida Attorney General Ashley Moody Thursday urged other states to "send help" and praised DeSantis.

"Unfortunately, Florida has to do what @JoeBiden refuses to do — secure the border. The crisis he created makes all of us less safe," she tweeted. "I'm proud to stand with @GovRonDeSantis and FL's

brave LEOs to protect Floridians from the criminals and drugs flooding the southern border."

Democrats, including both announced 2022 gubernatorial hopefuls, blasted DeSantis.

Agriculture Commissioner and gubernatorial candidate Nikki Fried, Florida's only statewide-elected Democrat, tweeted, "Florida's current governor just makes controversies up to get on Fox News."

"Diverting state law enforcement to Texas and Arizona is a political stunt that makes our state less safe," tweeted U.S. Rep. Charlie Crist, D-Tampa, also a gubernatorial hopeful.

"Another political STUNT by @GovRonDeSantis — instead of perpetuating the attacks on immigrants & going after Biden Administration, why don't you focus on the people who live in FL! We're dealing w/a broken unemployment system & affordable housing crisis that you could be fixing!" tweeted Sen. Annette Taddeo, D-Miami, mulling her own gubernatorial run.

"Some basic questions for @RonDeSantisFL," tweeted Rep. Carlos Guillermo Smith, D-Orlando. "How does this help Florida? Who's paying? Will this DEFUND local police? What will they be doing at the border? When is @GovRonDeSantis gonna stop chasing boogymen to start actually helping Floridians?"

Despite this, the Club awarded \$1,000 scholarships to two Dunnellon High School seniors, contributed monthly to Food 4 Kids, a weekend feeding program and donated packaged goods to the Annie Johnston Food Pantry.

## Three fundraisers this past week bring teen with Tourette syndrome closer to his surgery

Banana bread, barbecue and beer, burgers, big trucks and classic cars — all parts of the community-wide effort this past week to help 18-year-old Jeremy Schreifel's get the experimental brain surgery he hopes will give him relief from a severe case of Tourette syndrome.

The Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS) surgery, because it's experimental, is not covered by Jeremy's health insurance.

This past week, three fundraisers raised a total of \$50,353 for Jeremy's Journey.

With the help of a case and a half of bananas donated by Tony's Produce and extra baking pans and vanilla extract from Lollygaggers, Amber Howeth baked and sold 308 loaves of banana bread, raising \$3,286.

"I was not born and raised here, but I love this community with my whole heart," she said after totaling the proceeds.

On Tuesday, the Cove Pub and Grub donated \$3,060 from sales from a special barbecue menu and Copp Brewery beer, and a match of donated tips. Also, a local repairman donated his service call charge of \$137.50 to Jeremy's Journey.

On Saturday, a crowd of people braved the heat and humidity for a Boys and Their Toys car and truck show and family fun day hosted by Extreme Decalz in Crystal River.

The Loft Bar and Grill sold hamburgers and hot dogs from their food truck, Pop Fusions brought their gourmet ice pops, volunteers sold tickets for a 50/50 drawing and chances on gift items as TJ Brown performed on the Lowman

Law Firm stage. The event raised \$44,007. "It was amazing," Extreme Decalz owner Brian Sanders said.

In addition, an anonymous donor gave Jeremy's Journey \$20,000, bringing the total to nearly \$249,000.

Jennifer Schreifels, Jeremy's mother, said what she has said at every fundraiser: "It's overwhelming. This community, all these people. We are so thankful. Without the help of the community, this would never have been possible."

As an update on Jeremy, he is currently taking a combination of medications that is suppressing his violent ties, but also has caused his emotions to be flat, interspersed with anger.

"This medication right now is just a Band-Aid ... until we reach surgery date, which we won't know until he sees the DBS fast-track team on Aug. 30," Jennifer Schreifels said. "We're glad his ties are (lessened), but the medication is definitely making Jeremy not himself."

"Also, we don't know when the surgery will be, so Jeremy can't make plans for college at CF in the fall," she said. "It's a lesson in patience."

Meanwhile, a trust fund is in the process of being established for the money raised, which will be used for the surgery and all the required pre-surgery and post-surgery therapies and procedures.

15 months later, Radio City reopens with Dave Chappelle

NEW YORK — Fifteen months after shuttering for the pandemic, New York's Radio City Music Hall reopened its doors Saturday for the Tribeca Festival premiere of a new Dave Chappelle documentary for a full-capacity, fully-vaccinated audience. The debut of "Dave Chappelle: The Time This Place," which chronicles Chappelle's pandemic stand-up series held in rural Ohio cornfields, marked the first time the hallowed midtown hall was yet again packed since closing in March 2020 — a shutdown that put a year-plus's worth of concerts, including Radio City's famous Rockettes, on ice for easily the longest spell since the Art Deco venue first opened in 1932.

"But, man, let's get up," said Chappelle. He soon after introduced a New York feast of hip-hop acts who performed according to their native borough, including Q-Tip, Talib Kweli, Fat Joe, A\$AP Ferg, Redman, Ghostface Killah and De La Soul.

Masks weren't required inside Radio City but proof of vaccination was. In announcing the event in May, New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo said it would "go a long way towards bringing back this state, overall."

Directed by Julia Reichert and Steven Bogner, makers of the Oscar-winning "American Factory" (and fellow Ohioans whom Chappelle called his neighbors), "This Time This Place" shows Chappelle realizing his quixotic vision for keeping stand-up and live performance going through the summer of 2020 and beyond.

In the rural town of Yellow Springs (population 3,700),

Chappelle mounted a stage on a friend's farm and flew in a parade of comics, some of whom showed up dying for an audience, others who were rusty from months of quarantine. Among them: Chris Rock (who was in attendance Saturday), Jon Stewart and Tiffany Haddish — along with regulars Michelle Wolf, Donnell Rawlings and Mo Amer.

The film captures an uncharacteristically nervous Chappelle before his first appearance, the considerable safety precautions taken (including Chappelle and others wincing at a swab up their nose), their battles with the local zoning board, the protest and pain that followed the death of George Floyd, and, ultimately, the profound benefits of comedy and community.

"Look at what we did," Chappelle said on stage at Radio City. "Imagine what we can do together."

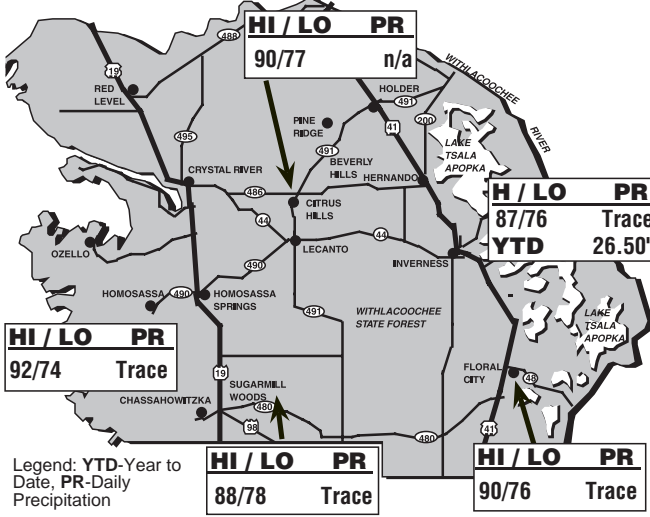

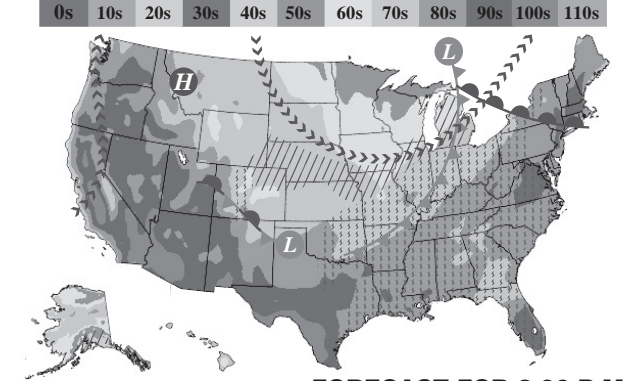

Police guessed she died of a mixture of drinking and drugs, or of an unknown illness. The police chief in Kuta, Bali, reached that conclusion without an autopsy.

"The victim's face and body also looked blue when examined," the website [www.tribun-bali.com](http://www.tribun-bali.com) quoted the chief as saying.

Mary's friends are convinced there's more to it.

"I know Mary well enough to know I doubt she'd take something out of the norm," Mike Florian, who lives in Homosassa, said. "It doesn't jive with who Mary was."

Laura Pattinson, a Lecanto High School cheerleader with Mary who had stayed in touch since then, said the story being told in Bali seems impossible to consider.

"Mary didn't do hard drugs," Pattinson, who now lives in Charlotte, North Carolina, said. "She liked her wine and her laughter."

■■■

They moved to Homosassa in 1988 from the St. Petersburg area when Mary was 9. Mary was in third grade; her half-brother, D.J., starting kindergarten, both at Lecanto Primary School.

Joan Bracken, who had divorced from Mary's father, said her kids grew up riding horses in the rural Homosassa lands east of U.S. 19.

Mary did well academically and in her social life. She was a popular girl in school.

Like a lot of teens, Mary was eager to start a new life out of her hometown.

"She wanted bigger things," Joan said. "She had bigger dreams."

In her senior year, Mary told her mother that her best friend's boyfriend was into drugs, and she needed to get away. Joan removed Mary from Lecanto High and placed her in a private Dunedin school, where she graduated in 1997.

Joan bought Mary a condo on Bayshore Boulevard in Clearwater, and she started working as a waitress at Hooters. She met Tampa Bay Bucs players, and one team official was so taken by her that he introduced Mary to a modeling agency, thus starting her career.

Mary moved to Miami and lived the life of high society, her mother said. Details, though, were scarce.

"Not as much as I wished," Joan said. "She's not in my reach anymore. She was having a lot of fun, I think."

Mary met a Los Angeles attorney who took her to the Left Coast,

where she continued modeling and freelance writing. And enjoying life. She told her mother of surfing with the Hiltons at Malibu.

Mary and the lawyer had a falling out, and she returned to Homosassa.

"He texted her, 'don't come back,'" Joan said.

It was a difficult time for Mary. "She was really hurting," Joan said. "She was with me for about a year. She was just so depressed. I told her, 'you're too young for that. You're going to go out and get a job.'"

Mary worked at a radio station and then at the power plant. She volunteered her time, too, with the Citrus County Chamber of Commerce where, as with other elements of her life, Mary made an impression.

"She was very vibrant and full of life," chamber CEO Josh Wooten said. "When Mary Castro was in a room, you knew she was in a room. We nicknamed her 'Movie Star Mary.' She drove around in a blue Jaguar and dressed to the hilt."

Wooten said Mary seemed divided in her loyalties — the comfort and familiarity of home, the excitement and adventure abroad.

"She was very glamorous with the way she carried herself, but she was a small town girl at heart," he said. "She was drawn back here. It's almost as if she had to recharge her batteries, then poof! — she was off again."

■■■

Mary had brought a friend from California, a hairdresser named Daniel. He was from Australia, and he convinced Mary to join him there.

"She really wanted to get back on in the world," Joan said.

So, off she went to Australia, which then led her to the Indonesian island of Bali in the Indian Ocean, where Australian visitors often go when their visas expired.

When the COVID-19 pandemic hit and countries began closing

borders, Joan tried to get her daughter home safely. With help from Congressman Daniel Webster's office, Mary was able to secure a flight out of Bali to the states. But she was turned away at the Bali airport and returned to her villa.

Joan clung to memories of her daughter coming home to visit.

"I loved having her home," she said. "We enjoyed having talks as adults. We walked. Long walks."

■■■

Laura Pattinson and Mary knew each other from Lecanto High School and were roommates for a few years. Like Mary's mom, Pattinson is perplexed and angry with the local Bali media for portraying Mary as a hard-drinking American.

"She did not do hard drugs. She would never take a sedative and mix it with alcohol," Pattinson said. "I loved her very much. I don't know what happened, but I don't want people to think she was this crazy party girl. It wasn't like that and it's not right."

■■■

Mary Castro's service is 10:30 a.m. Saturday, June 26, at Wilder Funeral Home in Homosassa Springs, and Mary will be buried at Stage Stand Cemetery.

Joan Bracken said she paid \$11,000 to have her daughter's body returned to Florida from Bali, a sum she attributed to pandemic-related costs.

She has spent these past two weeks reflecting on her daughter's life and dreams.

"She had that loneliness in her heart because she never married," Joan said. "She never got what she really wanted, which was a family. She dated famous people, especially in her modeling years. She didn't tell Mama a lot about what she was up to, because you didn't tell your mama things like that."

Wooten said Mary appeared to have an unspoken longing.

"I had a feeling there was a glamorous life she had outside of Citrus County," he said. "She was larger than life and she talked about modeling and things like that. She traveled a lot. I felt like, for whatever reason, she needed to be home."

■■■

Last month, Mary sent her mom a Mother's Day bracelet.

Joan told her, "I'm going to wear it until you come back."

They last spoke May 14. Their last text was May 25 — two days before Mary died.

Mary sent her a photo of a lunar eclipse.

"That's beautiful Mom," she wrote. "Just like you."

attorney to the Crystal River City Council meeting last week and asked for further delays. While council members and the mayor were polite, they said there would be no further delays.

Crystal River has been more than patient with the property owner. Council is willing to forgive \$333,350 in fines levied against

the property if they would simply do the right thing.

Some Crystal River residents have actually voiced support for the retail slum landlord standing on the belief that private property rights outweigh the needs of the community. Public health and economic revitalization of the city far outweigh any rights the investors might have. Even big-shot investment firms have to follow the law.

**Spacewalking astronauts install new solar panel**

CAPE CANAVERAL — Spacewalking astronauts equipped the International Space Station with the first in a series of powerful new solar panels Sunday, overcoming suit problems and other obstacles with muscle and persistence.

It took two spacewalks for French astronaut Thomas Pesquet and NASA astronaut Shane Kimbrough to install and unfurl the panel to its full 63 feet in length.

The solar wing unrolled like a red carpet once the final set of bolts was released, relying solely on pent-up energy. The slow but steady extension took 10 minutes, with station cameras providing live TV views.

"It is beautiful," Pesquet called out.

"Well done, both of you," Mission Control replied once the operation was complete. "That was great to see."

As the 6 1/2-hour spacewalk concluded, Kimbrough, who has three children, wished "Happy Father's Day" to all the flight controller dads. "Thanks for working with us on a Sunday."

**Pride parade crash appears unintentional**

FORT LAUDERDALE — A member of a men's chorus group unintentionally slammed into fellow chorists at the start of a Pride parade in South Florida, killing one member of the group and seriously injuring another, the group's director said Sunday, correcting initial speculation that it was a hate crime directed at the gay community.

Wilton Manors Vice Mayor Paul Rolli and Fort Lauderdale Mayor Dean Trantalis said the early investigation shows it was an accident. The 77-year-old driver was taken into custody, but police said no charges have been filed and the investigation is ongoing.

The elderly driver had ailments that prevented him from walking, according to a statement Sunday from Fort Lauderdale Police, who said he was cooperating with the investigation and there was no evidence drugs or alcohol was involved.

**Cops arrest man wanted in 3 Oregon deaths**

NORTH BEND, Oregon — A man sought in the killings of his father and two other people at a casino campground and in a shooting at a marijuana dispensary in a small Oregon city turned himself in to police in Milwaukee, authorities said Sunday.

Investigators believe Oen Evan Nicholson drove the over 2,000 miles from the coastal city of North Bend to Wisconsin, said Coos County District Attorney R. Paul Frasier.

He is believed to have abandoned his father's truck after crashing it in Oregon on Friday.

Nicholson is suspected in the death of his father, Charles Simms Nicholson, whose body was found in a trailer in an RV campground of The Mill Casino in North Bend on Friday.

Nicholson was charged with first-degree murder in the deaths of his father, Oyster and Davidson as well as second-degree attempted murder, first-degree assault and failing to help a person injured in a traffic accident, Frasier said.

## 12 dead in Alabama due to Claudette, including 10 children

ATLANTA — Tropical Depression Claudette claimed 12 lives in Alabama as the storm swept across the southeastern U.S., causing flash flooding and spurring tornadoes that destroyed dozens of homes.

Ten people, including nine children, were killed Saturday in a fiery multi-vehicle crash about 35 miles south of Montgomery on Interstate 65, according to Butler County Coroner Wayne Garlock.

He said the vehicles likely hydroplaned on wet roads, with eight children, ages 4 to 17, killed in a van belonging to a youth ranch for abused or neglected children operated by the Alabama Sheriffs Association. Two people died in separate vehicle, Garlock told local news outlets — 29-year-old Cody Fox and his 9-month-old daughter, Ariana, both of Marion County, Tennessee.

"He was a great guy and we're

really gonna miss him," said Aaron Sanders, who worked with Fox at the emergency management agency in Marion County. He said Fox also ran a hot tub business with his father and doted on his daughter. "He just loved her to death and that was his life."

Multiple people were also injured.

The National Transportation Safety Board tweeted that it was sending 10 investigators to the area Sunday to investigate the crash, which photos showed included at least four burned vehicles, including two large trucks. It said the inquiry would focus on vehicle technologies such as forward collision warning systems, fuel tank integrity and occupant survivability.

Meanwhile, a 24-year-old man and a 3-year-old boy were killed when a tree fell on their house just outside the Tuscaloosa city limits Saturday, said Capt. Jack Kennedy of the Tuscaloosa Violent Crimes Unit.

The deaths occurred as drenching rains pelted northern Alabama and Georgia late Saturday. As much as 12 inches (30 centimeters) of rain was reported earlier from Claudette along the Mississippi Gulf Coast.

Flash flood watches were posted Sunday for northern Georgia, most of South Carolina, the North Carolina coast, parts of southeast Alabama and the Florida Panhandle. A tropical storm warning was in effect in North Carolina from the Little River Inlet to the town of Duck on the Outer Banks. A tropical storm watch was issued from South Santee River, South Carolina, to the Little River Inlet, forecasters said.

WBRC-TV reported that search efforts were also under way for a man believed to have fallen into the water during flash flooding in Birmingham. Crews were using boats to search Pebble Creek.

The eight children killed in the van were returning to a youth ranch near Camp Hill, northeast of Montgomery.

# New leaders, new era: US-Israel relations reach crossroads

WASHINGTON — Their countries at crossroads, the new leaders of the United States and Israel have inherited a relationship that is at once imperiled by increasingly partisan domestic political considerations and deeply bound in history and an engrained recognition that they need each other.

How President Joe Biden and Prime Minister Naftali Bennett manage that relationship will shape the prospects for peace and stability in the Middle East.

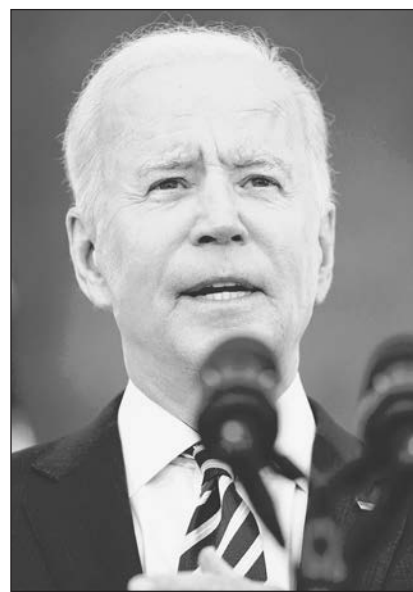
They are ushering in an era no longer defined by the powerful personality of long-serving Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, who repeatedly defied the Obama administration and then reaped the rewards of a warm relationship with President Donald Trump.

Bennett's government says it wants to repair relations with the Democrats and restore bipartisan support in the U.S. for Israel. Biden, meanwhile, is pursuing a more balanced approach on the Palestinian conflict and Iran.

The relationship is critical to both countries. Israel has long regarded the United States as its closest ally and guarantor of its security and international standing while the U.S. counts on Israel's military and intelligence prowess in a turbulent Middle East.

But both Biden and Bennett are also restrained by domestic politics.

Bennett leads an uncertain coalition of eight parties from across Israel's political spectrum whose main point of convergence was on

removing Netanyahu from power after 12 years.

Biden is struggling to bridge a divide in his party where near-uniform support for Israel has eroded and a progressive wing wants the U.S. to do more to end Israel's half-century occupation of lands the Palestinians want for a future state.

Shortly after taking office, the new Israeli foreign minister, Yair Lapid, recognized the challenges Israel faces in Washington.

"We find ourselves with a Democratic White House, Senate and House and they are angry," Lapid said upon taking the helm at Israel's foreign ministry a week ago. "We need to change the way we work with them."

A key test will be on Iran. Biden has sought to return to the Iran nuclear deal that President Barack

Obama saw as a signature foreign policy achievement. Trump withdrew from the pact to cheers from pro-Israel U.S. lawmakers and Israel. Though Iran has not yet accepted Biden's offer for direct negotiations, indirect discussions on the nuclear deal are now in a sixth round in Vienna.

The new Israeli government remains staunchly opposed to Biden's efforts to resurrect the deal. But it maintains it will discuss the issue behind closed doors rather than staging public confrontations, such as Netanyahu's controversial address slamming the agreement to the U.S. Congress in 2015.

In a conversation with Secretary of State Antony Blinken on Thursday, Lapid said the two agreed on a "no surprises" policy and to keep lines of communication open.

**Progress made in Vienna at Iran nuclear talks**

VIENNA — Top diplomats said Sunday that further progress had been made at talks between Iran and global powers to try to restore a landmark 2015 agreement to contain Iranian nuclear development that was abandoned by the Trump administration.

They said it was now up to the governments involved in the negotiations to make political decisions.

It was the first official meeting since Iran's hard-line judiciary chief won a landslide victory in the country's presidential election last week.

Some diplomats expressed concern that Iran's election of Ebrahim Raisi as president could complicate a possible return to the nuclear agreement.

Enrique Mora, the European Union official who chaired the final meeting of the sixth round of talks between Russia, China, Germany, France, Britain and Iran, told reporters that "we are closer to a deal, but we are not still there."

The U.S. did not have a representative at the table in Vienna. However, President Joe Biden's administration has signaled willingness to rejoin the Iran deal under terms that would broadly see the United States scale back sanctions and Iran return to its 2015 nuclear commitments.

**Gunmen kill at least 14 in border attacks**

CIUDAD VICTORIA, Mexico — Gunmen in vehicles opened fire in the Mexican city of Reynosa on the U.S. border, killing at least 14 people and causing widespread panic, authorities said. Security forces killed four suspects, including one who died near a border bridge.

The attacks began Saturday afternoon in several neighborhoods in eastern Reynosa, which borders the Texan city of McAllen, according to the Tamaulipas state agency that coordinates security forces. Images posted on social media showed bodies in the streets.

Authorities did not immediately comment on a possible motive for the attacks. The area's criminal activity has long been dominated by the Gulf Cartel, but there have been fractures within the group.

**Armenia votes in election triggered by war defeat**

YEREVAN, Armenia — Polls have closed in Armenia's national parliamentary election that was held to try to resolve tensions over last year's defeat in fighting against Azerbaijan over the separatist region of Nagorno-Karabakh.

Sunday's early election was called by Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan in a bid to ease public anger over the peace deal he signed in November, which set off months of protests demanding his resignation.

The Moscow-brokered agreement ended six weeks of fighting between Armenian and Azerbaijani forces, but saw Azerbaijan reclaim control over large parts of Nagorno-Karabakh and surrounding areas that had been held by Armenian forces for more than a quarter-century.

Thousands of Armenians took to the streets in the capital of Yerevan to protest the deal as a betrayal of their national interests.

# Long slams Rays, Mariners sweep

## Tampa Bay drops sixth straight

SEATTLE — Shed Long Jr. hit a grand slam with two outs in the 10th inning, lifting the Seattle Mariners over the Tampa Bay Rays 6-2 on Sunday for a four-game sweep.

"I knew I won the game. I didn't know it would be a grand slam off the bat," Long said. "It was unbelievable, honestly. Unbelievable. Just a great feeling. It's one of the coolest things you can do in baseball."

The Rays owned the best record in the majors before their current six-game losing streak.

Long's first homer of the season came against Diego Castillo (2-4). It was the first grand slam and game-winning home run of Long's career.

"It was the pitch I wanted to throw, and he just connected the way he wanted to connect," Castillo said.

Long started the season on the injured list with a stress fracture in his right shin. This was his 11th game since returning on

June 7.

Dylan Moore started Seattle's 10th with a bunt hit when Castillo's throw to third was too late to catch designated runner Taylor Trammell, who was pinch-running for Ty France.

Trammell then got caught in a rundown between third and home on Jake Bauers' grounder for the first out. Luis Torrens drew a walk to load the bases and Jake Fraley popped out to shallow right before Long's shot to right field.

France and Torrens also homered for the Mariners, who have won seven of eight.

It was the first time the Rays had been swept in a four-game series since the Tigers did it in a series finishing on July 3, 2016.

The Mariners trailed in all four games, and had the game-winning run come in the final inning three times in the series, including the last two in extras.

"Every opportunity that was presented to them, it felt like they capitalized," Tampa Bay manager Kevin Cash said. "And that's why we're going home from this trip with no wins."

Rafael Montero (4-2) pitched a perfect top of the 10th for the win.

## Birdies the last 2 holes to become the first Spaniard to win US Open

SAN DIEGO — Two career-changing putts for Jon Rahm brought two trophies Sunday.

He cradled his 3-month-old son, Kepa, as he walked off the 18th green at Torrey Pines on Father's Day. And then he collected the silver U.S. Open trophy after a performance filled with passion and absent of blunders that wiped out everyone else.

Rahm made a bending 25-foot birdie putt on the 17th hole to catch Louis Oosthuizen. He buried another curling, left-to-right birdie putt from 18 feet on the final hole for a 4-under 67 and a one-shot victory.

"Little man, you have no idea what this means right now," Rahm said to his son on the practice range when he won. "You will soon enough."

The 26-year-old Rahm became the first Spaniard to win the U.S. Open, finally getting the major prize to go along with his enormous talent. His victory also returned him to No. 1 in the world.

On a back nine filled with double bogies by so many contenders and a shocking meltdown by defending champion Bryson DeChambeau, Oosthuizen was

the last to fall.

Trailing by one shot, Oosthuizen drove into the canyon left of the 17th fairway for a bogey that left him two shots behind, and then he missed the fairway on the par-5 18th that kept him from going for the green for a look at eagle to force a playoff.

He settled for a birdie and a 71. It was his second straight runner-up in a major, and his sixth silver medal since he won the British Open in 2010 at St. Andrews.

"Look, it's frustrating. It's disappointing," Oosthuizen said. "I'm playing good golf, but winning a major championship is not just going to happen. You need to go out and play good golf. I played good today, but I didn't play good enough."

Only two weeks ago, Rahm was on the cusp of another big win. He had a six-shot lead at the Memorial after 54 holes, only to be notified as he walked off the 18th green at Muirfield Village that he had a positive COVID-19 test and had to withdraw.

Worse yet, his parents had flown in from Spain to see their new grandson, and Rahm was in self-isolation and couldn't be there for a special moment.

Sunday made up for it. His parents were at Torrey Pines to witness a

world-class performance capped off by one of the great finishes in U.S. Open history.

"It had to happen in a beautiful setting like this," Rahm said. "Three generations of Rahms on this green. One of them doesn't know what's going on."

For so much of the back nine, it was utter chaos with blunders that can define a U.S. Open.

DeChambeau, trying to become only the fourth player since World War II to win back-to-back in the U.S. Open, took the lead with an 8-iron that stopped inches away from a hole-in-one on the par-3 eighth. He had gone 30 consecutive holes without a bogey.

And then his lack of accuracy off the tee cost him. A bogey on No. 11. A bogey from deep rough on No. 12. And then on the par-5 13th, DeChambeau went from deep rough to deep bunker, blasting out of the sand over the green next to a beer box, making double bogey.

He took a quadruple-bogey 8 on the 17th hole with a shot in the canyon and a shank. He shot 44 on the back nine for a 77.

"I didn't get off the rails at all. It's golf," DeChambeau said. "I've had plenty of times where I hit it way worse See RAHM/Page B3

### Michaels, Abbott lead Virginia past Vols 6-0

OMAHA, Neb. — Logan Michaels homered for the first time this season, Andrew Abbott pitched six shutout innings and Virginia beat Tennessee 6-0 at the College World Series on Sunday.

Abbott and the Cavaliers held down a powerful Tennessee offense that averaged eight runs and hit 16 homers in its first five NCAA Tournament games.

Michaels hit Chad Dallas' hanging breaking ball out to left in the second inning for only his second homer in 343 at-bats since he joined the Cavaliers in 2019. His RBI single to center began a four-run seventh inning, and he singled and scored the Cavs' final run in the ninth.

### Mississippi State posts CWS-record 21 Ks in win

Will Bednar struck out a career-high 15 over six innings, the most at the College World Series in 25 years, and Mississippi State held off Texas 2-1 on Sunday night.

Bednar and Landon Sims set a CWS team record, combining for 21 strikeouts, and the Bulldogs (46-16) ran their season total to a Division I record-tying 766.

# Larson romps to yet another victory for Hendrick

## Collects his fourth consecutive win

LEBANON, Tenn. — Kyle Larson won again — that's all he does these days — this time in the Cup debut at Nashville Superspeedway, where Hendrick Motorsports' new star drove to victory lane for the fourth consecutive week.

Larson led 264 of 300 laps Sunday for his third consecutive win in a points race, fourth straight including last weekend's All-Star race. That win at Texas Motor Speedway kicked off a stretch of four wins in seven days as Larson collected the \$1 million All-Star payout then traveled to Ohio to pocket the \$6,000 purses in two sprint car races.

Rick Hendrick's cars have been to victory lane six consecutive weeks dating to Alex Bowman's May 9 win at Dover.

Nashville Superspeedway reopened this weekend after a decade of dormancy to host its first ever Cup race. NASCAR's top series last raced in the Nashville-area 37 years ago at the Fairgrounds, where Geoff Bodine won in the No. 5 Chevrolet for Hendrick.

To celebrate his win in his new No. 5, Larson did burnouts along the entire Nashville frontstretch to put on a show for the sold-out crowd of 40,000.

"There's a lot of fans out there and we had enough rubber and enough fuel there to do a good burnout at the end," Larson said.

Next up for Larson is a trip to Brandon, South Dakota, for Monday and Tuesday nights' World of Outlaws races at Huset's Speedway.

Larson's fourth Cup points win of the season was the first with sponsor Valvoline on his hood, which marked just the third time in 17 races so far this season that Larson featured a non-Hendrick company on his car. He's largely unsponsored after missing all but four races last season during a NASCAR suspension for using a racial slur while participating in an online race.

Ross Chastain finished second for Chip Ganassi Racing and Hendrick driver William Byron was third in a Chevrolet podium sweep.

"My goodness, we don't have anything for those Chevrolets

right now," said Ford driver Aric Almirola, who finished fourth after starting from the pole.

His Stewart-Haas Racing teammate finished fifth in one of the better days for the slumping organization. The pair of top-fives came the same day team co-owner Tony Stewart was at his first Cup race since the start of the pandemic.

### TRAFFIC TROUBLE

Traffic issues leading into the speedway delayed the start the race by 10 minutes.

NASCAR asked television partner NBC Sports to push back its first Cup race of the season to allow for more fans to get

seated before the race began. NBCSN had an NHL playoff game scheduled Sunday night and could only afford the 10-minute delay.

Nashville Superspeedway is 28 miles east of downtown Music City and the race was a sellout at about 40,000 spectators in the grandstands, temporary seating and suites.

Xfinity Series driver Noah Gragson and the wife of Cup rookie Chase Briscoe were among those caught in the congestion and Gragson tweeted that he had "been in traffic for 2 hours. Brutal."

Nashville opened in 2001 and hosted 21 Xfinity Series races

and 13 Truck Series events before it closed in 2011 when it couldn't get a coveted Cup date. Dover Motorsports owns the track and moved one of its weekends from its Delaware facility to Nashville to reopen the speedway and at last host a Cup race.

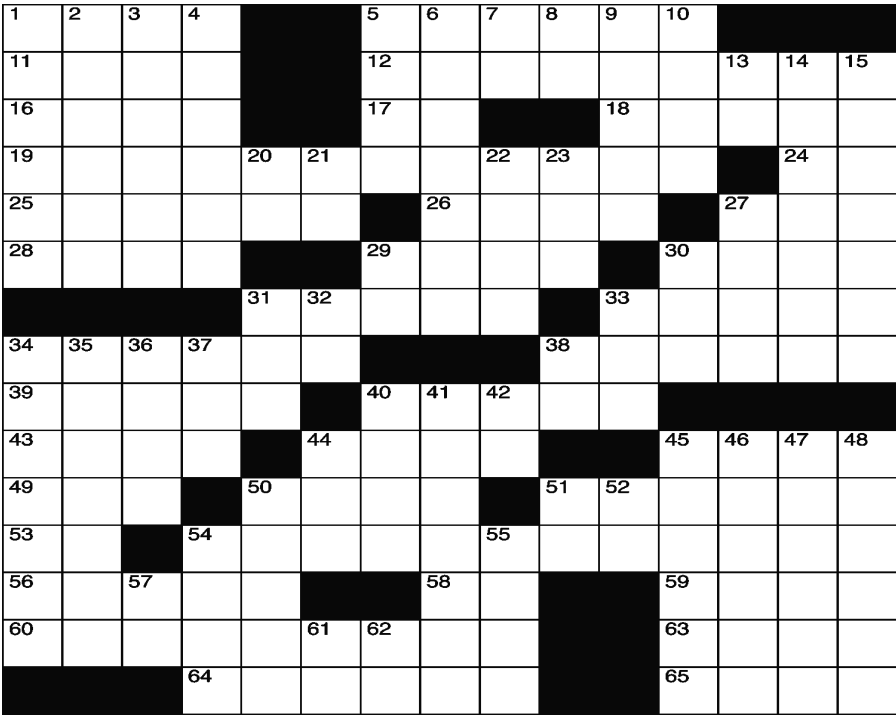
NASCAR awarded the track a four-year sanctioning agreement.

# Vegas wins it in OT

MONTREAL — Nicolas Roy converted his own rebound 1:18 into overtime and the Vegas Golden Knights rallied to a 2-1 win over the Montreal Canadiens on Sunday nights, tying the Stanley Cup semifinal playoff series at 2-all.

Robin Lehner got the start in place of Marc-Andre Fleury and stopped 27 shots, and Brayden McNabb also scored for Vegas. The Golden Knights turned the tables in Game 4 by rallying from a one-goal deficit two days after blowing two one-goal leads in a 3-2 overtime loss.

Game 5 is Tuesday night at Vegas.

Paul Byron scored on a breakaway with 1:05 left in the second period, and Carey Price stopped 17 shots. Montreal had won its previous four overtime games this post-season, and five straight dating to a 3-2 win against Pittsburgh in a preliminary round series last summer.

Former Canadiens captain Max Pacioretty — the target of a booing Montreal crowd — played a key role in setting up the decisive score. Pacioretty got a shot off by spinning around in the left circle, only to be stopped by Price.

The rebound went directly to Roy in front. Price kicked out his left pad to stop Roy's initial attempt, but was unable to control the rebound and made a lunging attempt as Roy lifted the shot over the goalie.

Vegas coach Peter DeBoer's decision to start Lehner paid off. The goalie rebounded after allowing seven goals on 37 shots in a second-round series-opening 7-1 loss to Colorado on May 30.

# Hawks take Game 7, head to ECF

## Booker's triple-double lifts Suns

PHILADELPHIA — Trae Young and the Hawks are taking their stunning turnaround to the Eastern Conference finals.

Young made a late 3-pointer and scored 21 points to help Atlanta win for the third time in the series in Philadelphia, a 103-96 victory over the top-seeded 76ers on Sunday night in Game 7.

The Hawks will open their first East finals since 2015 against the Bucks on Wednesday night in Milwaukee.

"This team is special, man," Kevin Huerter said. "Everybody has counted us out all year. For us to make it this far and win in this building in Game 7, it's huge for us."

Atlanta had been 0-9 in Games 7s on the road.

But the Hawks ignored their ignominious history and got one in Philly, where they already won in Game 1 and Game 5 and knocked out Joel Embiid, Ben Simmons and closed the book on the Process.

Not so deep down, not even the Hawks could have seen this coming, especially in March when they were 14-20, 11th in the Eastern Conference and fired coach Lloyd Pierce.

Under coach Nate McMillan, the Hawks turned into birds of prey and Young led a charge into the postseason for the first time since 2017 that kept rolling with a first-round win over New York.

Embiid, the NBA MVP runner-up, Simmons and a high-priced cast of stars were supposed to put the upstart Hawks in their place. It never happened.

Young shook off an otherwise off night from the floor — 5-for-23 — and kept shooting until he hit that 3 for a 93-87 lead with 2:31 left in the game.

Huerter, who led the Hawks with 27 points, sealed the win with three free throws and the packed house of 18,624 fell as silent as it was when the season opened without any fans.

Sixers fans let the home team have it and booed them off the court and were reprimanded by the public address announcer for throwing trash on the court.

Embiid scored 31 points.

This marked only the second year since 1973 — when the NBA began seeding for the playoffs by conference — when neither No. 1 seed will make the conference finals. West No. 1 seed Utah was eliminated by the Clippers.

Philly was on edge — the public

address announcer even noted "it's a little quiet in here" — having seen two losses in this series already. Playing for the season, Rivers played four reserves over the final minutes of the third that produced little offense and little faith the Sixers could keep pace. Embiid returned but promptly had a pass picked off by Lou Williams for a fastbreak dunk and the Hawks closed the third with a 76-71 lead. The Sixers had 17 turnovers.

Rattled by Game 7 and a packed house on the road? Not these Hawks, who took a 26-point lead in a Game 1 victory in Philly and then rallied from 26 down on the same court to pull out Game 5.

Young, the breakout star of the postseason, was a nonfactor in the first half. He had more pushups (three, after he was knocked out of the court by Dwight Howard) than baskets (1 for 12) in the first half. He even got T'd up for arguing over a rescinded foul call on the Sixers.

No matter. Huerter and John Collins picked up the slack and Danilo Gallinari hit consecutive 3s — one of an Embiid turnover — to send the Hawks into halftime with a 48-46 lead.

The Sixers had 10 turnovers in the half and again, Embiid and Curry showed the only signs of life for the offense. Simmons could be playing his way out of Philly with a postseason to forget. The All-Star guard was whistled for his third foul with 25.9 seconds in the first half and took only two shots. The embattled guard had vowed all series he would return to an aggressive style but instead was invisible on offense.

He picked up his fourth foul moments into the third quarter.

Rivers said before the game there were two big keys to winning Game 7.

"Execution for sure, and trust at the end of the day," he said. "Trusting what you've done all day and not getting away from it."

The Sixers strayed from what got them this far and now they head into an early offseason with a summer full of questions.

## Suns 120, Clippers 114

PHOENIX — Devin Booker's first exposure to playoff basketball continues to be a revelation.

Not necessarily for him, but for the rest of the NBA.

Booker had 40 points, 13 rebounds and 11 assists for his first career triple-double and the Phoenix Suns overcame Chris Paul's absence to beat the Los Angeles Clippers 120-114 on Sunday in Game 1 of the Western Conference finals.

"I don't understand why everyone's acting surprised at this point," Suns forward Jae Crowder said about Booker's big day. "This is his first time on this stage but he's capable. He's more than capable. He's more than ready. He prepares like no other."

Paul sat out because of COVID-19 health and safety protocols. Clippers star Kawhi Leonard missed his third straight game because of a sprained right knee.

Tied at 93 to start the fourth, the Suns went on a 12-2 run and pulled ahead 105-95 on Cam Johnson's dunk with 8:08 remaining. The Clippers wouldn't go away, though, cutting a 10-point deficit in the final two minutes to 116-114 when Terance Mann

hit a 3-pointer with 22 seconds left. But that's where the rally stopped for Los Angeles.

"I have no excuse," Clippers coach Tyrone Lue said. "I thought we played hard and competed. A little credit — they were making shots and we didn't. But I loved our fight. I loved what I saw."

Booker scored on a dunk on the next possession to seal Phoenix's eighth straight victory, getting a free lane to the basket on the blown defensive coverage. The sixth-year guard was a surprising omission from the All-NBA teams released a few days ago but he certainly looked the part on Sunday.

He wasn't worried about where this game ranks among his best performances.

"I'll let you guys do the rankings," Booker said. "I'm just going out there to win every game possible. I've been saying this since the start of the playoffs — every next game is the biggest game."

Game 2 is on Tuesday night in Phoenix.

Deandre Ayton had 20 points and nine rebounds for the Suns. Cameron Payne started for Paul and had 11 points and nine assists.

Reggie Jackson added 24 points for the Clippers.

## Late Saturday Bucks 115, Nets 111, OT

NEW YORK — A Game 7 thriller, the NBA's first do-or-die game to go to overtime in 15 years, came down to a matter of inches.

If Brooklyn star Kevin Durant was just slightly farther away — or if his foot was slightly smaller — he ends the highest-scoring Game 7 ever by an NBA player with a 3-pointer to win the series.

"We got lucky his toe was on the line and they called it a 2," Milwaukee's Khris Middleton said. "But once he hits that shot, we've got to forget about it. There's still ballgame left. That wasn't the game."

And given a second chance, the Bucks cashed it in for a ticket to the Eastern Conference finals.

The Bucks withstood Durant's NBA-record 48 points in a Game 7, beating the Nets 115-111 on Saturday night.

Giannis Antetokounmpo had 40 points and 13 rebounds, and Middleton made the tiebreaking shot with 40 seconds left in OT.

"At the end of the day, I try not to get too high, not to get too low. But I almost got emotional a little bit out there because the team really tried their best," Antetokounmpo said. "We kept our composure. We were down 2-0. A lot of people didn't believe we could make it."
