No noise ordinance, for now

Commissioners say they'll continue to study how to address the problem of rowdy boaters

Lots of talk Tuesday about noise from rowdy boaters, but no ordinance.

And no extra law enforcement.

Without a vote, county

commissioners declined to pursue a noise ordinance to protect homeowners from problem boaters, but promised the issue is not dead.

Commissioner Ruthie Davis Schlabach said she is convinced an enforceable law exists. "I just think enough is enough," Schlabach said. "The world is gray, not black and white, and I'm going to dive into that gray."

Later, commissioners voted down a \$561,562 proposal to add three Citrus County sheriff's deputies and a vessel for marine patrols. Commissioners Holly Davis and Jeff Kinnard were on the losing end.

County Attorney Denise Dymond Lyn said state law prohibits local governments from enacting noise ordinances for

boaters. The law allows only one narrow ordinance exception: 90 decibels at 50 feet.

Commissioners said they doubted that would solve the problem because 90 decibels is still loud.

Homosassa residents

many wearing blue T-shirts, have pleaded with commissioners to pass an ordinance to combat loud behavior from boaters that anchor in the main spring or adjacent canals and party all day,

D.A.B. shut down after dispute with FDOT

Citrus County commissioners expressed shock and concern on Tuesday with news that D.A.B. Constructors Inc. had closed its doors and stopped all ongoing road projects.

"It is a surprise for sure," Commissioner Jeff Kinnard said prior to Tuesday's regular board meeting.

The county commission had planned to approve a contract extension for D.A.B. to complete neighborhood road resurfacing by September. Instead, the matter was pulled from Tuesday's agenda and County Administrator

400 D.A.B. workers lose jobs

Michaelle Prater's husband, who has worked for D.A.B. Constructors for almost 16 years, reported to work Monday only to find he was out of a job.

The Inglis-based company went out of business Monday and let go 400 employees, including those who had been working on the U.S. 19 widening through Homosassa and Crystal River.

"The employees were given zero notice or made aware at any point that they would be unemployed when they arrived for work Monday morning," Prater said in an email to the Citrus County Chronicle.

D.A.B. Constructors closed its doors in Inglis over a

dispute with the state, according to the company.

"This is not only a blow to our family but a blow to every one of the families who are now wondering how they are going to pay the bills and put food onto their families tables," Prater wrote.

Local medical society: Health workers should get vaccines Group stops short of calling for mandatory inoculations for all working in health care jobs

As the surge of the new Delta variant of coronavirus continues to send the unvaccinated to hospitals and morgues, national and community medical associations are calling for mandatory vaccinations among health care workers. Some are stopping short and only encouraging vaccinations.

Citrus County Medical Society members voted last week to "remind all health care personnel with contact with patients to vaccinate against COVID-19, except for mitigating circumstances,"

according to a media release this week from the local organization.

The Citrus County Medical Society, which is a nonprofit organization of medical professionals, stopped short of calling for mandatory vaccinations.

While Schlabach said she would work to find a solution to an ordinance, she would not support additional law enforcement for waterways.

"This comes out of nowhere. Where are we getting the money from?" she said, adding that Homosassa residents should hire off-duty officers to patrol the waters.

Davis said she would recommend the county keep the tax rate the same because it would bring in more money due to higher taxable values. When Commissioner Ron Kitchen Jr. pointed out that's technically a tax increase, Davis responded: "We have been cheap in this county for too long."

As a kindergarten student at Seven Rivers Christian School, Norman Zerbe II found a plea for donations from The Path of Citrus County rescue mission.

"It was an envelope telling about what they do and something just clicked in me and I decided that I would like to help them," said the now-16-year-old Scout who is working toward his Eagle Scout rank.

Woman claims elderly couple's home is hers, charged with battery, burglary

A Floral City woman, 55, entered the home of an elderly couple and attempted to push the 81-year-old woman out of her own home, according to a Citrus County Sheriff's Office arrest affidavit.

Laura Lee Ohithomas was arrested and charged for resisting an officer without violence, trespass in an occupied structure or conveyance, battery on persons 65 years of age or older and burglary with battery.

Bond was set at \$29,000. On July 22, a deputy responded to a trespass at the residence of

an elderly couple. The deputy made contact with Ohithomas, who had reportedly chained and locked the gate of the residence using a padlock she brought with her.

Ohithomas alleged that she owned the property and that the couple was refusing to leave. However, the deputy discovered through the Citrus County Property Appraiser's website that it was not hers.

Ohithomas was informed that

she was being trespassed and was asked to leave. She reportedly told the deputy that she was not leaving and that the couple would be the ones leaving. The deputy informed Ohithomas that if she did not leave, she

would be arrested. Again, she refused to unlock the gate and leave, so she was placed den hose.

under arrest.

According to the report, Ohithomas refused to comply and began walking away. The deputy had to jump over a fence and chase after her. She was then handcuffed and placed in the patrol vehicle.

When the deputy spoke to the 81-year-old resident, she said that she woke up, went to take her medication and saw Ohithomas, a stranger, standing outside and using the gar-

The woman opened her sliding glass door and told Ohithomas that she had to leave, but Ohithomas refused and walked to the front of the home.

The woman opened the front door to tell her again, when Ohithomas allegedly pushed the woman's shoulder and entered her home.

According to the report, she then attempted to push the woman out of her home. She called for her husband, who was able to push Ohithomas out.

The deputy attempted to interview Ohithomas, but after her Miranda warnings were read, she refused. She was placed under arrest and transported to the Citrus County Detention Facility for booking and processing.

Music Review: Prince's 'America' vault release stunning

Anyone who feared that Prince's vault was filled with nothing but Billy Joel covers, as the satirical website The Onion joked shortly after his death, need not worry.

"Welcome 2 America" (Legacy Recordings) is the first complete, previously unreleased record to come out since Prince died in 2016. And it's a stunner

Incredibly, "Welcome 2 America" manages to be as relevant, or maybe even more relevant, today than when it was recorded, and promptly shelved, in 2010. Most of the songs have been unheard until now.

Confronting themes of racial justice, equality, big tech and just what it means to be human. "Welcome 2 America" feels like the soundtrack for the years since Prince's untimely death.

From the first song and title track, which starts off with Prince bemoaning the power of the iPhone and Google, the tone of "Welcome 2 America" is made clear.

"Land of the free/home of the slave," Prince determines, and we're off.

Oh, and it rocks too, in the genre-defying way that defined Prince's career.

Just try not to get up and dance during "Hot Summer" or "1000 Light Years From Here." There is one cover on the record, but it's not from Billy Joel. Instead, Prince taps fellow Minneapolis musicians Soul Asylum, making their song "Stand Up and B Strong" sound like a Prince original.

But "Welcome 2 America" is also tinged with melancholy. As alive, relevant and fresh as Prince sounds, there's no escaping the fact that he's gone and the only reason we're hearing this now is because of that.

Last year, West announced on Twitter - with colorful cover art and a track list - that he would release his latest album. At the time, his tweets indicated that his project would release on the same day as his rival Taylor Swift's project "Folklore," but his album was postponed.

The Citrus County Medical Society statement was released by Dr. Gustavo Fonseca, the organization's secretary. Fonseca did not return telephone calls from the Chronicle about the statement.

Neither of Citrus County's two hospitals, Citrus Memorial Hospital and Bayfront Health Seven Rivers, are making vaccinations mandatory for their staff.

Many health care companies owning hospitals and health care facilities across the nation, and many state and local governments have already mandated vaccines for health care employees and government workers.

Citrus Memorial Hospital spokeswoman Katie Myers said there were no plans to mandate vaccinations at the present time.

Citrus Memorial Hospital's vaccination rate among employees was 45%, she said. That's about the same rate as several months ago.

Myers also said her hospital was not canceling elective procedures.

The Chronicle asked to speak with Citrus Memorial's CEO Ginger Carroll about the issue, but the Chronicle did not get a response.


Rivers spokeswoman Jennifer Siem told the Chronicle her local hospital also unvaccinated." had no plans to cancel elective procedures.

As for Seven Rivers' vaccination rate, Siem told the Chronicle, "We remain consistent in following CDC guidelines which do not require health care providers to be vaccinated jobs. but do require masking of all providers and individuals in a health care setting."

She added, "Currently, while our hospital has not made the COVID-19 vaccine mandatory, many of our caregivers have chosen and are continuing to choose to be vaccinated. We continue to educate courage vaccination to fight against COVID-19."

Siem said Seven Rivers' employee vaccination rate was "nearly 50%."



Tech stock slump reins in market

A slide in technology and consumer-oriented companies helped pull stocks lower on Wall Street Tuesday, dragging the major indexes below the record highs they set a day earlier.

The S&P 500 fell 0.5%, snapping a five-day winning streak. The selling was most pronounced in technology and communication stocks, and in companies that rely on consumer spending. Traders shifted money into sectors seen as less risky, including utilities, health care and in companies that make household and personal goods.

Investors also bought bonds, sending the yield on the 10-year Treasury note down to 1.23% from 1.27% late Monday. Longterm yields have eased off from their sharp rise earlier in the year, but Wall Street is still worried about inflation.



Bay Area red tide outbreak a tragedy

I recently visited Tampa Bay to check out the red tide situation, and wish I hadn't. It was heartbreaking. I've never seen it so bad.

The dark chocolate brown water appeared devoid of life. A white disc lowered into it disappeared from view six inches below the surface. There was no sign of the usual baitfish activity, just decaying carcasses, including monster snook and redfish, floating all over the place.

I saw no manatees floating belly up, but have to believe many succumbed to their poisonous surroundings adding to an already record number of deaths this year caused in large part by a lack of seagrass on the east coast. With no sunlight able to penetrate the water and reach whatever sea grass remains in the Tampa Bay, the future outlook for animal life dependent on this vital resource is bleak.

I made the right decision in not bringing my fishing gear along. After a short while of experiencing the horrific odor and some minor respiratory irritation, I headed back home.

The recent rupture of the dike surrounding the abandoned Piney Point phosphate fertilizer plant reservoir and escape of hundreds of millions of gallons of super concentrated contaminated wastewater into the bay no doubt exacerbated the nature and extent of this tragedy. Hopefully, the operators of the plant and state regulatory agencies responsible for ensuring its safety will be held accountable.

Fish and Game has again closed the fisheries in the area, just two months after it had lifted restrictions imposed following the last red tide outbreak. Redfish, seatrout and snook are again catch-release only, which I'm sure will lead to lots more anglers heading up our way where enjoyable days on the water are still possible. Who

Terra Vista residents care about water

I take exception to your editorial on July 22 entitled "The water under all of us." Being a Terra Vista resident, the article not only misrepresented the facts on water conservation but also negatively misrepresented the perception of the residents living in Terra Vista as "elite" water mongers caring only about themselves and no one else.

A number of residents spent

many hours looking at the data on water usage and aquifers and permits, and were very knowledgeable going into the meeting. The residents at Terra Vista were actually in compliance and were well under the water usage allowable by the permit amount.

We were dropped from twoa-week watering to once-aweek watering because of over-usage of water by other county permits. At the same time, surrounding counties are allowed to water twice-aweek. In other words, we were selectively penalized for being the "good guys."

All we want is to go back to our two-a-week watering schedule as before. At the meeting, it was brought forth that there is a water leak in the permitted region of Sugarmill Woods that cannot be found. It's only 5% of the daily usage. That doesn't sound like much until you learn that the area with the leak consumes about one million gallons a day. That's 50,000 gallons of water loss a day! Does that sound like good water conservation? Find the leak and fix it!

Also at the meeting it was brought out that Citrus County is one of the luckier counties in the state because we have an abundant water supply with a large underground aquifer system that will last us for well over 20-plus years. Terra Vista had many concerned residents at our meeting with the commissioners; all we wanted was to go back to where our watering was before, because we have conserved our water usage to where it is well below that was permitted. We have good, intelligent, caring people in Terra Vista that, I feel, deserve an apology from the Chronicle's editorial board that negatively portrayed us as not caring about our water usage or our conservation. Nothing could be further from the truth. Shame on you!

The report by Gainesvillebased Wetland Solutions Inc., published this month, documented "a variety of hydrological, physical, chemical, biological and structural impairments" from 120 years of human nature.

That's unsettling.

As a result of human interaction, invasive vegetation has flourished while native fisheries and other river habitats have either suffered or naught.

Experts change minds, say vaccinated can spread virus

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention changed course Tuesday on some masking guidelines, recommending that even vaccinated people return to wearing masks indoors in parts of the U.S. where the delta variant of the coronavirus is fueling infection surges.

Citing new information about the variant's ability to spread among vaccinated people, the CDC also recommended indoor masks for all teachers, staff, students and visitors at schools nationwide, regardless of vaccination status.

Biden dismissed concerns that the new masking guidance could invite confusion, saving Americans who remain navirus transmission. unvaccinated are the ones who are "sowing policy follows recent deenormous confusion."

White House considering vaccine mandate for federal workers

WASHINGTON — The White House is strongly considering requiring federal employees to show proof they've been vaccinated against the coronavirus or otherwise submit to regular testing and wear a mask — a potentially major shift in policy that reflects growing concerns about the spread of the more infectious delta variant.

The possible vaccine mandate for federal employees - regardless of the rate of transmission in their area — is one option under consideration by the Biden administration, according to a person familiar with the plans who spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss deliberations that have yet to be made public. The White House is expected to announce its final decision after

eral Office of Management and Budget, in 2020 there were more than 4.2 million federal workers nationwide, including those in the military.

President Joe Biden suggested Tuesday that expanding that mandate to the entire federal workforce was "under consideration," but offered no further details. The Department of Veterans Affairs on Monday became the first federal agency to require vaccinations, for its health workers.

The broader requirement under consideration would be the most significant shift by the Biden administration this week as the White House grapples with a surge in coronavirus cases and hospitalizations nationwide driven by the spread of the delta variant and breakthrough infections among vaccinated Americans.

The data emerged over the last couple of days from over 100 samples from several states and one other country. It is unpublished, and the CDC has not released it. Man pleads guilty to 4 spa killings, sentenced to life

CANTON, Ga. — A man accused of killing eight people, mostly women of Asian descent, at Atlanta-area massage businesses pleaded guilty to murder Tuesday in four of the killings and was sentenced to spend the rest of his life in prison.

Robert Aaron Long, 22, still faces the death penalty in the other deaths, which are being prosecuted in another county. The string of shootings at three businesses in March ignited outrage and fueled fear among Asian Americans, who already faced increased hostility linked to the coronavirus pandemic. Many were particularly upset when authorities suggested Long's crimes weren't racially motivated but born of a sex addiction, which isn't recognized as an official disorder.

Cherokee County prosecutors had planned to seek the death penalty but decided a plea deal would bring swift justice and avoid any lengthy appeals. That's what the victims and their families who they were able to contact wanted, District Attorney Shannon Wallace said.

US stepping up airstrikes to back Afghan forces

WASHINGTON - The U.S. military has launched more than a dozen airstrikes in the past week in support of Afghan government forces in their fight against the Taliban, a sharp spike over the handful that were done in the previous six weeks, according to U.S. officials.

The Pentagon said Tuesday that both conventional warplanes and armed drones were used, but did not provide details. A U.S. official, however, gave some specifics and said there has been a significant increase in strikes since July 20, with the number sometimes reaching almost a handful a day.

The strikes, which include several conducted last week, indicate stepped up U.S. support after weeks of battlefield gains by the Taliban as U.S. troops complete their withdrawal. U.S. officials have said that the aircraft have been flown from bases outside of Afghanistan because the U.S. military pulled its combat planes out of the country.

Officers recount Jan. 6 stories

Some in tears while describing riot by supporters of Trump

WASHINGTON — "This is how I'm going to die, defending this entrance," Capitol Police Sergeant Aquilino Gonell recalled thinking, testifying Tuesday at the emotional opening hearing of the congressional panel investigating the violent Jan. 6 Capitol insurrection.

Gonell told House investigators he could feel himself losing oxygen as he was crushed by rioters - supporters of then-President Donald Trump — as he tried to hold them back and protect the Capitol and lawmakers.

He and three other officers gave their accounts of the attack, sometimes wiping away tears, sometimes angrily rebuking Republicans who have resisted the probe and embraced Trump's downplaying of the day's violence.

Six months after the insurrection, with no action yet taken to bolster Capitol security or provide a full accounting of what went wrong, the new panel launched its investigation by starting with the law enforcement officers who protected them. Along with graphic video of the hand-to-hand fighting, the officers described being beaten as they

windows and doors and interrupted the certification of Democrat Joe Biden's presidential win.

Metropolitan Police Officer Michael Fanone, who rushed to the scene, told the committee — and millions watching news coverage that he was "grabbed, beaten, tased, all while being called a traitor to my country." That assault on him, which stopped only when he said he had children, caused him to have a heart attack.

Daniel Hodges, also a D.C. police officer, said he remembered foaming at the mouth and screaming for help as rioters crushed him between two doors and bashed him in the head with his own weapon. He said there was "no doubt in my mind" that the rioters were there to kill members of Congress

Capitol Police Officer Harry Dunn said one group of rioters, perhaps 20 people, screamed the n-word at him as he was trying to keep them from breaching the House chamber — racial insults he said he had never experienced while in uniform. At the end of that day, he sat down in the Capitol Rotunda and sobbed.

"I became very emotional and began yelling, 'How the (expletive)

held off the mob that broke through can something like this happen?" Dunn testified. "Is this America?"

"My blood is red," he said. "I'm an American citizen. I'm a police officer. I'm a peace officer.

Tensions on Capitol Hill have only worsened since the insurrection, with many Republicans playing down, or outright denying, the violence that occurred and denouncing the Democratic-led investigation as politically motivated. Democrats are reminding that officers sworn to protect the Capitol suffered serious injuries at the hands of the rioters.

All of the officers expressed feelings of betrayal at the Republicans who have dismissed the violence.

"I feel like I went to hell and back to protect them and the people in this room," Fanone testified, pounding his fist on the table in front of him. "Too many are now telling me that hell doesn't exist or that hell actually wasn't that bad. The indifference shown to my colleagues is disgraceful."

The witnesses detailed the horror of their assaults and the lasting trauma in the six months since, both mental and physical. At the hearing's end, the witnesses all pleaded with the lawmakers to dig deeper into how it happened.

convicted in drug case

LOS ANGELES - A federal jury on Tuesday convicted a wealthy California political donor on charges he injected gay men with methamphetamine in exchange for sex, leading to two deaths and other overdoses.

Ed Buck, 66, was found guilty of all nine felony counts in federal court, which could lead to a life sentence. The verdict came exactly four years after one of the victims, 26-year-old Gemmel Moore, was found dead of an overdose in Buck's West Hollywood apartment.

"Today is bittersweet," LaTisha Nixon, Moore's mother, said after the verdict. "We got victory today."

The jury deliberated for more than four hours after a two-week trial. A sentencing date has not yet been scheduled.

Prosecutors said Buck paid men and provided drugs in return for sex acts. Buck had pleaded not guilty. His defense lawyers said neither fatal overdose victim died from meth and that many of the alleged victims were drug addicts.

Buck's attorneys one of whom was a prosecutor in the O.J. Simpson case did not immediately return a request for comment.

Buck's 2019 arrest marked a turning point for activists who protested outside his apartment and pressured law enforcement to act after Moore died on Buck's floor in 2017.

Even after Timothy Dean, 55, died 18 months later, it took another nine months and the near-death of another overdose victim before Buck was arrested in September 2019.

SEOUL, South Korea -North and South Korea exchanged messages Tuesday in communication channels that have been dormant for more than a year and agreed to improve ties positive steps but ones that still leave any resumption of stalled negotiations to rid the North of its nuclear weapons a long way off.

Liaison officials from the Koreas had several phone conversations including one on a military hotline and agreed to resume speaking regularly, Seoul officials said. The rivals use the channels to lay out their positions on issues and even propose broader dialogue, and the links are also critical to preventing any accidental clashes along their disputed sea boundary.

Police in Nicaragua arrest opposition leader

MANAGUA, Nicaragua -Police in Nicaragua arrested on Tuesday academic José Antonio Peraza, the leader of the opposition alliance White and Blue National Unity.

Peraza, a political science professor, was the 22nd opposition leader arrested, in addition to seven potential presidential candidates detained in a crackdown that started two months ago. Almost all were detained under broad accusations of treason.

On Saturday, opposition leader Noel Vidaurre was placed under police custody at his home, as was political commentator Jaime Arellano.

Almost all of those who could have challenged President Daniel Ortega in the Nov. 7 elections have now been detained.

TALLAHASSEE - With most students expected to be in classrooms next month, after many learned online for at least part of the 2020-2021 school year, retailers anticipate a surge in shopping during Florida's upcoming backto-school sales tax "holiday."

The return of students who re mained at home last year because of the COVID-19 pandemic is expected to mean a need for new clothes, footwear, backpacks and even pens and paper when the 10-day tax holiday begins Saturday.

'They're going to need supplies. But there's a special emphasis now I think with things like backpacks and clothing, that maybe there wasn't the same

focus on last year," Florida Retail Federation President Scott Shalley said Tuesday.

During the holiday, shoppers will be able to avoid paying sales taxes on clothes, shoes and backpacks that cost \$60 or less. school supplies that cost \$15 or less, and the first \$1,000 of the price of personal computers, including laptops and tablets, and computer accessories.

The holiday is part of a \$196.3 million tax package that state lawmakers approved in April.

State economists estimate Floridians will save \$69.4 million during the 10-day period, cutting state revenue by \$53.3 million and reducing local tax dollars by \$16.1 million. The holiday will run through Aug. 9.

"I hope it holds to be accurate," Shalley said of the

This is the second consecutive year that shoppers have been able to avoid paying sales taxes on the first \$1,000 of the price of consumers. Cell phones don't qualify as computer electronics.

The accounting firm KPMG estimates the average per-child cost in back-to-school items will be \$268 this year, a 9% increase from last year.

TALLAHASSEE -Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis, whose re-election campaign is selling koozies quoting him saying, "How the hell am I going to drink a beer with a mask on?" held a private meeting Monday with doctors to oppose mask mandates in public schools.

DeSantis said he fears that the federal government might try to force mask mandates in schools, saying children would suffer.

"Our view is that this should absolutely not be imposed. It should not be mandated. And I know our Legislature feels strongly about it," said DeSantis. He predicted lawmakers would hold a special session "to be able to provide protections for parents and kids who just want to breathe freely and don't want to

be suffering under these masks during the school year."

DeSantis didn't invite media to the discussion. but his office provided a video and transcript of the meeting in the state Capitol. Florida accounted for a fifth of the nation's new coronavirus infections last week. more than any other state, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease **Control and Prevention**

But DeSantis has been firmly opposed to lockdown restrictions, mask mandates and vaccine passports, signing a bill into law that prevents businesses to ask for proof of vaccination and local governments from imposing COVID restrictions.




Randolph's department has 316 employees in six offices who assist about 800,000 customers with property taxes, auto titles, and driver's licenses.

Homeschooling surges

lthough the pandemic disrupted family life across the U.S. since taking hold in spring 2020, some parents are grateful for one consequence: They're now opting to homeschool their children, even as schools plan to resume in-person classes.

The specific reasons vary widely. Some families who spoke with The Associated Press have children with special educational needs; others seek a faith-based curriculum or say their local schools are flawed. The common denominator: They tried homeschooling on what they thought was a temporary basis and found it beneficial to their children.

"That's one of the silver linings of the pandemic — I don't think we would have chosen to homeschool otherwise," said Danielle King of Randolph, Vermont, whose 7-year-old daughter Zoë thrived with the flexible, one-on-one instruction. Her curriculum has included literature, anatomy, even archaeology, enlivened by outdoor excursions to search for fossils. The surge has been confirmed by the U.S. Census Bureau, which reported in March that the rate of households homeschooling their children rose to 11% by September 2020, more than doubling from 5.4% just six months earlier.

Black households saw the largest jump; their homeschooling rate rose from 3.3% in the spring of 2020 to 16.1% in the fall.

The parents in one of those households, Arlena and Robert Brown of Austin, Texas, had three children in elementary school when the pandemic took hold. After experimenting with virtual learning, the couple opted to try homeschooling with a Catholic-oriented curriculum provided by Seton Home Study School, which serves about 16,000 students nationwide.

The Browns plan to continue homeschooling for the coming year, grateful that they can tailor the curriculum to fit their children's distinctive needs. Jacoby, 11, has been diagnosed with narcolepsy and sometimes needs naps during the day; Riley, 10, has tested as academically gifted; Felicity, 9, has a learning disability.

"I didn't want my kids to become a statistic and not meet

Ariena Brown, who gave birth to a fourth child 10 months ago, worked as a preschool teacher before the pandemic. Homeschooling, she says, has been a rewarding adventure.

"In the beginning, the biggest challenge was to unschool ourselves and understand that homeschooling has so much freedom," she said. "We can go as quickly or slowly as we need to."

Race played a key role in the decision by another African American family to homeschool their 12-year-old son, Dorian.

Angela Valentine said Dorian was often the only Black student in his classes at a suburban Chicago public school, was sometimes treated unfairly by administrators, and was dismayed as other children stopped playing with him.

As the pandemic eased, the family decided to keep Dorian at home and teach him there, using a curriculum provided by National Black Home Educators that provides content for each academic subject pertaining to African American history and culture.

"I felt the burden of making the shift, making sure we're making the right choices," Valentine said. "But until we're really comfortable with his learning environment, we'll stay on this homeschool journey.'

Having observed Lily's progress with reading and arithmetic while at home during the pandemic, Osgood is convinced homeschooling is the best option for her going forward.

She has made the same decision for her 12-year-old son Noah, who didn't like the remote classes offered by his public school in the spring of 2020, and did homeschooling throughout the 2020-21 school year. It went so well that they want to continue for at least a few more years.

"He told me he was learning so much more at home than he ever did in school," Osgood re-called. "He said, 'School is just so chaotic — we don't get very much done in any particular class. Here, I sit down, you tell me what to do, and minutes later I'm done.'

Heather Pray of Phoenix, Maryland, says homeschooling has been a major success for her 7-year-old son, Jackson, who has autism. The family made the switch because Jackson was struggling with the virtual learning that his school provided during the pandemic.

"My son did great (with homeschooling), even with just two hours of schoolwork a day," Pray said. "I got him into piano lessons, taught him to read.'

Pray is also homeschooling her daughter, Hayley, who's going into seventh grade and had been attending a Christian school.

"I had no idea how this was going to go — I just dove in headfirst," said Pray. "I felt God was holding my hand.

The Gonzalez family from Appomattox, Virginia — who are devout Catholics - opted to homeschool their three sons, ages 9, 13 and 15, after their Catholic school in Lynchburg closed in 2020 due to falling enrollment.

They're using the Catholic-focused curriculum from Seton Home Study School, which Jennifer Gonzalez, the boys' mom, described as rigorous but well-organized.

"My kids have just excelled," she said. "We're able to be home and be together."

Texas, Oklahoma make request to join SEC

Will be considered in the 'near future'

Texas and Oklahoma made a request Tuesday to join the Southeastern Conference in 2025 — with SEC Commissioner Greg Sankey saying the league would consider it in the "near future."

The wheels are in motion for a monumental move in college sports, but the Longhorns and Sooners are not yet free agents. And it's doubtful they want to wait until the contract that binds them to the Big 12 for four more years runs out to bolt to the SEC.

It also might not be in the best interest of the Big 12 to have two lame ducks in the conference much beyond the 2021-22 school vear.

"It's similar to a divorce, but it's business relationship where multiple parties realize that they just can't be together anymore," said Darren Heitner, a sports and entertainment attorney based in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. "You try to come to a resolution where perhaps nobody feels great about it, but at least there's something where they feel as though they're getting some fair value out of the equation."

A day after Oklahoma and Texas notified the Big 12 that they would not be extending a grant of media rights agreement past its 2025 expiration date, the schools publicly stated for the first time they want to join the SEC.

Oklahoma and Texas sent a joint letter to Sankey, requesting "invitations for membership to the Southeastern Conference starting

To protect team, self

TOKYO - Simone Biles arrived in Tokyo as the star of the U.S. Olympic movement and perhaps the Games themselves. She convinced herself she was prepared for the pressure. That she was ready to carry the burden of outsized expectations.

Only, as the women's gymnastics team final approached on Tuesday night, something felt off. And the athlete widely considered the Greatest of All Time in her sport knew it.

So rather than push through the doubts that crept into her head as she's done so many times in the past, Biles decided enough was enough. She was done. For now.

The American star withdrew from the competition following one rotation, opening the door for the team of Russian athletes to win gold for the first time in nearly three decades.

Jordan Chiles, Sunisa Lee and Grace McCallum guided the U.S. to silver while Biles cheered from the sideline in a white sweatsuit, at peace with a decision that revealed a shift not only in Biles but perhaps the sport she's redefined.

"We also have to focus on ourselves, because at the end of the day we're human, too," Biles said. "So, we have to protect our mind and our body, rather than just go out there and do what the world wants us to do.



"It stings," Cat Osterman would say more than two hours later. "I've never been on a team that had so much fight."

Just not enough.

Japan won its second straight Olympic softball gold medal, beating the United States 2-0 Tuesday night behind 39-year-old Yukiko Ueno in an emotional repeat of the 2008 victory in Beijing.

For Osterman and Monica Abbott, it was just like 4,723 days earlier.

Only worse. This likely was their final moment on their sport's grandest stage, which the International Olympic Committee has snatched away until at least 2028.

"I challenge the IOC to instate softball as a women's sport into the Olympic docket on a regular basis." said Abbott, who pitched a night before her 36th birthday. "It's been proven that we attract viewers, we're active on social media. It's a worldwide sport. It's played really well in multiple continents and areas of the world, and I think it's really difficult when you're in an Olympics and then out of an Olympics, you're in one and you're out of one, to continue to build that momentum and engagement for this sport to grow worldwide.'

Biles, Osaka

TOKYO — Simone Biles came into the Olympics as perhaps the biggest star of the Games. Naomi Osaka was such a big headline act that she was given the honor to light the Olympic flame in her native country.

In a matter of just hours on Tuesday, Osaka was knocked out early from the Olympic tennis tournament and Biles pulled out of the gymnastics team competition when she realized following a shaky vault she wasn't in the right headspace to compete.

Biles is scheduled to defend her Olympic title in the all-around final on Thursday. She also qualified for all four event finals later in the Games. Whether she will get that opportunity remains to be seen.

Osaka, who was born in Japan and grew up in the United States, struggled with her usually reliable groundstrokes and lost 6-1, 6-4 in the third round to former French Open finalist Marketa Vondrousova of the Czech Republic

"I definitely feel like there was a lot of pressure for this," Osaka said. "I think it's maybe because I haven't played in the Olympics before and for the first year (it) was a bit much. I think I'm glad with how I played, with taking that break that I had.'

ALASKA GOLD

Seventeen-year-old Lydia Jacoby of Alaska pulled off a stunning victory in the women's 100breaststroke, meter upsetting American teammate and defending champion Lilly King.

"I was definitely racing for a medal. I knew I had it in me," said Jacoby, who hails from the tiny town of Seward, which has a population of 2,733. "I wasn't really expecting a gold medal, so when I looked up and saw the scoreboard it was insane.'

STREAK SNAPPED

The streak of 12 straight gold medals for the U.S. men in the individual backstroke ended when a pair of Russians beat out defending Olympic champion Ryan Murphy in the 100-meter race.

Evgeny Rylov won the gold medal in 51.98 and teammate Kliment Kolesnikov took the silver in 52.00. Murphy settled for the bronze in 52.19.

It was the first backstroke defeat for the U.S. men at the Olympics since the 1992 Barcelona Games.

STREAK EXTENDED

The U.S. women's basketball team opened play with an 81-72 win over Nigeria that extended the Americans' win streak at the Olympics to 50 games.

A'ja Wilson scored 19 points and grabbed 13 rebounds in her debut.

MOVING ON

The United States made it through to the quarterfinals of the women's Olympic soccer competition after a 0-0 draw with Australia.

The Americans are looking to win a fifth Olympic gold medal in Tokyo. They are also vying to become the first team to win at the Olympics following a World Cup title.

HISTORIC FIRST

Flora Duffy won the Olympic women's triathlon, earning Bermuda's first gold medal ever and first medal of any kind since 1976.

Duffy is a two-time former world triathlon series champion. She's competing in her fourth Olympics and is one of just two athletes representing Bermuda in Tokyo.

STRUGGLING CHAMPS

The expected Olympic showdown between the top two women's volleyball teams in the world turned out to be a one-sided affair.

started taking criminal justice classes at Lake-Sumter State College in Leesburg, she said she knew she had found her path.

What she likes about law enforcement, she said, is that "the action definitely is appealing and (I'm) able to do good in the community.'

Staying active is a way of life for Barry. She participates in a volleyball league and likes to run and kickbox.

Doing good in the community also seems to come naturally. She volunteers with the Citrus County Education Foundation's Women Building Women Mentoring Program and with Little League. Her son and stepson, 7 and 15, respectively, enjoy baseball.

Mostly, though, Barry said she works. And she spends time with her family.

The job can be pretty consuming, although she said she and her husband try to leave the job at the door.

'But it's nice to have someone to bounce things off, someone who understands," she said.

Her job is a major focus. She's received training in "Proactive Investigations in Child Sex Trafficking," and 'Advanced Undercover Chat Training' through the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force, operated through the U.S. Department of Justice.



And there's much more, including Barry's pursuit of a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Columbia Southern University.

She said that for her work with the department's high-tech crime unit, "We're constantly getting training. ... There's so much to learn.'

As a woman in a male-dominated job, Barry has received training at the police academy in Eustis in defensive tactics and how to use force. Although she said she's always been physically

So, she said, she relies both on her physical agility and her communication skills.

She said when both a male and female deputy go on a call, "You can work off each other. You can deescalate by using communication.'

For her efforts, she's received a Distinguished Victims Services Award from state Attorney General Ashley Moody for her work and contributions to crime victims, and a medal of commendation for helping in a case in which thousands of images of child pornography were found and a live victim was saved.

She earned another certificate of commendation for receiving a confession in a sexual battery case in which the victim was younger than 12, and a certificate of commendation for working with outside agencies on a cybertip and building a case resulting in the successful prosecution of a husband and wife for sexually battering and exploiting a juvenile victim.

And that's just the tip of the iceberg of some of the difficult cases in which Barry has been involved.

Citrus County residents have not been shy in telling her that she's appreciated.

'In our community, we're supported so much," she said. "Daily, people thank us for what we do. The work is important. Not all law enforcement is bad.'

But Barry said that some of the most touching appreciation she has received is from young girls when she goes into a school or on a case She said one little girl asked her,

"Are you a policewoman?"

"I told her I was," Barry said. "It's very rewarding. I can have a lot of impact in such a positive way. We need more females in law enforcement," she said.





Mini Fact: Grizzly bears live about 12 to 30 years in the wild.

The grizzly bear is an awesome animal. It is so big and powerful that it has almost no enemies. A mother grizzly protecting her cubs is one of the most dangerous animals on Earth.

But grizzly bears are also intelligent and playful. This week, The Mini Page learns more about these fearsome, furry bears.

Color and size

The grizzly bear is also called the brown bear. Its fur may also be black or blond. It gets the name "grizzly" from the white ends of its fur. ("Grizzled" means something scattered with white or gray.)

Grizzlies are among the biggest bears on Earth. The polar bear is the only other bear that can get as big. When it rears up on its back paws, a grizzly may be 7 feet tall. An adult male may weigh up to 1,700 pounds.

What they eat

Grizzlies are **omnivores**, which means they eat a large variety of food. Their main foods are from plants, including grasses, fruits, berries, pine nuts, roots, honey and bulbs.

Grizzlies eat carcasses of dead animals. They hunt down elk or bison calves. They eat small animals such as gophers and ground squirrels, and insects such as ants and moths.

They are great at fishing, standing in the water and scooping up salmon or trout.

The grizzly year

When grizzlies start leaving their dens in April or May, the mother bear is especially protective of her cubs and their food, since they have not eaten for several months.

During the summer and early fall, a grizzly's life revolves around food. It is either finding and eating food, or sleeping.

Each autumn, a grizzly gains about one-third of its body weight in fat. Around November, grizzlies usually dig a new den and then go into their long winter hibernation.

Hibernating

When animals hibernate, they go into a special kind of deep sleep. They do this in order to survive long winters when food is scarce.

Grizzly bears may hibernate for more than half a year. During this time, they do not eat or drink, and they do not get rid of body waste. They live off layers of body fat.

Cubs are born when the mother is hibernating. The mother awakens to be sure

the cubs are tucked in warmly. She regularly cleans and cares for the cubs during the hibernation period.

The cubs spend the rest of the winter drinking milk from their mom and sleeping.

Experts believe that about 200 years ago, there were around 50,000 grizzlies in the western U.S. Today there are fewer than 1,500 south of Canada. (There are about 31,000 in Alaska.) The grizzly is a threatened species in the lower 48 states.

The biggest threat to the grizzly is the destruction of its habitat by logging, mining, housing development and road building.

A bear's life

Grizzly bears spend most of their time alone. Males usually roam over a large area, often covering more than 2,000 square miles, more than the state

of Delaware. Females range over territory only about onefourth as big. During

mating season, from May to early July, male

grizzlies search for females. The males and females then stay in the same territory for a short time. Male grizzlies do not help care for the cubs.

Grizzlies are great diggers. They use their long claws and big muscles to help them dig up roots. They also can dig up small animals such as gophers from their underground homes.



tournament. Also, what is the par contract, the best possible result for both sides?

South, with six losers, was slightly aggressive in bidding game, but he knew it could be laydown. East's double of four spades was speculative, but players often do that sort of thing in pairs events, especially if needing a good result to place. Also, here East was theoretically right because South had four losers. Although South could establish the diamond jack by leading twice toward his hand, the discard would serve no purpose.

However, West understandably led the club queen. But when declarer incorrectly ducked that, West shifted to the heart 10. Declarer ducked that too, so West went back to clubs, South capturing East's king with his ace. Declarer drew three rounds of trumps, West throwing hearts, and exited with the diamond two from hand. West went in with his nine and cashed the club jack: down one.

What was the unusual feature of the deal?


East doubled the final contract, but West won all four defensive tricks!

Strangely, the par result is four spades doubled and down one (after any lead but a club!) because East-West can make four hearts. The only game for North-South is three no-trump.
