#YourChoice: Semester 2 Student Enrollment Commitment for Current Virtual School families

The Citrus County School District strives to do what is best for all students, and we know that students are best served by having stability and consistency in their learning. Building on the success of our *Citrus Cares! Reopening Plan*, we want to ensure students are making adequate academic progress in the best learning environment possible while continuing to promote parental choice.

Per the recent Emergency Order filed November 30, 2020 by Florida's Commissioner of Education, Richard Corcoran, we are reviewing the academic progress of our students who are currently participating in virtual learning and planning for the second semester that begins on January 19th and ends on June 4th.

We are asking Citrus Virtual families to commit to the learning option that is best suited for their student by responding to the *Student Enrollment Commitment Form* that will be available in Skyward Family Access the morning of Friday, December 4th. Citrus Virtual families will also be receiving an email Thursday, December 3, with more details about this process. The *Student Enrollment Commitment Form* needs to be completed by Wednesday, December 9th.

The email will explain the options our virtual families have moving forward in the 2nd semester based on their child's academic progress during the first semester of school.

"Our main priority is making sure our virtual students are achieving academic success," says Superintendent Sandra "Sam" Himmel. "Making this choice for the remainder of the school year is also going to help our students maintain consistency in their classrooms."

Again, the *Student Enrollment Commitment Form* needs to be completed by Wednesday, December 9th.
