

Still no Citrus cold weather shelter

As the overnight temperatures continue to dip, the people in Citrus County who regularly work with people who are homeless are growing increasingly anxious.

In October, the local Salvation Army made the decision to no longer offer its facilities as a cold weather shelter.

As Maj. Hank Harwell, the Lecanto-based Salvation Army administrator, had explained in an email, the number of people utilizing the cold weather shelter as well as the

number of volunteers had declined, especially since the beginning of the coronavirus pandemic.

Also, a recent corporate policy mandating that all their regular volunteers need to be certified in their Safe From Harm program that protects children and vulnerable adults, "limited their pool of potential volunteers even more," adding, "We cannot accept the liability that would impose on us as an organization."

Since then, the groups, organizations and individuals who care about homeless people have been searching for a solution,

with no solution in sight.

"We have our feelers out, but there's nothing so far," said Vikki Spiller who, with her husband Cliff, runs B.A.S.I.C.S. United Homeless Outreach nonprofit organization in Citrus County.

"We've thought about how churches could take turns opening up their facilities for a night, but so far that's not happening.

"I drive around and there are so many empty buildings, and even if someone could donate or rent one out for a few months, that could work," she said.

Citrus County commissioners soundly reject move to universal garbage

County commissioners Tuesday once again put the lid on universal garbage.

They voted unanimously to reject the idea and opted to stay with the current system, which allows residents to deal with multiple providers or take garbage to the landfill themselves.

"I'm for free enterprise,"

Commissioner Scott Carnahan said. "I believe you should be able to do what you want."

County Commissioner Ruthie Schlabach said she would never vote for universal garbage if it ended up costing residents more. In Beverly Hills alone, she said, it would hike homeowners' bills by \$130. She based that on bids that came back to the county from three companies.

County Commissioner Ron

Kitchen Jr. said he believes universal garbage is the way to go but now is not the time.

The issue has come up several times in the past 25 years, but no board has ever taken the plunge.

A packed house showed up for the special meeting. All opposed universal pickup and they applauded the board's final vote.

"We need to put this to bed today," Bill Harris of Citrus Springs said. "We've got other

things to talk about."

County Commissioner Holly Davis said the timing "is just hideous" because residents are already saddled with a stormwater assessment tax and dealing with a pandemic. The county has not ironed out all the details on the plan, she said.

"(Universal garbage) is what we need long-term as a county,"

County nixes Pirates Cove purchase — again

County Commissioner Jeff Kinnard's second attempt to convince his colleagues to purchase Pirates Cove and transform it into a public park was again shot down.

The board voted 3-2 Tuesday not to support Kinnard's updated plan.

Kinnard, who had been leading the charge to buy the property off Ozello Trail, asked the board to seek new appraisals for four of the five lots with the county's contribution not to exceed \$375,000.

The money would come out of

these revenue pots: \$190,000 from District 1 park fees; \$100,000 from the Citrus County Tourist Development Council (subject to TDC approval); and \$85,000 from the Duke Energy special projects funds.

Kinnard said he has been working with several individuals and a nonprofit to purchase the remaining fifth lot which it would then convey to the county.

He got support from County Commissioner Holly Davis, who agreed impact fee funds to expand

park is a perfect use of that money.

But Commissioner Scott Carnahan said the county must prioritize its needs and right now, road resurfacing is high on that list.

He echoed earlier comments about not spending taxpayers' money on the purchase.

Instead, Carnahan supports lobbying in Tallahassee for conservation funding. That has not even been attempted, he said. Plus, there's no hurry. The property has been vacant for almost 30 years, he added.

"We don't have a money tree out there to keeping pulling out of," Carnahan said.

Kinnard said the impact fees and TDC funds cannot be used for road resurfacing. The Duke money could be used for roads only if it is placed in the general fund, he said.

Commissioner Ron Kitchen Jr. likened this move to what the board did in 2017 when a group of Homosassa residents asked for assistance in securing funding to buy property along the Homosassa River for a park.



Man accused of shooting at neighbor

Cops: Wandering livestock behind tiff

A man was in udder shock when he was shot at while trying to retrieve his wandering cattle from a neighbor's yard, according to a Citrus County Sheriff's Office arrest affidavit.

Matthew Dombrowski of Dunnellon, 60, was arrested and charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon without intent to kill. Bond was set at \$2,000.

On Nov. 25, deputies arrived at a Dunnellon residence in response to a disturbance involving an alleged firearm and gunshots.

When deputies arrived, they met Dombrowski, who was walking to the end of his driveway.

According to the report, deputies used their flashlight to see him and identified themselves as law enforcement.

In response, Dombrowski reportedly shone a flashlight in a sergeant's face. He was instructed to stop multiple times, but did not comply.

According to the report, Dombrowski began to reach into his pocket and when told to remove his hands, became argumentative. Due to the nature of the initial phone call, deputies

detained him. Deputies then spoke with the victim and witness. The witness said he was closing his gate for the evening when he saw someone had struck his fence. He then noticed his cows were standing in the middle of the road.

The witness, victim and another individual were attempting to corral the cattle when some of the animals reportedly walked down Dombrowski's driveway.

While walking down Dombrowski's driveway, the victim alleged he said out loud he was attempting to retrieve the wandering cows. After hearing three or four gunshots, the victim said he fell to the ground to avoid the bullets.

While on the phone with the victim, the witness said he heard gunshots and the victim yell he

was being shot at. The witness reportedly ran toward Dombrowski's home, saying it was just the victim and to stop shooting.

Dombrowski allegedly said he "didn't (explicit) care who it was" and fired two more shots.

Two witnesses reportedly saw Dombrowski carrying a black object that appeared to be a rifle. Another woman said she heard shouting and gunshots from outside, but does not believe it was Dombrowski.

Deputies were reportedly shown security footage from Dombrowski's home. They observed him standing near an old trailer with a large black item under his armpit.

Dombrowski was arrested and transported to the Citrus County Detention Facility, where he was charged.

Rollover ejects three teens from vehicle

A single-vehicle rollover threw three teenage girls from their SUV early Thanksgiving morning in downtown Inverness.

According to the Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) on Tuesday, Nov. 30, medical personnel at Ocala Regional Medical Center had to intubate the Inverness teens for incapacitating injuries from the 12:30 a.m. Nov. 25 crash at the intersection of West Main Street and Courthouse Square.

Hospital staff also informed FHP the minors had alcohol in their system, but the investigating trooper wasn't able to observe any signs of impairment.

The Chronicle is not releasing the names of the teens due to their ages.

According to FHP, a 17-year-old girl was driving a green Ford Explorer east on Main Street, approaching the junction of Courthouse Square and South Apopka Avenue. Traveling with passengers were two other girls, ages 17 and 15.

As the Ford took a left curve in the roadway at an estimated speed of 60 mph in a 30 mph speed zone, its driver lost control, causing the SUV to travel into Main Street's westbound lanes and overturn, according to FHP.

According to FHP, the Ford kept overturning toward the intersection's northwest corner, where it struck a crosswalk signal before rolling onto its roof in the northbound lanes of Courthouse Square.

Each of the teens, who were

not wearing their seatbelts, were ejected from the vehicle. According to Citrus County Fire Rescue, EMS crews airlifted the teens for treatment.

An FHP trooper tried to question the teens at the hospital, but the girls were intubated and unconscious at the time.

On Monday, the trooper followed up with the driver's mother, who said her daughter does not remember the crash, according to FHP.

FHP cited the Ford's driver with careless driving.

Lawmakers look at proposal to address toxic algae

TALLAHASSEE — Florida lawmakers Tuesday started moving forward with an effort to direct money in the fight against toxic algae toward long-term solutions and freshwater bodies.

The Senate Environment and Natural Resources Committee unanimously backed a proposal (SB 834) by Chairman Jason Brodeur, R-Sanford, that, in part, would require the Department of Environmental Protection to give preference to technologies intended to reduce nitrates and toxins that can spur harmful algae blooms. The technologies also would be aimed at improving freshwater bodies.

"As we wrestle with algae blooms in the state of Florida, let's start to move towards those things that have been proven to be

effective," Brodeur said. A Department of Environmental Protection grant program is currently available to government agencies for projects that do such things as evaluate and implement technologies and offer short-term solutions involving algae blooms and nutrients.

The state department has issued \$14.9 million in grants to 20 local government, university and water management projects, of which seven are dedicated to nutrient reduction and nine to addressing algae in waterways. The other four have gone to proposals

seeking to better predict the formation of algae blooms.

Brodeur's bill started moving forward as Gov. Ron DeSantis plans to seek additional money during the upcoming legislative session for water-quality issues.

DeSantis recently announced that his 2022-2023 budget proposal will include \$35 million to combat algae blooms and increase water quality monitoring. The proposal includes \$15 million for technologies and \$5 million to aid red-tide cleanup efforts by local governments. The governor is expected next week to release a

full budget plan that lawmakers will use as a starting point during the session, which will begin in January.

Also this month, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service set up a Joint Incident Management Team to respond to the "unusual mortality event" of manatees along the state's Atlantic coast, including in the Indian River Lagoon.

More than 1,000 manatees have died this year in Florida waters, a record for a single year. Nearly two-thirds of the deaths have occurred along the East Coast, with the main cause attributed to starvation due to a decline in seagrass beds because of repeated algae blooms over the past decade.

The state estimates that 58% of the seagrasses have been lost in the northern Indian River Lagoon.

'The Lost Daughter' wins big at 31st Gotham Awards

NEW YORK — Maggie Gyllenhaal's Elena Ferrante adaptation "The Lost Daughter" won four Gotham Awards including best feature film at the 31st Gotham Awards, the annual New York independent film celebration that serves as a boozy kickoff to Oscar season.

Gyllenhaal won breakthrough director and best screenplay for her directorial debut, and star Olivia Colman shared the award for outstanding lead performance with Frankie Faison, "The Killing of Kenneth Chamberlain," a drama based on the 2011 police shooting in White Plains, New York. "The Lost Daughter," a Netflix release, opens in theaters Dec. 17.

As one of the first stops in the long march to the Oscars, Monday evening's Gothams was the first real attempt since the pandemic began to summon all the season's usual glitz and pomp. Stars including Kristen Stewart, Tessa Thompson and Dakota Johnson walked the red carpet. Inside the crowded banquet hall, attendees were required to provide proof of vaccination and a negative COVID-19 test. Last year's Gotham Awards (where "Nomadland" won the top award) was held virtually, with winners accepting awards by Zoom and an online poker platform deployed to digitally sit guests at tables.

This year, even with the recent discovery of the omicron variant spooking a film industry still trying to rebound from the pandemic, the Gothams got back to normal — even while tweaking traditions.

For the first time, the Gothams

were presented without gendered acting categories. While the season's top award shows — the Oscars, the Emmys, the Tonys — haven't yet embraced such a move, the Gothams are part of a growing number of awards bodies, including the Grammys and the MTV Film and TV Awards, to ditch "best actor" and "best actress."

Several times during Monday night's show that was applauded. Ethan Hawke, a co-winner for his performance in the series "The Good Lord Bird," said he never understood the separate categories in the first place.

"True talent shines through the divisions meant to separate us," said "Billions" actor Asia Kate Dillon, a presenter.

Other borders seemed to disintegrate at the Gothams, once a more narrow celebration of independent film. Among the series

winners was Netflix's "Squid Game," the pop-culture sensation that has been watched for more than 2 billion hours, according to the streaming service. At the Gothams, speeches have often exalted the hard work and sometimes lesser-seen rewards of indie film.

"CODA," the celebrated coming-of-age drama about a hearing daughter in a deaf family, won several awards. Troy Kotsur, the veteran deaf actor who plays the film's fisherman father, won outstanding supporting performance. Emilia Jones, who stars as the daughter, won breakthrough performer. After an award-winning debut at a virtual Sundance Film Festival, the film's awards hopes had seemed to lag after a muted streaming debut on Apple TV+ in August. But the Gothams gave "CODA" a boost.





1950s actress Arlene Dahl dies at 96

LOS ANGELES — Arlene Dahl, the actor whose charm and striking red hair shone in such Technicolor movies of the 1950s as “Journey to the Center of the Earth” and “Three Little Words,” has died at age 96.

Dahl’s son, actor Lorenzo Lamas, said in posts on Facebook and Instagram that she died Monday morning in New York. No cause of death was given.

“I will remember her laughter, her joy, her dignity as she navigated the challenges that she faced,” Lamas said. “She truly was a force of nature.”

In 1959’s “Journey to the Center of the Earth,” an adaptation of Jules Verne’s sci-fi classic, Dahl plays the widow of a scientist who joins co-stars James Mason and Pat Boone on a harrowing race to the earth’s core.

She sang and danced in 1950’s “Three Little Words,” a musical biopic of songwriters Bert Kalmar and Harry Ruby, playing Ruby’s wife Eileen Percy opposite frequent co-star Red Skelton.

She co-starred with Bob Hope in 1953’s “Here Come the Girls,” provided the love interest for Skelton in 1950’s “Watch the Birdie” and played the hero’s sweetheart in such adventures as 1952’s “Caribbean” with John Payne, 1953’s “Jamaica Run” with Ray Milland and 1954’s “Bengal Brigade” with

Rock Hudson.

Dahl became as famous for her six marriages as for her acting career. Her husbands included screen performers Fernando Lamas and Lex Barker,

Fleischman’s yeast heir Christopher Holmes, wine importer Alexis Lichine and investor Rounseville Schaum. She was wed to businessman Marc Rosen for the last 37 years of her life.

When her movie career ended, Dahl remained prominent in television, including a three-year stint in the soap opera “One Life to Live” in the mid 1980s.

She made frequent appearances on “The Love Boat” in the 1980s, and guest-starred on her son Lamas’ series “Renegade” and “Air America” in the late 1990s.

Dahl also was active in the lifestyle business, with a syndicated column on beauty tips, a perfume, and lingerie and exercise outfits she designed herself. In the 1960s, Dahl wrote an advice book, “Always Ask a Man: Arlene Dahl’s Key to Femininity.”

Her marriage to Barker was her first; it lasted seven months. “Lex was the best undressed man I’ve ever known,” she said in a frank 1985 People magazine interview.

The marriage to Lamas ended after seven years when he left her for Esther Williams.

Of Norwegian descent, Dahl was born in 1925 in Minneapolis, where her father was a Ford dealer. Stage struck in high school, she joined a drama group and made her way to New York, where she modeled and appeared in Broadway plays.

She was signed by Warner Bros., making her first credited appearance in the 1947 musical “My Wild Irish Rose.” She then moved to MGM where her films included 1948’s “A Southern Yankee” with Skelton and 1950’s “The Outriders” with Joel McCrea.

Fashion designer Virgil Abloh dies of cancer at 41

NEW YORK — Virgil Abloh, a leading designer whose groundbreaking fusions of streetwear and high couture made him one of the most celebrated tastemakers in fashion and beyond, has died of cancer. He was 41.

Abloh’s death was announced Sunday by the luxury group LVMH (Louis Vuitton Moët Hennessey) and Abloh’s own Off-White label, which he founded in 2013. Abloh was the artistic director for Louis Vuitton’s menswear, but his ubiquitous, consumer-friendly presence in culture was wide-ranging and dynamic. Some compared him to Jeff Koons. Others hailed him as his generation’s Karl Lagerfeld.


“We are all shocked after this terrible news. Virgil was not only a genius designer, a visionary, he was also a man with a beautiful soul and great wisdom,” Bernard Arnault, chairman and chief executive of LVMH, said in a statement.

A statement from Abloh’s family on the designer’s Instagram account said Abloh was diagnosed two years ago with cardiac angiosarcoma, a rare form of cancer in which a tumor occurs in the heart.

“He chose to endure his battle privately since his diagnosis in 2019, undergoing numerous challenging treatments, all while helping several significant institutions that span fashion, art, and culture,” the statement read.

In 2018, Abloh became the first Black artistic director of men’s wear at Louis Vuitton in the French design house’s storied history. A first generation Ghanaian American whose seamstress mother taught him to sew, Abloh had no formal fashion training but had a degree in engineering and a master’s in architecture.

Abloh, who grew up in Rockford, Illinois, outside of Chicago, was often referred to as a Renaissance man in the fashion world. He moonlighted as a DJ.

Abloh’s death was announced Sunday, Nov. 28, by LVMH Louis Vuitton and the Off White label, the brand he founded.

But in a short time, he emerged as one of fashion’s most heralded designers. Abloh called himself “a maker.” He was named one of Time magazine’s most influential people in 2018.

In 2009, Abloh met Kanye West — now called Ye — while he was working at a screen-printing store. After he and Ye interned together at the LVMH brand Fendi, Abloh was Ye’s creative director. Abloh was art director for the 2011 Ye-Jay-Z album “Watch the Throne,” for which Abloh was nominated for a Grammy.

Abloh’s work with West served as a blueprint for future border-crossing collaborations that married high and low. With Nike, he partnered his Off-White label for a line of frenzy-inducing sneakers remixed with a variety of styles and Helvetica fonts. Abloh also designed furniture for IKEA, refillable bottles for Evian and Big Mac cartons for McDonald’s. His work was exhibited at the Louvre, the Gagosian and the Museum of Contemporary Art Chicago.

Abloh’s death stunned the entertainment world. Actor Riz

Ahmed said on Twitter that Abloh “stretched culture and changed the game.” Fashion designer Jeff Staple wrote, “You taught us all how to dream.” Pharrell Williams called Abloh “a kind, generous, thoughtful creative genius.”

Abloh took what he called a “3% approach” to fashion — that a new design could be created by changing an original by 3%. Critics said Abloh was more brilliant at repackaging than creating something new. But Abloh’s style was also self-aware — quotation marks were a trademark label for him — and high-minded.

“Streetwear in my mind is linked to Duchamp,” Abloh told the New Yorker in 2019. “It’s this idea of the readymade. I’m talking Lower East Side, New York. It’s like hip-hop. It’s sampling. I take James Brown, I chop it up, I make a new song.”

Stars lined up to be dressed by Abloh. Beyoncé, Michael B. Jordan, Kim Kardashian West, Timothée Chalamet and Serena Williams have worn his clothes.

Abloh’s Off-White label, which LVMH acquired a majority stake in earlier this year, made him an arbiter of cool. But his appointment at Louis Vuitton brought Abloh to the apex of an industry he was once a scrappy outsider in — and made Abloh one of the most powerful Black executives in a historically closed fashion world.

As Abloh prepared for his debut menswear show in 2018, he told GQ, “I now have a platform to change the industry.”

“We’re designers, so we can start a trend, we can highlight issues, we can make a lot of people focus on something or we can cause a lot of people to focus on ourselves,” Abloh said. “I’m not interested in (the latter). I’m interested in using my platform as one of a very small group of African-American males to design a house, to sort of show people in a poetic way.”

Abloh is survived by his wife Shannon Abloh and his children, Lowe and Grey.

The Salvation Army has agreed to provide the use of their cots and would arrange to have the canteen deliver meals to any new shelter site.

Spiller said even if someone would donate or lease a building she's not sure if the county would approve it.

"The county doesn't have a policy for something like this," she said. "They do for a regular shelter, but not for a nightly shelter. That's something that's needed here, a regular nightly shelter."

Meanwhile, Spiller and some of her friends who are involved with homeless outreach are carrying around cold-weather supplies in their vehicles such as tarps, blankets, socks, sweaters, ponchos, jackets and hygiene products to give to people they may meet in their everyday travels who don't have a warm place

Along with supplies, B.A.S.I.C.S gives out information about community resources that are available, especially for those who want to get out of their homeless situation.

"We do whatever we can," she said.

Laura Romero, a B.A.S.I.C.S. volunteer, said as she put her 5-year-old on the school bus on a recent chilly morning it saddened her to think about the lack of a local cold weather shelter.


"It's not just homeless people, but sometimes we would get whole families who didn't have heat where they live who would come and spend the night when we had the shelter," she said. "This is a real need in Citrus

County, and if anything, at least we want to bring awareness."

Spiller added that she's willing to give a short B.A.S.I.C.S. training to any group or business interested in ways they can help homeless people.

In years past, the Family Resource Center placed a flag outside its facility in Hernando to inform those needing a ride to the county's only cold weather shelter that rides will be available. Since the Salvation Army recently announced that it will also no longer be hosting the cold weather shelter, a local homeless outreach organization, Brothers and Sisters in Christ's Service — B.A.S.I.C.S — wants to find a place to keep people warm.

Commissioners offered support but said they would not put any county taxes into the plan. And they didn't.

The board didn't help Homosassa and now it's going to do so for Ozello? That's not fair, Kitchen said.

As for Homosassa, Davis said that was a different board and a different time. If Ozello wants an expanded park and the plan "checks all the boxes," she said she supports it.

At the end, it was Commissioner Ruthie Schlachbach who wavered and seemed ready to support Kinnard. She agreed the Ozello site offers a "perfect case for conservation" and favored lobbying for state money.

Three weeks earlier, the Pirates Cove property owner shot down the county's bid to buy the property for \$616,000. Kinnard said he would return with a new plan and he did.

Pirates Cove is a pristine 3.6-acre site off Ozello Trail, with 750 feet of water frontage and abuts an existing park. The property has sat idle since the restaurant/motel housed on it was destroyed by the no-name storm in 1993 and later demolished in 2010.

A contingent of Ozello residents showed up Tuesday to support the plan.

"We realize what a treasure (Pirates Cove) is and what it means to preserve it for the next generation," Ozello resident Barry Schwartz said.

Cecilia Treat, also from Ozello, said the majority of folks who visit Pirate's Cove are from out-of-town and from other states who are lured by the areas' beauty.

"They come here because it's Old Florida," she said. "It's not a city and they enjoy the beauty of it."

Sabrina Watson of Lecanto offered a differing view.

"This looks like a piece of property that can't sell so they're trying to sell it to the county," she said.

Also Tuesday:

■ The board unanimously selected Ron Kitchen Jr. as its new chairman, succeeding Scott Carnahan. Ruthie Schlachbach was chosen vice chair. Holly Davis was tabbed for second vice chair.

Carnahan threw Kitchen's name in nomination and asked nominations be closed. Davis seconded it.

■ Commissioners voted

5-0 to toughen its ordinance on simulated gambling devices and internet cafés. New language will result in more severe fines and longer jail time for lawbreakers.

■ The county's net borrowing for its new animal shelter has been reduced from \$7.5 million to \$6.52 million. The reduction was made possible in part by using building impact fees and private

donations.

■ Commissioners unanimously approved new ambulance fees, as suggested by the county's fire rescue department.

Among the changes: The mileage rate for

ambulances will increase from \$19 per mile to \$23 per mile for in-county and out-of-county transport.

On Oct. 2 the county took over the ambulance service from Nature Coast EMS.

she said. "We just don't need it right now."

The problem with waiting, she added, is the costs will be "super expensive."

Commissioner Jeff Kinnard set the tone of the debate early by saying he wouldn't support universal garbage because it wouldn't completely solve the main issues: litter along the road, illegal dumping or insufficient landfill capacity.

The landfill has

sufficient capacity at this time, he said.

Carnahan said Citrus County should explore other options, including putting more trash drop-off centers around the county.

Three companies responded to the county's bidding process: Florida Environmental Express, Waste Management and Waste Pro.

If the board had supported universal collection, homeowners would have paid \$259 annually to \$344 annually (\$21.58 to \$28.66 per month), depending on the plan.







NEEDED IMPROVEMENT

New traffic light goes up at dangerous intersection

After two years of telephone calls, letters, and editorials urging officials to act, a traffic light has now been installed at the intersection of County Road 491 and State Road 200.

It should be fully operational within the next week, said FDOT spokeswoman Kris Carson.

As has been pointed out many times, this is an inherently dangerous intersection. County Road 491 intersects S.R. 200 at a 30- to 40-degree angle. This creates a significant risk to drivers of cars on C.R. 491 making a left turn onto S.R. 200 toward Ocala, because there is both a lane for cars on S.R. 200 going straight through the intersection and there is a right turn lane for drivers on S.R. 200 planning to turn onto C.R. 491. This means the driver of the car on C.R. 491 must determine both if a car in the right lane on S.R. 200 is planning to turn onto C.R. 491 or continue through the intersection, and if a car in the right lane is blocking view of a car in the other lane that will continue through the intersection.

The risk is obvious and failed left turns onto S.R. 200 have led to two fatal accidents in the past year.

This intersection was discussed in the fall of 2019 during a Chronicle editorial board meeting with then-Commission Chairman Jeff Kinnard. He agreed that there is a legitimate concern

and promised to take the issue up at the next commission meeting. He was met with disdain from some of the other commissioners, who complained they didn’t take direction from the Chronicle. Of the other commissioners, only then-commissioner Brian Coleman agreed with the seriousness of the issue and urged investigation.

Despite their initial reluctance, commissioners heard from citizens regarding the issue, and they later agreed to request the state Department of Transportation to study a light at the intersection.

The state had apparently independently begun a study after receiving citizen complaints, and between citizen complaints and urging from the commission, state officials determined the intersection should receive a traffic light.

And now the traffic light is installed. This is a significant victory for safety, and it is also a victory for citizens who let governmental officials know their concerns about the intersection.

Thanks should also go to commissioner Kinnard, who kept his promise to raise the issue, and who pursued it with state officials until there was resolution.

The traffic signal is a concrete example of the positive things that can happen when local citizens and local government work together to address an issue of concern in the community.

wish to provide some additional context on the recent vote on the infrastructure bill that hacked the original proposal from the Biden administration of \$18 billion for veterans care to \$5 billion.

First, the vast amount of funds that were cut would have helped with the aging VA infrastructure, as the editorial notes. However, half of the surviving \$5 billion, while nowhere near enough to meet demand, will address many immediate needs.

More than \$2 billion will allow Veterans Affairs to update many aging buildings

and lease more medical offices. Another \$455 million will help homeless vets find housing; \$268 million will add 500 physicians; and \$150 million will help digitize medical records. Yes, these improvements are modest compared to the growing needs, but they will help.

Second, the funding cuts would not have been necessary had all members of Congress actually put our money where their mouths are. Our local representative, Daniel Webster, was among the 206 Republicans and 13 Democrats who voted against even the pared-down bill, all while professing to care about vets.

Who wants to bet that he, along with others who voted against the infrastructure bill, will take credit and pose for pictures when the funds flow into their districts?

Yes, our veterans deserve better from our representatives. So do we all.

Black artist Josephine Baker honored at France's Pantheon

PARIS — Josephine Baker — the U.S.-born entertainer, anti-Nazi spy and civil rights activist — was inducted into France's Pantheon on Tuesday, becoming the first Black woman to receive the nation's highest honor.

Baker's voice resonated through streets of Paris' famed Left Bank as recordings from her extraordinary career kicked off an elaborate ceremony at the domed Pantheon monument. Baker joined other French luminaries honored at the site, including philosopher Voltaire, scientist Marie Curie and writer Victor Hugo.

Military officers from the Air Force carried her cenotaph along a red carpet that stretched for four blocks of cobblestoned streets from the Luxembourg Gardens to the Pantheon. Baker's military medals lay atop the cenotaph, which was draped in the French tricolor flag and contained soil from her birthplace in Missouri, from France, and from her final resting place in Monaco. Her body stayed in Monaco at the request of her family.

French President Emmanuel Macron paid tribute to "a war hero, fighter, dancer, singer; a Black woman defending Black people but first of all, a woman defending humankind. American and French. Josephine Baker fought so many battles with lightness, freedom, joy."

"Josephine Baker, you are entering into the Pantheon because, (despite) born American, there is no greater French (woman) than you," he said.

Baker was also the first American-born citizen and the first performer to be immortalized into the Pantheon.

Conservatives eagerly awaiting

Supreme Court abortion arguments today

It's the moment conservatives have been waiting for:

Oral arguments at the Supreme Court on Wednesday represent the best opportunity leaders on the right have had in decades to gut the landmark 1973 Roe v. Wade decision, which codified a woman's constitutional right to an abortion before a fetus can survive outside the womb.

If they are successful, it could validate years of often painstakingly granular work that ultimately remade the Republican Party from an alliance of business-friendly leaders into a coalition of cultural conservatives and evangelicals who turned the issue of abortion into a national flashpoint. Even if the justices don't explicitly overturn Roe, they could open the door to a flurry of new restrictions that would please the right.

Buoyed by a court that is now dominated by a 6-3 conservative majority, some leading Republicans were already expressing confidence on Tuesday.

"We are asking the court in no uncertain terms to make history," former Vice President Mike Pence, who has been laying the groundwork for a presidential run in 2024, said during a speech in Washington. "We are asking the Supreme Court of the United States to overturn Roe v. Wade and restore the sanctity of life at the center of American law."

The justices will weigh whether to uphold a Mississippi law that bans abortion after 15 weeks, with limited exceptions — well before the current established point of "viability," at around 24 weeks. The court is also weighing challenges to a Texas law that bans abortions after six weeks — before many women even know they're pregnant.

The court could decide to uphold current precedent, could let the law stand, effectively doing away with the current viability standard, or could overturn Roe entirely.

"This is the first time that they have clearly had a majority of pro-life-leaning justices," said Columbia Law School's Carol Sanger, an expert in reproductive rights. "So they have the votes if

they choose to use them."

The court's decision, which is expected by late June, could dramatically shift the contours of next year's midterm elections, providing a new animating force for Democrats, who largely support abortion rights and have struggled to rally around a unifying issue this year.

Scuttling Roe "will surely embolden efforts of conservatives in many states to craft laws they think might not have held up under Roe," William Martin, a professor of religion and public policy at Rice University who has studied the rise of the anti-abortion movement, said in an email. "Conservatives will regard this as achieving a long-sought goal, but it may come at a significant cost, since Republicans probably

already have most of the voters for whom opposition to abortion is the ultimate litmus test."

Still, for conservative activists, the case is a culmination of decades of work electing Republican state legislatures, enacting new barriers to abortion access, and supporting anti-abortion judges, including the new conservative super majority on the Supreme Court.

"Tomorrow the Supreme Court will hear the biggest case for the pro-life movement in two generations," said Marjorie Dannenfelser, president of the Susan B. Anthony List, an anti-abortion group which sponsored Pence's speech and plans to spend \$10 million on TV and digital ads in Washington, D.C., and battleground states to promote the case.

Appeals court weighs Trump arguments

To withhold records related to Jan. 6 insurrection

WASHINGTON — A panel of judges on Tuesday questioned whether they had the authority to grant former President Donald Trump's demands and stop the White House from allowing the release of documents related to the Jan. 6 insurrection led by Trump's supporters.

But the judges also noted that there may be times when a former president would be justified in trying to stop the incumbent from disclosing records.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit heard arguments from lawyers for Trump and the House committee seeking the records as part of its investigation into the Capitol riot. Trump's attorneys want the court to reverse a federal judge's ruling allowing the National Archives and Records Administration to turn over the records after President Joe Biden waived executive

privilege.

Trump supporters broke into the Capitol on Jan. 6 after a rally near the White House where he made false claims of election fraud and challenged them to "fight like hell." About 700 people have been federally charged. Nine people died during and after the rioting.

The National Archives has said that the records Trump wants to block include presidential diaries, visitor logs, speech drafts, handwritten notes "concerning the events of January 6" from the files of former chief of staff Mark Meadows, and "a draft Executive Order on the topic of election integrity."

Compared to U.S. District Judge Tanya Chutkan, whose ruling Trump is contesting, the three judges on the appeals court spent relatively little time weighing the importance of the documents themselves. They instead focused most of the hearing Tuesday on what role federal courts should have when an incumbent president and former president are at odds over records from the former's administration.

The judges sharply questioned both sides and challenged them with hypothetical scenarios.

To Trump's lawyers, Judge Patricia Millett suggested a situation

where a current president negotiating with a foreign leader needed to know what promises a former president had made to that leader. The incumbent might seek to release a transcript of a phone call or other records from the previous administration for national security reasons, the judge said.

"To be clear, your position is a former president could come in and file a lawsuit?" Millett said. Trump lawyer Justin Clark responded, "That is our position."

To a lawyer for the House committee, Millett raised a scenario where a newly elected president might seek retribution against a disliked predecessor. The new president and a Congress led by the same party might declare that there was a national security interest in releasing all of the former president's records, even at the risk of endangering people's lives, she said.

"Needless to say, the former president comes to court, (says), 'Hang on,'" Millett said. "What happens?"

She did not say she was referring to any president and rejected committee lawyer Douglas Letter's response referencing a president who "fomented an insurrection."

"We're not going to make it that

easy," she said.

Letter argued the determination of a current president should outweigh predecessors in almost all circumstances and noted that both Biden and Congress were in agreement that the Jan. 6 records should be turned over.

"It would be astonishing for this court to override the current president and Congress," Letter said.

Democratic presidents nominated all three judges who heard arguments Tuesday. Millett and Judge Robert Wilkins were nominated by former President Barack Obama. Judge Ketanji Brown Jackson is a Biden appointee seen as a contender for a Supreme Court seat should one open during the current administration.

Jackson said Tuesday that she questioned whether judges should intervene in a dispute where the executive and legislative branches agree but a former president doesn't.

"The court swooping in to do some sort of balancing test ... actually raises its own separation of powers concerns in terms of the power of the court to resolve or to second-guess what this executive is saying," she said.

Given the stakes of the case, either side is likely to appeal to the Supreme Court.

ST. LOUIS — Ryan O'Reilly scored the lone goal in a shootout and goalie Jordan Binnington rebounded from a rough start to lift the St. Louis Blues to a 4-3 comeback win over the Tampa Bay Lightning on Tuesday night.

St. Louis erased an early three-goal deficit and has won its last five against the Lightning, the two-time defending Stanley Cup champions.

Tampa Bay scored two goals in a team-record five seconds and jumped to a 3-0 lead after just 5:29 in a matchup between teams that have combined to win the past three NHL titles.

O'Reilly, Logan Brown and Ivan Barbashev scored for St. Louis in regulation.

Binnington gave up three goals on the first nine shots he faced, but bounced back to make two clean stops in the shootout. Corey Perry hit the post for the Lightning.

Barbashev scored 71 seconds into the third period to tie it 3-all.

Erik Cernak and Perry scored five

seconds apart in the opening period to stake Tampa Bay to its 3-0 lead.

Anthony Cirelli added a goal for the Lightning, who last beat St. Louis 3-0 on Dec. 13, 2017.

Panthers 5, Capitals 4

SUNRISE — Sam Reinhart scored the winning power-play goal with 14.4 seconds left, capping a furious comeback for the Florida Panthers to beat the Washington Capitals 5-4 on Tuesday night.

Trailing 4-1, the Panthers scored four goals on a season-high 27 shots in the third period to snap a two-game skid.

Florida's rally was beyond improbable. NHL teams had lost 303 consecutive games when trailing by three or more goals entering the third. The last team to pull off such a comeback was, ironically, the Capitals — who on Jan. 18, 2020, trailed the New York Islanders 4-1 entering the third and went on to win 6-4.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. — Jaden Ivey scored 18 points and matched his career high with four 3-pointers, Brandon Newman added 13 points, and No. 2 Purdue pulled away from Florida State 93-65 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge on Tuesday night.

The Boilermakers have won seven straight home games in the annual clash between the conferences. They're also 7-0 for the first time since 2015-16 and the seventh time since 1940.

Florida State (5-2) was led by Caleb Mills with 22 points and John Butler with 10 as its four-game winning streak ended. The Seminoles had won four of their previous five in the Challenge.

One day after earning their highest

ranking since March 1988, the Boilermakers played like they weren't satisfied with being considered the second-best team in the nation. They believe they're the best.

It was hard to argue against them on Tuesday.

Purdue took control with an early 6-0 run, later scored eight straight to make it 27-14 midway through the first half and headed to the locker room with a 48-32 advantage.

Florida State slashed the deficit to 59-51 with 11:43 left, but the Boilermakers answered with 12 straight points to make it 71-51 and continued pulling away over the final 8 1/2 minutes.

Michigan into CFP top four Coachless Irish are sixth

DALLAS — Michigan moved up to No. 2 Tuesday night in the second-to-last College Football Playoff rankings, joining Georgia, Alabama and Cincinnati in the top four heading into conference championship weekend.

Oklahoma State is fifth going into the Big 12 championship game Saturday against No. 9 Baylor, and Notre Dame is sixth with no games left and no head coach.

Brian Kelly left the Fighting Irish and was introduced as the new coach at LSU on Tuesday, three days after independent Notre Dame finished its season 11-1.

Selection committee chairman Gary Barta, who is Iowa's athletic director, noted selection protocol requires the committee to consider the unavailability of players and coaches and how that could affect a team's performance in the postseason.

Losing Kelly had no impact on this week's ranking for Notre Dame because the committee does not project ahead into the postseason until all games are finished.

"And each of the 13 members can weigh that the way they want to weigh it, compared to head-to-head competition and common opponents and all the other things we evaluate," Barta said.

Georgia was first, as it has been for every selection

LSU, Kelly agree to 10-year deal

Worth at least \$95M

LSU formally announced the hiring of Notre Dame coach Brian Kelly on Tuesday and said they have agreed to a 10-year contract worth \$95 million plus incentives.

The hiring of Kelly — who has led Notre Dame for the past 12 seasons and eclipsed Knute Rockne for career victories with the storied Fighting Irish — came together on Monday night in yet another blockbuster coaching move in college football.

“Brian Kelly is the epitome of a winner,” LSU athletic director Scott Woodward said. “He has built and sustained success at every program he’s led, from multiple undefeated regular seasons and National Coach of the Year honors to (Division II) national titles and College Football Playoff berths. His credentials and consistency speak for themselves.”

Kelly replaces Ed Orgeron, a Louisiana native who won a national title at LSU just two seasons ago with Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Joe Burrow leading the Tigers to a 15-0 record. Orgeron has gone 11-11 since and agreed in October to a \$17 million buyout that would have him step down at the end of this season.

Orgeron coached his final game last Saturday, when the Tigers upset then-No. 14 Texas A&M to finish the regular season 6-6.

Like Orgeron, Kelly is 60 but the similarities more or less end there. Orgeron is a Cajun raised in the shadow of shrimp trawlers on the Bayou Lafourche southwest of New Orleans. He was raised on LSU football and idolized the Tigers stars of the past.

Kelly came from an Irish-Catholic family in the Boston area and is bound to be far more familiar with using nut crackers to pick the meat out of a lobster claw than with sucking seasoned juices from the heads of boiled crawfish.

But he has recruited in Louisiana, where LSU gets much of its elite home-grown talent. In recent history, Louisiana has produced as much NFL talent per capita as any state.

“I could not be more excited to join a program with the commitment to excellence, rich traditions, and unrivaled pride and passion of LSU football,” Kelly said. “I am fully committed to recruiting, developing, and graduating elite student-athletes, winning championships, and working together with our administration to make Louisiana proud.

“Our potential is unlimited,” Kelly added. “I cannot wait to call Baton Rouge home.”

LSU scheduled a flight for Kelly to Baton Rouge on Tuesday, inviting fans to greet the coach at the airport, and set Kelly’s introductory media conference for Wednesday.

Kelly is 113-40 as a head coach, including a current run of five straight double-digit victory seasons.

No previous Notre Dame coach has left the Irish, winners of eight AP national championships, to take a job at another school since the AP poll started in 1936. Rockne’s successor, Hunk Anderson, went from Notre Dame to North Carolina State after going 3-5-1 in 1933.

Notre Dame (11-1) remains in contention to reach the College Football Playoff for the third time in the last four years.

LSU paid Orgeron nearly \$9 million this season, making him among the highest paid coaches in college football along with Alabama’s Nick Saban, Clemson’s Dabo Swinney, Texas A&M’s Jimbo Fisher and, in the past month, Mel Tucker of Michigan State and James Franklin at Penn State. That list certainly now includes USC’s Lincoln Riley, who bolted Oklahoma over the weekend in the other big coaching move this week.

Orgeron was due to make an average of \$7 million over the length of his six-year that ran through 2025. Kelly’s full salary at Notre Dame, a private school, is unknown but it was believed to be more than \$5 million per year.

While Kelly has no personal ties to the South, neither did two of the past three national-title winning coaches at LSU. Les Miles, who won a title in the 2007 season, was a Michigan man who coached at Oklahoma State before replacing Saban in Baton Rouge. Saban, who won the BCS championship in the 2003 season, is a West Virginia native who came to LSU from Michigan State.

Kelly’s national titles have come at Division II Grand Valley State. He worked his way up from there to Central Michigan and then to Cincinnati, always winning more than the coaches who preceded him.

He did the same thing at Notre Dame, but the national championship has eluded him. As good as the Fighting Irish have been, they have not won it all since 1988 and have been outclassed in two College Football Playoff semifinals (in the 2018 season against Clemson and two years later against Alabama) and the BCS title game against the Crimson Tide in the 2012 season.

Kelly will now see Saban every season in the SEC West and try to fill the last remaining hole on his Hall of Fame resume at LSU, a school that has turned its last three coaches into national champions.

Pickett, Addison help No. 17 Pitt lead ACC’s all-league team

GREENSBORO, N.C. — Quarterback Kenny Pickett and receiver Jordan Addison were among 12 players from No. 17 Pittsburgh to headline the Atlantic Coast Conference’s all-league team.

Pickett and Addison were first-team picks for the offense in Tuesday’s release, while tackle Calijah Kancey was a first-team pick on defense. The Panthers will play in Saturday’s league championship game against No. 18 Wake Forest, which had first-team receiver A.T. Perry and first-team offensive tackle Zach Tom among its eight selections.

Clemson finished with 10 all-ACC picks despite seeing its six-year reign atop the league end.

Florida State senior defensive end Jermaine Johnson II, who ranks sixth nationally with 12 sacks, was the leading vote-getter with 189 points in voting by a panel of 50 media members and each of the league’s head coaches.

Michigan’s Hutchinson, Spartans’ Tucker earn Big Ten honors

ROSEMONT, Ill. — The Big Ten announced Tuesday that Michigan’s Aidan Hutchinson is its defensive player of the year and Michigan State’s Mel Tucker is the coach of the year.

Hutchinson leads the conference and is third nationally with 13 sacks, including three in the win over Ohio State last week.

Tucker has led the Spartans to a 10-2 record in his second year, including a win over rival Michigan, after they were 2-5 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season.

The Big Ten coaches’ all-conference first-team defense includes: linemen, Hutchinson; Haskell Garrett, Ohio State; Arnold Ebiketie, Penn State; George Karlaftis, Purdue; linebackers, David Ojabo, Michigan; Leo Chenal, Wisconsin; Jack Sanborn, Wisconsin; defensive backs, Dane Belton, Iowa; Riley Moss, Iowa; Dax Hill, Michigan; and Jaquan Brisker, Penn State.

The coaches’ all-conference first-team specialists: kicker, Jake Moody, Michigan; punter, Jordan Stout, Penn State; return specialist, Charlie Jones, Iowa. Offensive honorees will be announced by the league Wednesday.

Virginia Tech hires Penn State DC Pry as next head coach

Virginia Tech hired Penn State defensive coordinator and former Bud Foster disciple Brent Pry as its next head coach.

The school made the announcement Tuesday, saying Pry will be introduced Thursday.

Pry has been with Penn State since 2014, first as co-defensive coordinator before becoming the defensive coordinator in 2016. Penn State has ranked in the top five in defense in the Big Ten every season since he’s been there.

Auburn fires offensive coordinator Bobo

AUBURN, Ala. — Auburn coach Bryan Harsin has fired offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Mike Bobo after one season.

Spokesman Kirk Sampson confirmed Tuesday that Bobo isn’t being retained. He was hired in January with a three-year contract worth \$1.3 million annually. Auburn will owe him the remaining \$2.6 million.

The Tigers (6-6) lost their last four games, blowing double-digit leads in three straight to end the regular season.

Kentucky, Stoops agree to extension through 2028

LEXINGTON, Ky. — Kentucky coach Mark Stoops has agreed to a contract extension that will keep him with the No. 25 Wildcats through June 2028.

Stoops’ deal is being finalized, but will continue to include guaranteed extensions of one year for a seven-win season and two years for a 10-win finish.

Stoops is 58-53 in nine seasons with the Wildcats.

Getting defensive in SEC title contest

Game features two of nation’s top defenders

Alabama’s Will Anderson wreaks more havoc in opposing backfields than any college player in the country. Georgia’s Jordan Davis anchors the best defense in college football.

They could well be the best players on the field Saturday in the Southeastern Conference Championship game when No. 1 Georgia meets the fourth-ranked Crimson Tide.

And that’s saying something given the talent level on these teams.

Alabama quarterback Bryce Young has re-emerged as the Heisman Trophy front-runner, according to FanDuel Sportsbook, after leading a comeback, four-overtime win over Auburn.

But Anderson and Davis are getting plenty of acclaim, too.

“I think it’s cool,” Anderson said. “Especially nowadays a lot of defensive guys, you don’t get as much attention. But I think it’s good. It’s cool. I think it’s a mutual respect, and I think it’s cool.”

Anderson is an edge rusher who leads the nation in sacks and tackles for loss for the Tide and has been an outspoken

leader. “He’s done as much for our team as anybody ever has,” Alabama coach Nick Saban said.

Davis doesn’t pile up the stats from his position clogging the middle of the nation’s top defense, but he is a huge presence on the Bulldogs’ dominant defense — and even scored a touchdown.

Saban said, whatever the stats, the top thing to look for in an offense is how hard they make it for blockers.

And Davis, he said, “is really hard to block.”

That’s one thing he and Anderson have in common. Otherwise, Anderson is a former five-star recruit at a glamour position. Davis is a space-hogging lineman who only got three stars as a prospect.

Both are among the finalists for the Bronco Nagurski Trophy and Bednarik Award given to the nation’s top defensive player.

The 6-foot-4, 243-pound Anderson is the Tide’s most devastating pass rusher since the late Pro Football and College Football Hall of Famer Derrick Thomas. He has 27.5 tackles for loss and 13.5 sacks, corralling Mississippi State’s Will Rogers four times in that game.

Anderson is a five-time SEC defensive player of the week this season. He had seven sacks as a freshman despite not recording one until Game 8.

“He’s a tremendous athlete,” Georgia coach Kirby Smart said. “He plays with so much passion and toughness and energy. When

I see him play, he reminds me of (former Alabama linebacker) Rashaan Evans at times before Rashaan moved to inside ‘backer. He’s so explosive, twitchy and tough.

“He strikes people and really strikes blocks really well. He’ll be a key part of the game in terms of the way he plays and affects the game.”

The 6-foot-6, 340-pound Davis can hardly be judged on stats alone. His 24 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and two sacks hardly tell the story of his impact on the Bulldogs defense.

“I mean, I think the guy is one of the most dominant players in college football,” Saban said.

Davis scored on a 1-yard touchdown run against Charleston Southern and after the game directed the marching band in a rendition of “Glory, Glory.”

Anderson and Davis are studying film of the opposing offenses, but they can’t help but pay attention to each other at times.

Game respects game.

“He’s a great player. He’s big,” Anderson said. “I think he’s like the unit of their defense, honestly. He’s pretty hard to move around. Just watching him, I feel like he’s a really great athlete for that size and he’s a really

good player.”

Says Davis: “He’s a game wrecker, watching his film and just seeing him. He’s explosive. He’s definitely one of those guys you have to make sure to keep contained.”

Both will be focal points of the offenses on Saturday. But defensive standouts will be all over the field.

Georgia also has linebacker Nakobe Dean, defensive lineman Devonte Wyatt and defensive back Lewis Cine.

“This is not a one-man wrecking crew,” Saban said. “This is a really, really good group of players who play well together. There’s multiple players that have ability to make plays.”

Alabama’s other top defenders include linebacker Henry To’oTo’o, a Tennessee transfer, and defensive backs Jordan Battle and Josh Jobe.

But the defenders on both teams also get to take advantage of Anderson and Davis often taking on multiple blockers.

“You’ve got to focus on Will,” To’oTo’o said. “Will’s a monster, and he’s going to get back and cause havoc every single play no matter how many guys are blocking him.”

Davis is capable of the same.

Even a little Tiger is better than no Tiger

NASSAU, Bahamas — The only certainty about Tiger Woods is that he won't be playing very much golf, and that's if he decides it's worth trying to scale a mountain taller than all the previous ones.

"Making progress," he wrote to accompany a video of his swing he posted on Twitter two weeks ago.

"I'm so far from that," he said Tuesday when talking about taking on Jon Rahm and Collin Morikawa and Rory McIlroy in the biggest events on the toughest golf courses.

Woods walked into the room at Albany Golf Club without a noticeable limp as he climbed onto the stage and took his seat behind a microphone. He left the stage a little more gingerly, and conceded his leg and back were aching just sitting there.

"We all want to see him back. We all want to see him healthy and playing like the Tiger Woods we've seen for 20 years," Harris English said.

Those days were fading with age, and they probably are gone due to a badly damaged right leg stemming from a car crash in the Los Angeles suburbs some 10 months ago. Woods mentioned the possibility of amputation in the early stages of being hospitalized.

This is a slow road back before he can even think about the climb.

So much chatter is on the Masters in April, without consideration that Augusta National might be the toughest course to walk of any tournament he plays. Woods said he would love to return to the British Open at St. Andrews, where the steepest climb is crossing the Swilcan Bridge.

Woods has ruled out being a full-time player, and the argument can be made he already was headed in that direction. He played only 13 events on the PGA Tour in 2019, the last time he was healthy and the world wasn't in the throes of a pandemic.

The best-case scenario is a schedule geared around the majors, similar to Ben

Hogan's in the 1950s after his near-fatal car accident. Hogan was 37 when he won the 1950 U.S. Open. Woods turns 46 at the end of next month.

Would it be enough to satisfy his legion of fans for him to play only a few tournaments a year?

The short is yes. Because even a little Tiger is better than no Tiger at all.

"The PGA Tour is in such a good spot with these young guys. Tiger is only going to help draw more fans to the game when he's playing," English said. "We haven't had him for the last year and it's been doing great. He got us to where we're at. Any time he can play just adds interest and adds intrigue and puts golf in the national media."

Abraham Ancer might become a

footnote in history as the last player to face Woods in match play. It was Sunday singles at Royal Melbourne in the 2019 Presidents Cup, and Woods hit the ball as crisply as he did all year and won on the 16th hole.

In a loss, it was a special memory for Ancer.

"I was happy I got to experience him at a high level in a high-pressure match. It was cool for me and I learned a lot," Ancer said.

Equally memorable was the first time Ancer played in the same tournament as Woods, at Torrey Pines in 2018, and he wound up in the group behind him starting the final round on the back nine. Ancer recalled seeing "mayhem."

"Any time Tiger shows up at an event,

it's completely different, no matter how he's playing," Ancer said. "He transforms events."

Think of what now is the John Deere Classic, a sleepy Midwestern tournament until Woods played in his third event as a pro in 1996 and had a chance to win. The Quad City golf community has been buzzing ever since, even though Woods never returned.

Woods made one appearance at the Valspar Championship, and the gallery was standing 12 rows deep around some of the tees. He finished one shot behind. The Innisbrook crowd remains robust. Some who went for the first time must have liked what they saw.

"Anyone who's moved the needle or changed the game so much, to still be a part of the game, will bring people to it," Xander Schauffele said. "Whether it's once, twice or three times a year, there's just a level of excitement. I was lucky to play with him a few times. I can see what he does to people, and to venues."

It's the concept of a rising tide lifting all ships, and there's no tide like Tiger Woods.

The first step is getting him back in the water, and that's no small task.

He has been down a similar path before, most notably the progress he made from four back surgeries in a span of three years. He contended at tournaments (Valspar), then at majors (British Open at Carnoustie, PGA Championship at Bellerive) and then he won the Masters.

"I don't see that type of trend going forward for me," Woods said, another sobering comment from his news conference. "I won't have the opportunity to practice given the condition of my leg and build up. I just don't. I'll just have a different way of doing it and that's OK and I'm at peace with that. I've made the climb enough times."

At this point, no one should be looking for another Mount Everest. They just want to see Tiger, even if for just a little while.



Be a Sport This Winter



Do you live in an area where it snows? If you do, you probably know how much fun it can be outside during the winter.

This week, The Mini Page looks at some winter sports that can keep you active even when winter winds blow.

Ice skating

For hundreds of years, people have eagerly awaited cold weather, when rivers and ponds finally freeze solid enough to skate on.

Today, your community might have outdoor and indoor skating rinks. But you may be able to skate on a country pond just as people used to do.

Don't know how to ice skate? Take a lesson! And make sure you're skating safely:

- Be sure to wear a helmet and mittens, which will protect your head and hands if you fall on the ice.
- If you are skating on naturally frozen water, be sure the ice is thick enough all over. Lakes, rivers and ponds could have areas with thin ice. Always check with adults before skating. Do not skate by yourself.

Mini Fact:

The word "ski" comes from the Old Norse word "skio," meaning a split piece of wood.

Take a hike

One of the most pleasant winter outdoor activities is walking or hiking. This gives you a chance to enjoy the nature surrounding you. The sparkly snow and ice can make the scenery especially beautiful in the winter.

If there is a lot of snow, snowshoes can make your hike much easier. Experts say it's easy to learn to snowshoe. You just need to walk with your legs spread apart a little wider.

The wide, flat snowshoes help walkers balance on top of the snow rather than sinking. Poles may help snowshoers keep their balance.

Sledding and tubing

It's a thrill to ride down a big hill on a sled or inner tube, and you don't need much special equipment. But it's still important to be safe.

Be aware of the land under the snow. Injuries can happen when people run into a tree near the path or over rocks or other obstacles. Creeks and roads can be at the bottom of many sledding hills.

Winter sport safety

If you are going to be outside in the cold, dress in layers. This will keep you warmer than one big heavy coat or snowsuit. Also, you can take off a top layer if you are exercising enough to grow warm. Layer with:



sweatshirts and sweaters;

- warm socks. Wear several pairs, especially if you are on the ice;
- thermal, or long, underwear;
- regular warm clothes such as jeans, sweatpants, long-sleeved warm shirts,
- a winter coat;
- a warm hat;
- warm mittens or gloves.
- Wear sunscreen. You might not think you need sunscreen in the winter, but snow reflects, or bounces back, sunlight. Sunscreen is especially important in high-elevation areas, such as mountains. So are goggles.
- Wear protective gear. For sports such as skating, skiing and snowboarding, padding and helmets are especially important for beginners and young kids.
- Go inside often to warm up. Frostbite occurs when the skin gets frozen. If you notice your fingers, toes or ears becoming numb, it's probably time for an indoor break.
