Citrus County COVID-19 cases

According to the Florida Department of Health, 18 positive cases were reported in Citrus County since the latest update.

No new deaths were reported, for a total of 445.

To date in the county, 11,054 people have tested positive (including 99 nonresidents).

Four new hospitalizations were reported, for a total of 720 hospitalized.

Totals reflect preliminary reports received by the state, and are subject to revision.

DOH-Citrus' preregistration system to schedule COVID-19 vaccine appointments for all individuals 18 and older and frontline health care workers is now available.

Individuals can now be added to a waiting list for vaccine appointments and be notified when appointments are available in Citrus County by visiting myvaccine.fl.gov or by calling 866-201-0442; TTY is 833-476-1036.

As a reminder, the DOH-Citrus COVID-19 Vaccination site has moved and is no longer at the Central Ridge District Park. All first and second doses of the Moderna vaccine are now provided at the Duke Energy/DOH-Citrus COVID-19 Vaccination Site, 8200 W. Venable St., Crystal River. Carnahan mulls third term

County Commission Chairman Scott Carnahan said Tuesday he's likely going to seek re-election next year to a third term.

"I feel I've got more left in me," Carnahan said during an interview in which a reporter asked if he has re-election plans. "I think I bring a good common sense approach to the board."

Carnahan had planned to leave office after his second term runs out in 2022.

"I said I would do eight years and then the phone calls started coming in, 'You need to stay. You need to go four more years,'" he said.

Carnahan said he wouldn't expect a formal announcement until February 2022.

"I'm going to wait and see," he said. "If somebody I see can carry the torch, I'll say go ahead."

Crist running for governor

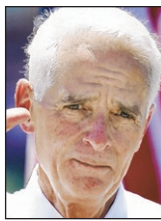
St. Petersburg Democrat originally elected to post in 2006 as a Republican

TALLAHASSEE — More than a decade after walking away from the governor's office, U.S. Rep. Charlie Crist launched a campaign Tuesday to try to unseat Republican Gov. Ron DeSantis in 2022.

Crist, a St. Petersburg

Democrat, was the first major candidate to formally enter the 2022 gubernatorial race. But DeSantis' political committee has been piling up cash in anticipation of a re-election campaign, and Democratic Agriculture Commissioner Nikki Fried and Democratic

U.S. Rep. Val Demings of Orlando are widely expected to run.

Crist, 64, made the announcement during a sun-splashed event in St. Petersburg. The podium displayed the campaign theme: "Florida For All."

"This won't be an easy fight, but nothing in life

worth fighting for is easy," Crist said. "I am announcing today that I am running for governor of Florida, for a Florida for all."

Crist listed priorities that are Democratic staples, including making it easier to vote, expanding Medicaid eligibility and treating climate change like the "existential threat it is." He also

bashed Republican lawmakers and DeSantis, describing their agenda as "shameful."

"The deck is stacked against the middle class, aided and abetted by Gov. Ron DeSantis and his Republican allies in Tallahassee," Crist said. "This is a governor who doesn't listen, who doesn't care and doesn't think about you."

Efforts to clean King's Bay, Homosassa River continue to show results

Spring cleaning arrived for two of Citrus County's major water systems.

April 1 kicked off the annual and separate restoration endeavors on the Homosassa River and in King's Bay, Crystal River.

Both cleanups were born from the respective citizen efforts of grassroot groups Save Crystal River Inc. (SCR) and the Homosassa River Restoration Project Inc. (HRRP) to vacuum dredge their local waterways of muck before replanting sandy bottoms with natural eelgrass.

"We're really excited," SCR Board President Lisa Moore told

Ex-detective seeks pretrial intervention

Abuse cases also heard in court

Stephen Paul Conley, the Citrus County Sheriff's Office detective sergeant who resigned before he was arrested for having a variety of narcotics, is trying to end his case without a conviction.

During a Zoom court hearing Tuesday, May 4, Conley's attorney, Brian Trehy, told

Citrus County Circuit Judge Richard "Ric" Howard he waived Conley's appearance because the Homosassa 47-year-old and former sheriff's office deputy and investigator of 20 years was in treatment.

Trehy said Conley was also eligible for a substance abuse pretrial intervention

County's assistant administrator resigns

Lachnicht wants to 'try different things'

Citrus County will be in the market for a new assistant administrator for the second time in three years following Steven Lachnicht's decision to resign.

Lachnicht, in a letter Monday to County Administrator Randy Oliver, said his last day will be June 4.

The former growth management director in Alachua County, Lachnicht has served in Citrus County since July 2019. His roles in Citrus included running departments of

growth management and community services while their director slots were vacant.

He said in an interview that it was time to leave.

"It's more fun being a director than being assistant county manager," Lachnicht said. "I like working with Randy. There's no animosity at all. I just reached a point to take a break and try different things."

Lachnicht, who earns \$121,002 annually in Citrus County, said he has no other jobs lined up.

Teen charged as an adult in rigged homecoming election

PENSACOLA — A Florida teen accused of rigging a homecoming queen election with her mother is being charged as an adult, prosecutors said.

Emily Rose Grover was still 17 when she was arrested in March. She turned 18 in April, and the State Attorney's Office in Escambia County confirmed Tuesday that Grover will be tried as an adult.

Grover and her mother, Laura Rose Carroll, 50, face multiple felony charges stemming from the October homecoming

vote at Tate High School in Pensacola.

While employed as an assistant principal at Bellview Elementary School in the same county, Carroll accessed the school district's internal system to cast fraudulent votes for her daughter so that she would win, officials said. The investigation began in November when the Escambia County School District reported unauthorized access into hundreds of student accounts.

Investigators found that in October, hundreds of votes for the school's homecoming court were

flagged as fraudulent, the news release said. There were 117 votes from the same IP address within a short period of time, the investigation found.

That's when investigators found evidence of unauthorized access to the system linked to Carroll's cellphone and computers at her home. The were 246 votes cast for homecoming court from those devices.

Multiple Tate students told investigators that Grover described using her mother's system access, or of watching her mother access records, for years, the report said.

The announcement echoed themes from Crist's past campaigns, down to his recounting of how his grandfather arrived in the United States from Cyprus and how his family had succeeded.

It was the latest move in a three-decade political career that has seen him get elected statewide three times as a Republican, run an ill-fated campaign for the U.S. Senate as an independent, become a Democrat, lose a 2014 bid for governor and get elected to Congress.

Through most of that career, Crist has offered an upbeat persona and relished in retail politics. But critics also have pointed to his party switching and history of runs for different offices, portraying him as a political opportunist.

"I just wonder which party is he going to run under? Do we know for sure? I thought about it, because you know, he's run as a Republican and lost, independent and lost, Democrat and lost," DeSantis said Tuesday. "Now I see he's voting with (U.S.

House Speaker) Nancy Pelosi 100% of the time. He could probably give it a run for the Green Party in San Francisco. So, who knows what is going to happen with that?"

Fried, the only statewide elected Democrat, indicated she would rather see Crist run for re-election to his congressional seat in a swing area.

"Certainly, I have had communications with Congressman Crist. It is a time when we need his voice and his vote up in Washington D.C.," Fried said. "His seat is one that only probably Charlie Crist can hold on to. So, I'd really like to have encouraged him to stay in Congress. But, certainly today is Charlie's day and I wish him the best of luck."

Crist, who walked onto the stage wearing a mask, criticized DeSantis' handling of the COVID-19 pandemic, asking how "many lives would have been saved" if the Republican had listened to experts and taken more precautions. The criticism came a day after DeSantis suspended all local-government coronavirus emergency orders related to the pandemic.

But DeSantis indicated

he is ready to fight with Crist and other Democrats about the issue.

"I implore them, from my political interests, to run on closing schools, run on locking people down, run on closing businesses," DeSantis said. "I would love to have that debate. I can tell you this: We have saved people's livelihoods. You know what, when you have kids in schools, when you have people working and you have people's businesses surviving, you are saving lives too."

Crist easily won a 2006 race for governor after getting elected in 2002 and 2000 as attorney general and education commissioner, which subsequently became an appointed post.

But Crist did not run for a second term as governor in 2010, instead leaving the Republican Party and launching an independent bid for a U.S. Senate seat. Crist lost the race to Republican Marco Rubio and was sidelined politically.

Crist became the Democratic nominee for governor in 2014 but lost to Republican Gov. Rick Scott. He then won a Pineellas County congressional seat in 2016.

Teen charged in crime spree

Arrest made for string of car break-ins; gun charges

A Citrus County 16-year-old boy was behind a lengthy crime spree of April car burglaries that also included credit card thefts, stolen guns and criminal mischief, according to the Citrus County

Sheriff's Office that arrested him.

In early April, Citrus County deputies were researching a rash of vehicle burglaries, and using interviews and surveillance tapes, investigators concluded it was the teenager who was behind the crimes, according to the

Chronicle is not naming him due to his age.

On April 9, deputies went to the home of the boy in Beverly Hills with a search warrant and deputies searched the home. The boy was at home and he was escorted outside.

According to the arrest report, detectives searched the boy's room and found a loaded Smith & Wesson 9mm handgun under his nightstand along with ammunition.

According to the arrest report, deputies found a second loaded handgun under the boy's bed along with a bag holding several debit and credit cards and wallets belonging to his victims. Also in the bag was a single glove and a window punch. Deputies ran the firearms' information through law enforcement databases and determined they were both stolen.

Deputies reported finding in the boy's closet, inside a pair of shoes, two

food stamp cards belonging to other victims.

The deputies arrested the boy and charged him with two counts of burglary and becoming armed as a result, 21 counts of burglary of a conveyance, three counts of grand theft of a firearm, one count of fraudulent use of a credit card, nine counts of criminal mischief, and two counts of possession of a firearm by a minor.

He was taken to a juvenile detention center.

Petit theft arrest leads to drug charges

Store video shows evidence

A Beverly Hills woman faces drug trafficking charges after she was arrested and accused of retail theft from the Lecanto Walmart.

The arrest saga of Danielle Tashaina Marie Horst, 33, began May 1 when a Citrus County Sheriff's Office deputy was called to the Lecanto Walmart and was met by the store's loss-prevention officer, according to the arrest report.

The deputy reported that the store's loss-prevention officer showed video evidence of Horst at the self-checkout register. The video showed Horst not scanning two long-sleeve T-shirts, the report stated.

That prompted the loss-prevention officer to confront her when she began to leave the store.

The loss-prevention officer reported that when they scanned the contents of her cart, they found 27 items that had not been scanned, according to the report.

Those items included shirts, bras, soap, face masks, Raid, wipes, and diapers. Their value was \$160.10, the report stated.

The deputy reported that they also searched her purse following her arrest. When the deputy asked Horst whether she had anything illegal in her purse, Horst replied she had methamphetamine, according to the report.

The deputy reported that when they searched Horst's purse, they found several baggies containing a total of 16.1 grams, the report stated.

The deputy noted that a criminal search of Horst showed she had a 2014 theft conviction.

The deputy charged her with trafficking in methamphetamine and petit theft, with a previous conviction. Her bond was \$26,000.

Ballet official accused of molestation

ST. PETERSBURG — The co-founder and artistic director of the St. Petersburg Ballet Conservatory has been arrested on battery and molestation charges after investigators said he had "an inappropriate sexual relationship" with a student.

St. Petersburg police arrested Servy Gallardo, 52, on Monday. He is charged with four counts of lewd and lascivious battery and one count of lewd and

lascivious molestation. Police said the victim was 15.

He also serves as the chief choreographer for the conservatory, which has been in business since 2018, the Tampa Bay Times reported.

Detectives "are concerned that there could be additional victims" and asked for anyone with information to come forward, the Times reported.

Gallardo remained in jail early Tuesday. An attorney for him was not listed on jail records.

Random House Children's Books announced Tuesday that "The Bench" will be released June 8.

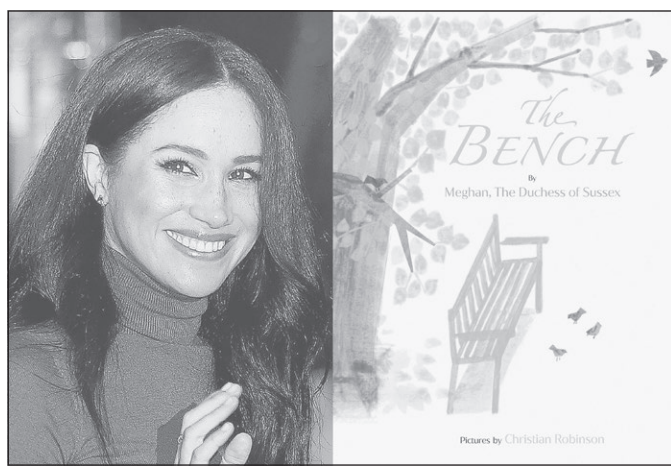
It is illustrated by award-winning illustrator Christian Robinson and Meghan will narrate the audiobook edition. The book features a diverse group of fathers and sons and moments they share, according to a statement announcing the release.

The book grew out of a poem Meghan wrote for Harry for their first Father's Day after Archie's birth, the statement said.

"That poem became this story," Meghan said. "Christian layered in beautiful and ethereal watercolor illustrations that capture the warmth, joy and comfort of the relationship between fathers and sons from all walks of life; this representation was particularly important to me, and Christian and I worked closely to depict this special bond through an inclusive lens."

The book is one of several projects that Meghan and Harry have announced since stepping away from royal duties in early 2020. Meghan, the actor formerly known as Meghan Markle, narrated the Disney nature film "Elephant" and the couple has a Netflix deal. 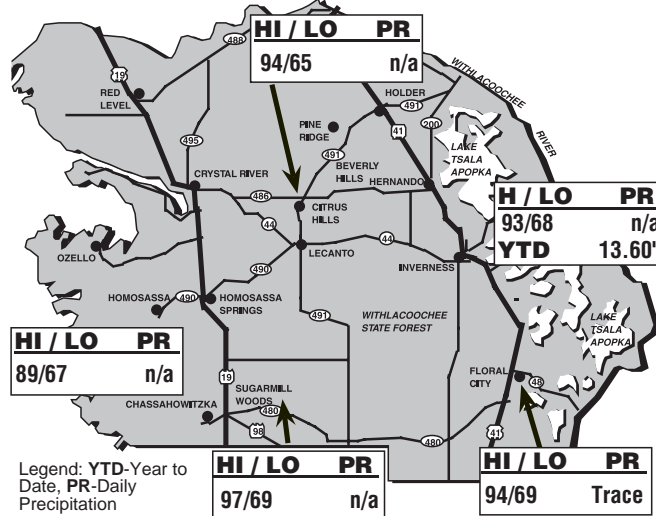

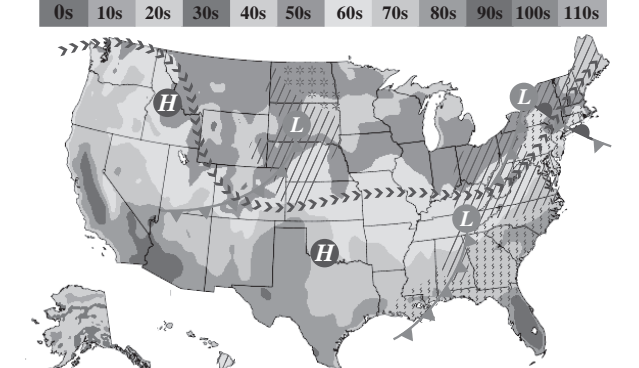

the Chronicle. "Everything's going great."

"Things are going even better than we had hoped," added Steve Minguy, HRRP's board president. "It's progressing better than we had hoped."

Winter Garden-based contractor Sea & Shoreline LLC and its roughly 45 workers and divers were tasked with handling operations at the two restoration sites.

Sea & Shoreline has been in charge of both environmental endeavors since their individual inceptions; 2021 is the sixth year for SCR's project, and the second year for HRRP's.

"We're cranking back up again this year," said Howard Miller, Sea & Shoreline's vice president of sales. "We're rocking and rolling with larger staff than we've had."

SCR's and HRRP's future funding sources are also looking strong.

Florida senators and representatives voted this legislative session in their proposed budgets to appropriate \$4 million toward SCR's upcoming phases of its King's Bay Restoration Project.

Moore thanked local state legislators, Senate President Wilton Simpson and Rep. Ralph Massullo, for their "tremendous efforts and hard work" to fight for SCR's money.

Rep. Ralph Massullo, R-Lecanto, told the Chronicle he's been speaking with Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) officials to secure \$4 million from the state's spring restoration fund.

"We've had good luck in the past," Massullo said about prior and similar funding asks to the FDEP. "I don't know how much

we'll get from them; we may get more. ... It doesn't hurt to ask."

Simpson, R-Trilby, could not be reached for comment.

Representatives and senators respectively budgeted \$50 million and \$75 million this legislative session for the springs fund.

Joint legislative committees will form to draft a singular state budget for Gov. Ron DeSantis to review and adjust before it's sent back to the Legislature.

After then-Gov. Rick Scott vetoed a \$350,000 allocation for it in 2016, HRRP members and donors fundraised \$75,000 to pay for project studies and permit fees.

Along with a \$2 million grant from 2019, state lawmakers during their 2020 session allocated \$1.5 million to launch the Homosassa River Restoration Project, which has planted more than 11,000 native and sustainable seagrasses in canals east of Fishbowl Drive Bridge, Minguy said.

Minguy said he's confident the fruits of HRRP's labor have proven it worthy of more support to clean the river more to the west.

"I think we've proven it's a viable concept and that it works," he said. "We're spending taxpayer dollars effectively and efficiently, and we hope Tallahassee sees that as well."

Perfecting a method it's used for years and hopes to expand through Florida's coasts, Sea & Shoreline is on track to meet its yearly and ultimate deadlines.

"We're moving nice," Miller said, "and every year it gets a little more easier."

Sea & Shoreline barges and divers can only do in-water work outside of the local manatee migration season, which runs from Nov. 15 to March 31.

With 54 acres tallied as of April 1, Moore said, Save Crystal River's goal is to rehabilitate 90 acres

of King's Bay before the city's 100th birthday on July 2, 2023.

Moore said SCR is also applying for grants to restore Hunter Springs Cove in Crystal River, and around the city's anticipated Riverwalk.

Due to a shortened cleanup period in 2020, a portion of HRRP's first of three phases to restore 46.19 acres in the Homosassa River by 2025 has been completed.

Similar to 2020, the King's Bay Restoration Project is based on and around Shatz Island off of Kings Bay Drive, while the restoration of the Homosassa River is headquartered on 3 rented acres behind the Bella Oasis Hotel off U.S. 19.

From an industrial pumping system on the sites, pipes snake out toward and into the bay and river to barges or divers sucking the water bottom clean of invasive algae and vegetation.

Miller thanked Sea & Shoreline's neighbors for accommodating its work, which sometimes goes underneath private docks or gets in the way of passing watercraft.

"People have been so gracious," he said. "Keep an eye out for us because we're out there."

Miller said complaints and concerns can be directed to him at 727-248-6644.

Whatever's removed from the Homosassa River and King's Bay travels back to the nearest pump site at a rate between 2,500 and 4,500 gallons a minute, and is filtered through a series of mechanical de-watering sieves to remove

larger sediments.

Water's then pumped into fine-mesh Geotube bags, after being injected with microscopic polymers used to bond onto nitrogen and phosphorus particles — fuel for algae blooms.

Once the Geotube bags reach their maximum size — a typical height of 8 feet — clean water seeps from their tiny pores and into a lined trench flowing naturally back into the waterway, leaving the clumps of polymers and particles behind.

Afterward, Sea & Shoreline plants thousands of its homegrown durable eel-grasses on the clear bottom to be maintained until they take a natural foothold to create new ecosystems.

"Seagrass saves sea life," Miller said, quoting his company's new slogan.

Citing recent data from the U.S. Geological Survey, which conducts annual manatee health assessments in King's Bay, Miller said Sea & Shoreline's methods created a reliable food source for the marine mammal.

"Because of our project," he said, "we have the healthiest manatees anywhere."

Miller said Sea & Shoreline has been trying to get more restoration projects along Florida's east coast, where manatees have been dying from starvation.

"We're trying to work with the other side of the state to get some projects going," he said, "and get some seagrass growing as quickly as we can."

Duke Energy rate deal approved

TALLAHASSEE — With backing from representatives of consumers and businesses, the state Public Service Commission on Tuesday unanimously approved a settlement that will increase base electric rates for customers of Duke Energy Florida.

Duke reached the settlement early this year with the state Office of Public Counsel, which represents consumers, and major electricity users after months of negotiations. The settlement would lead to about \$195 million in rate increases over three years.

"This was a massive undertaking to have reached a settlement agreement," commission Chairman Gary Clark said.

Base rates make up a large portion of customers' monthly electric bills and can spur lengthy, contentious disputes when they are changed. Duke is operating under a 2017 settlement, with the newly approved plan slated to last from 2022 through 2024.

The plan, in part, includes base-rate increases of \$67.246 million in 2022, \$48.933 million in 2023 and \$79.199 million in 2024, for a total of

Duke, which has more than 1.8 million customers in the state, said in January that average residential customers would see bill increases of 3% to 4% in 2022, while non-residential customers would see increases of 1% to 6.5%. All customers would see annual increases of 1% to 2% in 2023 and 2024.

Anastacia Pirello, an attorney with the Office of Public Counsel, said the settlement is the "best overall outcome" for consumers. For example, Pirello and Jon Moyle, an attorney for the Florida Industrial Power Users group, pointed to part of the settlement that reduces the amount of profit Duke will be allowed to earn.

That issue involves an allowed return on equity, a closely watched measure of profitability. The settlement will allow Duke to have a return within a range with a "midpoint" of 9.85%. That is compared to Duke's current midpoint of 10.5% — a change that Pirello and Moyle said could save about \$200 million.

"It's a great opportunity for ratepayers to make some considerable savings," Moyle said. Duke officials said they think the agreement is fair and will help meet the utility's needs.

School board, sheriff revise plan to access student data

NEW PORT RICHEY — A Florida school district and the local sheriff's officers agreed Tuesday that resource officers will no longer have access to student data, including the school system's early warning system that designates students as "at risk."

The revised agreement between the Pasco County Sheriff's Office and the county's school board came amid a U.S. Department of Education investigation into whether sharing such information violated federal law.

A sheriff's analyst who serves on the school system's threat-assessment team will still be able to review student data, the Tampa Bay Times reported. And the agency will still be able to access that information in cases of public safety emergencies, including child abductions.

Under the revised agreement, the sheriff's office will create a record of any data they access and why it was necessary. The information will be sent to the school district, sheriff's spokeswoman Amanda Hunter told the newspaper.

The agency had used the school district data to create a secret list of children who could "fall into a life of crime," the newspaper reported in 2020.

There were 420 students on the list last year, the Times reported. And students could be on the list due to factors like getting a D or F grade, or

from experiencing childhood trauma such as child abuse, officials said.

"We are voluntarily making this update to our agreement with the Pasco County School Board to ease any anxiety that parents may have as a result of misinformation perpetuated by media reports," Sheriff Chris Nocco said in a prepared statement. "To be clear, over the 20 years that our SROs have had access to this information, we have never relied on grades, attendance or school discipline to deem any child at-risk for being a 'future criminal,' nor do we use predictive policing, and this update to policy just further clarifies and reflects that reality."

The sheriff's office is already facing a federal lawsuit that the intelligence-based policing program violates people's rights by improperly targeting and harassing them. Nocco rejected the claims in the lawsuit filed in Tampa in March.

School Superintendent Kurt Browning said he sought to amend the agreement because the issue had become a "distraction" to the school district's efforts to serve children.

"We just determined that we can still provide the same level of service," he said. "People did not understand that we were not doing anything nefarious with data."

Browning said that the stories reported by news media "stirred a lot of people up over things we weren't doing."

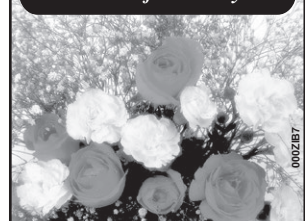

Oliver said Lachnicht filled a need.

“He had a heavy planning background and we were hurting in planning,” he said.

Oliver said the person who follows Lachnicht should be “similar but

different.” Asked how different, he said: “I want to get somebody more assertive.”

Lachnicht is Oliver’s second hire for assistant administrator. His first, James Mallon, lasted just three months after being hired in November 2018; he resigned after being elected to a New Jersey borough council in his hometown.

Commission Chairman

Scott Carnahan said he hopes Oliver chooses someone without familiarity in Citrus County.

“We’ll wait to see what happens,” he said. “It’s Randy’s call to make.”

program, which, if Conley completes, would lead to the dismissal of his five felony drug-possession charges.

Judges can enroll willing drug offenders with two or fewer nonviolent felony charges or convictions into the supervised pretrial intervention program while their case continues, according to Florida law.

Depending on their success in the program’s stringent counseling, education, treatment and drug-testing regiments, a defendant could see either their charges dropped or a return to prosecution.

Howard noted Conley’s possession charges for fentanyl, methamphetamine, oxycodone, morphine and clonazepam would make it “a tall order” for Conley’s eligibility for pretrial intervention.

“He’s got a lot of different drugs,” the judge told Trehly before scheduling Conley’s next court date for June 29. “He can continue his placement with the treatment provider.”

Assistant State Attorney Blake Shore told a *Chronicle* reporter on Tuesday prosecutors could argue against a defendant’s placement in drug pretrial intervention if they believed the offender had an intent to sell narcotics.

Shore, who supervises Conley’s prosecutor, said he has yet to review Conley’s case, but assumes the former lawman didn’t deal drugs based on the current evidence and charges

against him.

After pulling him over for running a stop sign at a Beverly Hills intersection, sheriff’s office deputies arrested Conley on Feb. 27 after they allegedly found him with 2.5 grams of morphine, 12 oxycodone pills, a morphine pill, a clonazepam pill and 0.6 grams of fentanyl.

Deputies also found a glass pipe coated with meth residue in between the driver’s seat and center console, and a holstered pistol next to the seatbelt buckle.

Conley was released from custody a few days after his arrest after posting bail on a \$11,000 bond.

Six months before his arrest, Conley resigned in August from the sheriff’s office’s Criminal Investigations Division in lieu of Sheriff Mike Prendergast firing him as discipline for being stopped a couple days earlier by deputies for driving away from a known drug house.

Howard on Tuesday set Aug. 2 as the trial date for Hiram Bonilla, the Tampa 57-year-old accused of sexually abusing a 67-year-old patient while a nurse at Citrus Memorial Hospital.

Bonilla told Howard he’s in the process of hiring a private attorney, adding his finances were hit hard after Hurricane Maria destroyed his family’s farmstead in Puerto Rico.

Bonilla also said he wasn’t interested in having a public defender represent him.

“If you’re going to get an attorney, you better get them on quick,” Howard told Bonilla. “You can’t just go around for the rest of life saying you’re going to get an

attorney some day.”

Bonilla has a final pretrial hearing on July 19.

Hillsborough County Sheriff’s Office deputies on Jan. 12 arrested Bonilla on a warrant alleging lewd and lascivious battery on an elderly person and two counts of lewd and lascivious molestation on an elderly person.

It’s alleged Bonilla in January molested a woman and performed a sex act on her while she was a patient at the hospital in Inverness.

Assistant State Attorney Debra Munchel told Howard forensic reports state Bonilla’s DNA was on the woman’s body.

Howard on Tuesday scheduled Kimberly Darnell Taschereau’s trial for the week of Aug. 30, with a final pretrial date on Aug. 16.

Taschereau, a Homosassa 23-year-old, is charged with aggravated child abuse and child neglect in connection to her alleged kicking in February 2020 of a boy who suffered from a ruptured intestine.

Taschereau denied striking the child, adding she stepped on him when she got out of bed.

Howard set Taschereau’s trial after her lawyer, Eric Evilsizer, asked Howard for a 30-day continuance so he could continue his review of his client’s case.

“There’s still plenty of time to work this case,” the judge told Evilsizer.

If convicted as charged, Taschereau faces a prison term of up to 35 years. Munchel told Howard she’s offered Taschereau a 10-year prison sentence in exchange for a plea-change.

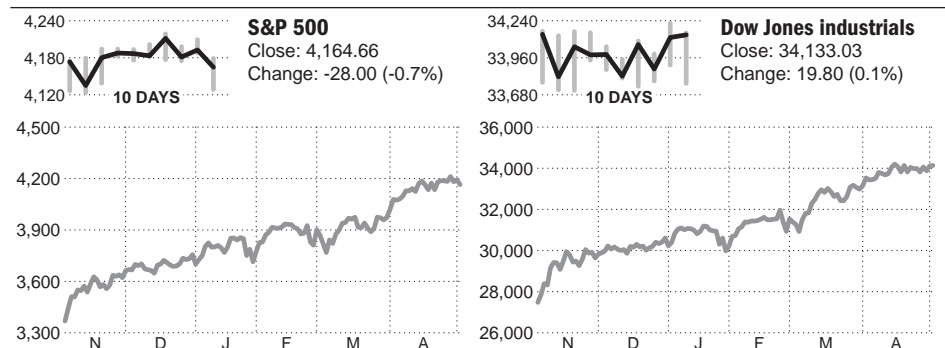

Unemployment work-seeking requirement not full problem

In Florida, COVID-19 vaccination appointments opened to all adults on April 5.

Now, over a year into the pandemic, millions of Floridians are fully vaccinated. Many citizens who desire to get the vaccine to combat the novel coronavirus have had a chance to do so, with countless completing the vaccination cycle. People want to go out and have fun again, but not everyone is ready to go back to work.

Citrus County Chamber of Commerce president/CEO Josh Wooten, the outward voice for local businesses, fired off a letter last week to Gov. Ron DeSantis, asking him to bring back the reporting requirement of "actively seeking work" from unemployment claimants, because he said was hearing employers plea for workers, but business owners allegedly can't find any because they are making more money staying home and being unemployed.

Just a few days later, state officials extended the waiver for unemployed Floridians to continue receiving benefits without actively searching for a job until May 29.

But Florida is "open" and has been for quite some time now. The policies in place to have the state economy fully running but still have very padded unemployment cushions in place for workers are two policies that are not in synch. There needs to be incentive to go back to work.

The initial pandemic state of emergency was declared April 16, 2020, so that claimants would not get caught up in endless red tape when applying for unemployment, but as more and more people get vaccinated, when is it time to return to "normal"?

Last week, the Centers of Disease Control and

Prevention (CDC) released a new set of mask prevention measures, noting that vaccinated folks can safely congregate maskless outdoors, but still recommends a mask indoors and in crowded spaces for the time being. The economy continues to grow, forecast to rebound to pre-pandemic levels by late summer, and most all people are ready to return to the pre-pandemic way of life.

Sure, there are still lingering effects of the COVID shutdowns, but at the same time, many are ready to move on as they have all of the protection available against the vaccine.

Bringing back the "actively seeking work" requirement isn't the answer to completely end the abuse of the unemployment, but it will deter some from applying and getting back to work. Alternatively, there is a longstanding problem with the low wages of the service industry and the amount received in unemployment. For those who have to pay for child care, sometimes staying home is the better option. That's an issue that needs attention, not just acknowledgement. The system needs a hefty change.

Jobs are being offered to people at this point, and the people just don't show up. Many prefer unemployment than actually working.

There's more than one viewpoint to this issue — from family, to individual to employer.

However, everyone has the opportunity to get vaccinated in Florida right now, so as we enter the summer months, there should be a focus on getting back to "normal." COVID recovery will ramp up once more people get off unemployment, and back to work.

How about a weekly spotlight in the Chronicle featuring photos of six animals seeking forever homes? Reduce the population and you reduce the suffering. Yes, an improved facility is long overdue, but it is not a gesture of kindness. It will improve nothing but the conditions.

If you truly care about and love these animals, think about what you can do to reduce the population. Direct your energy and emotions toward truly improving the process. And the commissioners can perhaps determine a less expensive way to improve internal conditions for the animals, workers and volunteers.

Oh say, can you leave a little money for a Baker Act facility? That was a fleeting priority not long ago. I'll wager that there are more human beings suffering in Citrus County than animals. Actions speak louder than words. Always.

Biden aiming for more vaccinations

Wants 70% of adults with shots by July 4

WASHINGTON — President Joe Biden on Tuesday set a new vaccination goal to deliver at least one shot to 70% of adult Americans by July Fourth as he tackles the vexing problem of winning over the “doubters” and those unmotivated to get inoculated.

Demand for vaccines has dropped off markedly nationwide, with some states leaving more than half their available doses unordered. Aiming to make it easier to get shots, Biden called for states to make vaccines available on a walk-in basis and he will direct many pharmacies to do likewise.

His administration for the first time also is moving to shift doses from states with weaker demand to areas with stronger interest in the shots.

“You do need to get vaccinated,” Biden said from the White House. “Even if your chance of getting seriously ill is low, why take the risk? It could save your life or the lives of somebody you love.”

Biden’s goal equates to delivering at least the first shot to 181 million adults and fully vaccinating

160 million. It’s a tacit acknowledgment of the declining interest in shots.

Already more than 56% of American adults have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine and nearly 105 million are fully vaccinated. The U.S. is currently administering first doses at a rate of about 965,000 per day — half the rate of three weeks ago, but almost twice as fast as needed to meet Biden’s target.

“I’d like to get it 100%, but I think realistically we can get to that place between now and July Fourth,” Biden said of his new goal.

He said the administration would focus on three areas as it tries to ramp up the pace of vaccinations:

- Adults who need more convincing to take the vaccine.

- Those who have struggled or are in no hurry to obtain a shot.

- Adolescents aged 12-15, once federal authorities approve vaccination for that age group.

Acknowledging that “the pace of vaccination is slowing,” Biden predicted the inoculation effort is “going to be harder” when it comes to convincing “doubters” of the need to get their shots.

He said the most

effective argument to those people would be to protect those they love. “This is your choice: It’s life and death.”

Biden’s push comes as his administration has shifted away from setting a target for the U.S. to reach “herd immunity,” instead focusing on delivering as many shots into arms as possible. Officials said Biden’s vaccination target would result in a significant reduction in COVID-19 cases heading into the summer.

To that end, the Biden administration is shifting the government’s focus toward expanding smaller and mobile vaccination clinics to deliver doses to harder-to-reach communities. It is also spending hundreds of millions of dollars to boost interest in vaccines through education campaigns and greater access to shots through community organizations that can help bring people to clinics.

Biden touted creative efforts to make it “easier and more fun” to get vaccinated, such as grocery stores offering discounts to shoppers who come to get shots and sports leagues that hold promotions to get shots for their fans.

Chauvin’s lawyer seeks new trial, hearing to impeach verdict

MINNEAPOLIS — The defense attorney for the former Minneapolis police officer convicted of killing George Floyd has requested a new trial, saying the court abused its discretion, and he wants a hearing to have the verdict impeached because of what he says is jury misconduct, according to a court document filed Tuesday.

Derek Chauvin, who is white, was convicted last month of second-degree unintentional murder, third-degree murder and second-degree manslaughter in the May 25 death of Floyd. Evidence at trial showed Chauvin pressed his knee against Floyd’s neck for 9 1/2 minutes as the Black man said he couldn’t breathe and went motionless.

Defense attorney Eric Nelson said he is requesting a new trial in the interests of justice. He said there were abuses of discretion that deprived Chauvin of a fair trial, prosecutorial and jury misconduct and that the verdict was contrary to law.

A request for a new trial is routine following a guilty verdict and often mirrors issues that will be raised on appeal, said Mike Brandt, a Minneapolis defense attorney who has been closely following the case. If this request is denied, it can add another layer of decisions for Nelson to appeal. Brandt and others have said Chauvin’s convictions are unlikely to be overturned.

Nelson cited many reasons in his request for a new trial. He said Judge Peter

Cahill abused the discretion of the court and violated Chauvin’s right to due process and a fair trial when he denied Nelson’s request to move the trial to another county due to pretrial publicity.

Overpass collapse on Mexico City metro kills at least 24

MEXICO CITY — The death toll from the collapse of an overpass on the Mexico City metro rose to 24 Tuesday as crews untangled train carriages from the steel and concrete wreckage that fell onto a roadway.

Monday night’s accident was one of the deadliest in the history of the subway, and questions quickly arose about the structural integrity of the mass transit system, among the world’s busiest.

Another 27 people remained hospitalized of the more than 70 injured when the support beams collapsed about 10:30 p.m. as a train passed along the elevated section, Mayor Claudia Sheinbaum said.

On Tuesday, a crane carefully lowered a train car containing four bodies to the ground.

Of the 24 killed, 21 died at the scene, while the others died at hospitals. Only five have been identified so far. Children were among the fatalities, Sheinbaum said.

Belgian government, colleges hit by cyberattack

BRUSSELS — The company providing internet services for Belgium’s parliament, government agencies, universities and scientific institutions said Tuesday that its network was under cyberattack, with connections to several customers disrupted.

Belnet said in a statement the attack “is still in progress and takes place in successive waves. Our teams are working hard to mitigate them.” The company has around 200 customers.

Two hours later it said “the effect of the attack seems to be diminishing,” but provided no other details.

Storms continue to pound Southern states

Flash flooding feared in parts of Alabama

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — Relentless wind and rain continued to pummel large swaths of the South on Tuesday, causing tornadoes, sparking a flash flood emergency in Alabama and damaging homes from Texas to Virginia.

The National Weather Service issued the flash flood emergency for the Birmingham, Alabama, area at the start of rush hour, warning that torrential rains — as much as 5 inches in some areas — had already fallen and another 2 inches were possible before the storm system continued moving east.

Jefferson County Emergency Management officials urged residents to stay off the roads because so many were flooded and covered.

Parts of Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama and Tennessee, as well as corners of Arkansas and Georgia were at enhanced risk for the worst weather, according to the national Storm Prediction Center. That zone is home to more

than 11 million people and includes the cities of Nashville, Tennessee; Birmingham, Alabama; Baton Rouge, Louisiana; and Jackson, Mississippi, forecasters said.

“We’ll see all three threats as far as hail, wind and tornadoes on Tuesday,” said Mike Edmonston, a National Weather Service meteorologist in Mississippi.

The storms have been responsible for three deaths this week and, as of Tuesday evening, more than 350,000 customers were without power from Texas to Maryland, including 143,000 in Mississippi and 76,000 in Virginia, according to poweroutage.us.

With warnings about possible tornadoes stretching from Louisiana eastward, dozens of school systems in Mississippi and Alabama dismissed students early so buses and cars would not have to be on the road during potentially violent weather.

A Tennessee woman died when a tree fell on her home as storms moved through the state Tuesday, Weakley County

Emergency Management Director Ray Wigington told WKRN-TV. He said at least six mobile homes were damaged by the falling tree around 4 a.m.

At least eight people were injured when storms that brought tornadoes to Texas flipped tractor-trailers on an interstate and damaged structures. Three drivers were hospitalized, one with serious injuries, after their tractor-trailers overturned in the storms Monday night along Interstate 35 near Waxahachie, about 30 miles south of Dallas, officials said.

In addition to the injured tractor-trailer drivers, five others in Texas were hospitalized after the storm came through Ellis County, an official said. County Judge Todd Little told KXAS between 25 to 50 structures were damaged, but they had no fatalities.

At least 11 Tennessee counties were hit by possible EF-0 tornadoes Tuesday, said Faith Borden, meteorologist with the National Weather Service in Nashville.

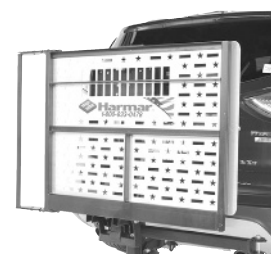

New kids' TV show emerges from Mister Rogers universe

NEW YORK — Mister Rogers' neighborhood is expanding.

In rare welcome news of sprawl, PBS Kids is releasing a new puppet-led series called "Donkey Hodie," inspired from characters in the original Fred Rogers TV show.

"Every part of it seems to be infused with joy and heart and humor," says Adam Rudman, who co-created and co-produced the show with his brother, David. "And I think that's something that Fred Rogers would appreciate."

The whimsical series for children ages 3-5 starts airing Monday and centers on the adventures of Donkey Hodie, an enthusiastic yellow donkey with a bright magenta mane. She's the granddaughter of the donkey puppet Rogers created back when TV shows were in black and white.

"This is a show about a little donkey with big dreams. It's about persistence, it's about resilience and it's about frustration and things going wrong," says Ellen Doherty, chief creative officer of Fred Rogers Productions.

During each 15-minute episode, Donkey Hodie learns lessons, like why following a recipe step-by-step makes sense and the importance of making a plan before tackling a big project.

She's helped by a colorful gang of friends — Purple Panda, Bob Dog and Duck Duck, each of whom brings something to the table.

If Donkey is the one who comes up with an idea, Panda is the supportive friend, telling her she can do it. Bob Dog is the enthusiastic helper and Duck Duck is the practical pal, asking how they're going

to succeed.

"We really worked hard on the character blend," says David Rudman, who performs Bob Dog and Donkey's grandfather and also directs the episodes. "They all bring something interesting and they work really well together."

The song-filled series is set in land of Someplace Else, named after the place where parents are always asking noisy kids to go. It has a windmill — an original Don Quixote joke by Rogers — but the creators have built a wonky land with rolling hills and no straight lines.

"All the little details — every flower, every bush, every tree — everything on there is made by somebody. It's made by hand. So nothing is built in a computer," says David Rudman.

The new series is metaphorically connected by cobblestone path to both the animated "Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood" and the mother ship, "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood."

"We are proud that once again we'll be sharing the ideas and teachings of Fred Rogers with kids and families, just as we did with 'Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood,'" says Linda Simensky, head of content for PBS Kids.

Doherty notes there are lots of Easter eggs hidden throughout the new world, including nods to familiar sights on "Mister Rogers" like Trolley, the fish tank and a porch swing.

The creators chose to go with puppets instead of animation because of their expressive nature. "Young children have very big emotions and it just felt like puppets were the best way to express that for this world," says Doherty.

The project started when the Rudmans, who founded Spiffy Pictures and whose projects include "Nature Cat," were tapped to breathe new life into minor characters from the "Mister Rogers Neighborhood." They pored over old footage of the show and dug into the history.

"We started to discover these really funny, quirky, obscure characters that a lot of people didn't know," says David Rudman. The brothers added new characters and edited old ones.

"We redesigned them. We gave them new personalities in most cases and updated them to fit how the show was going," says Adam Rudman, who is head writer and while not a performer, can occasionally be heard as a background voice.

Researchers: Climate pledges see world closing on Paris goal

BERLIN — Recent pledges by the United States and other nations could help cap global warming at 2 degrees Celsius (3.6 Fahrenheit) by the end of the century, but only if efforts to cut greenhouse gas emissions to "net zero" by 2050 succeed, scientists said Tuesday.

More than 190 countries agreed six years ago in Paris to keep the average temperature rise below that threshold — ideally no more than 1.5 C — by 2100, compared to pre-industrial times, to avoid serious harm to humans and the natural world.

The Climate Action Tracker, compiled by a group of researchers who translate targets and actual emissions into temperature estimates, projects that the world is currently set to overshoot the Paris accord's less ambitious goal by 0.9 degrees.

"That's still catastrophic climate change, a situation that is basically not controllable and which we have to avoid by all means," said Niklas Hoehne of the New Climate Institute, one of the

authors of the study.

By including the latest proposals from governments in their calculation, researchers found the estimate dropped to 2.4 C — an improvement of 0.2 C on the previous optimistic forecast the group made in December. U.S. President Joe Biden's recent ambitious new climate goals contributed significantly to the revised estimate, along with the European Union, China, Japan and Britain.

1904 — Cy Young of the Red Sox pitched a perfect game against the Philadelphia Athletics, beating Rube Waddell 3-0. Having pitched nine hitless innings in two previous efforts, he ran his string of hitless innings to 18.

1917 — Ernie Koob of the St. Louis Browns pitched a no-hitter against the Chicago White Sox for a 1-0 win in St. Louis.

1925 — Manager Ty Cobb of the Detroit Tigers hit three homers, a double and two singles against the St. Louis Browns.

1925 — Shortstop Everett Scott of the New York Yankees was benched, ending his streak of 1,307 consecutive games played that started while playing for the Boston Red Sox. Scott, who gave way to Pee Wee Wanninger, had the longest playing streak before Lou Gehrig.

1933 — Pepper Martin of the St. Louis Cardinals hit for the cycle and scored four runs in a 5-3 win over the Philadelphia Phillies.

1939 — Sam Chapman of the Philadelphia Athletics hit for the cycle in a 10-5 win over the St. Louis Browns. Chapman completed the cycle with a single in the ninth.

1962 — Bo Belinsky of the Los

Angeles Angels beat the Baltimore Orioles 2-0 with a no-hitter at Dodger Stadium. Belinsky struck out nine and walked four.

1978 — Pete Rose became the youngest and 14th player with 3,000 hits when he singled against Montreal's Steve Rogers at Cincinnati's Riverfront Stadium.

1980 — National League president Chub Feeney suspended Pittsburgh's Bill Madlock for 15 days and fined him \$5,000 for shoving his glove in the face of home plate umpire Gerry Crawford.

1999 — Colorado became the first team in 35 years and the third century to score in every inning in a 13-6 win over the Chicago Cubs. The last time a team scored in all nine innings was also at Wrigley Field, when St. Louis beat the Cubs on Sept. 13, 1964.

Trees and birds go together, and although most of the birds at Ziggy's Haven Bird Sanctuary in Inverness are in cages, birds in the wild visit there as well.

So, when the Citrus Garden Club wanted to plant a tree for a local nonprofit, Ziggy's was an ideal match.

"Today we're planting a wax myrtle," said Lesly Smith from Citrus Garden Club. "We had to do our research for this one to find one that's a Florida native, a fast grower and non toxic."

"We'll plant it and then we'll come out and maintain the tree and anything else we might be able to do here," she said.

Nick Anderson, a Ziggy's volunteer, said they routinely invite local organizations like the garden club to help out.

"When they said they wanted to do some planting to spruce up the place, we absolutely loved the idea," he said. "We worked with them first to make sure the tree they wanted to plant was non toxic because birds are exceedingly sensitive."

"It's not just about them eating it, but birds actually have to

Remember these 'steps' to prevent falls

I recently gave a balance and fall prevention presentation and besides laughter from the many stories I told on myself, everyone present learned at least one thing new they can do to prevent a fall.

It has been a while, so I thought this would be a wonderful opportunity to remind you of what "steps" (like the reference?), you can take to prevent yourself from falling. Not all falls can be prevented, but so many more can be and you have the power to take control.

Here are my top fall prevention tips:

1. Take your time. Move at your own pace. Don't let anyone rush you.
2. Keep an eye on your pets. Pets are great until they're under your feet. Don't trip because you didn't know they

3. Wear proper-fitting shoes. Some can wear flip flops, or mules. Some can't. Accidentally stepping out of your shoes could trip you up.
4. Get rid of throw rugs. Throw rugs are major contributors to trips and falls.
5. Clean spills immediately. If you don't, the next time you sprint through the kitchen, it is likely you'll have forgotten the spill and you're down for the count.
6. Be aware of your surroundings. Don't walk through leaves, you don't know if they are covering a hole. Watch the lip of the garage where the door seals. Watch curbs and step depth.
7. Have grab bars installed in the bathtub and shower.
8. Raise/lower your bed. If your bed is too high off the floor or

too low, it can be difficult to get in and out of, that could also lead to falling on the floor.

9. Raise your toilet seat. Enough said.
10. Keep areas well lit. Is the path to the bathroom well lit in the middle of the night? How about from the carport or garage to the house at night? How about the hallways?
11. Eliminate clutter. Pick up anything on the floor that could cause a trip, slip or fall.
12. Don't be vain; use your cane. It is for your safety.
13. Have annual eye/hearing exams. Loss of vision and hearing can affect your balance.
14. Never be afraid to ask for help. Ever. We all need a little help every now and then and age has nothing to do with it. So if you need help, ask for it.
15. Do not use step stools.
16. Do not use ladders. Neither of these are your friend.
17. Don't change positions too quickly. Many falls occur because you move too quickly. If you

have been lying down, or sitting for a long period of time, change positions slowly.

18. Don't block view of your path. In other words watch where you are going.
19. Reorganize cabinets so that what you use more often is right in front not too high and not too low.
20. Keep moving. A little exercise is better than none at all.

"Epsom, England, was soon to become a spa town, and the mineral is now all the rage in gardening circles on Pinterest," Kathy continues. "I've had a fair amount of personal experience with the stuff, and I swear by it. I put it in every planting hole I dig in and every pot I plant."

"Studies have been done on the mineral and they seem to suggest that its best use is that of a foliar spray — dissolve in water and spray on the foliage of the plant — and it is only necessary if the soil is low in magnesium. The only thing I have found that doesn't benefit from its use is cacti. For some reason the cacti that I have used it on have died forthwith!" Kathy concludes, "Please keep in mind that this is only my opinion and

anecdotal evidence. Nothing more."

Kathy, also, shared in her "Hints" that she has had great success growing Campari's tomatoes from the seeds of salad tomatoes she purchased from a local grocery store. She had not tried these before and it was an education for her. She thinks they must be disease-resistant, don't grow big or gangly and bear prolifically. Proof was in the eating since they taste just like the originals! Only one caution was expressed and that was that the clusters get so heavy that they break the stem, so individual clusters need to be supported.

On May 7, when Crystal River stages First Friday from 4-8 p.m., Roger Osborne, the owner of All About Nature in Heritage Village, will welcome visitors to an open house at his newest shop, Land and Sea Décor, 660 N. Citrus Ave.

Mini Fact:
Holi is a Hindu festival celebrated in the spring in India. It's also called the festival of colors.

The United States is home for millions of people who have come here from other countries. Our family members, friends, neighbors, doctors, mail carriers and teachers might have immigrated to the U.S., or their parents or grandparents might have.

In May, we celebrate Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month, when we honor those who can trace their backgrounds to more than 40 countries in Asia and the Pacific Islands — more than 24 million Americans.

This spring, several violent incidents have targeted Asian Americans. President Joe Biden called these tragic events “very troubling” and “un-American.”

But people from Asia and the Pacific Islands have been fighting against discrimination since the 1700s.

Keeping people out

Early immigration laws prevented Chinese, Japanese, Filipino and other people from becoming citizens of the U.S.

In the mid-1800s, large numbers of Chinese people came to California during the Gold Rush. They provided labor for farming and laying railroad tracks. They were paid much less than white workers.

As laws became more strict about allowing new immigrants from China, more people from Japan arrived. By the 1920s, U.S. laws

restricted most people from Asia, including India and the Philippines, and these rules stayed in place until 1965.

Sent away

During World War II, the United States was at war with Japan. After the 1941 Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor in Hawaii, some people were afraid that Japanese Americans might help the enemy.

In 1942, the federal government forced all Japanese Americans on the West Coast, including American citizens, to leave their homes and lives and go to internment camps in several western states. (To intern means to confine people, especially during a war.)

In 1988, Congress apologized for the government's actions and passed a law giving those who had been forced to live in these camps \$20,000.

Going forward

Today, people are becoming more aware and accepting of people from other countries. Asian Americans, Pacific Islanders and people from all over the world have made important contributions to the communities we live in and our culture — from traditions, to food, to medicine and health, to sports, government and education. Everyone is valuable!
