Mama's Kuntry Kafe, two other stores, forced to move

Lisa and Dale White, owner of Mama's Kuntry Kafe in Inverness, survived the early days of the leased premises is under the COVID-19 scare.

But there's one thing they couldn't live through: a termination of property notice.

The Whites, along with the two other tenants of West Gate Plaza, just east of Pleasant Grove Road, said they got notices last week in the mail signed by the landlord — Lee Radeker Jr. — that said they had until April 30 to move out.

"It was a shock to say the least," Lisa White said.

The Chronicle obtained a brisk breakfast crowd Monday,

signed by Radeker, which states:

"We write to inform you that contract for sale. Accordingly, we write to provide you notice of termination of the lease."

The letter goes on to notify the tenants to remove all their personal property from the premises by April 30.

Radeker is listed as the plaza's property owner, according to the Citrus County Property Appraiser's Office.

When reached by phone Radeker declined to comment. Lisa White, talking with the

document with the letterhead of took time to talk with a Chronian Orlando law firm postmarked cle reporter about the surprise April 12, which includes a letter, turn-of-events. She had just finished remodeling restaurant.

While obviously unhappy with the unexpected development, White said she is putting the best face on it and calls it a blessing in disguise.

She and her husband were able, on short notice, to secure a lease at a storefront in downtown Inverness, at 104 U.S. 41 site of the old Townhouse restaurant. It's bigger and it's at a great location, she said.

FDOH: 25% of Citrus residents fully vaccinated

Citrus County's rate of positive COVID-19 tests increased roughly 3% over the week as a quarter of its state residents became fully vaccinated against the disease.

According to the Florida Department of Health (FDOH) on Monday, April 19, the county's 7-day average positivity rate of new novel coronavirus cases for its Florida residents was at 8.34% — up from the average 5.35% reported April 12.

Health officials want to keep positivity

COVID-19 data from the FDOH is subject to change as epidemiological investigations reveal new information on cases.

On Monday, the FDOH documented a total 10,718 COVID-19 cases for Citrus County, an increase of 178 infections since April 12, at an average 25 transmissions a day.

Also, over the week, six more locals were admitted to hospitals for COVID-19, raising the county's total number of hospitalizations to 691, according to the FDOH. Another person also died from COVID-19 since April 12, bringing the local death count to 434.

TALLAHASSEE Florida's top Republicans cited events in cities around the country — but not the Jan. 6 riots in Washington — as Gov. Ron DeSantis signed a bill Monday to create tougher penalties for people who participate support the effort. in violent protests.

The so-called anti-riot bill was a response to protests around the country because of police violence against African-Americans, After the Jan. 6 insurrection at the U.S. Capitol by supporters of then-President Donald Trump, Republicans pushing the legislation used it as an example to

Emergency responders pronounced the woman dead at the crash scene.

Sqt. Steve Gaskins, an FHP spokesman, said highway patrol is not releasing the woman's name as it's protected by Florida's victim rights rules under Marsy's Law.

Inverness to review projects

State wastewater agreement, road, and park facility on agenda for city

The Inverness City Council on Tuesday, April 20, will vote whether to approve an agreement with state officials over a \$2.4 million project to change from commercial septic systems along State Road 44 to municipal sewer

The city's portion of the cost will be \$472,000 under the proposed deal the council will consider during their regularly scheduled April 20 meeting. The public is invited to attend. City Hall is a 212 W. Main St., Inverness.

In November 2020, the council hired North Carolina-based Kimley-Horn & Associates to oversee the 7,200-foot-long wastewater project along the west side of State Road 44.

The project will run from the Outback restaurant to Nick Nich-

The city council paid the consultants \$191,500 to design and oversee the project. The state grant allows business to abandon their existing septic tanks and hook up to city sewer services. The wastewater project is also meant to attract future development along the highway leading into the city.

City Manager Williams said once the council approves the agreement, money from the grant can be released and "from this point the design proceed."

In other action, the council will:

■ Consider putting out to bid engineering work to do design and architectural work and oversee all the administrative oversight of a project for a new maintenance building at the popular Whispering Pines Park.

Feds to probe Pasco school policing plan

NEW PORT RICHEY — The U.S. Department of Education has opened an investigation into whether a Florida school district broke federal law when it shared private information about students with the local sheriff's office.

The Pasco County School District shared information on student grades, discipline and attendance with the Pasco County Sheriff's Office, the Tampa Bay Times reported. The agency then used the data to compile a list of students officials believed could "fall into a life of crime," the newspaper reported.

The agency is already facing a federal lawsuit that the intelligence-based policing program violates people's rights by improperly targeting and harassing them. Sheriff Chris

"Their knowledge of our agreements with the Sheriff's Office appears to be based on recent news stories, which do not provide a full picture," the school district's statement said.

Sheriff's officials have also maintained that the program does not label students as potential criminals. Students are only added to the list if they have committed a crime, the statement said. Also, sheriff's employees can only see whether a student has been flagged by the district's early warning system — not whether they had been flagged for a specific reason, such as grades or attendance. The sheriff's office said

school employees are involved in selecting which students are added to the The program has drawn

criticism from some parents and teachers.

A Department of Education statement said it would offer no comments until the investigation has been completed.





Swift

Police: Stalker arrested at Taylor **Swift's apartment**

NEW YORK — A stalker who claims pop star Taylor Swift is communicating

with him on social media was arrested on a trespassing charge after trying to break into the singer's Manhattan apartment, police said Monday.

Hanks Johnson, 52, was arrested at 8:30 p.m. Saturday after a 911 caller reported he was inside Swift's Tribeca building without permission, a police spokesperson said.

According to the criminal complaint against him, Johnson told police, "She knows that I'm coming here, we're friends."

A security employee of Swift's told police that Johnson had rung the doorbell and tried to

enter the building at least five times over the past six months, the complaint states. The security guard said he had personally told Johnson he was not wel-

come there. Johnson was charged with criminal trespass and released on his own recognizance after an arraignment Sunday night. It wasn't clear if he had an attorney who could

comment. The Daily News reports that outside the courthouse, Johnson made a show of sending direct messages to Swift's Instagram account and claimed the predictive text suggestions on his phone were replies from her.

He also showed off a restraining order barring him from contacting models Bella and Gigi Hadid, who are friends of Swift's, the newspaper said. From wire reports

On April 20, 1999, the Columbine High School massacre took place in Colorado as two students shot and killed 12 classmates and one teacher before taking their own lives. On this date:

In 1812, the fourth vice president of the United States, George Clinton, died in Washington at age 72, becoming the first vice president to die while in office.

In 1971, the Supreme Court unanimously upheld the use of busing to achieve racial desegregation in schools.

In 1972, Apollo 16's lunar module, carrying astronauts John W. Young and Charles M. Duke Jr., landed on the moon.

In 2010, an explosion on the Deepwater Horizon oil platform, leased by BP, killed 11 workers and caused a blow-out that began spewing an estimated 200 million gallons of crude into the Gulf of Mexico. (The well was finally capped nearly three months later.)



Technology companies helped drag U.S. stocks broadly lower Monday, pulling the indexes below the record highs they reached last week.

The S&P 500 dropped 0.5%, shedding more than a third of its gain from last week. Tech stocks were the biggest weight on the market, but the losses were shared broadly by a mix of banks, energy companies and others that rely on direct consumer spending. Chipmaker Intel fell 1.7%, Capital One lost 0.9% and Valero Energy slid 2.3%. Only real estate stocks eked out a gain.

The pullback came as bond yields mostly moved higher after easing last week. Rising bond yields tend to make shares in technology companies that have had a strong runup over the past year look too expensive.

The S&P 500 fell 22.21 points to 4,163.26. The benchmark index is coming off its fourth straight weekly gain. The Dow Jones Industrial Average lost 123.04 points, or 0.4%, to 34,077.63. Both the S&P 500 and Dow hit all-time highs on Friday.

The tech-heavy Nasdaq composite slid 137.58 points, or 1%, to 13,914.77, while the Russell 2000 index of smaller companies fell more than the broader market, shedding 30.67 points, or 1.4%, to 2,232.

For the past few years, shelter management has worked with the county to come up with a plan to retrofit or replace the shelter. Plans failed because the BOCC (Citrus County Board of County Commissioners) doesn't want to use county funds for this county responsibility.

Now that the shelter buildings have deteriorated to such a degree as to be nearly unsalvageable, it seems that the BOCC prefers to throw a minimum amount at it to make it look less like it's falling apart. For several years, the majority of the improvements and repairs to services and structures have been donated to the shelter by the community via nonprofit organizations committed to helping shore up the shelter and make it more habitable and safe for animals, staff and volunteers.

> don't see any other county department depending upon donations for their improvements and repairs. The current budget for Animal Services is roughly \$2,000,000 annually, half of which goes directly to the sheriff's office for Animal Control, which the sheriff's office supervises. The balance of the budget pays all shelter expenses, including those incurred by every cruelty case. Many of those cruelty cases go on for years, and the care and custody of those animals is borne by the shelter.

Animal Services is a department of the county, and the county should be entirely responsible for ensuring its viability.

That time in his life people could also hear him for free. Like many other famous vocalists and musicians, they got their roots singing or playing in places of worship.

There is an irony in all this that essentially comes about from skilled advertising and marketing that preys on our lives for pleasure temptations focusing on money and how we should spend it. It pervades not only in music and entertainment, but what we eat, drink and wear. You can buy a 79¢ mango at Save a Lot or one for \$1.25 at Publix. At Goodwill, a Pierre Cardin shirt sold for \$5, while at Bealls, a Columbia shirt was \$40.

How we spend our money runs the continuum of frugality to generosity. We get to evaluate ourselves on this matter in springtime when we see what we spent during the year to figure taxes, or when our places of worship typically have their stewardship campaigns. Both have required or suggested standards from which you can rearrange your financial findings to become a better cheapskate or spendthrift, more prudent or altruistic. Most people have a blending of all these components.

Whatever financial facts reveal, it usually comes from one's heart as to what the just right place is for guiding spending. Your heart, however, can be wrongly placed like Goldilocks' situation of trespassing and false entitlement regarding the three bears' just-right porridge, chairs and beds. Discovering this, the growling bears chased her into the forest never to be seen again. Therefore, be financially forthright with your spending, lest you get chased into the Withlacoochee State Forest.

Untrue on both counts. Here are the facts: On Feb. 25, the House passed the Equality Act. This act protects people from being discriminated against on the basis of sex, sexual orientation and gender identity. Most GOP House members voted against the bill, arguing it threatens religious beliefs.

Florida Rep. Greg Steube said, "It's not clothing or personal style that offends God, but rather the use of one's appearance to act out or take on a sexual identity different from the one biologically assigned by God at birth." He went on to say, "Gender confusion that exists in our culture today is a clear rejection of God's good design.'

Rep. Steube was not, as Mr. Stock asserts in his letter, complaining about the disenfranchisement of God in Congress. He was using his religious beliefs to justify voting against antidiscrimination protections for LGBTQ Americans.

Jerry Nadler of New York responded with this: "Mr. Steube, what any religious tradition describes as God's will is no concern of this Congress," a clear reference to the Jeffersonian principle of separation of church and state. Walter Mondale, Carter's vice president, dies at 93

MINNEAPOLIS — Former Vice President Walter F. Mondale, a liberal icon who lost the most lopsided presidential election after bluntly telling voters to expect a tax increase if he won, died Monday. He was

The death of the former senator, ambassador and Minnesota attorney general was announced in a statement from his family.

Mondale followed the trail blazed by his political mentor, Hubert H. Humphrey, from Minnesota politics to the U.S. Senate and the vice presidency, serving under Jimmy Carter from 1977 to 1981.

His own try for the White House, in 1984, came at the zenith of Ronald Reagan's popularity. Mondale's selection of Rep. Geraldine Ferraro of New York as his running mate made him the first major-party presidential nominee to put a woman on the ticket, but his declaration that he would raise taxes helped define the race.

On Election Day, he carried only his home state and the District of Columbia. The electoral vote was 525-13 for Reagan — the biggest landslide in the Electoral College since Franklin Roosevelt defeated Alf Landon in 1936. (Sen. George Mc-Govern got 17 electoral votes in his 1972 defeat, winning Massachusetts and Washington, D.C.)

"I did my best," Mondale said the day after the election, and blamed no one but himself.

"I think you know I've never really warmed up to television," he said. "In fairness to television, it never

really warmed up to me." Years later, Mondale said his campaign message had proven to be the right one.







Fall Proof Your Life? Yes, Please!

We spend most of our lives bumping into things or tripping over toys and pets, sometimes we even trip over imaginary objects. Hardly ever does it result in a fall, instead we Weeble-Wobble and move on; that's called balance. As we age, balance seems to diminish. Does it, or do we stop doing the things necessary to maintain or improve balance?

A friend of mine told me that this was the 3rd time he had fallen this week. I was amazed that he said it so nonchalantly. He saw my amazement and went on to tell me about the hundreds of "Jumps" (parachute type) he made in his life. Essentially, he did not fear falling because he knew how to fall safely.

Simply put, not thinking about falls is a major contributor to falling. Some reasons I've heard are: "I should have put my glasses on," "My medication made me drowsy," "I was carrying...," "I was in a hurry and just missed the step," and "I think I stepped in a hole," None of these reasons or lapses in judgment is worth a change in lifestyle. If the label on a medication container reads, "Do not operate machinery" or this "Medication can cause dizziness" it should be interpreted as "Caution: May contribute to falls!"

Life's journey can have many paths; not all are enjoyable and some cannot be prevented. A fall resulting in a lasting injury is one of those journeys that can have devastating effects on a person and their family. Many times, the family is also greatly impacted by a devastating fall. As we age the injuries from falls can be more severe and many times the recovery is less than complete. There is a lot of information available on how to "Fall Proof Your Home." This generally includes information on clearing anticipated fall zones, like the garage entrance to the house and removing potential trip items, like frayed rugs. Most of this guidance meant to minimize injury should a fall occur. I believe "Fall Proofing" is a great idea and should be considered for every home.

What about the fall that does not go according to your "Fall Proof" plan or occurs when you're not in your home? To avoid these falls wouldn't it require you to "Fall Proof Your Life?" The simple answer is..... Yes! How is that possible? The human

When it is new, it can take abuse as it ages, it needs TLC. Do what is necessary to improve your balance and you have a "Fall Proof Your Life Plan." Reducing the likelihood of a fall is the best plan. It makes you safer and it does not require the monumental task of redecorating to fall proof every place you go. Businesses, friends, and family may get irritated when you move their furniture or remove rugs.

Eat Right – Your body cannot not operate on bad fuel or no fuel. Make sure you are getting adequate nourishment. Quantity of food does not equal nourishment; type of food matters most.

Exercise – Use it or lose it. Exercise to prevent falls. To improve balance, we only need to walk. Walking on a flat surface, on an uneven surface (grass), and walking a straight line are examples of simple balance exercises.

Remain Alert – Falls, like automobile accidents, often disrupt you from getting to your destination. If you are ill, emotionally distracted or just do not feel right, exercise caution when moving about.

Age or the first fall should not be the trigger for starting a "Fall Plan." Anyone taking medications that impact balance, or with illnesses such as UTI (Urinary Tract Infection), ear infections, blood pressure or sugar issues should be concerned about falls. Remember the 70's toy: "Weeble Wobbles" and the saying "Weebles Wobble but They Don't Fall Down;" Be A Weeble! If a fall plan is too much trouble the other choice is to learn how to fall. However, for most, learning to fall by jumping out of an airplane 100 times is not an option!!

3D imaging 2.0

Ifirst did an article on three-dimensional imaging in 2017. We have had four more years of use of our three-dimensional scanner; this is an update on those four years.

Uncovering underlying pathology is probably the greatest benefit of the three-dimensional scanner. The facial bones are the most complex collection of bones in the body. There is even a recognized specialty of oral and maxillofacial radiology, just for the interpretation of these complex structures.

We have been able to see in clear detail what can only be surmised with a flat X-ray. Being able to visualize a tumor or a mass that has displaced normal anatomy is vital to not only an accurate surgery, but preservation of the healthy surrounding tissues.

Planning for surgical reconstruction when there has been trauma, pathology, or the loss of multiple teeth has been greatly accentuated by being able to visualize in three dimensions the area of the jaws that need to be rebuilt.

We can see the extent of bone loss, and therefore plan for proper bone grafting. Also, a surgical guide can be constructed utilizing a 3D printer from these same three-dimensional films, which many times is crucial for an accurate reconstructive effort.

Typically, my partner and I will sit in front of a computer screen and do a mock surgery on this three-dimensional image. We may then direct the construction of surgical guides, or even replacement parts.

In the not-too-distant past, if we knew that a large surgical deficiency would be created, that part of the jaw may have to be replaced with sterilize cadaver bone which would have to be shaped at the time of surgery, or a reconstruction plate which would have to be bent by hand during surgery to rejoin a section of jaw that has been removed.

This was extremely time-consuming and kept the patient asleep for a longer period of

My partner, Dr. Rushi Patel, trained with these 3D modalities, which did not exist in my residency in their modern form. He has taken several patients to surgery with pre-constructed titanium mandibles, created by a 3D printer, to replace segments that had to be removed because of tumors.

The time in surgery is dramatically reduced, and therefore the trauma of surgery is dramatically reduced. The contour of these premade elements is perfect and requires no time during surgery to make them fit.

In the office, we utilize three-dimensional radiography to plan the precise placement of implants and replacement of bone, so that your teeth can be replaced most accurately. This is called "guided surgery," whereby a 3D printer is utilized to create a guide which is used during surgery for the absolute accurate placement of an implant.

As you can imagine, your teeth must match up properly. Doing virtual surgery, transferring that information to a physical model, and utilizing a guide at the time of surgery made from that model ensures that reconstruction of missing teeth and bone can be done not only in the most accurate way, but in the least amount of time, which translates into a quicker and easier postoperative recovery.

Are some COVID-19 vaccines more effective than others?

Are some COVID-19 vaccines more effective than others?

It's hard to tell since they weren't directly compared in studies. But experts say the vaccines are alike on what matters most: preventing hospitalizations and deaths.

"Luckily, all these vaccines look like they're protecting us from severe disease," said Dr. Monica Gandhi of the University of California, San Francisco, citing study results for five vaccines used around the world and a sixth that's still in review.

And real-world evidence as millions of people receive the vaccines show they're all working very well.

Still, people might wonder if one is

better than another since studies conducted before the vaccines were rolled out found varying levels of effectiveness. The problem is they don't offer apples-to-apples comparisons.

Consider the two-dose vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna, found to be about 95% effective at preventing illness. Studies for those shots counted a COVID-19 case whether it was mild, moderate or severe — and were conducted before worrisome mutated versions of the virus began circulating.

Then Johnson & Johnson tested a single-dose vaccine and didn't count mild illnesses. J&J's shot was 66% protective against moderate to severe illness in a large international study. In just the U.S., where there's less spread of variants, it was 72%

effective. More importantly, once the vaccine's effect kicked in it prevented hospitalization and death.

AstraZeneca's two-dose vaccine used in many countries has faced questions about the exact degree of its effectiveness indicated by studies. But experts agree those shots, too, protect against the worst outcomes.

Around the world, hospitalizations are dropping in countries where vaccines have been rolling out including Israel, England and Scotland — regardless of which shots are given. And the U.S. government's first look at real-world data among essential workers provided further evidence that the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are highly protective — 90% — against infections whether there were symptoms or not.

certificates, are documents that show

be used could vary widely around the world. Experts say they should be free and available on paper, not just on apps, since not everyone has a smartphone.

In the U.S., federal officials say there are no plans to make them

In the U.S., federal officials say there are no plans to make them broadly mandatory. In some states, Republican governors have issued orders barring businesses or state agencies from asking people to show proof of vaccination.

Objections revolve mostly around privacy and security — how people's personal information will be stored — and fairness. Critics say the passports will benefit people and countries with more access to vaccines.

Supporters say they could make reopenings faster and easier. Proof of vaccination or a negative test could be a way for businesses and schools to reassure customers, students and parents that steps are being taken to limit transmission of the virus.

International travel bans by countries could also be eased if people are able to show proof they're

vaccinated. Some countries have long had requirements to prove vaccination against yellow fever.

Still, a challenge is creating certification systems that work across vaccine providers and businesses. More than a dozen initiatives are underway to develop a credential that could be stored on a smartphone or printed on paper, using a QR code.

"I feel pretty good and I push myself pretty hard. ... We will see how things play out," he said. "It is a long time between now and the beginning of the season. Just be smart about all these different things we have to do and fulfill. We all take a lot of pride in being ready to go and I am sure we will be."

ESPN first reported Brady's comments at Sunday night's

"It's good progress," Brady said. "It's rehab. None of that is fun, but looking forward to getting back to real training and stuff, which is hopefully here pretty soon.

"I'm cool with it. It's just part of what you deal with. Things come up. You deal with them the best way you can, with the best opportunity to improve.

THIS DATE IN BASEBALL

1910 — Addie Joss of Cleveland pitched the second no-hitter of his career, a 1-0 win over the White Sox in Chicago. An official scoring change aided Joss. In the second inning Freddy Parent lightly topped a ball to Cleveland third baseman Bill Bradley. Bradley raced toward the ball, juggled it and failed to get Parent before he crossed first base. The initial ruling on the play was a base hit, but the official scorer later changed it to an error on Bradley. Joss allowed two walks and fielded 10 balls from the mound and earned 10 assists.

1912 — Fenway Park was opened in Boston and the Red Sox defeated the visiting New York Highlanders, later known as the Yankees, 7-6 in 11 innings. Tiger Stadium in Detroit also opened its doors as the Tigers defeated the Cleveland Indians

1916 — The Chicago Cubs played their first game at Weeghman Park — renamed Wrigley Field in 1926 — defeating the Cincinnati Reds 7-6 in 11 innings.

1920 — Manager Gavvy Cravath of the Philadelphia Phillies inserted himself as a pinch hitter and beat the New York Giants with a three-run homer, 3-0. It was his last home run in the majors. 1937 — Gee Walker hit for the cycle on opening

day to lead the Detroit Tigers to a 4-3 win over Cleveland. 1938 — Cleveland's Bob Feller pitched the first

of 12 career one-hitters, beating the St. Louis 1939 — In his first major league game, Ted Wil-

liams hit a 400-foot double in four at-bats as the Boston Red Sox lost 2-0 to New York at Yankee

Stadium. Tom Seaver of the New York Mets recorded his first major league victory with a 6-1 triumph over the Chicago Cubs. Seaver went 7 2/3 innings and gave up eight hits and one run.

1982 — The Atlanta Braves recorded their 12th consecutive victory from the beginning of the season — a 4-2 decision over Cincinnati in Atlanta and eclipsed the major league record set a year earlier by the Oakland A's.

1988 — The Baltimore Orioles set a major league record with their 14th straight defeat at the start of the season, losing to the Milwaukee Brew-

1997 — The Chicago Cubs stopped their season-opening losing streak at 14 games, rallying in the sixth inning to beat the New York Mets 4-3 in the second game of a doubleheader. The Mets won the opener 8-2. Chicago's 0-14 start set a National League record and was the second worst behind the 1988 Baltimore Orioles, who began 0-21.

2006 — Julio Franco became the oldest player in major league history to hit a home run when he hit a two-run, pinch-hit shot in the eighth inning to help the New York Mets rally for a 7-2 win over San Diego. Franco, 47, replaced Athletics pitcher Jack Quinn in the record book who was 46 years, 357 days old when he homered on June 27, 1930.

2007 — Alex Rodriguez went 3-for-5 with two home runs in a 7-6 loss to Boston and joined Mike Schmidt, who hit 12 homers in the first 15 games in 1976, as the fastest to reach a dozen in baseball history.

2012 — Drew Stubbs had three hits and drove in three runs to lead the Cincinnati Reds to a 9-4 win over the Chicago Cubs — the 10,000th victory in franchise history.

Kiermaier had two hits and two RBIs from the nine-hole and combined with seven-hitter Joey Wendle and eight-hitter Willy Adames Tampa Bay today.





The oldest world bridge champion was Boris Schapiro, who won the Senior Pairs in 1998 when 89 years old. His partner was Irving Gordon from Scotland. They scored a cold top on this deal.

Two hearts showed opening values with hearts and either minor. Three clubs was an inquiry. North's first double indicated clubs; his second, extra values. South ran to four spades, but when doubled, retreated to the better fit.

A diamond lead would have been lethal, but West chose a heart. Schapiro ruffed on the board and played a trump to his queen and West's ace. Again, a diamond shift would have been effective, but West thought from the bidding that South had four spades (so no discards) and was worried that he had the diamond jack. So West switched to a spade.

South won, drew the missing trump and ran the spades, discarding a diamond loser. Schapiro lost only one trick in each minor.

DEAR ANNIE

Now. when we sit down, she throws her leg on me and says, "Rub my feet." I didn't mind when she appreciated it, but now that she expects it, this ruins it for me. If I say no, she gets upset.
