# Entire Suncoast Parkway scheduled to open by early 2022

Citrus County is just months away from the debut of the biggest transportation corridor in recent history — the opening of the new 12.7-mile Suncoast Parkway.

Motorists will soon be able to bypass all the traffic lights to get from U.S. 98 to State Road 44 by taking the 70-mph toll road. For many commuters, this will be a game-changer.

Angela Starke, spokeswoman with Florida's Turnpike Enterprise, said it is anticipated the entire stretch of roadway will open in early 2022.

More updates will be provided

as details become available.

"(The) Suncoast Parkway 2 project will increase capacity to ease current and future congestion and improve safety by creating full interchanges in areas undergoing significant residential development," Starke said.

When it opens, there will be 15 new bridges, two all-electronic tolling gantries, equipment buildings and a pedestrian overpass over U.S. 98.

There will also be five wildlife crossings: four are enclosed culverts or pipe-like tunnels and one is a wildlife bridge.

Both types of structures will help to protect the local wildlife

with safer options for movement under roadways and through the area," Starke said.

Work began on the \$135-million Suncoast Parkway 2 project in February 2018.

The original contracted completion date was summer 2022 but the project is ahead of schedule. The new road will be funded entirely

with turnpike toll revenues. Once this first phase ends, work on the next leg of the parkway extending the road another 3 miles to County Road 486 — is expected to begin. From County Road 486, county officials hope the state extends the road to U.S. 19, north of Crystal River at Red



The Suncoast Parkway and West Cardinal Street interchange will be a busy one as it will allow travelers direct access to the southwest and central parts of Citrus County.

A local landlord assaulted one of his tenants with a baseball bat and threated to kill him after an argument over money, according to a Citrus County Sheriff's Office arrest affidavit.

Patrick Hogan, 72, of Homosassa was arrested and charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon without intent to kill. Bond was set at \$2,000.

On Aug. 24, deputies were dispatched to a Homosassa residence in

# Actor Ed Asner dies at 91

LOS ANGELES — Ed Asner, the burly and prolific character actor who became a star in middle age as the gruff but lovable newsman Lou Grant, first in the hit comedy "The Mary Tyler Moore Show" and later in the drama "Lou Grant," died Sunday. He was 91.

Asner's representative confirmed the actor's death in an email to The Associated Press. Asner's official Twitter account included a note from his children: "We are sorry to say that our beloved patriarch passed away this morning peacefully. Words cannot express the sadness we feel. With a kiss on your head — Goodnight dad. We love you."

Built like the football lineman he once was, the balding Asner was a journeyman actor in films and TV when he was hired in 1970 to play Lou Grant on "The Mary Tyler Moore Show." For seven seasons he was the rumpled boss to Moore's ebullient Mary Richards (He called her "Mary," she called him "Mr. Grant") at the fictional Minneapolis TV newsroom where both worked. Later, he would play the role for five years on "Lou Grant."

The part brought Asner three best supporting actor Emmys on "Mary Tyler Moore" and two best actor awards on "Lou Grant." He also won Emmys for his roles in the miniseries "Rich Man, Poor Man" (1975-1976) and "Roots" (1976-1977).

He had more than 300 act-

He was John Goodman's father in the short-lived 2004 CBS comedy "Center of the Universe" and the voice of the elderly hero in the hit 2009 Pixar release, "Up." More recently, he was in such TV series as "Forgive Me" and "Dead to Me."

Nonetheless, Asner told The Associated Press in 2009 that interesting roles were hard to come by.

"I never get enough work." he said. "It's the history of my career. There just isn't anything to turn down, let me put it that way."

As Screen Actors Guild president, the liberal Asner was caught up in a political controversy in 1982 when he spoke out against U.S. involvement with repressive governments in Latin America. "Lou Grant" was canceled during the furor that followed and he did not run for a third SAG term in 1985.

Asner, born in Kansas City, Missouri, in 1929, almost became a newsman in real life. He studied journalism at the University of Chicago until a professor told him there was little money to be made in the profession. After being drafted in 1951, he served with the Army Signal Corps





# Policies, practices reduce gun suicide

Gun violence conversations tend to focus on homicides. However, gun suicide claims the lives of 23,000 people in America every year.

Nearly two thirds of all gun deaths in the U.S. are gun suicides. Having access to a firearm triples the risk of suicide. Most people who attempt suicide do not die, unless they use a gun.

Firearm suicide is a preventable health crisis. Solutions include Extreme Risk Laws (Red Flag Laws), Secure Gun Storage and Waiting Periods.

Florida has a Red Flag Law that passed after the horrific murders at Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland on Feb. 14, 2018. This law allows law enforcement to intervene when a person is in a crisis and considered a danger to themselves or others. They now can petition a court for an order of protection to temporarily prevent someone in crisis from accessing guns.

Gun owners can make their homes and communities safer by storing their guns securely. This means locked, unloaded and separate from ammunition.

Over 80% of child firearm suicides involved a gun belonging to a family member. Securing firearms protects children and adults by preventing unintentional shootings and gun suicides.

# 'As long as it takes': FEMA, other agencies respond to hurricane

Hundreds of emergency responders were in place in Louisiana and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers had power restoration experts and generators at the ready as Hurricane Ida hit on Sunday as one of the most powerful hurricanes to make landfall in the U.S., federal officials said.

The Coast Guard prepositioned vessels for "deep water search and rescue efforts," and President Joe Biden said federal support would remain in the region for "as long as it

"I want to make sure that we're ready to surge all the response capacity, capability that we have to deal with whatever comes next, and a lot's going to be coming," Biden said during a stop Sunday at Federal Emergency Management Agency headquarters.

Much of the response began days before landfall and included special precautions due to the coronavirus pandemic, the White House said. Louisiana Gov. John Bel Edwards told CNN's "State of the Union" a few hours before Ida's expected landfall that there were 600 people ready to deploy for search and rescue efforts, including teams from 15 other states, with "many more" on the way.

"We're as ready as we can be," he said. Biden met via videoconference with FEMA Administrator Deanne Criswell on Saturday to discuss storm preparations, and he said Sunday that "prepositioning" in the region had been a critical part of the response. More than 100 ground ambulances and 20 air ambulances were deployed to help evacuate nursing homes in the storm's path, FEMA said. Precautions were also being taken to prevent the spread of COVID-19 at the large shelters the American Red Cross is opening, including masking, rapid testing and social distancing.

FEMA deployed 10 Incident Management Assistance Teams to support states — six in Louisiana, two in Alabama and two in Mississippi — and said three more teams were on standby to deploy if needed. More than 2,400 FEMA employees were in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas and ready to provide additional help, FEMA

JEREMIE, Haiti — U.S. military aircraft are now ferrying food, tarps and other material into southern Haiti amid a shift in the international relief effort to focus on helping people in the areas hardest hit by the recent earthquake to make it through the hurricane

Aircraft flying out of the capital, Port-au-Prince, arrived throughout the day Saturday in the mostly rural, mountainous southern peninsula that was the epicenter of the Aug. 14 earthquake. In Jeremie, people waved and cheered as a Marine Corps unit from North Carolina descended in a tilt-rotor Osprey with pallets of rice, tarps and other supplies.

Most of the supplies, however, were not destined for Jeremie. They were for distribution to remote mountain communities where landslides destroyed homes and the small plots of the many subsistence farmers in the area, said Patrick Tiné of Haiti Bible Mission, one of several groups coordinating the delivery of aid.

At the request of the Haitian government, getting as much help to such people as fast as possible is now the focus of the \$32 million U.S. relief effort, said Tim Callaghan, a disaster response team leader for the U.S. Agency for International Development.

# Michigan beats Ohio for LLWS title

# Final pits two teams from Great Lakes region.

SOUTH WILLIAMSPORT, Pa. -Twice, Jackson Surma walked to the plate with runners in scoring position in the biggest game of his young life. Both times he delivered.

Jackson drove in four runs and Ethan Van Belle struck out eight as Michigan beat Ohio 5-2 on Sunday in the championship game of the Little League World Series.

"The first one, I knew I had runners on second and third," Jackson said. "There weren't two outs, so I needed just something in play. He threw me a curveball, I sat on it and drove it to left. The second one, he threw me a high fastball and I went up

there and got it."

The team from Taylor North Little League delivered the first LLWS title for the state of Michigan since 1959 when Hamtramck National Little League won it all.

"We're just excited we're mentioned with them," manager Rick Thorning said. "To be in that group and say that a team from Michigan won the LLWS, it still doesn't sound right when you say it.'

Both Michigan and Ohio are from the Great Lakes, marking the only time clubs from the same region played in the championship. That was because international teams didn't compete in the LLWS for the first time since 1975, due to travel restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Little League allowed two squads from each U.S. region to fill out the 16-team field.



BALTIMORE — Joey Wendle hit a pair of homers, including a grand slam, and drove in six runs to lead the Tampa Bay Rays over the Baltimore Orioles 12-8 Sunday for a three-game sweep.

Austin Meadows and Jordan Luplow also homered for Tampa Bay, which finished 18-1 against Baltimore this year. The AL East-leading Rays have beaten Baltimore 12 straight times, tying a franchise record they set against the Orioles in 2008.

"That team over there plays hard all the time," Rays manager Kevin Cash said about Baltimore. "To continue coming back today was a really good example of that. Sometimes it just goes that way. I don't think any of us can put our finger on it. You applaud their

Rookie Ryan Mountcastle tied a

24th home run for the Orioles. Jorge Mateo and Cedric Mullins also homered.

"I want to go out there and win every day," Mountcastle said. "It's obviously a lot more fun when you win. I just have to keep working hard and pounding away at the rest of this season.

With the Rays leading 6-4 in the seventh inning, Wendle broke open the game when he hit a 1-1 pitch from Paul Fry over the right-field fence for his third career grand slam. Wendle had gone 50 games without a homer before going deep in consecutive at-bats.

"It feels good," Wendle said. "I'm starting to see the ball a little bit better. I'm making some better contact. Great team win and great to be able to contribute."

against Baltimore six times. Chris Archer made just his second

career high with four hits, including his start since April 10 for the Rays after being sidelined with a forearm injury. Archer had to leave his previous outing in the second inning on Aug. 22 against the Yankees because of a hip issue. # US Open gets started today

NEW YORK - Novak Djokovic is well aware that his two-track pursuit of men's tennis history at the U.S. Open the first calendar-year Grand Slam in more than a halfcentury and a record 21st major title — means all eves will be on him when he is on the court.

"I'm hugely inspired and motivated by that, no doubt. But at the same time, I know how to balance things out mentally, with lots of expectations, obviously, around. My participation here — without Rafa (Nadal) and Roger (Federer) participating," Djokovic said Friday, mentioning the two sidelined rivals with whom he shares the current men's standard of 20 majors.

"I feel it," he continued. "I know there's a lot of people who are going to be watching my matches and expecting me

to do well and fight for a Slam." Naomi Osaka knows, too, that her return to Grand Slam action for the first time since pulling out of the French Open for a mental health break means she will be the center of attention when she has a racket in her hand as the defending women's champion at Flushing Meadows - and when she has microphones in front of her.

"I mean, it will definitely feel a bit different. I don't really know how to describe it, but I kind of had to get over the feeling of people's gazes feeling a bit different to me. At the same time, I started to tell myself that it is what it is. Like, I did what I did, so I can't really change people's perception on me,' Osaka said. "It might make me feel a little bit nervous. But first rounds always make me feel a little nervous. Maybe I can just attribute it to that. I guess I'll find out when I'm in that situation."

The year's last Grand Slam tournament begins Monday with full crowds allowed a year after all fans were banned because of the coronavirus outbreak — and, even if this weren't the first one since 1997 that'll be missing Federer,



# **Dobbins expected to miss** year because of torn ACL

OWINGS MILLS, Md. — Baltimore Ravens running back J.K. Dobbins is expected to miss the 2021 season with a torn ACL.

"Been down this road before," tweeted Zac Hiller, Dobbins' agent, while retweeting an ESPN report about the injury. "He'll come back bigger stronger faster."

Dobbins left the Ravens' preseason finale at Washington on Saturday night midway through the first quarter following his injury, and coach John Harbaugh said only that the former Ohio State star would be evaluated.

Much of the Ravens' rushing prowess of late has been because of quarterback Lamar Jackson, but Dobbins ran for 805 yards and nine touchdowns as a rookie last season. Gus Edwards, who ran for 723 yards and six TDs, could now play a more important role.

# **Former IOC president Jacques Rogge dies at 79**

LAUSANNE, Switzerland — Jacques Rogge, the Olympic sailor and orthopedic surgeon from Belgium who led the International Olympic Committee as president for 12 years, has died. He was 79.

The IOC announced his death on Sunday without giving details. Rogge's health had visibly declined when he attended Olympic events since his presidency ended in 2013.

"First and foremost, Jacques loved sport Derby, he's that good a horse." and being with athletes — and he transmitted this passion to everyone who knew him," Thomas Bach, Rogge's successor as president, said in an IOC statement. "His joy in sport was infectious."

"He will be remembered particularly for championing youth sport and for inaugurating the Youth Olympic Games," Bach

said. Rogge represented Belgium in rugby and was a world champion in sailing. He competed in the Finn class at three Olympic Games from 1968 through

He led the European group of Olympic committees before being elected as the IOC's eighth president in 2001.

The IOC said the Olympic flag will be flown at half-mast for five days at Olympic House in Lausanne.

Rogge leaves a wife, Anne, a son, a daughter and two grandchildren.

# **Derby champ Medina** Spirit wins in comeback

DEL MAR, Calif. — Kentucky Derby winner Medina Spirit held off Rock Your World in the stretch to win the \$100,000 Shared Belief by 1 1/4 lengths on Sunday at Del Mar for embattled trainer Bob Baffert.

Medina Spirit raced for the first time since finishing third as the 9-5 favorite in the Preakness on May 15, days after the colt's medication positive from the Derby on May 1 was revealed by Baffert.

Ridden by John Velazquez, Medina Spirit ran a mile in 1:37.29. He paid \$3.80, \$2.40 and \$2.10 at 4-5 odds.

"It's a relief. I was a little nervous today," Baffert said. "It just shows the class that he has and determination. This is the reason he won the Kentucky

Baffert said the Pennsylvania Derby at Parx Racing on Sept. 25 or the Awesome Again Stakes at Santa Anita on Oct. 2 are possibilities for Medina Spirit's next start.

A fourth on the hard courts of the U.S. Open in the Sept. 12 final would not only let him break a tie for career Slams with Federer and Nadal but also go 4-for-4 this year, something only two other men have managed to do.

Osaka has started accumulating major titles, especially on hard courts -two at the Australian Open (including this year) and two at the U.S. Open (including last year, when she wore masks to her matches with the names of Black victims of violence).

Shortly before the French Open began in May, she vowed not to speak to the media, saying the process raised doubts in her mind. Then, when she skipped the news conference after her first-round win in Paris, she was fined \$15,000 and threatened with suspension — so Osaka withdrew from the tournament altogether, explaining that she dealt with anxiety and depression, and sat out Wimbledon, too.

"I didn't know," she said Friday during a 13-minute news conference that included jokes and smiles, "how

# THIS DATE IN BASEBALL

1905 — Ty Cobb made his major league debut, hitting a double off Jack Chesbro of the New York Highlanders in the Tigers' 5-3 victory.

1910 — Tom Hughes of the New York Yankees pitched a no-hitter for 9 1-3 innings before giving up a single to Harry Niles of the Cleveland Indians. The Yankees lost 5-0, with Hughes giving up seven hits in 11 innings.

1912 — Earl Hamilton of the St. Louis Browns pitched a 5-1 no-hitter against the Tigers at Detroit.

1916 — Dutch Leonard of the Boston Red Sox pitched a no-hitter against the St. Louis Browns for a 4-0 victory.

1918 — The New York Giants beat the Brooklyn Dodgers 1-0 in a game that took 57 minutes to play.

1941 — Lon Warneke of the St. Louis Cardinals pitched a 2-0 no-hitter against the Cincinnati Reds. Only three balls were hit to the outfield.

1953 — In the opening game of a doubleheader, rookie Jim Pendleton hit three of the Braves' major-league record eight homers in a 19-4 win over Pittsburgh. The Braves hit four more homers in the second game, an 11-5 win, to set a major-league record for a doubleheader.







My parents found out last year and became extremely angry with me. All I feel now is their hatred. They say I am a disgrace. Though they still take care of my needs — food, clothes.

shelter, etc. they say that when I turn 18. I'll be on my own. I am not included in any family outings or welcome at any of my relatives

homes. I try really hard to get them to love me again. I work hard at school and have excellent grades. I am constantly doing work around the house, but nothing gets acknowledged. I try to apologize for being gay, but they won't hear it.

The only one in my family who still seems to love me is my big brother, but he is in the Army and only comes home a couple of times a year. He has talked to my parents on my behalf, but they don't listen to him at all. I have considered suicide, but I really don't want to die. I just want to be forgiven. Is there anything I can do? — "Riley"

Dear Riley: I know life is very hard right now, but I beg you, please, do not hurt yourself. And if you feel that you are going to, dial 911.

If you are not in immediate danger and would just like to talk to someone who understands what you're going through, I highly recommend calling the Trevor Lifeline, at 866-488-7386. The Trevor Project is a nonprofit organization that focuses on suicide prevention among LGBTQ youths, and someone is there to help 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Whoever answers can provide resources for coping with the hardships you're facing at home.

You are beautiful and perfect just the way you are. Hang in there and there will be happier days in your future. I promise.

**Dear Annie:** A farm that has been in my family for four generations was passed down to me. I love this land. It is not a great investment, I admit, but I don't want to sell it. Instead, I would like for my children to own it when I die.

My children don't share the same connection to the farm that I do. I understand that they most likely will want to sell it so they can use the proceeds for something else. I am OK with that.

The problem? My husband insists that I should put his name on the deed now or provide in my will that he will inherit the farm from me if I die before he does. He insists that I should do so "as a sign of respect."

He says that he might need to sell it to pay for his care in old age. I doubt that, because we are reasonably well-off, but I have offered to put the land in a trust so that if he doesn't have enough money to pay for his care, the income from the farm can be used to support him. He is not satisfied.

Dear Love This Land: It is your ancestral farm, and you should do with it whatever you please. But seeing as you mentioned that money isn't really a concern, have you looked into donating the land? You seem to have such a deep connection with it that you might find joy in knowing it went to a good cause.

DeChambeau missed a 6-foot putt for 59 on Friday and missed four birdie putts to win in regulation and in the playoff Sunday. And then he missed the most important putt of the week from just inside 10 feet to extend the playoff. It cost him a victory that looked like it was his all

"Patty Ice" simply wouldn't allow it.

That's the nickname Cantlay heard from thousands of delirious fans at Caves Valley who got a royal treat in the PGA Tour's first appearance in Baltimore in nearly 60 years.

Cantlay lived up to the moniker over the final two hours.

He made putts from 8 feet for par, 8 feet for bogey and 20 feet for birdie on the final three holes of regulation for a 6-under 66, the last one to force a playoff. He holed par putts of 6 feet and 7 feet on the 18th hole in the playoff.

The last one gave him the victory, his PGA Tour-leading third of the season. Not only did it move him to the top of the FedEx Cup standings, the victory gave Cantlay the sixth and final automatic spot on the U.S. Ryder Cup team.

He wouldn't have been left off, anyway, not with that clutch performance.

Cantlay now starts the Tour Championship with a two-shot lead based on his standing as the race concludes for the \$15 million prize.

It was a big disappointment for DeChambeau, who powered his way around Caves Valley and appeared to have it wrapped up when he birdied the par-5 16th for a one-shot lead, and then watched Cantlay put it in the water on the next hole.

Instead, his only big moment 
Durant holds off Langer was saving par after driving into the stream right of the 18th fairway on the fourth extra hole.

As if the final round wasn't entertaining enough, there were a few testy moments between the only two players who had a chance to win all day.

DeChambeau was rolling his eyes when Cantlay marked and studied 2-foot par putts on the front nine. Cantlay was walking up the 14th fairway as DeChambeau prepared to hit his approach when DeChambeau backed off and asked him to stop

This was a tough loss in other ways for DeChambeau, who also closed with a 66. They finished at 27-under 261. No one has ever shot 261 on the PGA Tour and didn't take home the trophy.

Sungjae Im birdied his last two holes for a 67 to finish alone in third, four shots behind. Rory McIlroy closed with a 67 to finish fourth.

DeChambeau looked to be a winner long before he prematurely tipped his cap to the gallery walking up to the 18th green in regulation.

He holed a 12-foot birdie putt on the par-5 16th hole, striking a pose of head bowed with arm extended in a clenched fist. That gave him a one-shot lead, and Cantlay still faced an 8-foot par putt. He made that, a sign of what was to come.

Cantlay's tee shot on the par-3 17th bounced short and to the right with just enough momentum to roll onto the rock framing the pond and drop into the

Tournament over? Not quite. Cantlay hit a lob wedge from 100 yards in the drop area to 8 feet. DeChambeau hit a poor chip from the rough to 12 feet and two-putted for bogey, and Cantlay came up clutch again to make his putt and stay one shot

And then he holed a 20-foot birdie on the 18th, and DeChambeau missed his 12-foot birdie putt for the win to send it to a

- INSIST ON CASH
- Don't accept a check for more than the selling price. You can bet it's a scam.
- Inform the Buyer that you'll wait two weeks before sending any merchandise.
- Never use money from a check to send gift cards, money orders, or wire money to strangers or someone you just met. Many scammers demand that you send money through money transfer services like Western Union or MoneyGram, or buy gift cards and send them the PIN numbers. Once you wire money, or give someone the gift card PINs, it is like giving someone cash. It's almost impossible to get it back.
- Toss offers that ask you to pay for a prize. If it's free, you shouldn't have to pay to get it.
