Models confirm Florida's COVID-19 resurgence Warn of 'catastrophic consequences'

Florida has ranked sixth in the nation for coronavirus spread for six weeks according to a model tracking COVID-19 transmission, and three other projection models forecast bad scenarios for the state by Oct. 1.

All four models agree Florida is in a resurgence and indicate, to varying degrees, COVID-19 cases will continue to increase statewide in coming weeks, with two models warning the worst is yet to come.

The Florida Department of Health's COVID-19 dashboard reported Thursday 85,926 people have tested COVID-19 positive and 3,061 people have died from the disease.

The past week has seen record-setting days in the number of new cases, with newly diagnosed infections topping 1,000 daily in 15 of the past 16 days, including more than 2,700 new cases, and at least 25 new deaths, reported Wednesday.

Gov. Ron DeSantis has attributed some of the surge to increased testing statewide — more than 1.5 million have been tested — and said numbers are skewed by the timing of "data dumps," when labs report "batched" test results.

The governor has also said increased rates of those testing positive are partially because the state is targeting testing in "high-risk environments," such as nursing homes, prisons and jails, industrial worksites and migrant farmworker communities.

**July 4 fireworks postponed**

CR council reacts to rising virus cases

Citing Florida's and Citrus County's increasing rate of COVID-19 cases, Crystal River City Council decided to postpone the

city's July 4 fireworks show to an undetermined date.

Council made the 5-0 vote during an emergency and virtual meeting on Thursday, June 18, 2020.

"It's frustrating ... I hate this whole thing, and I hate the fact we have to discuss it," Mayor Joe Meek said about the motion. "Fourth of July

means a lot to us ... and I think the council has made that clear."

"This is just the responsible, right thing to do now," added Councilwoman Cindi Guy. "In order to protect our citizens, our staff and our first responders ... it's a very obvious decision."

Meek said he's hopeful Crystal River can host a

substitute event in September within its downtown to help revive businesses impacted by the coronavirus.

Council members voted at an in-person meeting on June 8, 2020, to move forward with the city's Independence Day fireworks display, after canceling the accompanying festival at Kings

Bay Park. Crystal River's waterfront parks were also going to be open for firework watchers, of which more than 10,000 were expected to show as July 4 falls on a Saturday and on the same weekend Florida's scallop season starts.

City officials earlier in June relied on See JULY 4/Page A5

**Filling up local freezers**

Duke Energy sends 500 pounds of redfish fillets to struggling families

Scores of Citrus Countians are either laid off or facing economic hardships from the coronavirus economic lockdown.

Many are scrimping to get by and wondering where their next meal will come from.

Relief is on the way for about 1,500 people, thanks to Duke Energy, which took 275 adult redfish from the complex's mariculture center in Crystal River and delivered them Wednesday, June 17, 2020, via cooler to three local seafood places: The Crab Plant, Seafood Seller & Cafe and Shrimp Landing.

Employees at those sites spent Wednesday filleting, flash-freezing and packaging the redfish. Duke employees will return Thursday, pick them up and deliver them to the Citrus County Family Resource Center for distribution to those in need during its "pantry days" event.

Ginger West, executive director of the Family Resource Center in Hernando, says the donation would fill one giant deep freezer, and maybe more. "We were very excited, yes," West said. "It's a special treat, it's something nice. (Duke) has always been very, very good to us. We were like, 'Wow.' Just think of how many people we can feed."

All-in-all, that's about 500 pounds of redfish fillets, considered a delicacy and hard to find in seafood restaurants. Duke estimates the in-kind contribution of high-quality protein is valued at about \$20,000.

The project was the brainchild of Duke's hatchery manager, Eric Latimer, who wanted to do something to help alleviate the economic hardship of many in the community.

"I knew there was a need for high-quality protein," said Latimer, who helped deliver the fish Wednesday. "(We) have the protein and we have the fish."

Duke spokeswoman Dorothy Pernu handled the logistics,

arranging staff to deliver the iced-up fish in containers to the three Crystal River eateries that agreed to partner on this effort. The 275 fish were divided up among the three so each place was responsible for preparing about 90 fish.

Kelly Kofmehl, owner of The Crab Plant, met the Duke vans Wednesday morning and helped unload them to his preparation facility. He figured it would take his employees about three hours to fillet, See REDFISH/Page A9

# Panel backs changes to comprehensive plan

*TDC supports 'health in all policies'*

Citrus County's comprehensive plan is getting healthier.

The Planning and Development Commission on Thursday, June 18, 2020, unanimously backed suggested revisions to the county's growth blueprint to enact "Health in all Policies."

Other counties, such as Alachua and Hernando, have enacted similar language to their

comprehensive plans, land development director Joanna Coutu said.

The Citrus County Health Department worked with county officials in developing the plan. The work has been ongoing and it's only a coincidence, she said, that the proposed changes are occurring during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Health director Ernesto "Tito" Rubio said the guidelines are suggestions for a healthier

community, such as developing policies to protect children and the elderly from second-hand smoke, and having sidewalks built when appropriate.

The comprehensive plan is the guidebook for growth, but the elements have no backing unless they're spelled out specifically in the land development code.

Still, one recommendation captured the Citrus County Building Alliance's attention.

The revised plan would allow for sidewalks and multipurpose trails in residential and

commercial developments. Coutu said she included all development, and not just new projects, to be open for sidewalks in case the county receives grants to build one.

She cited the safe schools grant that is paying for a sidewalk on Forest Ridge Boulevard to give children and parents walking access to the elementary school.

Gaston Hall, representing the CCBA, said it's one thing to require sidewalks in new development but it's not reasonable to expect it in existing

developments, even with available grants.

"When you start getting into the existing stuff, you'll have all kinds of issues," Hall said. "I've been here long enough to see good intentions go bad."

The PDC vote is a recommendation to the county commission, which has the final say on comprehensive plan changes. While it gave unanimous backing, the PDC asked the county staff to try and find middle ground with the CCBA before the matter reaches county commissioners.

### Idle speed in effect July 4 for Kings Bay

The idle speed/no wake, holiday speed zone ordinance (2004-02) will be in effect for Kings Bay, Crystal River and any canals and tributaries leading to these areas for the upcoming Independence Day holiday, Saturday, July 4, 2020.

### County to offer no-cost water testing

In June of 1991, the Environmental Protection Agency implemented the Lead and Copper Rule as part of the Safe Drinking Water Act. This law mandates that Public Water Systems (PWS) conduct sampling and analysis for levels of lead and copper in households located within their distribution system.

Sampling and testing is scheduled for the month of August 2020 in the County's Charles A. Black, Citrus Springs-Pine Ridge, and Sugarmill Woods PWS' at no cost to our customers and takes only a few minutes of your time. These samples are collected to determine the contribution of faucet fixtures and household plumbing and/or solder to the lead and copper levels in tap water.

Owners of homes in these areas that were constructed between 1982 and 1984 when lead and copper materials may have been used are strongly encouraged to participate. Homes with a whole house water filter or taps with an under sink filter may not be used for sample collection.

## School board member Kennedy elected VP of FSBA

School board members statewide have a familiar face as one of its leaders.

Citrus County School Board member Thomas Kennedy was elected and sworn in Thursday, June 18, 2020, during a virtual meeting as vice president of the Florida School Boards Association (FSBA).

"I was honored to be selected by these peers I have admired, many of whom have been mentors to me and have truly played a role in me being a better board member," Kennedy told the Chronicle, "and I hope to continue to make sure we are meeting all the needs of our students in Citrus County and also in the state of Florida."

FSBA has around 350 school members in its ranks, representing 63 of Florida's 67 school

districts, according to Kennedy. For more information, visit fsba.org.

To be considered as a candidate by the FSBA Nominating Committee, Kennedy submitted a lengthy application in March 2020 of his resume as a school board member.

"It was a very rigorous process," he said.

Kennedy also sent in recommendation letters proving his service on the local dais and in the community.

Citrus County School District Superintendent Sandra "Sam" Himmel and Citrus County Education Foundation Executive Director Shaunda Burdette wrote to the FSBA on Kennedy's behalf.

"His resume showcases his involvement and leadership in numerous activities, task-forces, and committees that span the multiple facets of education," Himmel wrote. "All stakeholders admire and

depend on Thomas to be a voice that builds relationships and puts children first."

"More and more community members, including many local business owners, are now asking how they can be involved with our schools due to being informed and inspired by Thomas Kennedy," Burdette wrote.

FSBA Nominating Committee members interviewed Kennedy and other applicants in late-April, questioning them about their dedication to their school district and the FSBA.

"You tend to have to reach a certain level of experience in order to be considered," said Kennedy, who's been an FSBA member since he was sworn in as a Citrus County school board member in November 2010 and completed some training.

Kennedy was soon called with news he had

been recommended by the FSBA nominators to join the ballot for the entire 2020-21 FSBA executive officers slate, made up of five people.

Other FSBA members voted 58-3 on June 18 to elect Kennedy and the other four officers.

Kennedy's term as vice president will last until

June 2021, when he might apply for a higher position; however, until then, Kennedy is ready to devote more time to students, teachers and school staff.

"We're very focused on this coming year," he said, "and we have some big challenges ahead with the uncertainties of COVID-19."

## Florida governor suggests closing schools during upcoming elections

TALLAHASSEE — Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis moved to give elections officials across the state some relief, by closing schools so they can be used as polling places, allowing state employees to staff precincts and providing more time to count absentee ballots amid the coronavirus pandemic.

But an executive order issued

by the governor on Wednesday fell short of what elections officials had requested two months ago, when they sought more flexibility in conducting the state's primary in August and the nationally important presidential election in November.

Craig Latimer, president of the Florida Supervisors of Elections, said the governor's executive order was welcome but should have come sooner and

delivered more.

"Florida's 67 Supervisors of Elections submitted recommendations to the governor in April, which were substantially different from the accommodations offered by Governor DeSantis," said Latimer, who serves as Hillsborough County's election's chief.

The officials had asked the governor to allow counties the option of starting voting sooner so they could begin counting

absentee ballots earlier — a crucial request, elections officers said, because of the heightened interest in voting by mail to avoid Election Day crowds and exposure to the virus. In addition, elections officials asked the governor to allow them to consolidate voting places because of the potential scarcity of poll workers to fully staff precincts.

Latimer said elections officials were reviewing the governor's

executive order, which acknowledged some of the state's current rules could "prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with the COVID-19 emergency."

The governor's order encouraged schools to close on Aug. 18, the day of the state's primary and again on Nov. 3, to allow some campuses to be used as voting sites. He also encouraged teachers and administrators to serve as poll workers.

The hall of fame's Class of 2020 was chosen from a field of 12 finalists that also included Frogger, Goldeneye 007, Guitar Hero, NBA Jam, Nokia Snake, Super Smash Bros. Melee, Uncharted 2, and Where in the World is Carmen Sandiego?

Atari's Centipede is credited with bringing more female players into arcades when it debuted in 1981, challenging players to fire on an insect as it zigzagged down the screen. Developer

Brown was renowned for hundreds of iconic musical works including hits like "I Feel Good" and "A Man's World," and was known around the world for his flashy performances and dynamic stage presence. But years of drug problems and financial mismanagement caused his estate to dwindle.

More than a dozen lawsuits have been filed over the years by people trying to lay claim to what's left, which courts have estimated to be worth anything from \$5 million to more than \$100 million.

**Denying marriage claim, justices OK James Brown's wish**

COLUMBIA, S.C. — The Godfather of Soul's dying wish to help educate needy children is a big step closer to being fulfilled, now that South Carolina's Supreme Court — wading into a 14-year-old legal saga yet again — has ruled that **James Brown's** last partner was not legally married to him.

In an unanimous ruling on Wednesday, the state's justices wrote that **Tomi Rae Hynie**, a former partner of Brown's who claimed to be his wife, failed to annul a previous marriage, and therefore did not have a right to his multimillion-dollar estate.

Brown's union with Hynie has long been the center of the

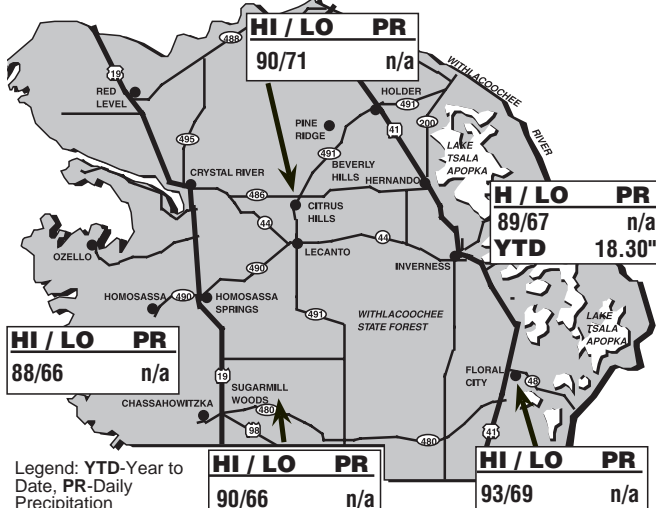

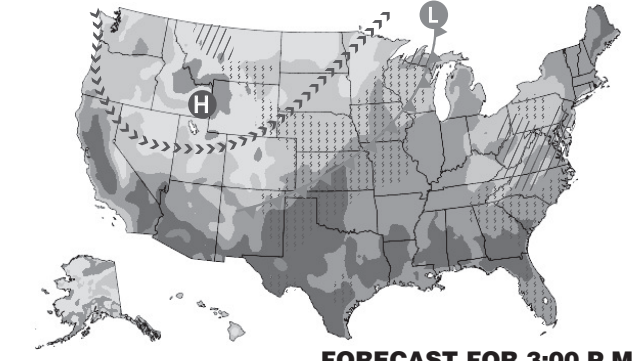

reassuring data from the Florida Department of Health of steady or declining rates of coronavirus cases.

"The state was experiencing a COVID-19 rate of about 1,000 cases a day ... and the county had less than one case per day," City Manager Ken Frink told council on June 18. "Unfortunately, the information that you relied on to make that decision has changed drastically since then."

Since June 8, Citrus County's COVID-19 cases rose from 128 to 162, as of June 18, according to the health department.

Frink also said Florida's rate of cases has almost tripled.

Council members were also tested for the virus after they came into close contact with a positive case on June 8, likely during their meeting.

Frink told council

between 20 and 30 city staff and Citrus County Sheriff's Office personnel would be needed to help contain crowds and motorists for the fireworks show, exposing themselves to thousands of locals and visitors whose own hometown canceled its fireworks outing.

Event volunteers are also not signing up, Frink said.

"They're concerned with their own safety and the safety of their families," he said, recommending council postpone the event. "I'm as about as patriotic as you get ... so this is a very difficult thing for me to see."

City special events coordinator Leslie Bollin told the council the city's fireworks vendor from Homosassa, Dragonworks, would not charge Crystal River a 20% fee for holding off on the \$16,000 show.

Echoed by their colleague on the dais, Meek and Councilman Ken Brown said nobody should be questioning

their patriotism.

"That shouldn't even be a question," Brown said.

"I'm not saying people should not get together to celebrate the fourth and get together with family," Meek added, "but for the city to organize an event that will bring in thousands of people, we have to ask our ourselves: is this the responsible thing for us to do at this current time?"

Meek also addressed critics of the council's decision who argued the city shouldn't cancel the fireworks while crowds gather to protest police brutality and racism across the U.S.

"We're not organizing those protests and mass-gatherings," he said about the demonstrations over the May 25, 2020, death of George Floyd in Minneapolis police custody, "but we are organizing this event."

Davis, the daughter of former longtime Crystal River Airport operator Tom Davis, said the county should seek guidance from the public.

"All of us love Citrus County," she said. "We have that shut-the-door-behind-me mentality. No more people coming here is a pipe dream. We have to prepare for growth and we have to preserve our history."

■ **Pandemic:** Davis said the county was correct to keep the local state of emergency in place, despite efforts by her opponent to do otherwise. She also said commissioners should lead the public's response.

"I wish some of the commissioners had been a better role model," she said. "I see a mask as wearing a seatbelt to save someone else. Every little bit we do

will help." ■ **Taxes:** Davis would not rule out raising taxes if a need for it is shown.

"As a lifelong Republican, taxes do not scare me. Waste scares me," she said. "I'm not a no-tax Republican. I'm a better-use-my-tax-dollars-wisely Republican."

■ **Chain of command:** Davis is critical of incumbent Jimmie T. Smith's public campaign to fire the land development director, saying he should direct any concerns to

County Administrator Randy Oliver.

"Seems like he handled that very poorly," she said. "Let the county administrator do his job. You don't micromanage. I always go the positive route first. I'm typically pretty successful at that."

■ **The goal:** Smith said his aim is to forge a positive future for the younger generation. He cited, for example, his successful push to have Lecanto Community Park designated as a drone-friendly park, and has supported efforts in Beverly Hills to reopen the county pool.

"If you look at the policies and things I've brought forward, it's not the decisions we make now, it's the decisions we make now that affect future generations."

■ **Board support:** Smith acknowledged a hit-and-miss success rate for finding majority support for his initiatives.

"The things I bring forward are for debate and discussion," he said. "We seem to struggle on debating even for five minutes. I don't know what it is that they don't want to debate or discuss things."

■ **Pandemic response:** Smith has three unsuccessful attempts at ending the COVID-19 local state of emergency, arguing the emergency no longer exists because hospitalizations from the virus have dropped.

"I never said we should pull back completely," he said. "What was the mission? The mission was to flatten the curve. We flattened the curve almost

right away. So, mission accomplished."

■ **Economic development:** Smith, a vocal critic of the county's land development division, said the county has a reputation of being difficult to work with.

"Builders and developers have trouble getting things accomplished," he said. "We have a process that is basically anti-business."

# Univ. of Florida ends 'gator bait' cheer, cites racism

ST. PETERSBURG — The University of Florida is ending its "gator bait" cheer at football games and other sports events because of its racial connotations, the school's president announced Thursday in a letter making several other similar changes on campus.

Florida president Kent Fuchs said in a letter to the university's faculty, students and staff that the cheer has a "horrific historic racist imagery" involving African American people, especially children, being used as bait for alligators.

"Accordingly, university athletics and the Gator Band will discontinue the use of the cheer,"

Fuchs wrote. The university's sports teams in the Southeastern Conference are nicknamed the Gators, for the ubiquitous Florida reptile. In the past, the school's band would strike up a "gator bait" tune and fans would respond with their arms doing a chomping motion while shouting the slogan.

The link to racism is borne out by news articles in years past. For example, in 1923, Time Magazine published a story about how "colored babies were being used for alligator bait" in Chipley, Florida.

"The infants are allowed to play in the shallow water while expert riflemen watch from concealment nearby," the article said. "When a saurian (alligator) approaches this

prey, he is shot by the riflemen." The Chipley Chamber of Commerce responded to the Time article by calling it a "silly lie, false and absurd."

The letter from Fuchs outlined a number of other steps the university in Gainesville, Florida, is taking on racial issues following the death of George Floyd at the hands of Minneapolis police. Floyd's

death has sparked nationwide protests focused on police brutality against African Americans.

Among other things, Fuchs said the university will require students, faculty and staff to be trained on "racism, inclusion and bias" and will also bring a new focus on the African American experience in the upcoming

academic year. The University of Florida, the state's largest with about 52,000 students, is

expected to reopen in the fall semester with restrictions related to the coronavirus outbreak.

**Jean Kennedy Smith, 92**

Jean Kennedy Smith, who was the last surviving sibling of President John F. Kennedy and who as a U.S. ambassador played a key role in the peace process in Northern Ireland, has died, relatives said Thursday. She was 92.

Former U.S. Rep. Patrick Kennedy, Smith's nephew, confirmed her death. She died Wednesday at her home in Manhattan, her daughter Kym told The New York Times.

Smith was the eighth of nine children born to Joseph and Rose Kennedy, and tragically several of them preceded her in death by decades. Her siblings included older brother Joseph Kennedy Jr., killed in action during World War II; Kathleen "Kick" Kennedy, who died in a 1948 plane crash; the president, assassinated in 1963 and Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, slain in 1968.

Among Smith's other siblings, Rosemary died in 2005, Patricia in 2006 and Sen. Edward Kennedy, the youngest of the Kennedy siblings, died of brain cancer in August 2009, the same month their sister Eunice Kennedy Shriver died.

"A child in a big family constantly feels surrounded and supported,"

Smith wrote in "The Nine of Us," her 2016 memoir: "For me, there was always someone to play with or someone to talk to just around the corner, out on the porch, or in the next bedroom. I never felt alone."

For much of her life, Smith was viewed as a quiet sister who largely shunned the spotlight. She married Kennedy family financial adviser and future White House chief of staff Stephen Edward Smith in 1956, and wrote in her memoir that her childhood seemed "unexceptional" much of the time.

"It is hard for me to fully comprehend that I was growing up with brothers who eventually occupy the highest offices of our nation, including president of the United States," she explained. "At the time, they were simply my playmates. They were the source of my amusement and the objects of my admiration."

Though she never ran for office, Smith campaigned for her brothers, traveling the country for then-Sen. John F. Kennedy as he sought the presidency in 1960.

In 1963, she stepped in for a traveling Jacqueline Kennedy and co-hosted a state dinner for Ireland's president. The same year, she accompanied her brother — the first Irish Catholic president — on his famous visit to Ireland. Smith later recalled the trip as "one of the most moving experiences of my own life." Their great-grandfather, Patrick Kennedy, was from Dunganstown in County Wexford in southeastern Ireland.

Three decades later, in 1993, Smith was appointed ambassador to Ireland by then-President Bill Clinton.

The former Democratic president on Thursday recalled her as a "tireless champion of peace, inclusion, and dignity." He said Smith was "immediately embraced" by the Irish people not just for her famous name, but also because of her "clear passion for peace and willingness to push for it."

"An activist diplomat, she was not afraid to break with convention or explore the limits of her mandate," Higgins said in a statement. "She will be forever remembered as the diplomat who had a sense of Irish history and of what had influenced the Irish in the United States."

Simon Coveney, the country's Deputy Prime Minister, said her work in "reaching across political divides" was "invaluable" in Ireland's hard-won peace.

**World War II forces sweetheart singer Vera Lynn dies at 103**

LONDON — Dame Vera Lynn, the endearingly popular "Forces' Sweetheart" who serenaded British troops during World War II, has died at 103.

During the war and long after, Lynn got crowds singing, smiling and crying with sentimental favorites such as "We'll Meet Again," and "The White Cliffs of Dover."

"The family are deeply saddened to announce the passing of one of Britain's best-loved entertainers at the age of 103," her family said in a statement. "Dame Vera Lynn, who lived in Ditchling, East Sussex, passed away earlier today, 18 June 2020, surrounded by her close family."

Lynn possessed a down-to-earth appeal, reminding servicemen of the wives and sweethearts they left behind when they went off to war.

"I was somebody that they could associate with," she once told The Associated Press. "I was an ordinary girl."

Tributes poured in from political leaders, entertainers, veterans and thousands of fans.

Prime Minister Boris Johnson said her "charm and magical voice entranced and uplifted our country in some of our darkest hours. Her voice will live on to lift the hearts of generations to come."

Lynn hosted a wildly popular BBC radio show during the war called "Sincerely Yours" in which she sent messages to British troops abroad and performed the songs they requested. The half-hour program came on during the highly coveted slot following the Sunday night news.

"Winston Churchill was my opening act," she once said.

But Lynn once thought the war would doom her chance of success.

"When war first started, when it was declared, I thought, 'Well there goes my career.' You know, I shall finish up in a factory or the army or somewhere," she recalled. "You imagined all the theaters closing down, which didn't happen except when the sirens sounded. And everybody, if they wanted to, they could stay in the theater and the show would go on."

In September 2009, long after her retirement, Lynn topped the British album chart with a hits collection titled "We'll Meet Again — The Very Best of Vera Lynn." It reached No. 1, despite competition from the release of remastered Beatles' albums.

Amid this year's coronavirus outbreak, Lynn and opera singer Katherine Jenkins released a charity version of "We'll Meet Again." Once again the public found comfort in her words of hope, which resonated in the locked-down country.

In a reflection of her enduring appeal, Queen Elizabeth II also invoked the words of Lynn's signature song as she addressed the nation in lockdown. The monarch, who served as an ambulance driver during the war, played on the song's theme, promising that loved ones would be reunited in the end after being separated by the virus.

"We should take comfort that while we may have more still to endure, better days will return," the queen said. "We will be with our friends again; we will be with our families again; we will meet again."

Lynn earned her nickname, "The Forces' Sweetheart," after being ranked No. 1 in a 1939 Daily Express poll that asked servicemen to name their favorite musical artists. Years later, she reflected on time spent with soldiers abroad.

"What they needed was a contact from home," she said. "I entertained audiences from 2,000 to 6,000. And the boys would just come out of the jungle and sit there for hours waiting until we arrived and then slip back in once we'd left."

bag and freeze the fish. He jumped at the chance when Duke approached him. "I think it's a good way to give back to the community, to help families," Kofmehl said. The 275 adult redfish were 18 to 27 inches long and took from four to six years to spawn and grow at the Crystal River Mariculture Center, a certified aquaculture producer and multi-species hatchery that grows and releases redfish and spotted seatrout into the Gulf of Mexico.

Since opening in 1991, the center has cultivated and released more than 4.1 million fish and crustacean. Duke said it's one of the most successful marine-stocking programs

in Florida. "This is the first donation of this type, but we have a long history of participating in community events," Duke spokeswoman Heather Danenhower said. The Family Service Center serves many different sized families, West said, but the donation comes at a critical time when school is out and a lot of donors have made their way north for the summer.

"Summer is traditionally a hard time for us," West said. Coupled with the COVID-19 pandemic, "this year has just been totally weird," West added. "Families need more food," she said. "But it's just at the time when our donors have normally gone north for the summer, a big portion of our donors are not year-round residents. During the

summer, they're not here to bring food. A lot of the organizations that bring food, like the Woman's Club, they don't meet during the summer." More people are coming at a time when the agency has less food, but no one has been turned away. "So far, so good," West said. "It all works."

Those who need assistance should come to the Family Resource Center at 2435 N. Florida Ave., Hernando, West said. Those coming for the first time should bring an ID for each family member. DeSantis affirmed Tuesday he will not recede from his June 5 launch of phase two in his three-part reopening plan.

"We're not shutting down. We're going to go forward," DeSantis said. The four models suggest voluntary compliance with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines and social distancing protocols is episodic, at best.

According to a transmission model built by open-source software developer GitHub, the virus is spreading at an "Rt COVID-19 value" of 1.06, meaning each Floridian with the virus infects on average six people.

An Rt value above 1.0 means the virus is spreading. Florida was below 1.0 Rt from April 29 through May 10 and was at 1.08 on May 28, according to GitHub.

At 1.06, Florida has ranked sixth nationally in

spread for six weeks, GitHub calculates, and it is the same "reproduction number" cited by MIT graduate and independent data scientist Youyang Gu in his COVID-19 projections model.

Gu's model uses machine learning to inform its predictions, which are incorporated into aggregates calculated by the CDC.

It puts the new case peak at 8,000 daily in mid-July, dropping to 4,800 by Oct. 1. It projects daily fatalities peaking at 58 in early August and dropping to 43 by Oct. 1, when 8,257 Floridians are estimated to have died from the disease.

Several weeks ago, Gu's model offered the most dire prognostications, especially when compared with forecasts calculated by the oft-cited Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation's (IHME) model.

In early June, IHME predicted 3,899 COVID-19 deaths by Aug. 4, a downward revision from its previous estimate that 5,440

Floridians would die from the disease by early August.

The IHME model, which has been highlighted by White House officials, now projects the state could see 54,000 new daily COVID-19 infections and 438 daily deaths come October.

Meanwhile, Children's Hospital of Philadelphia Research Institute and the University of Pennsylvania have issued a similar dire forecast for the Sunshine State.

Florida has "all the markings of the next large epicenter of coronavirus transmission" and risks being the "worst it has ever been," according to Wednesday's projections from institute and university researchers.

"The potential for the virus to take off (in Florida) is very, very nerve-racking and could have catastrophic consequences," University of Alabama at Birmingham Division of Infectious Diseases Director Dr. Jeanne Marrazzo told CNN on Thursday.

# A good run cut short by COVID-19

*Gatto started season on fire for Citrus baseball*

**Editor's note:** This is one of a series of stories the Chronicle will tell highlighting some of the senior spring sports athletes in the county who had their careers cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Mikey Gatto had certainly gotten off to the kind of start he'd want for a senior season.

Through seven games he was batting .435 with a .567 on-base percentage out of the leadoff spot. He had even seamlessly transitioned to a new position.

But he never got to play another game. The Citrus baseball team, like all teams, saw its season unexpectedly conclude in mid-March due to COVID-19.

"It's kind of sad how everything ended," Gatto said. "I played with most of these kids my entire life and to have it ripped away. But we had a good run."

"I think I had success just knowing it was my last year and putting everything on the line this year. I was hoping for my best season to go out."

It seemed to be heading in that direction. Gatto's previous two years with the Hurricanes were nothing to scoff at, especially a sophomore season that landed him on the All-Chronicle team.

Back in 2018, Gatto hit .373 with nine doubles, a triple, 13 runs scored and 15 RBI in 24 games. He

admittedly slumped as a junior to .267 with six doubles, 15 runs and five RBI.

This year he roared back with a vengeance at the plate, impressing new head coach Jon Bolin.

"He was hitting the ball hard to all fields," Bolin said. "He was using the whole field instead of trying to pull everything."

There were a couple other new wrinkles this season for Gatto. For

one, the No. 6 he had worn since T-Ball wasn't available in his size. So he switched to No. 2, paying homage to Derek Jeter.

Unlike Jeter, though, Gatto found himself departing from the infield. Primarily a second baseman with some time at shortstop sprinkled in, Gatto had to fill a void in center field this year.

"We moved him from second base to outfield and just being the

natural athlete that he is he adjusted right away," Bolin said. "He became one of our better defensive players. He swung the bat well, but we knew he could do that."

"It was going pretty good," Gatto said. "I thought it wouldn't be as fun or enjoyable out there, but it was still pretty fun. I had a lot of balls hit to me. I had to learn a lot but I learned pretty quick."

Gatto produced an All-Chronicle campaign in football back in the fall, recording 76 tackles out of the defensive backfield while tying for the team leads with three interceptions and nine passes defended. But he's ready to leave the gridiron in the rearview mirror.

Baseball, however, is a sport he plans to continue going into college. He has yet to make a decision on a school and barely getting to play this spring didn't help improve his stock.

"I hate it for everybody, for all the seniors throughout the United States," Bolin said. "This was only a snapshot of what we've seen from Mikey. I wish he had more of an opportunity for colleges to see him. He can definitely play college baseball."

Indeed there were missed opportunities on and off the field. Prom, Grad Bash, a traditional graduation were all things Gatto lamented not getting to experience.

At least with baseball, he figures there's more to come at the next level. However, he'll never get that time back with his fellow Hurricanes.

"We had a good run," Gatto said. "They're all my buddies. We made a lot of memories. All that good stuff."

### Players counter with 70 games

NEW YORK — Baseball players proposed a 70-game regular-season schedule Thursday, a plan immediately rejected by baseball Commissioner Rob Manfred with the sides 10 games and about \$275 million apart on plans to start the coronavirus-delayed season.

As part of the union proposal, players would wear advertisement patches on their uniforms during all games for the first time in major league history.

"This needs to be over," Manfred said. "Until I speak with owners, I can't give you a firm deadline."

### OSU-Alabama set series

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Alabama and Ohio State have scheduled a home-and-home football series for the 2027 and 2028 seasons.

The first game will take place in Columbus, Ohio on Sept. 18, 2027, with the Buckeyes coming to Tuscaloosa the following Sept. 9.

### SEC pushing flag change

The Southeastern Conference is considering barring league championship events in Mississippi until the state changes its Confederate-based flag.

"It is past time for change to be made to the flag of the State of Mississippi," Commissioner Greg Sankey said Thursday in a statement. "Our students deserve an opportunity to learn and compete in environments that are inclusive and welcoming to all."

The NCAA already said it would not schedule post-season events in Mississippi.

# Birdies galore at PGA event in Hilton Head

The RBC Heritage began two months later than usual with a little rain, a little sunshine and a lot of birdies, most of them from Jordan Spieth to turn a rough start into a furious finish.

Ian Poulter holed a 30-foot birdie putt and followed with a 5-iron to 4 feet for a birdie that closed out his round of 7-under 64, giving him a share of the lead Thursday with Mark Hubbard at Hilton Head.

"I've always loved coming here to play golf," said Poulter, and he has plenty of company this year.

The RBC Heritage, typically a week after the Masters in April, is the second tournament since the PGA Tour returned after 90 days from the COVID-19 pandemic.

The top three players in the world are at Hilton Head — Rory McIlroy, Jon Rahm and Justin Thomas — and none broke par on a day in which 66 players in the 151-man field shot in the 60s. A year ago, only 38 players in the 132-man field opened with rounds in the 60s.

Spieth wouldn't have guessed he would be one of them after a tee shot that was 5 yards right of the 12th fairway hit a tree and didn't stop rolling until it was out-of-bounds. He made triple bogey and was 3 over through three holes.

"All of a sudden, I'm 3 over through three, and you start to see guys going 2 under through two, 2 under through three early," Spieth said. "It's not a great feeling."

Determined to at least try to get under par for his round, Spieth had a career-best six straight birdies on his back nine and finished with seven birdies over his last eight holes for a 66.

Dustin Johnson was poised to make a move until he hit into the water on the par-3 14th and compounding the error with a three-putt triple bogey. He still managed a 68.

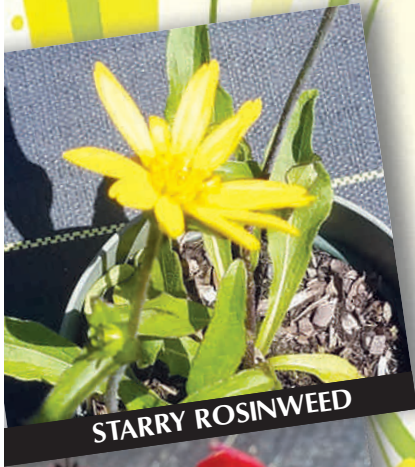

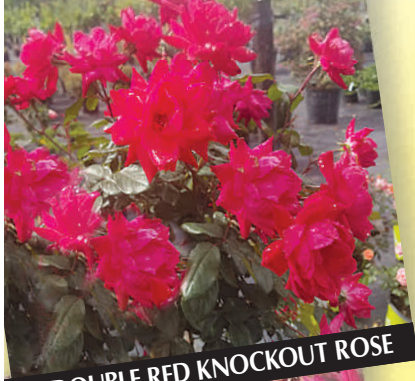

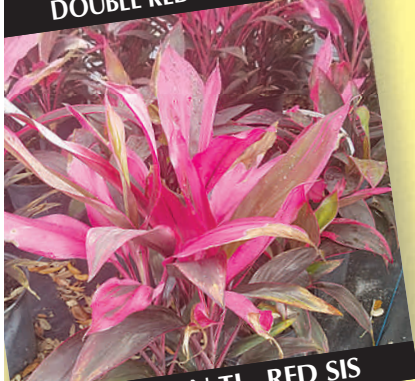

2 1/2 miles north at West Cardinal Street and U.S. 19, which opened last year, Patel said his store will still be able to compete because it will attract the Sugarmill Woods folks and also because it's so close to the Suncoast Parkway intersection about four miles away on U.S. 98.

And being on a major highway heading into Homosassa and Crystal River, Patel said he hopes to

capture the tourist crowds. The intersection of U.S. 19 has become hot, he said, with the recent opening of McDonald's and the planned debut of a new Wendy's.

Meanwhile, there is no word on when the 7-Eleven store off State Road 44 in Inverness will open.

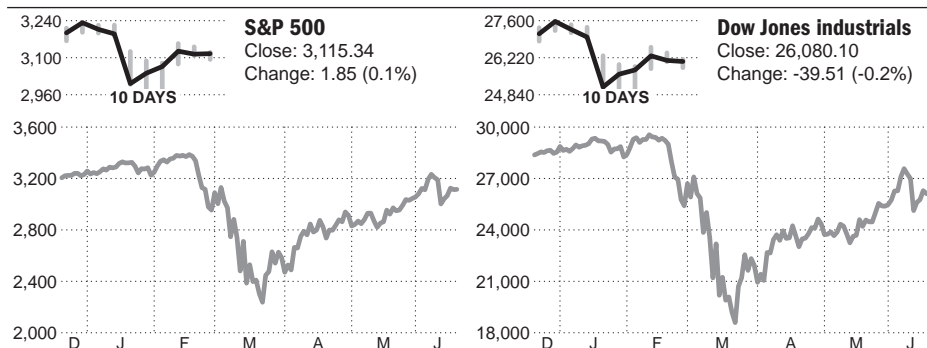

# Wall Street in neutral after wobbly day

NEW YORK — Wall Street held at a near standstill on Thursday, with indexes split as caution about rising coronavirus infections in hotspots around the world washed over hopes for a coming economic recovery. The S&P 500 edged up by 0.1% after flip-flopping repeatedly between small gains and losses through the day. Earlier, stocks slipped in European and Asian markets, while Treasury yields faded in another sign of increased caution.

Slightly more stocks fell in the S&P 500 than rose, but the index ended up adding 1.85 points to close at 3,115.34. The Dow Jones Industrial Average slipped 39.51, or 0.2%, to 26,080.10, and the Nasdaq composite rose 32.52, or 0.3%, to 9,943.05.

# State floundering with pandemic unemployment assistance

Countless citizens unemployed in Florida due to the COVID-19 pandemic find themselves not only in financial distress, but simply wondering what is going on and why promised federal financial assistance is not being received.

Some are still in limbo waiting to get the additional federal \$600 weekly CARES Act supplement, with no solid explanation available from state leaders or the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (FDEO) as to why it hasn't arrived yet.

It's becoming increasingly evident that the ease of accessibility of the Florida unemployment system is being stymied by governmental leadership, leaving those forced to navigate unemployment confused, with no answers available with a reasonable amount of effort.

It shouldn't be like that, and it's not in other states. Florida has a problem, and it needs to be amended now to ensure that residents don't end up deeply food insecure or homeless. The current system is unacceptable. Many in Florida are facing mounting bills and heavy stress; they're frustrated and angry.

So, why aren't people getting the money?

Unemployed Floridians are able to receive a maximum of \$275 per week from the state, and because of the pandemic, the federal government promised a supplement of an additional \$600 per week for up to 12 weeks as part of the CARES Act stimulus signed into law on March 27. On May 4, Gov. Ron DeSantis publicly declared that 99.9% of unemployment claims have been paid. However, records from

the FDEO show that as of May 27, only half of all claims had been paid.

The explanation from state leadership has been akin to crickets.

The Florida system did not expect the surge of unemployment claims due to the pandemic (and quite frankly, buckled under the strain), but there should have had a plan in place for economic disaster and a better equipped website to handle such a volume of claims.

Nonexistent or contradictory guidance, paired with a lack of basic features on a state website is

not just unacceptable — it's a failure in leadership and design.

DeSantis blames Florida's poorly constructed unemployment system on his predecessor Rick Scott. But, DeSantis has been holding the reins long enough to surely know of flaws within the system he manages.

The state has remedied some of the issues on the website, but current leadership hasn't taken swift action to fix the system in its entirety as other states did amidst pandemic response.

It should be a priority to help the state's most vulnerable. There's no excuse for those who are unemployed to go without federal assistance because of the indifference and ineptitude of those responsible for assuring the operations of the state safety net.

The governor needs to take leadership, ensure a redesign to the website to be easily accessible (even for the most technologically challenged citizen to navigate), and make sure that 100% of unemployment claims in the state of Florida are paid.

**THE ISSUE:**

State fails to explain why many unemployed Floridians are not receiving \$600 federal supplement income.

**OUR OPINION:**

Florida needs to repair its mismanaged, disorganized unemployment system and be more transparent.

# The faces of hunger

Food banks often only work behind the scenes to ensure those agencies who serve the public directly are well supplied with nutritious foods. Much like a distribution center for a supermarket, we deal with semi-truck loads of food by the pallet, but rarely do we have an opportunity to meet the thousands of neighbors in need that we ultimately serve.

Until Michael called. Living many states away and with a growing concern for his sister who lives locally, Michael phoned the area food bank for some guidance and happened to connect to me. As we spoke, I learned that his sister Ruth has suffered through a terrible marriage full of domestic violence. With a divorce, no financial support, a home to care for and a severe depression setting in, Ruth had become distant, withdrawn, unable to eat and on the verge of becoming homeless. Poor Michael was beside himself as the COVID-19 pandemic had closed him off from any opportunity to visit her and care for his stricken sister.

Although we deal with pallets and pounds, we are also here to provide to those in need and Ruth was certainly no exception. I explained to Michael how our network of pantries, soup kitchens and shelters function on the front line while we help to flow food in mass amounts through them. With the pandemic spiking needy

clients by 300-400% and Ruth's fragile state, I knew an emergency intervention was needed. Armed with a box of assorted fruit, vegetables, prepared meals and a salvaged bouquet of flowers, I took down her address and headed to see Ruth.

As we chatted, I encouraged Ruth to partake of the list of our agencies who locally distribute food and other assistance. She explained that she had started to investigate some programs to help her get back on her feet, but the tags on her car had expired, she had run out of money, had no source of income and was pretty frankly embarrassed by the path life had taken her on. She felt so ashamed she couldn't face her family, friends or even neighbors.

It struck me hard that this lovely lady had weathered a storm, but was left so beaten down that her body had recovered, but her spirit just couldn't. I knew our agencies and believed wholeheartedly that one of them would embrace Ruth and be able to offer much more than a meal.

"Of course, I will! I'll go over and see her today," Ms. Lorraine Adams manages the food pantry and Celebrate Recovery meals for the Life Tree

Presbyterian Church, but also has the compassion and strength to be a solid shoulder for those in need of emotional support. I had a feeling she was just the right person Ruth needed in her life.

Just an hour later Lorraine checked back in with me. "She was apprehensive, but we chatted and made a date to go to lunch." What? My heart sang! Lorraine made several more visits and quickly convinced Ruth to step back into the world with her right by her side. "I've got this," she told me. Ruth has been through an awful lot, but these are exactly the people we want to reach and help.

The good reports kept coming. With Lorraine's help, Ruth has started taking care of herself, has gotten her car back on the road, has started applying for jobs and is planning her future with the possibility of roommates, "like the Golden Girls." This is what a community support system is all about. Organizations connecting each other to the people who truly need them so that our community prospers person, by person.

"We can't thank you enough for everything you have done to help our family," said Michael. I told him how much I appreciated his kind words, but that it was not only my pleasure to help make connections for Ruth, but the reason why we exist. We do not just feed to end hunger, but we nourish hope as well.

**Trump team seeks fourth debate with Biden**

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump's campaign is requesting a fourth debate with his presumptive Democratic rival, citing an expected surge in mail and absentee voting this fall because of the coronavirus.

Trump campaign manager Brad Parscale and former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani made the request Thursday in a call with Frankahrenkopf, the co-chair of the nonpartisan Commission on Presidential Debates. The request was described by a person familiar with the conversation who was not authorized to discuss it publicly.

It marked a dramatic reversal from the Trump campaign's position in December, when Trump and Parscale were threatening that the president could participate in fewer or even no debates put on by the commission, against his Democratic opponent.

**Court rejects Trump bid**

*To end young immigrants' protections*

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court on Thursday rejected President Donald Trump's effort to end legal protections for 650,000 young immigrants, the second stunning election-season rebuke from the court in a week after its ruling that it's illegal to fire people because they're gay or transgender.

Immigrants who are part of the 8-year-old Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals Program will retain their protection from deportation and their authorization to work in the United States — safe almost certainly at least through the November election, immigration experts said.

The 5-4 outcome, in which Chief Justice John Roberts and the four liberal justices were in the majority, seems certain to elevate the issue in Trump's campaign, given the anti-immigrant rhetoric of his first presidential run in 2016 and immigration restrictions his administration has imposed since then.

The justices said the administration did not take the proper steps to end DACA, rejecting arguments that the program is illegal and that courts have no role to play in reviewing the decision to end it. The program covers people who have been in the United States since they were children and are in the country illegally. In some cases, they have no memory of any home other than the U.S.

Trump didn't hold back in his assessment of the court's work, hitting hard at a political angle.

"These horrible & politically charged decisions coming out of the Supreme Court are shotgun blasts into the face of people that are

proud to call themselves Republicans or Conservatives. We need more Justices or we will lose our 2nd Amendment & everything else. Vote Trump 2020!" he wrote on Twitter, apparently including the LGBT ruling as well.

In a second tweet, he wrote, "Do you get the impression that the Supreme Court doesn't like me?"

Later, he said the decision showed the need for additional conservative justices to join the two he has appointed, Neil Gorsuch and Brett Kavanaugh, and pledged to release a new list from which he would choose a nominee if another opening occurs on his watch. Both of his appointees dissented on Thursday, though Gorsuch wrote the LGBT rights ruling.

Roberts, with whom Trump has sparred, wrote for the court that the

administration did not pursue the end of the program properly.

"We do not decide whether DACA or its rescission are sound policies," Roberts wrote. "We address only whether the agency complied with the procedural requirement that it provide a reasoned explanation for its action. Here the agency failed to consider the conspicuous issues of whether to retain forbearance and what if anything to do about the hardship to DACA recipients."

The court's four conservative justices dissented. Justice Clarence Thomas, joined by Justices Gorsuch and Samuel Alito, wrote that DACA was illegal from the moment it was created under the Obama administration in 2012. Thomas called the ruling "an effort to avoid a politically controversial but legally correct decision."

**Decline in deaths may be temporary**

The number of deaths per day from the coronavirus in the U.S. has fallen in recent weeks to the lowest level since late March, even as states increasingly reopen for business. But scientists are deeply afraid the trend may be about to reverse itself.

Deaths from COVID-19 across the country are down to about 680 a day, compared with around 960 two weeks ago, according to an Associated Press analysis of data compiled by Johns Hopkins University. The analysis looked at a seven-day rolling average of deaths through Wednesday.

A multitude of reasons are believed to be at play, including the advent of effective treatments and improved efforts at hospitals and nursing homes to prevent infections and save lives.

But already there are warning signs.

For one thing, the number of newly confirmed cases per day has risen from about 21,400 two weeks ago to 23,200, the AP analysis found.

And in Florida, Georgia, Texas and Arizona — states that loosened their stay-at-home restrictions early — daily deaths have been quietly rising since early June.

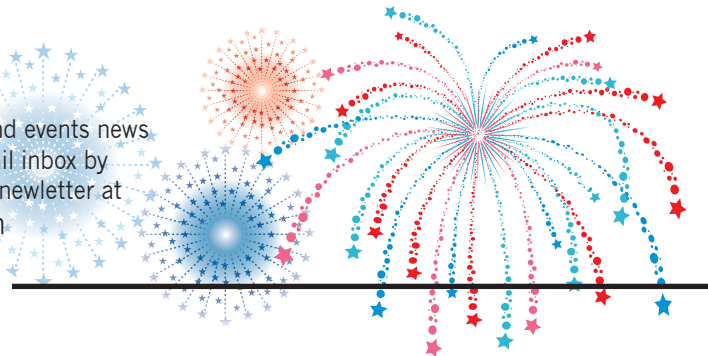

# Safe this summer Be sure to handle fireworks properly

The arrival of warm weather provides more opportunities to

gather and celebrate. From national holidays to impromptu backyard barbecues, the opportunity to kick back and relax is

a hallmark of summer.

Fireworks also figure prominently in summer: When in the hands of professionals, fireworks are a wonder to behold from a safe distance. But far too often people set off their own pyrotechnics and meet with grave results.

In 2017, hospital emergency rooms in the United States treated an estimated 12,900 people for fireworks-related injuries. Of those injuries, 54% were to the extremities and 36% were head injuries. Children under the age of 15 accounted for more than one-third of those injuries, according to the National Fire Protection Association.

The risk for serious injury is significant anytime fireworks are handled. That is why individuals need to be especially careful when handling fireworks.

### Keep children away

Never allow young children to ignite or play with fireworks. Even sparklers can be dangerous. Experts say sparklers burn at temperatures between 1,800 and 3,000 degrees, which is hot enough to melt metal. Most people wouldn't let children touch a stove set to 350 degrees, so they must exercise the same caution when using sparklers.

Children may not realize that fireworks can remain hot even after the colors have disappeared. Some fireworks considered "duds" can unexpectedly reignite, even after being moved.

### Exercise caution

Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose nearby in case of fire or to douse used fireworks before discarding them. When setting off fireworks, never point or throw fireworks at another person. Individuals should keep a safe distance immediately after

lighting fireworks.

When shopping for fireworks, buy them only from reputable sources and avoid fireworks packaged in plain brown wrapping, which is normally indicative of fireworks designed for professional displays and not home use.

### Additional safety measures

The following are some additional measures when handling fireworks.

■ Never use fireworks when under the influence.

■ Never ignite devices inside of a container.

■ Maintain a safe distance from people, houses and flammable materials when using fireworks.

■ Wear protective eyewear when using fireworks.

■ Make sure fireworks are legal in your area prior to purchasing them.
