Finally, U.S. 19 work begins anew

Parkway work time lines also released

It took over two months, but the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has found a new contractor to complete the widening on U.S. 19.
But only part of it.
The surety handling the project in the wake of former contractor D.A.B. Constructors' bankruptcy filing in September, has signed a contract with Tampa-based PCS Civil to complete the widening of the 4.7-mile section from West Jump Court to West Fort Island Trail.
Preliminary work began Monday but should be more noticeable soon. The project is slated to wrap up in fall/winter 2023.
The widening project is broken into two separate projects with two separate contractors.
The state is still negotiating with a Palm Harbor-based Nelson Construction to finish the 2.1-mile stretch from West Green Acres to West Jump Court.

Because of driver concerns, FDOT is looking into adjusting the traffic signal timings along that stretch.
"It is good news," said County Commissioner Jeff Kinnard, who chairs the Hernando-Citrus Metropolitan Planning Organization. "They have got a pretty limited window by contract to finish it up. I've heard very good things about both contractors."
Suncoast Parkway
Florida's Turnpike Enterprise has announced the dates and construction funding for the next

phases of the Suncoast Parkway 2 extensions.
■ From State Road 44 to County Road 486: the 3-mile extension is funded for construction in fiscal year 2023. The road is scheduled to terminate about 1,500 feet east of the Pine Ridge entrance.
Cost including right of way acquisition and construction: \$90 million.
■ From State Road 486 to North Citrus Avenue (County Road 495): Design on that 6-mile extension will start Jan. 22, 2022, and be funded for fiscal year 2026 at a cost of \$226 million.

CCSO takes third at international competition

When Citrus County Sheriff's Office SWAT Team personnel get dispatched to a scene, they know they're going into the fray.
"They're the high-risk team," CCSO Col. Elena Vitt said. "They know, in their position, the importance of a life-and-death situation — that's what they do, and they take it serious."
So when a contingent of CCSO Special Weapons and Tactics members traveled earlier in November to compete at the annual SWAT Round-Up International conference in Orlando, their mission to succeed and survive didn't change.
"It's the closest thing you can get to a real-life scenario, stress-wise," SWAT Team Commander Lt. Bobby Lambert said about the Nov. 7-12 event. "It's a test of your physical fitness, your skills as far as shooting, and working together as a team."
After participating in SWAT Round-Up's bout of five feats, CCSO's group of 10 elite deputies placed third overall out of the 42 law enforcement agencies attending.
It's the first time the local SWAT team reached the podium in its 12 years competing at SWAT Round-Up, hosted by the Florida SWAT Association.
"It makes me really proud," Lambert said. "... knowing we're doing everything right and training really hard to make sure we keep our job performance and our fitness

Stay safe this season

Officials warn of holiday dangers

To keep the holidays festive instead of tragic, safety officials are asking that people take precautions against avoidable holiday disasters.
And the winter holidays are often some of the worst when it comes to fires and injuries.
According to the American Red Cross, there are nearly 47,000 fires in the United States during the months of Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's.
On average, one in every 22 home fire started by Christmas trees result in at least one death, according to the Red Cross.
Fires that start because of a candle are four times more likely during the winter holidays because many more people use them as part of their holiday decorations.
During the winter holidays an average of 40 home fires a day are caused by children playing, according to the American Red Cross.
The American Red Cross offers some common sense advice to reduce the risk of home fires.
■ Place Christmas trees, candles, and other holiday decorations at least three feet away from heat sources like fireplaces, portable heaters, radiators, heat vents and candles.
■ Purchase flame retardant metallic or artificial trees. If you purchase a live tree, make sure that it has fresh, green needles that aren't easily

Dunnellon man arrested for child porn

He is already facing drug-dealing charges

A Dunnellon man who resigned as a Citrus County educator after his arrest on drug-dealing charges was jailed again after authorities discovered a stash of child pornography on his electronic devices.

Lake County Sheriff's Office deputies on Tuesday, Nov. 23, took 52-year-old Jeffrey Scott Brake into custody on a Citrus County warrant alleging 13 counts of possessing child pornography, according to the Citrus County Sheriff's Office (CCSO).

Brake was booked into the Lake County jail under a \$195,000 bond.

At the time of his arrest, Brake was out

on bond for his other local felony case connected to the fentanyl, heroin, methamphetamine, digital scale and hypodermic needles CCSO seized in August during a raid of Brake's Citrus Springs homestead.

Prosecutors charged Brake with trafficking in between four and 14 grams of fentanyl, possessing heroin with intent to sell, possessing meth with intent to sell, possessing a residence with intent to traffic in a controlled substance, and possessing drug paraphernalia.

If convicted as charged, Brake would face a prison sentence of up to 75 years.

Brake's arrest in August netted him a

in jail under \$192,000 bond.

\$41,000 bond, which Circuit Court Judge Richard "Ric" Howard reduced in September to \$13,500, which Brake posted bail on.

CCSO searched Brake's home in August on suspicions he was involved with child porn the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children reported to the sheriff's office earlier in 2021.

Brake told investigators he viewed child pornography, according to the sheriff's office, but detectives couldn't immediately locate any illicit materials.

Tiffany Barry, a detective with CCSO's High Tech Crimes Unit, continued searching and found multiple images of child pornography in digital storage devices belonging to Brake, according to the sheriff's office.

An arrest warrant was issued Monday for Brake, who was living out of the county at the time.

According to the Citrus County School District, Brake worked as an educator since August 2001, teaching at seven schools — most recently at Citrus Springs Middle School.

School board members voted to suspend Brake without pay, pending termination, and Brake resigned in lieu of being dismissed.

Crash sends dirt bike underneath SUV, into path of motorcycle

A dirt biker from Broward County had to be hospitalized for severe injuries after an SUV rear ended him on a Dunnellon-area roadway, sending his ride underneath the vehicle.

Another motorcyclist also had to be transported for treatment after his motorcycle collided with the dirt bike once it left the SUV's undercarriage.

According to Florida Highway Patrol (FHP), which didn't identify the motorists involved in the 5:49 p.m. crash from Monday, Nov. 22, the dirt bike and its driver, a 19-year-old Deerfield Beach man, were northbound on North Citrus Avenue just north of West Adirondack Street.

Traveling behind the white Yamaha YZ450 dirt bike was a blue Chevrolet Suburban, which was being followed by a silver Suzuki Boulevard C50 motorcycle.

According to FHP, the Chevrolet's front collided with the Yamaha's rear, causing the dirt bike to overturn onto its side before going underneath the SUV and its driver, a 65-year-old Crystal River man, who was uninjured.

Afterward, the Suzuki and the 70-year-old Dunnellon man driving it collided with the downed Yamaha, causing the motorcycle to fall onto its side as well.

According to FHP, the back-to-back collisions ejected both motorcyclists from their respective rides.

Emergency responders transported the dirt bike's driver to hospital to be treated for serious injuries, and the motorcycle's rider was taken to hospital for non-incapacitating injuries.

Both men were in stable conditions, according to FHP on Tuesday.

Judge rejects Fla. sports betting deal

TALLAHASSEE — Calling it a “fiction,” a Washington, D.C.-based judge late Monday ruled that a deal giving the Seminole Tribe control of online sports betting in Florida violates a federal law that regulates gaming on tribal lands.

U.S. District Judge Dabney Friedrich's ruling invalidated a sports betting plan in one of the nation's most highly sought-after markets and scrapped a deal negotiated by Gov. Ron DeSantis.

Sports betting was included in an agreement, known as a compact, signed by the governor and Seminole Tribe of Florida Chairman Marcellus Osceola, Jr. this spring, and approved by the Legislature during a May special session. The U.S. Department of the Interior, which oversees Indian gambling issues, signed off on the deal in August.

But in Monday's 25-page decision, Friedrich ruled that the deal violates the federal Indian

Gaming Regulatory Act, or IGRA, which creates a framework for gambling activity on tribal lands. The ruling centered on gamblers being able to place sports bets online from across the state, with the wagers run through computer servers on tribal property.

“Altogether, over a dozen provisions in IGRA regulate gaming on ‘Indian lands,’ and none regulate gaming in another location,” she wrote. “It is equally clear that the (Interior Department) secretary must reject compacts that violate IGRA's terms.”

Although the compact deems sports betting to occur at the location of the tribe's servers, “this court cannot accept that fiction,” Friedrich wrote.

“When a federal statute authorizes an activity only at specific locations, parties may not evade that limitation by ‘deeming’ their activity to occur where it, as a factual matter, does not,” she added.

Under the 30-year deal, the Seminoles agreed to pay the state at least \$2.5 billion over the first five years in exchange for

controlling sports betting and being allowed to add craps and roulette to the tribe's casino operations.

The “hub-and-spoke” sports-betting plan was designed to allow gamblers anywhere in Florida — except on other tribal lands — to place bets with mobile apps or other devices, with the compact saying bets “shall be deemed to be exclusively conducted by the tribe.”

Owners of Magic City Casino in Miami-Dade County and Bonita Springs Poker Room in Southwest Florida — which have been owned by the Havenick family for decades — filed a lawsuit against U.S. Department of Interior Secretary Deb Haaland and her agency alleging that the sports-betting plan violated federal laws and would cause a “significant and potentially devastating” impact on their businesses.

Friedrich's ruling, which came weeks after the tribe quietly launched its mobile sports-betting app, injects uncertainty into

the Seminoles' future sports-betting activities. The tribe's Hard Rock app was still accepting wagers Tuesday morning, and a spokesman did not say whether the Seminoles plan to shut it down.

Speaking to reporters Tuesday in Broward County, DeSantis said he negotiated the agreement with the tribe because he felt the state wasn't receiving enough money under a previous deal with the Seminoles, whose Tampa casino is one of the nation's most profitable. The governor, a lawyer, acknowledged that the hub-and-spoke plan was an “unsettled legal issue.”

“They wanted to do the sports (betting), and so we said ‘fine.’ And the reason why I'd said that is because it would probably pass on a referendum anyways. And then if a company gets it, the tribe gets it anyways. So, we felt that that made sense,” he said.

The governor said the state, which is not a party in the lawsuit, would support an appeal by the federal government.

Woman accused of battery on seniors while naked

A local woman entered a residence, took off her clothes and proceeded to hug, grab and sit on the laps of those inside, according to a Citrus County Sheriff's Office arrest affidavit.

Heather Cruz, 35, of Dunnellon, was arrested and charged with resist officer with violence, burglary with battery, three counts of battery on persons 65 years of age or older, two counts of battery on

LEO, battery and exposure of sexual organs. Bond was set at \$48,000.

Deputies responded Sunday, Nov. 21, to a Dunnellon home in reference to a trespassing. Deputies reportedly observed Cruz completely naked and sitting on the front porch.

According to the report, Cruz drove her vehicle to the residence and walked into the home through the side garage door. Once inside, Cruz took

all her clothes off and began to hug and grab the homeowner after being told to stop.

Cruz reportedly sat on the lap of another resident while naked and was told to stop. Afterward, she sat on the lap of another person, who told her to get up. Cruz reportedly said, “You like it.”

Two individuals in the home then tried to get Cruz out and escorted her to the door. At

Jon Batiste leads Grammy nods with 11

Jon Batiste might be the Grammys biggest surprise: The multi-genre performer and recent Oscar winner made such an impression on voters that he scored the most nominations with 11 on Tuesday.

Batiste earned an album of the year nod for "We Are" along with record of the year with "Freedom," a feel-good ode to the city of New Orleans. His nominations span several genres including R&B, jazz, American roots music, classical and music video.

Justin Bieber, Doja Cat and H.E.R. each came away with the second-most nominations with eight by the time the Recording Academy was done announcing its nominees for its Jan. 31 show. Billie Eilish and Olivia Rodrigo both had seven nods.

Along with Batiste's surprise domination, another shock was The Weeknd nabbing three nominations after the pop star claimed he would not allow his label to submit his music. Earlier this year, he angrily slammed the Grammys, calling them "corrupt" after he received zero nominations despite 2020's biggest single, "Blinding Lights."

Even though The Weeknd said he would boycott future Grammys, he still became a nominee for his work on album of the year projects, including Doja Cat's deluxe edition "Planet Her" and Kanye West's "Donda." His

third nomination was for his appearance on West's single "Hurricane," which also features Lil Baby.

Harvey Mason Jr., the Recording Academy's CEO, said he was pleased with the new peer-driven voting system after seeing the list of nominees.

He instituted the 10-3 initiative — which allows the academy's more than 11,000 members to vote for up to 10 categories in three genres. All voters can vote for the top four awards.

The new system replaced the anonymous nominations review committee — a group that determined the contenders for key awards. Some claimed committee members favored projects based on personal relationships and promoted projects they favored and worked on.

For the first time, the

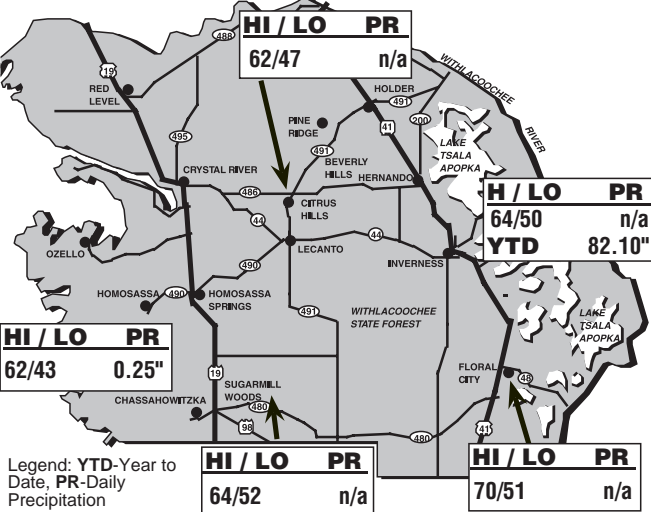
academy expanded the number of nominees in the general field categories from eight to 10. The change impacts categories such as record, album, song of the year and best new artist.

Harvey said the academy increased slots in the general field categories after seeing an uptick voting participation over the past year along with the acceptance of new membership invitations and a high number of more than 21,730 entries submitted for consideration.

Other album of the year nominees include: Bieber's "Justice (Triple Chucks Deluxe)," Eilish's "Happier Than Ever," West's "Donda," Tony Bennett & Lady Gaga's "Love for Sale," Olivia Rodrigo's "Sour," Taylor Swift's "evermore" and Lil Nas X's "MONTERO."

broken. Keep live trees as moist as possible by giving them plenty of water.

■ Make sure that light strings and other holiday decorations are in good condition. Do not use anything with frayed electrical cords and always follow the manufacturer’s instructions.

■ Always unplug tree and holiday lights before leaving home or going to bed. Never use lit candles to decorate a tree. Always extinguish candles before leaving the room or going to bed.

■ Use only sturdy tree stands designed not to tip over. Keep curious pets and children away from Christmas trees.

■ Keep anything that can catch on fire — pot-holders, oven mitts, wooden utensils, paper or plastic bags, food packaging, and towels or curtains — away from your stove top.

■ Designate one person to walk around your home to make sure that all candles and smoking materials are properly extinguished after guests leave.

■ Smoke alarms save lives. A smoke alarm reduces the risk of death because of a fire by nearly half. Install a smoke alarm near your kitchen, on each level of your home, near sleeping areas, and inside and outside bedrooms.

But it isn’t only the risk of home fires that comes with the holidays, according to the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission.

On average, there are about 160 decorating-related injuries each day

during the holiday season, with almost half of the incidents involving falls, according to the safety commission. In the 2019 holiday season, about 14,800 people were treated in emergency rooms due to holiday decorating-related injuries.

The safety commission also asks that you give some thought to your Christmas gifts.

That’s because in 2020 there were nearly 150,000 toy-related, emergency department-treated injuries.

Nonmotorized scooters accounted for 21% of all toy-related, emergency department-treated injuries, according to the safety commission.

The number of scooter injuries increased 17% in fiscal year 2021, from 35,600 scooter injuries reported in 2020, to 41,700 injuries reported in 2021.

Meanwhile, the safety commission also warns about the risk of cooking fires.

■ Cooking fires remain the number one cause of residential fires. The safety commission reports that there are about 360,000 home fires every year, resulting in about 2,400 deaths and nearly 10,400 injuries each year.

■ The worst cooking fire day is Thanksgiving. That’s because an average of 1,700 cooking fires occur on Thanksgiving Day each year, three times the average number of cooking fires on any other day of the year.

As Thanksgiving Day fires continue to surpass most others days, turkey deep fryers are growing in popularity.

Fire departments across the country

respond to more than 1,000 fires involving deep fryers each year, resulting in an average of five deaths, 60 injuries, the destruction of 900 homes and more than \$15 million in property damage, according to the National Fire Protection Association.

The National Fire Protection Association has released a list of what to avoid when using turkey fryers.

A hot oil spill can happen with fryers designed for outdoor use using a stand. The fryer could tip over or collapse causing the hot oil to spill. Newer countertop units using a solid base appear to reduce this risk. NFPA does not believe the risks of either type of turkey fryer to be acceptable because of the large amount of hot oil involved and around the speed and severity of burns.

In deep frying, oil is heated to temperatures of 350° or more. Cooking oil is combustible. If it is heated above its cooking temperature, its vapors can ignite.

Propane-fired turkey fryers must be used outdoors. They are very popular for Thanksgiving. If rain hits the hot cooking oil, the oil may splatter or turn to steam, leading to burns.

Turkeys must be completely thawed before placing in the fryer, a partially thawed turkey will cause the oil to splatter causing serious burns.

The fryers use a lot of oil, usually about five gallons. Extreme caution must be taken when placing and removing the turkey from the fryer to be sure it’s is not dropped back into the fryer, splattering the oil on the chef.

to the level that when the county needs us, we're there to respond and take care of any situation that comes up."

Those who competed were: Lambert; Sgt. Brian Casalvieri; Sgt. Heath Schaffer; deputies Thomas Beagan, John Boudreau, Rudy Danner, Donald Hunter, Kyle Riemer and Geoffrey Blotz; and a confidential SWAT member.

"Our team had everything; we were so well-rounded," Vitt said about watching the SWAT Round-Up performances. "It was so fluid; I just went, 'Wow, that was spectacular.'"

For the sheriff's office, the achievements of its SWAT Team is a testament to how far the specialized force — now 23 members strong — has come.

"We've come a long way," Vitt said. "The level of excellence this team possesses is beyond words. ... The community should be proud knowing that these guys will be there to handle anything possible."

To learn more about SWAT Round-Up International from Nov. 7-12 at the Orange County Sheriff's Office Range, visit floridaswat.org/swat-round-up.

Along with demonstrating its skills at SWAT Round-Up, the CCSO SWAT Team reestablished connections with its counterparts from across the globe. COVID-19 canceled the event in 2020.

"The biggest takeaway we get from this is the networking with other teams, looking at their trainings, tactics, equipment," Lambert said, "being able to talk to team leaders and team commanders from across the nation and world, and asking, 'What works for you best?'"

Law enforcement vendors also set up displays at SWAT Round-Up before the teams train to go head-to-head in front a couple thousand viewers.

"That's pretty

nerve-wracking," Lambert said about the crowds, "and you've got to perform."

SWAT Round-Up grades its contenders in scenarios mirrored after the emergencies they encounter in the field, like hostage rescues with 150-pound dummies and limited ammunition to take down small targets.

"Every shot counts," Lambert said, "and you can't miss."

SWAT Round-Up's minor and technical rules also teach competitors to stay focused on the stressful task at hand.

"And not trying to jump five steps ahead," Lambert said.

Lambert said the toughest challenge was SWAT Round-Up's serpentine course of roughly 20 obstacles, which

kept around 10 teams from finishing.

"For some teams, it's 15-20 minutes; we ran it in 4:44, taking fourth," he said. "It's one of those things the pains really start to set in halfway through, then you have to dig deep and rely on your heart to push through and finish."

To overcome each challenge at SWAT Round-Up, like they do responding to life-threatening calls, CCSO SWAT members didn't stop supporting one another.

"That's the best thing they bring to a critical incident," Lambert said, "that teamwork to make sure we get everybody out safe."

It was teamwork, composure and professionalism that helped CCSO SWAT personnel in October 2020

stop a gunman opening fire on deputies in Hernando without exchanging gunfire themselves.

"The situation ended peacefully with no further loss of life," Lambert said.

Soon after returning from Orlando, the CCSO SWAT Team resumed its regular trainings. Its members were testing out short shooting courses for patrol deputies to try out during the inner-agency Top Shot tournament in December.

CCSO's SWAT members don't know when they have to respond to a call as a unit during either their normal sheriff's office duties or down time with their families, but they'll be ready when they do.

"Our community at times doesn't think that these type

of situations are going to happen here, but they'll happen anywhere," Vitt said. "We're not little Citrus

County anymore, and we need a SWAT team to handle those situations and protect the community."

Santa experience 2021 mix of laps, distancing

NEW YORK — Santa is back this year, but he pleads caution as he continues to tiptoe through the pandemic.

“Be smart. Be caring. If you have the tiniest tickle in your throat, the tiniest feeling, worry about yourself and worry about everybody else, and know Santa will always be there next year,” said 57-year-old Kevin Chesney, who’s been donning the big red suit since he was a kid.

Amid a downturn in Jolly Old Elves — about 15 percent fewer in one large database — Chesney is busier than ever from his North Pole in Moorestown, New Jersey. The photo studio where he works quickly sold out its 4,500 appointments to sit with him and the seven other Santas in the studio’s stable.

They’re among the brave in Santa’s ranks with full-contact visits, lap sitting included, though Chesney wears a mask until just before the photos are taken.

Other Santas might not be wearing masks or plastic face shields, or hanging out in protective snow globes like many did last year, but it seems 50-50 this season that they’re not quite ready for hugs, whispers in their ears for secret wishes, and kids smiling or sobbing on their knees.

Some Santas will remain behind barriers that popped up last year for safety. At Minnesota’s Mall of America, the big man will be housed in a log cabin behind a window with guests seated on benches in front of him. At 169 locations for the outdoor retailers Bass Pro Shops and Cabela’s, benches will also be used, with plastic partitions deployed at some stores for Santa’s photo ops.

to the pandemic. He pivoted to virtual Santa and this year will offer both.

“We think that it would be very irresponsible of us to just ignore it and pretend like everything’s back to normal,” he said of the pandemic. “We’ve hidden some microphones so Santa can hear just fine. I know from our Santa community and knowing so many other Santas that the majority of them are reluctant, highly reluctant, to go back to the way it was before the pandemic. But we also have some who are just like, you know what, I don’t care. Having both of those groups is what’s happening in the country, too.”

Russell Hurd in Royse City, Texas, has been

playing Santa since 2017, after he retired from the Army. He’ll be in his red suit to go with his long — and very real — white beard at the Gaylord Texan Resort & Convention Center near Dallas. His visits with the throngs are distanced and masks are required. He longs for that to end.

“The way it used to be, it’s meaningful for us Santas, too. I mean, we’re human beings. We crave that interaction, but for now we do what we can,” Hurd said.

Hurd is unvaccinated and tests regularly for COVID.

“I know a lot of unvaxxed Santas across the country. I mean, it’s not just Texas,” he said.

Count American Dream, a mega mall of 3 million square feet in East Rutherford, New Jersey, among retailers offering distanced Santa. He’ll be on ice, skating the indoor rink with visitors, and also tooling around with guests in hot pink golf carts.

At Macy’s stores, Santa will be making his list and checking it twice from behind a desk, with guests seated on the other side.

“We’re encouraging everyone to maintain masking throughout their visits,” said Kathleen Wright, senior manager at Macy’s Branded Entertainment. “Santa has been a part of the Macy’s tradition since 1862 so we’re overjoyed that we can safely continue the tradi-

tion this year.”

At Oakbrook Center, a mall in suburban Chicago owned by Brookfield Properties, Santa’s spot is a tricked-out motorhome with his fans allowed inside. Santa will be happening at 117 of 132 malls Brookfield owns in 43 states.

The company is following local mandates on safety protocols but will distance anyone who asks. The same goes for CBL Properties, which owns 63 malls in 24 states and offered Santa visits from a safe distance last year.

“We’re bringing back a

more traditional Santa experience this year,” said CBL spokeswoman Stacey Keating. “Visitors who wish to do so will be able to sit on Santa’s lap or on Santa’s bench. Masks will not be required at the set or during photos unless there’s a local mandate in place.”

And, bonus: “We’re also bringing back pet photo nights with Santa,” she said, “as well as Santa Cares, a reservation-only event that caters to those with sensory sensitivities and for whom the traditional experience may be too overwhelming.”

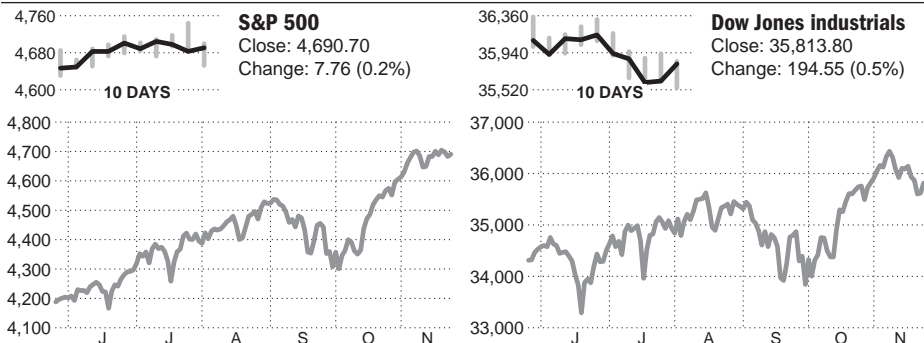

Oil prices rise despite release of crude

Wall Street closed out a wobbly day of trading Tuesday with a mixed finish for the major stock indexes, as gains in banks and energy companies tempered losses elsewhere in the market.


The S&P 500 managed to rise 0.2% after wavering between small gains and losses for much of the day. The benchmark index was coming off two straight drops after setting a record high last Thursday. The Dow Jones Industrial Average rose 0.5%, while the Nasdaq composite closed 0.5% lower.

More than 60% of the stocks in the S&P 500 rose. Banks, energy stocks and household goods companies rose. Those gains were tempered by losses in technology and communication stocks, and a mix of companies that rely on consumer spending.

The price of U.S. crude oil rose 2.3% and wholesale gasoline rose 3.4% despite the fact that President Joe Biden ordered 50 million barrels of oil released from the nation's strategic reserve to help bring down energy costs.

Our nation’s veterans deserved better

The celebration of Veterans Day each year is a reminder to all that the men and women who put on the uniform of the United States armed forces sign a blank check payable to the United States of America for an amount up to and including their very lives.

That reminder, however, was conveniently cast aside by the Congress less than a week before this year’s Veterans Day. On the Friday before Veterans Day, the Congress, unbeknown to most veterans and the general public, saw fit to give short shrift to the more than 9 million veterans enrolled in the VA health care system.

Unlike the blank check that these veterans had given to the United States, the Congress indifferently used them as budget pawns by opting to give them a check stamped “NSF” for insufficient funds, when it axed \$18 billion desperately needed for the modernization of the VA’s health care infrastructure from the \$1.2 trillion infrastructure bill.

The axing of this miniscule amount compared to the \$1.2 trillion bill that’s laden with funding for a myriad of infrastructure and non-infrastructure items was a kick in the teeth for veterans because of its direct impact on the quality and availability of VA health care.

With an estimated three quarters of the VA’s 1,700 health care facilities more than 50 years old and a median age of 58 years, the VA’s

aging and obsolescent infrastructure is inadequate for delivering modern 21st Century health care.

As a result of the VA’s obsolescent infrastructure, many of its hospitals cannot optimally accommodate treatment modalities and technologies developed since they were built decades ago. This adversely impacts the quality of veterans’ care, discourages eligible veterans from seeking care, and negatively affects the morale and effectiveness of VA health care providers.

The VA’s obsolescent infrastructure is also mismatched with the changing geographical distribution and demographics of the current veterans’ population. As such, the closing of chronically underused facilities, the building of new facilities in geographical areas that are underserved, and the redesigning of “male-oriented” facilities to make them more accommodating to the growing number of women veterans are needed to optimize the availability of care.

Given the increasing age and obsolescence of the VA’s health care infrastructure, the axing of the \$18 billion for its modernization was not only shortsighted, but also flat wrong because it devalued the selfless service and willing sacrifices of our nation’s veterans.

Our nation’s veterans, who were willing to give all, certainly deserved better than being treated as budget pawns by the Congress.

Animal services does all it can to save animals

Since the rescue request regarding the Out of the Box (OOTB) animals has been made public,

Facebook has been flooded with lies and accusations about shelter staff.

As a 7-year shelter volunteer, here’s the truth: No one works in animal welfare for the money.

Nineteen employees take care of 200 animals. Regulations are dictated by county, state and federal government.

CCAS has a meager budget, which includes animal control. Human resources and risk management have much to do with why only county employees are permitted access to some animals. Alongside medicating, cleaning, intakes, surrenders, forensic exams, surgeries, confiscations, reclaims, quarantines, OREU, adoption events, microchips, vaccinations, adoptions, interactions, data input, fosters, rescues, volunteers, training, meetings, reports, calls, emails, laundry, donations, supplies and billing. They run play groups, walk, play and love on animals in the early mornings before the shelter opens and after it closes.

Because Robert Schweickert believes he can do anything if it “saves” animals, the court was forced to keep the animals in the shelter for months. He’s done that before. He kept them in horrible

conditions under the guise of “rescue” because to him a horrible life is better than humane euthanasia.

Because of public outcry, those unadoptable dogs might have an extended stay. Some of the people screaming about how terrible the shelter is, had knowledge of the horrible conditions the dogs were kept in at OOTB. They didn’t adopt, foster and find rescues. They didn’t contact law enforcement about dogs with illnesses, injuries, malnutrition and filth. They knew many of those animals were unadoptable. They did not protect those animals. To them, a filthy, isolated, life of pain is better than no life at all.

Spend the day at CCAS, and you’ll see how hard everyone works to improve the lives of animals in their care. Due to the court case and behavioral issues, the OOTB dogs weren’t allowed to associate with volunteers, be fostered or adopted. But at least twice daily, they were walked, given enrichment, provided medical care, and physical affection, by those 19 staffers.

Will things improve because disparaging remarks are made about staff? Will things improve because the public sees and shares false and inflammatory comments online? Some will believe the lies because it lets them cast stones at those who protect

those abused and abandoned rather than the perpetrators.

What it will do is keep away those who donate, adopt, foster and volunteer.

Vaccines making holiday easier

Yet hot spots still remain

The U.S. is facing its second Thanksgiving of the pandemic in better shape than the first time around, thanks to the vaccine, though some regions are seeing surges of COVID-19 cases that could get worse as families travel the country for gatherings that were impossible a year ago.

Nearly 200 million Americans are fully vaccinated. That leaves tens of millions who have yet to get a shot in the arm, some of them out of defiance. Hospitals in the cold Upper Midwest, especially Michigan and Minnesota, are filled with COVID-19 patients who are mostly unvaccinated.

Michigan hospitals reported about 3,800 coronavirus patients at the start of the week, with 20% in intensive care units, numbers that approach the bleakest days of the pandemic's 2020 start. The state had a seven-day new-case rate of 572 per 100,000 people Tuesday, the highest in the nation, followed by New Hampshire at 522.

In the West, New Mexico, Arizona, Colorado, Utah and Montana also ranked high. Some Colorado communities, including Denver, are turning to indoor mask orders to reduce risk, a policy that has also been adopted in the Buffalo, New York, area and Santa Cruz County, California.

The statistics in Michigan are "horrible," said Dr. Matthew Trunsky, a respiratory specialist at Beaumont Health in suburban Detroit.

"We got cold and moved indoors and have huge pockets of unvaccinated people," he said. "You can't have pockets of unvaccinated people who don't want to be masked and not expect to get outbreaks, not expect to lose parents, not expect to lose teachers."

During a recent office visit, he encouraged a patient who uses oxygen to get vaccinated. The patient declined and now is in the hospital with COVID-19, desperately relying on even more oxygen, Trunsky said.

He said he continues to encounter patients and their family members espousing conspiracy theories about the vaccine.

"We've had several people in their 40s die in the last month — 100% unvaccinated," Trunsky said. "It's just so incredibly sad to see a woman die with teenagers. Especially with that age group, it's nearly 100% preventable."

In Detroit, where less than 40% of eligible residents were fully vaccinated, Mayor Mike Duggan said hospitalizations have doubled since early November.

"We have far too many people in this country that we have lost because they believed some nonsense on the internet and decided not to get the vaccine," said Duggan, a former hospital executive.

Biden dips into reserve

US to release
50 million
barrels of oil

WASHINGTON — President Joe Biden on Tuesday ordered a record 50 million barrels of oil released from America's strategic reserve, aiming to bring down gasoline and other costs, in coordination with other major energy consuming nations including India, the United Kingdom and China.

The U.S. action is focused on helping Americans coping with higher fuel and other prices ahead of Thanksgiving and winter holiday travel. Gasoline prices are at about \$3.40 a gallon, more than 50% higher than a year ago, according to the American Automobile Association.

"While our combined actions will not solve the problems of high gas prices overnight, it will make a difference," Biden promised in remarks at the White House. "It will take time, but before long you should see the price of gas drop where you fill up your tank."

The government will begin to move barrels into the market in mid- to late-December. Gasoline usually responds at a lag to changes in oil prices, and administration officials suggested this is one of several steps toward ultimately bringing down costs.

Oil prices had dropped in the days ahead of the announced withdrawals, a sign that investors were anticipating the moves that could bring a combined 70 million to 80 million barrels of oil onto global markets. But in trading after the announcement, prices shot up roughly 2% instead of falling.

The market was expecting the news, and traders may have been underwhelmed when they saw the details, said Claudio Galimberti, senior vice president for oil markets at Rystad Energy.

"The problem is that everybody knows that this measure is temporary," Galimberti said. "So once it is stopped, then if demand continues to be above supply like it is right now, then you're back to square one."

Shortly after the U.S. announcement, India said it would release 5 million barrels from its strategic reserves. The British government confirmed it will release up to 1.5 million barrels from its stockpile. Japan and South Korea are also participating, and U.S. officials said it's the biggest coordinated release from global strategic reserves.

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson's spokesman, Max Blain, said it was "a sensible and measured step to support global markets" during the pandemic recovery. Blain added that the country's

companies will be authorized but not compelled to participate in the release.

Despite all the optimistic statements, the actions by the U.S. and others risk counter moves by Gulf nations, especially Saudi Arabia, and by Russia. Saudi Arabia and other Gulf countries have made clear they intend to control supply to keep prices high for the time being.

As word spread in recent days of a coming joint release from U.S. and other countries' reserves, there were warnings from OPEC interests that those countries may respond in turn, reneging on promises to increase supplies in coming months.

Wyoming Sen. John Barrasso was among Republicans who criticized Biden's announcement. The No. 3 Senate Republican said the underlying issue is restrictions on domestic production by the administration.

"Begging OPEC and Russia to increase production and now using the Strategic Petroleum Reserve are desperate attempts to address a

Biden-caused disaster," Barrasso said. "They're not substitutes for American energy production."

Biden has scrambled to reshape much of his economic agenda around the issue of inflation, saying that his recently passed \$1 trillion infrastructure package will reduce price pressures by making it more efficient and cheaper to transport goods.

Republican lawmakers have hammered the administration for inflation, hitting a 31-year high in October. The consumer price index has soared 6.2% from a year ago — the biggest 12-month jump since 1990.

The Strategic Petroleum Reserve is an emergency stockpile to preserve access to oil in case of natural disasters, national security issues and other events. Maintained by the Energy Department, the reserves are stored in caverns created in salt domes along the Texas and Louisiana Gulf Coasts. There are roughly 605 million barrels of petroleum in the reserve.

Child 6th death in parade crash

Suspect charged in
Waukesha tragedy

An 8-year-old boy became the sixth person to die Tuesday as a result of a man driving his SUV into a suburban Milwaukee Christmas parade, with a criminal complaint alleging that the suspect in the case steered side-to-side with the intent of striking marchers and spectators.

Darrell Brooks Jr., 39, was charged with five counts of first-degree intentional homicide, a charge that carries a mandatory life sentence if convicted. He rocked back and forth in his seat and cried throughout his court hearing on Tuesday, his attorney's arm on his back, as the charges against him were detailed. His bail was set at \$5 million, and a preliminary hearing was scheduled for Jan. 14.

"The nature of this offense is shocking," said Waukesha Court Commissioner Kevin Costello.

Additional charges related to the sixth death and the more than 60 people injured will be coming later this week or next, said Waukesha County District Attorney Susan Oppen. The criminal complaint said 62 people were injured, up from the 48 previously announced by police.

Brooks is accused of speeding away from police and entering the Waukesha Christmas parade on Sunday night, refusing to stop even as an officer banged on the hood of his SUV. Another officer fired three shots into the vehicle, but it did not stop.

Five people ranging in age from 52 to 81 were pronounced dead within hours. Jackson Sparks, 8, was

the first of many injured children to have died. He was walking in the parade with his 12-year-old brother Tucker, who was injured in the crash and was being discharged from the hospital, according to his GoFundMe page.

"This afternoon, our dear Jackson has sadly succumbed to his injuries and passed away," the page's organizer, Alyssa Albro, wrote.

The city's livestream video and bystander video captured the chaotic scene when an SUV sped along the parade route and then into the crowd. Several of those injured remain in critical condition.

According to the criminal complaint, witnesses told police that the vehicle "appeared to be

intentionally moving side to side," with no attempt to slow down or stop as it struck multiple people and sent bodies and objects flying.

Brooks ignored several attempts to stop him, according to the criminal complaint.

The complaint said one witness who spoke with police said the SUV "continued to drive in a zig zag motion. It was like the SUV was trying to avoid vehicles, not people. There was no attempt made by the vehicle to stop, much less slow down."

Waukesha Police Chief Dan Thompson said Brooks was leaving the scene of a domestic dispute that had taken place just minutes earlier when he drove into the parade route.

Jury awards \$26M in damages for Unite the Right violence

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. — A jury ordered 17 white nationalist leaders and organizations to pay more than \$26 million in damages Tuesday over the violence that erupted during the deadly 2017 Unite the Right rally in Charlottesville in 2017.

After a nearly monthlong civil trial, the jury in U.S. District Court deadlocked on two key claims but found the white nationalists liable on four other claims in the lawsuit filed by nine people who suffered physical or emotional injuries during the two days of demonstrations.

Attorney Roberta Kaplan said the plaintiffs' lawyers plan to refile the suit so a new jury can decide the two deadlocked claims. She called the amount of damages awarded from the other counts "eye opening."

"That sends a loud message," Kaplan said.

Jury gets case of white men charged in Arbery's death

BRUNSWICK, Ga. — Jurors in the case of three white men charged with killing Ahmaud Arbery deliberated for about six hours Tuesday without reaching a verdict as they weighed prosecution arguments that the defendants provoked the fatal confrontation against defense attorneys' insistence that their clients acted in self-defense.

After initially indicating they wanted to work into the evening, the jurors were soon dismissed by the judge with instructions to resume deliberations Wednesday morning.

"We are in the process of working to reach a verdict," the foreperson told Superior Court Judge Timothy Walmsley.

Bus crashes, catches fire in Bulgaria; at least 45 dead

SOFIA, Bulgaria — A bus carrying tourists back to North Macedonia crashed and caught fire in western Bulgaria early Tuesday, killing at least 45 people, including a dozen children, authorities said. DNA tests were being carried out to identify the victims.

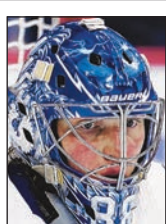
The bus apparently ripped through a guardrail on a highway, though authorities said the cause was still under investigation. Photos taken shortly after the crash showed the vehicle engulfed in flames as plumes of thick, black smoke rose. Daylight revealed a burned-out shell with all of its windows blown out, sitting in the median. A portion of the guardrail was lying in the road.

Bucs shift attention to road woes

Super Bowl champs are 5-0 at home stadium

TAMPA — Winning for the first time in nearly a month was a relief for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, who now face the challenge of finding a way to regain their mojo on the road.

The Super Bowl champions are 5-0 at home this season compared to 2-3 away from Raymond James Stadium, where they haven't lost a game since last Thanksgiving weekend. They finished last season on an eight-game winning streak that included three road playoff wins.

This year, they've been an entirely different team on the road, where turnovers, costly penalties and inconsistency on defense have made it much more difficult to win.

Monday night's 30-10 victory over the New York Giants stopped a two-game skid that seemed longer because surprising road losses to New Orleans

and Washington were wrapped around the team's bye week.

"As Dorothy would say, there's no place like home," coach Bruce Arians said, noting his team played smarter and with a sense of urgency and passion that was absent the previous two games.

"It's never been easy on the road," Arians added. "It's not just us. It's everybody."

The Bucs (7-3) will aim to reverse the trend when they visit the surging Indianapolis Colts (6-5) on Sunday. Arians reiterated it's not difficult to figure out what his players need to do better to end the road woes.

"We have to protect the football. Protect the football, eliminate the penalties and we'll be fine," the coach said.

"For us right now, it's being able to take this game, build off it and take it on the road," Arians added. "Hopefully, start winning on the road the rest of the way."

WHAT'S WORKING

Tom Brady avoided his first three-game losing streak since 2002 by rebounding from turning over the ball five times in losses to New Orleans and Washington to throwing for 307 yards and two touchdowns against the

Giants. That boosted his season totals to 3,177 yards passing and a league-leading 29 TDs.

Bolts blank Flyers

Vasilevskiy makes 34 saves in 4-0 victory

TAMPA — Andrei Vasilevskiy made 34 saves, Zach Bogosian and Corey Perry both ended lengthy goal droughts, and the Tampa Bay Lightning beat the Philadelphia Flyers 4-0 on Tuesday night.

Vasilevskiy made a nifty first-period glove save on Claude Giroux's left-circle shot. The 2021 Conn Smythe Trophy winner as the playoffs MVP has a 199-86-22 career record. It was his first shutout this season and 27th overall.

"There's no doubt that he is the best goaltender in the world right now," Flyers coach Alain Vigneault said. "He's won two Stanley Cups. He wants to play every game. A big body, great work ethic. He's the standard right now."

Bogosian stopped a 62-game goal drought, dating to a goal against Detroit on Jan. 12, 2020 when he was with Buffalo. Perry got his 387th career goal after going 37 games without one.

"You're happy for those guys," Tampa Bay coach Jon Cooper said.

Steven Stamkos had a goal and two assists for the Lightning, who have points in 11 of the last 12 games (9-1-2). Alex Barré-Boulet had the other goal and Bogosian added an assist.

Stamkos, with 493 points, moved past Martin St. Louis (491) for the most points at home by a Tampa Bay player.

Philadelphia's Carter Hart stopped 31 shots, including a number of strong saves. The Flyers have scored two or fewer goals in 10 of the last 12 games.

"For the last 30 minutes of the game, we weren't very good," Vigneault said. "Our passing game was off, created numerous amount of Grade-A opportunities for them. They were the better team."

Bogosian opened the scoring from the top of the left circle 2:28 into the game.

Stamkos and Perry, from in-close during a delayed penalty, made it 3-0 in the second.

Cincinnati moves into playoff position

Ohio State rises up to No. 2 spot

Cincinnati moved into position to make the College Football Playoff on Tuesday night, climbing a spot to fourth behind Georgia, Ohio State and Alabama.

A team from outside the Power Five conferences has never been selected for the semifinals in the previous seven years of the College Football Playoff.

Ohio State (10-1) moved up to No. 2 from fourth on the strength of a lopsided victory against Michigan State, and Alabama (10-1) slipped back a spot to three. Oregon's loss to Utah cleared space in the top four and Cincinnati took it, moving up one spot.

Heading into the final full weekend of games, one loaded with playoff and conference championship implications, Cincinnati (11-0) has a realistic path to a playoff spot no matter what happens around the Bearcats.

"We keep trying to stress to our guys we have a ways to go," Cincinnati coach Luke Fickell said in an interview with ESPN. "The recognition is well deserved."

Cincinnati plays at East Carolina (7-4) on Friday and then meets Houston (10-1), ranked 24th by the committee, in the American Athletic Conference championship game on Dec. 4.

Before this season, no team from a so-called Group of Five conference had ever been ranked better than seventh by the CFP selection committee.

Michigan (10-1) is fifth heading into its game against Ohio State that should produce the Big Ten's best shot to make the playoff.

Notre Dame (10-1) is sixth. The Fighting Irish's only loss is to Cincinnati.

Oklahoma State (10-1) at seventh is the highest ranked Big 12 team.

A rivalry based on performance, another on words

NAPLES — Golf loves a good rivalry, and right now there would seem to be something for everyone, depending on tastes.

One is based on performance and admiration.

“Honestly, it was the ‘Jin Young Ko Show’ today. It was really cool to witness,” Nelly Korda said Sunday after the South Korean star shot a tournament-best 63 from the final group on the last day of the season to beat her out for LPGA player of the year.

The other is rooted in petty arguments and trash talk.

“My first impression of him was he was always a little cocky, just a little like, ‘I’m too cool for this game.’ That was my first impression,” Bryson DeChambeau said when asked about Brooks Koepka. “And he’s kind of held up those standards so far.”

They will settle it Friday in Las Vegas in the latest iteration of “The Match,” a made-for-TV exhibition, this one over 12 holes.

Why only 12 holes?

“Eighteen holes with him is a long time,” Koepka said Monday evening. “I don’t want to be around him as much anybody else.”

Ko and Korda could use another year like this one before their dominance of the LPGA Tour can really be called a rivalry. But it has all the ingredients, at least on the course.

They swapped places at

No. 1 in the world over the last month, and the season ended with Korda at the top of the women’s ranking by the slimmest of margins. Both had a sub-69 scoring average — no one had done that on the LPGA Tour since Annika Sorenstam in 2002.

And while each won five times, the prizes for the 23-year-old American were a little glossier. One was an Olympic gold medal Korda keeps in a sock to prevent it from getting scratched. The other was from the Women’s PGA Championship, her first major.

Ko stole the show at the end. “Nelly has great year — gold medal, win major tournament and three more wins,” Ko said. “Well, I feel a little sad for Nelly. I was a little luckier than her.”

The season-ending CME Group Tour Championship not only offered the richest prize in women’s golf at \$1.5 million, it decided the LPGA’s most prestigious award between the best two players. Ko and Korda were part of a four-way tie for the lead going into the last round.

Ko had reason to withdraw after the first round due to an injury to her left wrist that had troubled her since May. She couldn’t practice early in the week. To avoid aggravating her wrist, she only took full swings with a wedge during her warm-up on the range.

She not only shattered the tournament scoring record by five shots, Ko hit the final 63 greens in regulation, a staggering display of consistency.

“This is great for women’s golf and great for our tour,” Lydia Ko said of their battle.

What was great for men’s golf was seeing a video of Tiger Woods swinging a golf club again, nearly nine months after a car accident that shattered bones in his right leg. Never mind that it was only one wedge and the video lasted all of three seconds.

That might make 12 holes of the big match in Las Vegas feel like an eternity. But then, it’s good to at least get this out of the way.

“I think the whole word wants to see it,” said Koepka, presumably using a figure of speech since at least a small part of the world will be busy searching for Black Friday deals the day after Thanksgiving.

Koepka and DeChambeau’s dislike for each apparently goes back to the first time they played together in the final round of the 2016 Masters.

“I never really liked him,” Koepka said.

It became public at Liberty National in 2019 at the start of the PGA Tour postseason.

Koepka had been vocal about slow play, and it was clear DeChambeau — who was glacial — was the target. So when DeChambeau saw Koepka’s caddie talking to two reporters on the practice green, he walked over and told Ricky Elliott to tell his boss that if Koepka had any problems he could always go straight to him.

“You can tell him that,” Elliott

replied, and sure enough, that’s how it unfolded a short time later. And that supposedly was the end of it.

But then DeChambeau was doing a live streaming video game on Twitch when he was overheard making fun of Koepka by saying “he didn’t have any abs” in ESPN’s “Body Issue” magazine.

In Koepka’s mind, it was game on. And on it went.

There was the leaked video of Koepka rolling his eyes as DeChambeau walked behind him at the PGA Championship. Fans began shouting “Brooksie” at DeChambeau.

Both stand to make money off this silly social media dispute, and there remains no small measure of skepticism that it’s all staged as part of the hype Las Vegas loves.

The PGA Tour is offering a \$40 million bonus pool for a “Player Impact Program” that is measured by various metrics, and DeChambeau suspects that’s what has been driving Koepka.

“It’s disgusting the way the guy has tried to knock me down,” DeChambeau said. “There’s no need for it in the game of golf. For what reason? I don’t know. Maybe he’s jealous and wants to get part of that PIP money from the tour.”

Koepka figures he’s already 1 up in talking smack. DeChambeau looks forward to a chance at “kicking his butt.”

One can only hope that what happens in Las Vegas really does stay there.

IS CINCINNATI IN CONTROL OF ITS PLAYOFF HOPES?

It certainly looks that way, but calling it a slam dunk is probably an overstatement. Here is the scenario that makes things most precarious for the

Bearcats even if they stay unbeaten.

— Alabama beats Georgia in the Southeastern Conference championship game, leaving both the Crimson Tide and Bulldogs 12-1 and easy choices to be in the field of four. Alabama with a competitive loss to Georgia will also clearly still be in the mix, though no team with two losses has ever made the playoff.

If any team is going to break that precedent, Alabama is a good bet.

Barta said of the Tide and Ohio State: “Both are considered to be great teams, not just good teams.”

— The winner of Ohio State-Michigan goes on to win the Big Ten, making that team a lock to grab a playoff spot.

— Oklahoma State — or maybe Oklahoma — wins out to leave the Big 12 champion 12-1.

Can Cincinnati hold off a 12-1 Big 12 champion or an 11-2 Alabama with a close loss to Georgia?

No Group of Five team has ever been particularly close to finishing in the top four, even the unbeaten ones like UCF in 2017 and ‘18 and Cincinnati last season.

Coming into this season there was little reason to believe a Power Five conference champion with one-loss would be in danger of finishing behind a unbeaten G5 team.

So until it actually happens, feel free to hold onto a little bit of skepticism.



Pilot International celebrates its 100th anniversary

Pilot International had a centennial celebration last month on Founders Day, Oct. 18, 2021.

We have three different Pilot Clubs here in Citrus County — the Crystal River Pilot Club, the Gulf to Lakes Pilot Club and the Rails 2 Trails Pilot Club.

As with other organizations some clubs in and out of the country have aged out, but new ones always emerge.

They are not actual Pilots, but a huge service club that stands for friendship and service that is part of Pilot International, which is also in other countries with new ones pending.

The club’s focus is on brain safety and supporting their community’s needs. They also do a puppet show for children and in nursing homes to educate the importance of brain safety.

According to the Pilot international website, they have thousands and thousands of members with clubs all over the U.S. and around the world.

They were founded Oct. 18, 1921, in Macon, Georgia, by Elizabeth Leonard and 40 local businesswomen. Lucy B. Allen was the first president.

Collett Cross is the current president of Pilot International that has headquarters in Macon, Georgia. Cross is from the Mississippi district.

The name “Pilot” was motivated because of the riverboat pilots during that era who represented leadership and guidance.

Pilot club principles are “friendship and service,” their motto is “True Course Ever” and their emblem is a “riverboats pilot’s wheel with eight spokes.”

Collett Cross said, “Pilot International celebrated twice for their 100th year: First in Atlanta, Georgia, this summer at their national Convention in July and again on Founders Day, Oct. 18, 2021, the actual 100th year date, in Macon, Georgia.” with numerous club members from all over attending.

Besides having clubs all over the U.S., “Pilot Clubs are in Japan, Bahamas and South Africa,” said Cross. “The Turks and Caicos are now approved, and we are talking to two other countries — Austria and Canada.”

During Pilots centennial celebration, President Cross “challenges each club to touch 100 lives during the 2021-2022 year.”

Kathryn Christmas, president of the Gulf to Lakes Pilot Club, treasurer of Pilot Scholarship House Foundation and membership coordinator appointed by the Pilot Florida district governor, attended the first 100th celebration in Atlanta with Diana Kingree, president of the Rails 2 Trails club.

“It was a beautiful celebration and I got to take a lovely educational tour on a bus while there and the different flags displayed moved us to tears,” Christmas said.

“We have three scholarship houses for girls in college and one for boys, with a fifth one in the works,” she noted.

Jeanmarie Patterson is also in the GTLP club was invited by her friend and longtime Pilot

Wally Faherty to a meeting. Then, she was hooked on Pilots especially because of their support for brain injuries, Pilot scholarship houses for those qualified in college who need free housing and her interest in the Brain Minders program of puppets and coloring books to educate the importance of brain health.

“I love the mission of Pilot International, and being a Pilot member has offered me to come together with like-minded ladies and serve Citrus County in friendship and service,” Patterson said.

Some of their county projects are CREST School, Find-M’ Friends, Sheriff’s Youth Ranches, Pilots Scholarship Houses, and Safe Harbor Fund, helping those with natural disasters, etc.

Nancy Wilson is president of the Crystal River Pilot Club. Her sponsor was Stephanie Price, a member since 2004.

“We have emeritus members who joined in 1979,” Wilson said.

“We are dedicated, committed, and loyal — we Pilots are to ‘Do More, Care More and Be More’ in our community and beyond, providing support both hands on and need encouraging,” Wilson said.

The Crystal River club gives two \$750 scholarships to Crystal River High students in memory of Pilot Barbara Utsey, promote brain safety, caring for families in need and encourage youth leadership and development.

“Another way we ‘Care More’ is giving Pick Me Ups to serving caregivers — first responders, residents and employees at assisted living units,” Wilson said.

Are you dreaming of turkey for Thanksgiving? Turkey is just one of many things we have to be thankful for. The Mini Page takes a look at how fortunate many people are today.

Be thankful... for education



More than 175 million kids around the world are not enrolled in preschool, according to the United Nations (U.N.). Also, the U.N. reports 6 out of 10 kids leave elementary school without reaching basic levels of reading and math.

Many more girls than boys are never given the chance to learn to read and write.

In many countries, when kids do get to go to school, conditions may be as hard as in pioneer times. They might sit on dirt floors, go without heat or air conditioning, not get lunch and not have books or paper.

... for nearby schools

Your parents may drive you to school, or you can take a bus, bike or walk. In the 1880s in America, kids in rural, or country, areas may have lived 3 to 5 miles from the school.

Sometimes students got to ride to school on a horse or in a wagon. But most walked miles every day in all types of weather.

... for school workers

Pioneer kids had to help clean the school and outdoor bathrooms. Even third graders helped chop wood for the heating stove.

... for books

Before the 1900s, books were very expensive. Students shared schoolbooks if they were lucky enough to have them. Kids might not have had any books other than the Bible. In pioneer America, few people had more than one or two books at home. No “Diary of a Wimpy Kid” or “Big Nate” books for those children!



After about 1850, most students got more variety. “The McGuffey Reader” came into classrooms with poems, plays, stories and speeches. Editions got more difficult as the kids advanced.

... for hand-washing

The World Health Organization (WHO) and UNICEF say about 3 billion people around the world lack facilities to wash their hands at home. This includes 75% of the population in sub-Saharan Africa, which is approximately 767 million people.

... for running water

More than 1 out of every 6 people in the world cannot get as much fresh water as they need.

According to WHO, more than 785 million people do not have enough safe water for drinking, cooking and cleaning needs. People may have to walk hours each day to get their family’s water. Usually this job falls to girls. Many girls are unable to go to school because they have to spend so many hours getting water.

... for bathrooms

Be thankful for bathrooms. People in the 1800s had to go to an outdoor bathroom called a privy.

In the privy, a person sat on a wooden bench with a hole cut in it. But first, people would circle a stick in the hole, making sure no spiders were waiting to come up and bite them. Snakes might have been on the privy floor.

In the night, people could use the chamber pot kept under their bed. But they’d have to clean it, too. Eww!

What is one of the most inexcusable errors often made at the bridge table?
Look at today's North-South hands. How should South play in five clubs after West leads the spade king? (Lead king from ace-king when the contract is higher than four no-trump and in a suit that you and your partner bid and raised.)
This deal occurred during a seven-table pair event in Europe some years ago. One lucky East-West pair made four spades doubled. Two North-South pairs went down in six clubs. The others were in five clubs.
If West had led the diamond nine, he would have defeated the contract immediately. If he had chosen a heart or a club, declarer would have failed more slowly. But everyone led a top spade.
Now each declarer had to be careful. If he made the reasonable assumption that he would lose two diamonds, his 11 tricks had to be five trumps, two top hearts, two established diamonds and two spade ruffs in dummy. However, entries were in short supply.
The correct play, found by four declarers, was to ruff the spade lead high in the dummy, cross to hand with a trump, ruff another spade high, cash the top hearts, discarding the last spade, and draw trumps. Finally, lead a diamond to the 10. South lost two diamond tricks, but that was all.
Everyone is told not to play immediately after the dummy is tabled. But even experts err every so often. On this deal, one anonymous expert declarer ended with egg on his face. As soon as the dummy appeared, he ruffed the spade lead low. He couldn't recover.
