Potential threat made to Citrus **High School**

Citrus High School principal Laura Mason emailed staff and students on Wednesday afternoon about a potential threat against the school.

According to Mason's announcement, it was reportedly made on social media. The threat is being investigated, but has not been confirmed by the district or the Citrus County Sheriff's Office.

Citrus County School District spokeswoman Lindsay Blair added that neither CCSO or the district have been able to locate the source of the alleged threat.

At this time, Mason wrote, the threat is considered unsubstantiated.

School bus crashes, no injuries

A Citrus County School District bus was involved in a vehicle crash just before 3:15 p.m. Oct. 27 in the northbound lane on the corner of State Road 44 (Gulf-to-Lake Highway) and County Road 491 (Lecanto Highway).

School district spokeswoman Lindsay Blair said the Forest Ridge Elementary school bus was returning from a kindergarten field trip. Twenty-nine students were on board.

According to staff reports, another school bus arrived at the scene to transport students and personnel back to campus. At this time, no known injuries have been reported.

County to price Pirates Cove

Commission votes 3-2 to negotiate figures, but not to expend county funds

A divided county commission Tuesday voted to direct staff to negotiate a purchase price for the Pirate's Cove property at the end of Ozello Trail for use as a passive park.

Commissioners Ron Kitchen Jr. and Scott Carnahan adamantly opposed the move and were the sole nay votes.

"I don't think our staff

needs to get involved," Carnahan said.

If Ozello wants to negotiate with the real estate agent, fine, he said. But he didn't want to expend county resources or use taxpayer dollars to buy the property — if it comes to that.

Kitchen called this another example of "government mission creep" overextending the county's reach and taking on too many projects at one time. There are more important priorities, he said, including repaving of roads.

'We don't need any more parks," Kitchen said. Kitchen likened this

move to what the board did in 2017 when a group of Homosassa residents asked for assistance in securing funding to buy property along the Homosassa River for a park.

County commissioners offered support, but said they would not put any county taxes into the plan.

And they didn't. **But Commissioner Jeff**

Kinnard said it won't hurt to at least find out how much it will cost the county if it wants to buy the property. He disagreed with Kitchen about the necessity of parks, especially as the county grows.

"It is the county's responsibility to build parks," he said, "Our county is growing up."

Kinnard said the purchase would come from

state grants or impact fee money — not one dime of taxpayer money would be used, he said.

Kinnard envisions the Pirate's Cove property as a world-class "passive park," with picnic tables and grills. It would be a tourist draw, he said.

Pirate's Cove is a pristine 3.6-acre site with 750 feet of water frontage and abuts an existing park. The property has sat idle

Citrus County's halls of justice are over a year and a half away from getting

Since late September 2021, construction crews have been gutting 112 N. Apopka Ave. next door to the county courthouse in Inverness, setting the stage for a courthouse annex remodel to provide extra room for the local judiciary.

Transforming what was once an elections office and Coca-Cola bottling plant into a satellite courthouse is expected to take around 20 months, the county's facilities management director said Monday, Oct. 25.

among the 66 veterans and 66 guardians to take an Honor Flight to Washington, D.C.

Since 2005, Honor Flight, a national organization, has taken veterans to Washington at no cost to them. Their fares are paid through donations raised by local organizations, individuals and service clubs.

To date, about 245,000 veterans from around the nation have taken an Honor Flight.

The Oct. 20 flight was courtesy of the Villages Honor Flight, which flies out of the Orlando Sanford International Airport in Sanford.

'It was their 50th Honor Flight and they wanted to make it extra special, and they did," Morrison said.

On Friday, Oct. 22, the two men sat down together at Morrison's house to talk about their experiences of that day.

"The trip can be described in one word," Morrison said, "Wow."

"Double wow for me," Graham said.

The agenda is basically the same for every Honor Flight. The veterans leave early in the morning and spend the day visiting some of the iconic memorials and monuments around Washington, D.C., including the Air Force Memorial, Korean War Memorial, The Vietnam War Memorial ("the wall"), the World War II Memorial, Arlington National lington Cemetery, the Marine Corps War Memorial ("Iwo Jima") and others.

There are USO "girls" singing, bagpipes playing, flags waving, mail call with handwritten letters from students to the veterans, patriotic songs, and one-on-one care from a volunteer guardian.








Hard Rock considering two NYC-area casinos 8 miles apart

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. — Hard Rock wants to build a casino in or near New York City, even as it moves forward with a plan to build another one in northern New Jersey, about 8 miles away.

Jim Allen, chairperson of the global gambling, entertainment and hospitality company owned by Florida's Seminole Indian tribe, said Tuesday that Hard Rock will submit an expression of interest to New York officials by the Dec. 10 deadline.

New York has three remaining casino licenses to be awarded in the downstate region that includes New York City, which has long been the holy grail for the casino industry, given the region's population and wealth.

Speaking at the East Coast Gaming Congress in Atlantic City, Allen said Hard Rock has been planning a New York project ever since the possibility was announced seven years ago.

Afterward, Allen said in an interview that the company is not abandoning a plan it unveiled in 2015 to build a casino resort at the Meadowlands Racetrack just outside New York City.

"We're interested in both markets, and if God is good enough to allow us to operate in both, we would be happy to do so," he said.

Hard Rock would need permission from New Jersey voters to build in the Meadowlands. They resoundingly rejected a plan in 2016 that would have authorized casinos outside Atlantic City, the only place in New Jersey they are permitted.

Allen, whose company spent a half-billion dollars to open a Hard Rock casino in Atlantic City in 2018, said the New York and northern New Jersey market can support numerous casinos.

Young women boycott UK nightclubs over 'spiking' concerns

LONDON — Young women across the U.K. boycotted nightclubs and pubs Wednesday as university towns and cities join in a national "girls night in" protest after increasing reports of drink spiking and students being drugged by needle

The online campaign, which has gained momentum in university cities including Bristol, Brighton and Nottingham, wants to raise awareness about women's safety and demand more urgent action by the government and nightclubs to prevent "date rape" drugs from being brought into clubs. boycotts in British cities this week have gathered thousands of followers on social media.

The protests came after a sharp rise in recent months of reports of drink spiking and needle "spiking" — where women report being injected with drugs in the back or in the leg at nightclubs as students return to campuses after a long spell away due to the coronavirus pandemic.

The National Police Chiefs' Council said there have been 198 confirmed reports of drink spiking in September and October across the U.K., and 24 reports of people being injected while on nights out.

Police in Nottingham, central England, said last week that extra officers were being put on patrol on the weekends to ensure people could enjoy a safe night out. The force said that since Oct. 2, 14 women and a man have alleged being spiked "by something sharp, as opposed to a traditional method of contaminated alcoholic drinks."





One of the benefits of the county ending its contract with Nature Coast for ambulance service and having the fire department take over the job was firefighters and ambulance workers being cross trained to serve both functions.

But Stevens told the Chronicle Wednesday he won't force that issue, but rather allow employees in the two groups to cross train at their own pace and over time.

"Let that transition take care of itself," Stevens said. "Eventually we'll have that organization (that the county wants).

The county will provide the educational opportunities to cross train, but "I'm not going to force them," Stevens said.

There will be firefighters and paramedics eager to expand their skills, but others preferring to focus on one area of emergency

"Everybody in the organization has value," he said.

But certification as both a firefighter and a paramedic is not for everyone, he said.

"It's a hard bridge to cross. It's hard to keep up," Stevens said of the certification process that must be renewed every two years.

County Administrator Randy Oliver told the Chronicle that cross training won't always work.

One in 10 people typically have height problems if they have to climb a ladder, he said. Others feel too claustrophobic when they put on a respirator mask.

To staff ambulances and meet peak demand levels, Stevens said he had to hire additional paramedics and is still looking to hire more.

"They were working their paramedics to death," he said of Nature Coast.

The 2022 budget for the ambulance service is \$12.98 million.

Stevens said the transition isn't without its problems.

without the staff to man cost \$30,000 each. them all, he said.

The county took 16 and paid off what was still owed for them. Six of those were new. The remaining 10 had some problems, either mechanical or they weren't properly supplied with medical equipment or materials, Stevens said.

"They were below my standard," he said.

Two broke down while transporting patients in October:

The county ordered six new ambulances, but Stevens told the Chronicle he will have to wait as long as a year to get them. They cost \$188,000 each.

The department is hiring two additional mechanics and staff to ensure fire and ambulance stations are adequately equipped and vehicles are maintained.

The next few coming years will have their own challenges for EMS and its facilities.

Ambulance crews share space at firehouses, but the county will have to decide what to do with Nature Coast's former facilities, Stevens said. The nonprofit organization had five standalone facilities, including a maintenance yard.

The county remodeled its fire houses, but adding ambulance crews may call for additional changes to the buildings, he said.

Stevens also wants to work closer with local high schools to involve students in possible careers as paramedics or firefighters and begin training programs while they still attend

school. There have also been other surprises.

Ambulance stretchers must be recertified every year. They are designed to

25 ambulances but was transporting patients. They

Stevens told the Chronicle they were not all recertified as they should have been, so that will have to be remedied.

Luckily, both the county's fire department and Nature Coast used the same medical director, so the ambulance crews' transition to the county didn't require additional certification or testing, Stevens said.

And now that both services are under the same fire rescue department, Stevens said they can better coordinate. That means if a fire rescue vehicle arrives on scene and no one wants or needs medical treatment, firefighters can notify ambulance crews they're not needed and they can return and be available for another call.

Stevens said the EMS has responded to 1,600 calls between Oct. 2 when the county took over the service and Oct. 26, but is awaiting data about response times. The plan is to have more ambulances in service than Nature Coast EMS.

Stevens had 16 days from the time the county commission voted to take over the service to Oct. 2.

Stevens thanked his department and county support employees such as human resources and computer information technology staff for their help during the transition.

"If we didn't have that, we couldn't have done this in 16 days. No way, shape, or form," he said.

There will still be bumps along the way, Stevens said, "but we're going to do the best we can to resolve them.'







Be careful with Medicare calls

Recently there was a Sound Off call about Medicare insurance calling to sign you up for benefits. Be very careful of these calls because they are not promoting U.S. government original Medicare; they are promoting Medicare Advantage Plans which are private insurance companies who are licensed to offer health insurance to Medicare eligible people. These plans are quite different from original Medicare as they operate like an HMO. You must stay within the network of providers for each plan or the cost becomes very high. They are usually not portable, in that if you live in another state for part of the year, a Florida Medicare Advantage Plan will not have in-network services in your second state. Also, if you need specialized treatment or surgery, you may not be able to use the doctor or hospital you prefer. Medicare Advantage Plans may be cheaper up front but they come with limitations subscribers need to be aware of before enrolling.

The people who are calling are salespeople and they receive high commissions if they convince you to enroll in a Medicare Advantage Plan. Their prime objective is not to offer you more benefits but to make money.

Because it is now open season to pick a different or new Medicare plan, the sales people are out in force to sign you up and make the money. The October issue of the AARP Bulletin offers a good overview of Medicare Advantage Plans and how it com-

Biden's bill needs to become law

Some of you may remember stories about the time before Medicare coverage became law (under President Lyndon Johnson, a Democrat.)

Now President Biden another Democrat, proposes to include additional services under Medicare, specifically dental, hearing and vision.

US limits immigration enforcement actions

'Protected' areas to be off limits

WASHINGTON — U.S. immigration authorities will limit arrests at schools, hospitals and other "protected" areas under guidelines issued Wednesday by the Department of Homeland Security, part of a broader effort to roll back the approach to enforcement under President Donald Trump.

Agents and officers are being directed to avoid making arrests or carrying out searches at a range of sensitive locations "to the fullest extent possible," according to a memo from DHS Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas outlining the policy.

It is the latest in a series of immigration policies under President Joe Biden aimed at taking a more targeted approach to enforcement. The policy is similar to one under President Barack Obama that restricted arrests churches and schools.

The new policy includes not just schools but medical and daycare facilities, playgrounds and recreation centers as well as demonstrations and

Migrant caravan grows as it heads through Mexico

VILLA COMALTITLAN, Mexico — A growing migrant caravan filled the square in this town in Chiapas state on Wednesday afternoon after knocking off another 13 miles of its trek across southern Mexico.

About 2,000 migrants had walked out of the southern city of Tapachula near the Guatemala border on Saturday. While the multitude is challenging to count, it appeared significantly larger when it left Huixtla after a day of rest and its leaders estimated its size at 4,000. It reached the town of Villa Comaltitlan on Wednesday.

encourages migrants to seek to enter the country illegally. The Trump administration sparked criticism for seeking to arrest and remove anyone in the country illegally regardless of criminal history or community ties, though DHS also operated under a sensitive locations policy that limited enforcement actions in churches and other places.

"The caravan is like a magnet, it goes sucking up people, migrants who had been in the towns (of coastal Chiapas) are joining," said Irineo Mújica, an immigration activist with the organization People without Borders.

Without any issue, the migrants passed a customs, immigration and military checkpoint where authorities typically seize drugs and look for human smugglers.

Though still significantly smaller than caravans in 2018 and 2019, this is the biggest group moving through southern Mexico since the pandemic started early last year. In January, a caravan left Honduras, but authorities in Guatemala broke it up.

Mayorkas has argued that his agency does not have the resources to pursue all of the estimated 11 million people in the country without legal status and that it should focus on those who pose the greatest risk to society.

In announcing the new policy guidelines, the secretary said agents and officers should consider "broader societal interests" and the impact of their activities on communities.

Banks and health care companies helped pull stocks on Wall Street mostly lower Wednesday, as the market eased back from its latest record highs.

The S&P 500 fell 0.5% after shedding a modest gain as the selling picked up in the last hour of trading. The Dow Jones Industrial Average dropped 0.7%. Both indexes set all-time highs the day before.

The tech-heavy Nasdaq composite ended essentially flat after an early tech company rally lost steam. Treasury yields were mixed. Energy futures mostly fell.

Investors were focusing on a mixed batch of earnings from a variety of well-known companies, including Microsoft, General Motors and Coca-Cola.

The S&P 500 slipped 23.11 points to 4,551.68. More than three-fourths of the companies in the benchmark index fell, with financial, health care and industrial stocks accounting for most of the decline. Those losses offset gains from communication services stocks and a mix of companies that rely on consumer spending.

The Dow fell 266.19 points, or 0.7%, to 35,490.69. Most of the blue-chip index's stocks were in the red, led by Visa, which slumped 6.9% a day after reporting strong quarterly results.

The Nasdaq edged up 0.12 points, or less than 0.1%, to 15,235.84, and the Russell 2000 index of small companies took the heaviest losses, falling 43.58 points, or 1.9%, to 2,252.49.

US issues first passport with 'X' gender marker

DENVER — The United States has issued its first passport with an "X" gender designation, marking a milestone in the recognition of the rights of people who do not identify as male or female, and expects to be able to offer the option more broadly next year, the State Department said Wednesday.

The department did not identify the passport recipient, but Dana Zzyym, an intersex activist from Fort Collins, Colorado, told The Associated Press in a telephone interview that they received it. Since 2015, Zzyym, who prefers a gender-neutral pronoun, has been in a legal battle with the State Department to obtain a passport that did not require Zzyym to lie about gender by picking

either male or female.

Zzyym (pronounced Zimm) picked up the UPS package with the passport after getting an early morning text and phone call from their lawyer, Paul Castillo of Lambda Legal, that it had arrived. Zzyym had stayed up late celebrating Intersex Awareness Day with two visiting activists.

California virus cases stop falling

SACRAMENTO, Calif. — California Gov. Gavin Newsom rolled up his sleeve Wednesday and received a coronavirus vaccine booster shot, a move he encouraged others to take as the state heads into the time of year that in 2020 ushered in the deadliest spike of COVID-19 cases.

Much has changed since then — 88% of those 18 and older in California have received at least one dose of a vaccine that didn't exist last fall and millions have survived contracting the virus and have a level of natural immunity, though it's unclear for how long.

Still, millions are not vaccinated and new cases and hospitalizations have flattened after a steady twomonth decline that saw California boast the nation's lowest infection rate. State models show a gradual increase in hospitalizations in the next month.

Sudan arrests three critics of military coup

CAIRO — Sudanese security forces detained three prominent pro-democracy figures overnight, their relatives and other activists said Wednesday, as internal and international pressure mounted on the country's military following its coup.

The arrests came as protests denouncing Monday's takeover continued in the capital of Khartoum and elsewhere, and many businesses shut in response to calls for strikes. The coup threatens to halt Sudan's fitful transition to democracy, which began after the 2019 ouster of longtime ruler Omar al-Bashir in a popular uprising.

Groups of protesters some places, dozens, in others, hundreds — set up barricades of stones on main roads throughout the day. Security forces waded in, chasing demonstrators and dismantling the barriers.

WHO: Europe led **COVID** cases, deaths last week

GENEVA — Europe stood out as the only major region worldwide to report an increase in both coronavirus cases and deaths over the last week, with double-digit percentage increases in each, the U.N. health agency said Wednesday.

The World Health Organization said new COVID-19 cases in its 53-country European region, which stretches as far east as former Soviet republics in Central Asia, recorded an 18% increase in COVID-19 cases over the last week — a fourth straight weekly increase for the area.

In WHO's weekly epidemiological report on COVID-19, Europe also saw a 14% increase in virus-related deaths. That amounted to more than 1.6 million new cases and over 21,000 new

The United States tallied the largest number of new cases over the last seven days - nearly 513,000 new cases, though that was a 12% drop from the previous week — and over 11,600 deaths, which was about the same number as the previous week, WHO said.

Iran's president says cyberattack meant to create 'disorder'

DUBAI, United Arab Emirates — Iran's president said Wednesday that a cyberattack which paralyzed every gas station in the Islamic Republic was designed to get "people angry by creating disorder and disruption," as long lines still snaked around the pumps a day after the incident began.

Ebrahim Raisi's remarks stopped short of assigning blame for the attack, which rendered useless the government-issued electronic cards that many Iranians use to buy subsidized fuel at the pump.

However, they suggested that he and others in the theocracy believe anti-Iranian forces carried out an assault likely designed to inflame the country as the second anniversary of a deadly crackdown on nationwide protests over gaso-

"There should be serious readiness in the field of cyberwar and related bodies should not allow the enemy to follow their ominous aims to make problem in trend of people's life." Raisi said. State television later aired footage of the president visiting a gas station in central Tehran.

"Right now, things have increased price wise; it's hard to get certain materials," Carl Hall said about the challenges of meeting a hopeful 14-month deadline. "For us, it's trying to meet the schedule the judges want ... and get us in and operational as soon as possible."

Chool is in session and that means busy families may be in need of a few meal solutions that fit into their schedules—particularly items to grab on the way to school or work.

Granola bars often fit the bill as nutritious options in portable packages. While store-bought granola bars are convenient, they tend to be made with nuts or oats, which are not ideal for those with food allergies or intolerances.

People can easily whip up homemade granola bars that are chock-full of vitamins and minerals and can be customized to food preferences and tastes. This recipe for Nut-Free Granola Bars from "Eat What You Want" (Ten Speed Press) by Danielle Walker can be enhanced with raisins, chocolate chips or dried fruits.

Nut-Free Granola Bars

Makes 12

- 2 tablespoons warm water
- 1 tablespoon chia seeds
- 1/3 cup light-colored raw honey
- 1 tablespoon
- virgin coconut oil
 2 tablespoons
- unsweetened sunflower seed butter
- 3/4 cup raw pepitas■ 3/4 cup raw
- sunflower seeds
- 1 cup unsweetened coconut flakes
- 2 tablespoons sesame seeds
- 2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon fine sea alt■ 1/4 cup chocolate chips,

Preheat the oven to 350

and long sides of the pan with parchment paper so the ends hang over the sides.

Whisk the warm water and chia seeds in a small bowl and set aside.

Melt the honey in a small saucepan over medium-high heat. Turn the heat to medium and simmer for 5 to 7 minutes, until a candy thermometer reads 225 degrees. Stir in the oil and sunflower seed butter and remove the pan from the heat. Let cool for 10 minutes.

Place the pepitas and sunflower seeds in a food processor and pulse once or twice until coarsely chopped. Add the coconut flakes, sesame seeds, vanilla, cinnamon, and salt and pulse a few more times, until coarsely chopped and incorporated. Add the chia mixture and the honey mixture and stir by hand until just combined. Immediately spread the mixture into the prepared baking dish.

Place a piece of parchment paper on top and use a flat-bottomed measuring cup to press the mixture firmly and evenly into the pan. Remove the top piece of parchment and bake for 15 minutes, until golden. Sprinkle the chocolate chips over the top. Let cool in the pan for 30 minutes, then transfer the pan to the freezer for 1 hour, until set.

Remove the pan from the freezer and lift the parchment flaps to remove the slab from the pan. Using a sharp knife, cut into 12 rectangular bars. Serve the bars chilled.

Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator for 2 weeks, or in the freezer for 6 months. Defrost in the fridge overnight.

Praying for Haiti

ood morning, as I gaze out the west window the full moon hangs in all its splendor. As always I stand in awe how it is not altered even a tad in the midst of the rocking changes and uncertainties of the world. Take this, the moon has no light of its own. It merrily reflects the sun. Amazing. That's just how I want to be- no light of my own, but unshakably reflecting the Lord through the adverse seasons of life.

This brings a question a reader had of whether we know the group of Mennonite people kidnapped in Haiti. I don't know them personally. My heart especially goes out to the children and baby, wondering what they may be facing. I am comforted to know that God surely is always bigger than any situation and he even cares more than any earthly being.

If I look at the trauma raging on all sides, there is no way of being filled with joy; then as my eyes are turned to the Savior I regain a sense of peace that only comes from resting in the One who can keep us safe.

As I hear of those in hostage I think back and retell my children stories of when I was 14 years old and my parents, older brother, and myself took a much anticipated trip to Haiti to visit my uncle and his family who did mission work there for a number of years. My heart still aches at the thought of visiting an orphanage owned by a native; those living conditions remain etched in my mind. The little children could sing like a bird, yet their eyes spoke of the trauma they have been through. Getting a sense of security in not being alone at night, they would huddle together in bed with up to four children in a half bed. Though I knew it was not possible, I would so much have liked to just make life okay for their troubled hearts.

I was drawn by their simple way of life and narrow foot paths connecting the little houses with thatch roofs. Our children dream of going to Haiti and helping someday. For now, our nook is home, maybe one day when the children are

older and the way is clear, we'll attempt it.

With wide open ears they listen how most of these children in Haiti live their lives with a single meal a day, and how they're content with that. We take the opportunity to explain to them that while we tend to be discontent with our wide range of food options, they are happy with their daily rice and beans and sometimes for a special occasion, a bit of meat or the sauce.

I will inject though, that we have also witnessed that malnutrition due to a lack of even rice and beans. I still go in knots thinking about it. They had no choice of being born in that setting. On several occasions, we were invited to eat with Haitians in their homes. Outside the door of the teeny house where we were eating, little children with big eyes waited, in hopes of eating some

Etched in my mind are the two little girls who clutched a plate between them, which we handed out to them and took turns taking bites till every last bit was licked clean from the plate.

May I ever thank the Giver of all good things and not be found fussing over food, or anything, for that matter!

I used to think I don't like rice and beans till I was in Haiti. I truly enjoyed their way of making it. We adopted their recipe, and now enjoy it here in our home.

Haitian Rice with Sauce

- 3 cups water
- 1 1/2 cup rice
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 1/2 teas chicken base
- 1/2 teas garlic powder
- 1 1/2 teas salt
- 1 cup cooked pinto or black beans (opt)

Pour water, oil, and seasoning into a medium sauce pan. Bring to boil, add rice. Stir then simmer for ten minutes. DO NOT stir while simmering. Remove from heat, cover and let set another ten minutes. Fluff with a spoon and add beans. Spoon onto your plate and ladle a generous serving of the following sauce on top. Very good!

- 2 cups pizza sauce
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 3/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 3/4 teaspoon salt ■ 3/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/2 Tablespoon real lemon ■ 1/2 cup chicken, diced
- 1/2 cup potatoes, diced
- 1/2 cup carrots, sliced
- 1/2 cup cabbage, chopped
- 1/2 cup onions, chopped

Dump all together in a medium sized sauce pan. Simmer until veggies are tender.

Note: these veggies are all optional, use what strikes your fancy. The Haitians would also mix up a bit of flour with water then form small logs with this dough and toss them into the sauce. When the veggies were done, the dough rolls were also ready! They use ample amounts of garlic in their cooking; feel free to tweak seasonings to taste. I seldom use exact amounts when cooking.

Meet Saturday in 'Cocktail Party'

GAINESVILLE — Florida coach Dan Mullen has fielded quarterback questions all season: Emory Jones? Anthony Richardson? Why Jones? Why not Richardson?

If he's frustrated by the weekly inquiries, Mullen hasn't shown it. He did, however, offer a possible glimpse as the Gators returned from a bye week and began preparations to play top-ranked Georgia in their annual rivalry game known as "The World's Largest Outdoor Cocktail Party."

"Have they named a starting quarterback? I'm sure that's got to be ... that's shocking," Mullen said on Monday. "That's their No. 1 deal, right, who their starter is? Much bigger than ours. They're the No. 1 team. So I'm shocked how anybody's even looking at our situation."

Both teams' unsettled QB situations are sure to be one of the main story lines as the Bulldogs (7-0, 5-0 Southeastern Conference) and the Gators (4-3, 2-3) square off in Jacksonville for the 86th time in the last 89 years. Georgia is a 14 1/2-point favorite, according to FanDuel Sportsbook.

Bulldogs coach Kirby Smart insisted Monday he doesn't know whether Stetson Bennett or JT Daniels will start.

"It's going to be based on practice," Smart said. "No decision has been made whatsoever."

Bennett started the last three games in place of Daniels, who is recovering from a strained lat. Bennett, who also started the second game of the season against UAB

HOUSTON — José Siri launched himself headfirst into home plate, popped up with arms flexed and screamed with all his might.

Welcome to the World Series, rook.

The career minor leaguer sparked a team whose biggest stars took a while to shine, sending the Houston Astros to a 7-2 victory over the Atlanta Braves on Wednesday night that evened the Fall Classic at one game apiece.

Jose Altuve doubled early, homered late and scored twice to break out at the plate. Siri's speed and aggressive play created havoc on the bases, leading to a four-run second inning that helped the Astros snap a five-game skid at home in the World Series.

It's the first time they've won a World Series game in Houston since a 13-12 victory over the Dodgers in 10 innings in Game 5 on Oct. 29, 2017.

Altuve hit a leadoff dou-

ble and scored in the first inning before adding a solo homer in the seventh as the Astros rolled past the suddenly sloppy Braves.

José Urquidy gave the Astros five solid inning and Houston's bullpen, already so important this postseason, did the rest.

The series shifts to Atlanta for the first of three games Friday night.

I was asked recently at one of my seminars as to what would be the proper prop to run on my boat for this nature coast area? Most assuredly meaning the rocky, oystery, vast shallow area.

Before we cover some basic lingo, purposes and varieties of props, let it be known that everything from shallow-water running capabilities to fuel economy, to top-end speed

If you're not sure which prop you have on your outboard simply check the outside of the hub of the prop and you'll find numbers stamped into the metal. For example, a 14 x 17 prop has a 14-inch diameter and a 17-inch pitch.

Ask a technician and/or check the manufacturer's specifications to insure you have the proper prop for your outboard. The warranty folks could also be happier knowing, should something happen.

Another thing to consider is to always use GPS speeds for any calculations speedometers are rarely anywhere near accurate. Aluminum vs. stainless?

If you're running an aluminum prop, whether here or anywhere else, you'd be wise to replace it with a stainless. How many guides do you know who run aluminum? And we're out there all the time. While aluminum makes an inexpensive backup, it's not a good choice for the primary — the slightest touch of an oyster bar or rock will wipe it out, while a stainless can endure incredible battering and still get ya home. Stainless also peller you choose. It's thus most directly related because they can be

thinner blades and several times stronger.

Just remember, striking anything hard — even a sandbar — can cause even stainless to get out of round and possibly start a vibration. And if not corrected, can lead to big time problems for shafts, seals, gears and lower units. If any suspicion, don't hesitate to take it to a good shop for a check.

Four Blades or Three? Many flats guys like four blade props because of increased traction and lift which results in a quicker hole shot, and can keep the boat at plane at lower RPM.

I currently run a three blade on my Twin Vee simply because it's what came with my Suzuki and it performs for me quite fine. When I wear this one out I may opt for a four blade, we'll see. However, four-bladers cost considerably more than threebladed ones and you lose a few mph at top end with them. It can be a personal preference thing. Three bladers have made a lot of anglers happy, but if budget is not really a factor you may want to spring for the extra blade. Here again, keep in mind the area we're in.



G.K. Chesterton wrote, "A good novel tells us the truth about its hero, but a bad novel tells us the truth about its author."

A good trump split often makes life easy for the deal's hero, the declarer; but a bad split tells us the truth about the declarer's skill level.




In today's deal, how should South play in four spades? West leads the club ace, under which East plays the queen, showing the jack as well. (Here, he could not have a singleton.) West continues with the club king and another club.

South's two-club opening was strong, artificial and forcing. North's three-club rebid was the double negative showing a very bad hand. Regardless, South wasn't going to stay out of game with one of the best

hands he had ever held. "I did warn you, partner," said the

dummy as he tabled his cards. After ruffing the third club, the declarer could have entered the dummy and taken a trump finesse, but he saw that there was little advantage in this play. It would be of benefit only if East had king-doubleton. A greater risk was a bad trump

break. South led the spade queen from his hand at trick four. If East had won with his king and played his last club, declarer would have ruffed with dummy's spade eight. Therefore, East ducked. But now South entered the dummy with a heart to the jack and took a trump finesse. When it won, he cashed the spade ace. The king didn't drop, but declarer claimed, stating that he would play his red-suit winners until East opted
