Dr. Lewis Thomas, medical author and former president of New York's Sloan Kettering Cancer Research Center, wrote in the Foreign Policy Journal, Spring 1984: "There is no question that our health has improved spectacularly in the past century. and more.



## Hiatt chosen as CIQ Featured Quilter

Janette Hiatt is the featured quilter for this year's Quilt Show during Kamiah's 83rd annual Barbecue Days. The Central Idaho Quilters (CIQ) chose to honor Janette for her beautiful quilts, high-quality workmanship, love of piecing, and willingness to share her time and talent with others. She will have on display a sample of her handiwork at St. Catherine's Catholic Church, corner of 7th and Idaho streets, on Saturday, Aug. 31, from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. and Sunday, Sept. 1, from 10 a.m.-3 p.m.

Janette says that quilting never "crossed [her] mind" growing up in Woodland on the Simler ranch. There was always plenty to do and she much preferred helping her father, Dean, outdoors. She considered rounding up cattle on Pardee as "fun" and favored haying any day to doing dishes. Years later when Janette told her family she was learning to quilt they were surprised that she liked something that was not an outdoor activity!

As a mail carrier in Spokane, Wash., she delivered mail to a quilt shop and became interested in the fabrics, patterns and quilts on display. She signed up for a beginning quilting class and has been quilting since. She is quick to point out "all I want to do is piece." She likes machine piecing; sewing precisely-cut pieces of fabric together to form a whole pattern. "Precisely-cut pieces" are the operative words here. She once read a pattern over and over to make sure she had the cutting instructions firmly in her mind, used a specialty ruler, and then realized after she had cut out the entire pattern that she was one-fourth inch off on every piece. Quilters will understand – somehow this happens to all who have wielded scissors or rotary cutters to their most favorite and, more often than not, most expensive fabric. Unfortunately, Janette had to buy more material, but got it right the

Entries will be accepted Wednesday, Aug. 28 from 5-7 p.m. and Thursday, Aug. 29 from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. at St. Catherine's Church (at the side basement entrance across from the swimming pool). NO ENTRIES will be accepted af-

ter 1 p.m. on Thursday to allow time for display setup. Utmost care will be taken with all entries. All entries must be free of fragrances and odors for the comfort and safety of our workers and viewers — thank you!


All items entered must be picked up at the close of the show on Sunday, Sept. 1, beginning at 4 p.m. unless prior arrangements have been made at the time of entry. For your protection, ALL ITEMS MUST have a label attached on the back of the item.

Once again the Central Idaho Quilters have made a beautiful queen size quilt that will be given away to some "lucky" person at the close of the show on Sunday. Tickets are available from CIQ members at any time, Freedom Northwest Credit Union, during the parade, and at the Quilt Show.

## Museum open for BBQ Days

The Kamiah Valley Historical Society is pleased to sponsor the Kamiah Valley Museum located at 518 Main Street across from the Emergency Services Building.

The local museum will be open during Barbecue Days on Saturday, Aug. 31 from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. Come see the ancient mammoth bones discovered in Kamiah in 1958, the many historic items on display from Lewis County and the



surrounding Kamiah Valley, as well as historic pictures and news of early Kamiah, Native American early tools, medical implements of Dr. Bryan and Dr. Bridwell, and other items donated by local people.

We are proud of this small local museum and encourage visitors and former residents to drop in and see the many exhibits. Entry is free but a small donation jar is available for those wishing to help us.

CDs of over 1,400 pictures of the early history of the Kamiah region are available for purchase. It includes pictures of citizens of the past, early farming and logging in the area, and past community events in Kamiah. Copies of *Tales from Sarah's Shoebox*, the story of a local family moving West; *1948 Kamiah Fun and Facts*; the 1923 Kamiah Cookbook; the 2019 Historical Community Calendar; and *Pioneer Profiles*, a history and photos of the Clearwater Valley written by Cheetah Brown, are all available for purchase at the museum







second time.

Janette

Janette originally wanted to make all her quilts by hand, but soon realized at the pace she was sewing, she would "be lucky to finish two quilts" in her lifetime. Janette will display in the Quilt Show a hand-sewn "Flower Garden" she made for her mother, Evelyn, while they waited together during her mother's chemotherapy. In memory of her mother, Janette says the quilt has more sentimental value than expertise. She is a self-proclaimed

"social quilter." When asked to define a social quilter she quipped one who likes "[quilt] retreats, group sewing days and visiting!" Definitely, friendship and fabric (food, too!) are key ingredients for quilters, all of which she gets as a member of CIQ. Joining this quilting group in 2005, Janette reflects that these women are truly her quilting mentors and inspiration. She has discovered that the members are always willing to help, to answer questions no matter how small. Interestingly, CIQ members say the same about Janette. They also note that she quietly and efficiently takes the initiative to serve others. They find her to be humorous and caring, willing to share her quilting knowledge, and last but not least, mentor beginning quilters. Janette became a mentor to her daughter, Kary, introducing her to the art of quilting. According to Janette, Kary has already out-quilted her!

Janette sees herself as a "behind the scenes kind of person." Indeed, while honored to be the featured quilter, she is uncomfortable Continued from page 8 with all the attention she is receiving. However, she is in

charge of CIQ's membership dues and keeps the club on its toes making sure they follow Robert's Rules of Order. She helps each year with the Quilt Show and makes char-

Quilt Snow and makes charity quilts (for victims of the local 2015 fire and ICARE). She has also made six to eight Quilts of Valor, one of which (a blue ribbon winner in a previous Kamiah Quilt Show) will be showcased in her display.

Another quilt to look for

in her exhibition is the "Turtle

Quilt" (pictured hanging behind Janette in the photo on page 8). This particular quilt is her "most favorite" because it reflects her love of the Oregon coast and its sea turtles. She is also presenting a quilt she made for Kary which she admits was "beyond my abilities at that time." But, Kary is happy with it.

For 11 years, Janette's

father, Dean (who died in 2018), drove the quilt truck in the Barbecue Days Parade. "He really enjoyed pulling the quilter's float," she notes, and "always threaten[ed] to throw the quilters off" if they didn't behave. Janette laughs that if her father were here, "he probably would throw me off the truck!"

In addition to quilting and the Oregon coast, Janette's interests include tie-dye (especially shirts, because "when you're quilting nobody sees the threads"), peace signs, collecting batik fabric, reading, walking, Willie Nelson, and the Seattle Seahawks.







"It was a BIG one; I had some problems moving that thing around in my garage!"


Soon the word got out that Roberson was gifted with crafting wood into furniture and before he knew it,

# The history of Kamiah

Older than the recorded history of the West, Kamiah was the winter home of the Nez Perce Indians. It was here they came to fish for steelhead, a staple in their diet, and to manufacture "Kamia" ropes, hence the name Kamiah, meaning the place of "many rope litters."

Lewis and Clark camped for several weeks during the early spring of 1806 in the Kamiah Valley waiting for the snow to melt before they could continue their journey east. The valley is rich in the

heritage and legends of the Nez Perce and it was here, among the ancestors of the present day Nez Perce, that the Appaloosa horse was first bred, primarily for use as a war animal.

#### **Lewis & Clark Meet the Nez Perce**

The homeland of the Nez Perce Tribe was located in present north central Idaho.

They spent their lives roaming the grassy plateaus, hunting, fishing, gathering berries and herbs. They migrated across the Bitterroot Mountains to eastern Montana to hunt buffalo, but when winter came they returned to their lodges in the sheltered valleys. One of those winter home sites is now known as the Kamiah Valley. The first white

men known to the Nez Perce were Captains Meriwether Lewis and William Clark. The Lewis and Clark Corps of Discovery waited with the Nez Perce in the Kamiah Valley almost a month in the spring of 1806 for the snow to melt so they could cross the Bitterroot Mountains on their return to the East. Their campsite was located on the former site of the lumber mill across the Clearwater River from the present townsite.

Of the Nez Perce William Clark wrote, "These people has shewn much greater acts of hospitality then we have witnessed from any nation or tribe since we have passed the rocky mountains."

It was here that one of his men

brought Lewis a black and white bird highlighted with a red face and light breast which Lewis named in his own honor, the Lewis Woodpecker.

A short distance up the Clearwater,



in East Kamiah, stands the original home of Sue McBeth, a Nez Perce missionary of the early 1800's. It is located across the highway from the First Presbyterian Indian church, longest in continuous service in the State of Idaho. Here also is the Nez Perce Historical Park Site, "The Heart of the Monster" which is an important legend in Nez Perce Indian lore.

Elk, deer, bear, game birds, wild turkeys, steelhead and Rainbow trout, bass, kokanee, snowmobiling, 4-wheeling and skiing are nearby for the hunter, fisherman and those who enjoy the great outdoors.

Osprey soar and swoop over the Clearwater River from their nests high on the great yellow pine. Bald Eagles wait on the winter ice flows to snag a steelhead for dinner. Many small birds flit through the riverside greenery and high in the surrounding mountains. Birders delight in a visit here.
