Frequently Asked Questions on Sea Turtles

The beach seems a natural and safe place for a nesting sea turtle, but it is often filled with manmade hazards. Beach furniture, children's toys, trash, unfilled holes, and towels left on the beach can all act as barriers to nesting sea turtles. A sea turtle coming ashore may attempt to climb over or try to move around a beach towel or sand sculpture mound. On land, sea turtles are less agile and unstable, which also increases their risk of flipping over on the beach.

Here are some common questions asked about sea turtles:

Can sea turtles right themselves if they flip over?

According to experts, most sea turtles have the ability to right themselves; it all depends on the size, age and type of surface. A beach with loose sand makes it harder for their flippers to gain traction.

How long can a sea turtle survive on

A sea turtle on its back is a dire situation, according to experts, and the position puts pressure on the internal organs causing potential damage; dehydration, predators, and the morning sun bring heat and new threats.

Do sea turtles get stuck in holes on the beach?

Yes, and particularly hatchlings who can easily get stuck in unfilled holes. The smooth sides of the holes make it difficult to climb out, and they become trapped, dehydrated, and vulnerable to predators, ending their journey before it begins.

On Marco, hatchlings are starting to come out of their sandy nest mostly at

night and as they all race to the water, they face a gauntlet of obstacles on the beach. Let us all give them better odds of survival.

Note: If you encounter hatchlings or eggs on the beach, and while it's natural to want to help them, according to FWC, please don't pick up hatchlings crawling towards the ocean or collect exposed sea turtle eggs.
