Sami's 19

Sami's made it in nine wins a row by scoring seven runs in its final two at bats and then held off a late rally bid by Brewery.

Sami's trailed 15-12 as it came to the plate in the bottom of the fifth inning. Three straight singles loaded the bases for Dick Carson (four RBIs), who promptly lined an opposite field triple, plating all three base runners and tying the game at 15. Sami's added two more runs to complete the five-run uprising, giving the White and Red a two-run lead it would not yield. Carson had plenty of hitting support from his teammates including Jon Krebs (three hits, two RBIs including a triple); pitcher John Binns (three hits and two RBIs including a triple); George Giacobbi (three RBIs including a triple) and Dick Eddy (three hits including a triple). Not to be left out, Tom Whitlock ripped a triple (Sami's had six for the game) while Doug Stang chipped in with two RBIs.

Down by four runs entering the bottom of the seventh inning, Brewery staged a rally that came up just short. Gary Pringle (four hits and three RBIs) lofted a two-run opposite field single cutting the Brew Crew's deficit to two at 19-17. An error enabled Brewery to pull within one run at 19-18, however, the Blue and Red's bid to extend the rally and the game ended on a flyout. Brewery's other hitting stars included Ray Capella (three hits including a two-run home run and three RBIs); Gary Menzies (three hits, three RBIs); Jon Wiseman (three RBIs, all of them coming on a three-run opposite field home run) and Steve Friend, who had a triple.
